# Five felony charges filed for fatal Hwy W crash

Jennifer Moerer, 34, of Fairview, was charged in connection with her involvement in a crash on Route W, 0.8 miles west of MO-37 near George's on October 23, 2013.

Moerer was arrested on Thursday, February 13, at Mercy Hospital in Cassville by Cpl. John Lueckenhoff with the Missouri State Highway Patrol.

Barry County Prosecuting Attorney Johnnie Cox filed three counts of class C felony involuntary manslaughter and two class C felony assault in the 2nd degree charges for the wreck that killed three people and seriously injured two more.

According to the statement of probable cause, Moerer was travelling 72 miles an hour, attempting to pass a vehicle on Route W when

her view of oncoming traffic was obstructed by a hillcrest.

The crash caused a chain reaction that involved four vehicles

Moerer's 2003 Chevy Trailblazer was travelling east and struck a westbound 2003 Ford Ranger driven by Antonio Luna, age 73, of Rocky Comfort. Morer's vehicle then struck an eastbound 2005 Chevy Malibu driven by Amanda Walker, age 27,

# Prosecutor Attorney Cox seeks Circuit judge position

Barry County's Prosecuting Attorney Johnnie Cox announced his intention to run for the portion of Barry County Associate Circuit Judge - Division I in the upcoming 2014 primary.

Victor Head, the current Circuit Judge, announced his retirement that will go into effect on December 31, 2014.

Cox has been the Prosecuting Attorney for Barry County for three terms, his first elected term being 2002.

Cox stated, "It's a unique opportunity that the judgeship opening is available, and I've considered it before, but the timing didn't seem right. However, this time, everything seems to fall into place."

Cox worked as an Assistant Prosecuting Attorney since his graduation from the Univeristy of Missouri - Kansas City law school in 2000. Cox feels that his experiences in those positions makes him a qualified candidate for the judgeship opening in Barry

County.

"Serving the people of Barry County has been a very rewarding experience. I've appreciated the trust that has been placed in me in the Prosecuting Attorney position, and I will do all that I can to see that I continue to work hard for the citizens of the county."

One of the most memorable and challenging cases of Cox's career with Barry County was the Christopher Collings case in the slaying of young Rowan Ford.

Cox detailed the ways in which serving as the Prosecuting Attorney has helped to prepare him as a candidate for the judge opening. "My duties already require me to keep a level of impartiality and represent the public. I also have to weigh evidence when assigning charges to cases. As a prosecutor, you are charged with ensuring the rights of all people are protected, even with a defendant. I have to make sure all defendants are given a fair trial, even it if hinders my case against them."

The Barry County election will in April, and if elected, Cox would take over the judge position January 1, 2015.

Cox would assume all of Judge Head's duties in the county, including his involvement with Drug Court.

Cox graduated from Cassville High School in

of Purdy and her husband, Lukas Walker, age 34, of Wheaton. Lastly, the Walkers' Malibu was struck by a 1998 Dodge Durango driven by Suzanne Morin, age 34, of Butterfield, with passenger George Luna Nunez.

Three fatalities occurred as a result of the crash. Lukas Walker was pronounced dead on the scene. Amanda Walker passed away on February 12 as a result of injuries from the wreck. The Walkers left behind three children. Antonio Luna died in the week following the crash from his injuries.

Morin and Luna-Nunez were also seriously injured the crash and were airlifted to Springfield hospitals along with Luna.

According to the affidavit of probable cause, Morer had passed another vehicle at high speeds a few minutes before the crash that killed three people and seriously

injured two. It was stated that she had a pattern of reckless driving that repeated regularly in the days and week prior to the crash, as well.

Morer's three year-old son was also in her vehicle, but only experienced minor injuries.

# Gun-toting senior holds thieves at bay, two arrested

An Exeter couple are in custody following a home invasion where a 73 year-old woman pulled a pistol on one of them.

The break-in occurred around 12:48 a.m. on Wednesday, February 12, according to the Barry County Sheriff's Department. A burglar broke into a garage door at a residence on Farm Road 1085, then broke into two more doors to gain access to the home.

The woman in the home then asked, "Who is in my house" while pointing a pistol at the man, according to Sheriff Mick Epperly. At that point, the man, wearing a black hoodie, shined a flashlight in the woman's face and left the premises on foot to a vehicle waiting.

Sheriff Epperly stated, "He must have decided he

was in the wrong place when he saw her with her gun. Some could have been shot in this circumstance, and it would have been justified according to Cassville's new law with breaking through three different doors."

The thief took an unknown amount of meat from a freezer in the garage along with some tools before he left. The Sheriff's Department has more deputies patrolling the area since the incident.

Megan Homewood, age 28, and Preston Kovanda, age 25, were arrested at their home in Exeter on Tuesday, February 18, around 10:30 a.m. Three children were removed from the home by the Department of Family Services at that time, as well.

# Plaque presented at Valentine's dinner

The Annual Valentine's Party and dinner sponsored by The Wheaton Historical Society turned out a capacity crowd last Friday night. More than 100 people were in attendance.

Ceremonies were presided over by David Shockley, President of the organization, and entertainment included a comedy skit with religious overtures performed by Lindy Lombard, of Security Bank in Wheaton, and Kay Hughes, along with musical selections by Sheila Young, Donna Watkins and Shelly Dennett

Honorees for the occasion were Ralph Lamberson and his wife, Betty Higgs Lamberson, both of whom are Wheaton natives with Betty having long standing ties to the Higgs family. The Higgs family settled in the area in the early days, long before the Civil War days of 1861 to 1865. The Lamberson family also came in the early days and settled on "Oliver's Prairie," where Wheaton is now located.

The emcee for the dinner was Ralph Lamberson (who much to his and Betty's surprise) was honored by the

In brief remarks at the end of the presentation, former Sen. Emory Melton of Cassville, a known scholar of Barry County, noted that, "Your honorees, Ralph and Betty, have made sure that those who come after us have been adequately informed about the history of Wheaton and adjoining communities."

"I didn't really understand the wide range of information until I took my 534 page copy of the Wheaton Echoes from the shelf earlier today and went through it page by page. If you don't have one, you should get one. It is a treasure trove of information, and it was compiled by Ralph and Betty Lamberson. It contains over 700 photo reproductions," Melton added.

"It is mind boggling to consider all the help they had in putting the book and the Centennial Celebration in 2007 together. In the book are the names of the Wheaton Centennial Committee, Kay Lombard, Naomi Young, JoAnn Jump, Joe Higgs, Floyd and Ann Hughes, Sandra Tinsley, Jill Paden, Rebecca Roskob, Jason Navarro and Gary Cartwright. Dozens of others assisted in putting the whole thing together and the names appear throughout the 534 pages," Melton stated.

"But in any organized effort there must be leaders, and we have to conclude the spark plugs, if you will, were Ralph and Betty Lamberson," Melton concluded.

The restoration of the railroad station on the Missouri-North Arkansas, at its original site from 1907 to 1957, is present evidence of ingenuity of Wheaton. It houses historical items and is open to the general public at scheduled times.



# **Barry County man still missing**

Jeffrey Ingram, a 31 yearold man from Cassville, is still missing, according to Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly.

Ingram originally went missing on January 16 around 8:30 p.m. after telling family that he was going to harm himself. Ingram left the residence driving a white 2013 Toyota Tacoma with a dent in the rear bumper with tag number 6YR123.

Epperly said that the department has checked his bank records as well as talked to his family and friends, but they haven't had any success locating him. Epperly stated, "It's crazy what happened with this case. He just vanished."

Ingram was raised in the Taney County area, according to Sheriff Epperly. Deputies have been in contact with the Taney County Sheriff's Department and shared his photo and vehicle description, but they have been unable to locate him as well.

Epperly continued, "We have spoken with his mother, and he appreciates all we have done to try and find him, but she doesn't know where he could be, either."

The Sheriff's Department has scoured the county looking for him and pouring through records, hoping to find some trace of him, to no

Epperly stated, "We know we've got a missing person, we just don't know where to look at this point."





Cassville firefighters are now participating in a 40 hour class on building collapse through the University of Missouri. They have currently completed 20 hours of training, using a house on 11th and Main Street in Cassville. Since that house is now demolished, they will be using another on Highway 248 to complete the remaining 20 hours of their training.

The building collapse classes will teach the firefighters to properly shore up a house, or to support by placing against something solid or rigid. Also, how to rescue victims from a fire so it's safe for the fire fighters is covered. The grant that Springfield received was

# Couple arrested for squatting in local home

Two are in custody for allegedly squatting in a residence in Barry County last

On February 10, the Barry County Sheriff's Department was dispatched to a residence located at 19785 Hidden Valley, in Cassville, for two persons occupying a property that did not belong

Deputies arrived and found that Rita and Jason

Ponder had entered the residence though a bedroom window and were living there. The Ponders are thought to have broken into the property sometime in between February 8 and February 10.

Sheriff Mick Epperly stated, "We received a report that a male and female were in a camper without permission. When deputies arrived, it was Rita and Jason Ponder, and we have had both of them in jail on numerous occasions."

The property owners, Glenna and Marc Edmonson, claimed that the Ponders stole propane and electricity while they were there in the amount of less than \$500. Epperly stated that the pair had moved personal items into the residence, as

Sheriff Epperly stated, "With the belongings inside, it was clear that they were essentially squatting there without permission."

Both Jason and Rita Ponder have each been charged with class C felony burglary in the second degree. They are being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of \$10,000 cash-only bonds.

# Abandoned horses seek refuge at local farm

When people hear of dumped animals needing homes, most people wouldn't think that horses are the animals in question. However, according to a local horse trainer, Mary Fenske, that is exactly what is happening all too often in the area.

Fenske, of Purdy, has taken in 12 horses in the last six months when people were unable to care for them. Seven of those horses she took in after speaking to their owners, but the other five were just dumped without her permission.

Fenske stated, "Last week, I got a phone call telling me that some of my horses had gotten out. When I went out to see, three horses were outside of my fence, but they weren't mine."

Fenske thought she knew who owned the horses, but when she asked them, they claimed they didn't belong to them. So now, Fenske is taking care of the vet bills and food to rehabilitate the three. She stated, "As soon as I took them in, they drank 20 gallons of water first off."

This is the second time that abandoned horses have shown up at Fenske's farm, either because they had been dumped or gotten out of their owners' fences. The first two horses that showed up were in really poor health, but the three from last week weren't as bad.

She said the vet checked them and said two were foundered, and all were extremely hungry and thirsty. Fenske speculated that part of the problem could be that some people might not realize that the grass left on the ground after the snow doesn't have enough nutrients in it for horses due to the harsh conditions of the winter.

She stated, "They have to be supplemented with minerals and some sweet grain. They can't just dig for grass in the snow. The horses that showed up had obviously gone through fences because they were hungry."

Fenske placed an ad in the newspaper for the horses in case someone is looking for them, but she isn't expecting to get any calls. She stated, "The

market isn't good for horses right now, and people just can't afford to care for them."

For a woman who has been raising, riding and training horses since before she could walk, the challenges of caring for horses are not new. However, for someone who isn't is as experienced, the care can be overwhelming. Fenske said, "If someone has to have a vet come out to castrate, that might be \$150 in a single vet bill for a horse that, right now, will probably only bring \$50 at an auction. It isn't practical to raise them."

Many livestock auctions have imposed a minimum tariff to sell a horse to cover costs of sale. Fenske said it isn't uncommon for a horse to sell and the owner owe more to the auction than what the horse brought because of the poor market.

When faced with horses that were obviously not being cared for, Fenske said her reputation is at risk as a trainer if she didn't do what she could for them. The pos-

sibility that someone would think that Fenske would let her horses live with health issues like some of them had. Fenske isn't the only one who has had horses just show up at her property. She stated, "Several people, including a good friend, have had the same problem. People assume that since you have horses, you will want a few more, but that isn't always the case."

Fenske added, "I used to be able to sell horses as fast as I could train them. It's just not profitable to take care of hoses the way they need to be cared for anymore."

However, Fenske summed up her feelings, "You have that horse, you need to take care of them. I can't stand to see something innocent hurt."

As far as the horses that showed up, Fenske said she will continue to care for them and work on rehabilitating them. She explained, "I wouldn't let them starve. No matter how you look at it, it's wrong."

# **Monett hosts 45th Dairy Day**

The 45th annual Monett Dairy Day took place Tuesday, February 18, at the Monett National Guard Armory.

This educational event has been available for local area dairy producers since 1969 in order to assist them in making management decisions and provide them with research-based information. Highlights of the program included: adaptation of new milking technology and what the new farm bill means to producers.

Dr. Tony Rickard, Extension Dairy Specialist, University of Missouri, Cassville, started off the event with a presentation on maintaining a dairy industry in Southwest Missouri and providing ideas for new equipment and how to properly feed your cattle in order to get the most and best quality milk out of your farm. Murray Lane, from Dairy Farmers of America, Monett, then discussed testing milk for residues.

Following lunch, which was sponsored by the Monett Chamber of Commerce, Commercial Exhibitors and Participants, Duane Ripperda, from Arentsen Farm Sales and Service, Alberts, IL, spoke about, how a robotic milker fits in Missouri dairies. Completing the program, Dr. Scott Brown, Program Director for Food and Agriculture Policy Research Institute, University of Missouri, Columbia, spoke of the dairy outlook and Farm Bill update.

Mark Fellwock, an area dairy farmer and Lawrence County Farm Bureau president, was one of many at the event. "I was born and raised on a dairy farm," stated Fellwock. He continued, "My wife and I took over the farm from my father when he passed away eight years ago.

It's great coming to this event to get new ideas. Even if it's just one, you can take it back and put it to use." Fellowock went on to state, "We homeschool our children," who were present at the event. "Bailey, Riley and Hayden work on the farm as well. In my opinion it's the best way to raise a family, to have them with you. It's tough to make money in the dairy business, so tweaking your management can help, and people can learn that here."





# Southwest Trojans survive Purdy upset bid

After posting resume'builder wins against Monett and Cassville, and then winning a tough conference game on the road at McAuley, the Southwest Trojans returned home on Thursday, February 13, to grind out a 62-57 win over Purdy. The comeback victory vaulted Southwest into first place in the Ozark 7 Conference standings, with only games against Thomas Jefferson and Verona standing between the Trojans and a championship.

Purdy came to town looking for a fight, and for most of three quarters, the Eagles were the more aggressive team. Brent Cornman shredded the Southwest defense for 11 first-quarter points as Purdy shot out to a 15-12 lead at the first break.

After too many close games in too few days, the Trojans were unable to match the intensity level of the Eagles. Blake Barnes and Brad Daniels, who scored at will against Cassville and McAuley, could not find the range

Although Daniels scored with a pretty one-handed jumper to open the second quarter, Purdy rushed to a 23-14 lead with an 8-0 run. Alex Mareth canned a pair of free throws and drained a midrange jumper to key the outburst.

With the race cars sputtering, Southwest turned to the old reliable Diesel. Big center Robbie Randall took over the paint, scoring 7 unanswered points with a power move, a jumper, and an old school three-point play to cut the Purdy lead to 24-18 at the 3:00 mark.

Mareth and Cornman responded to push the lead back to 28-21, but Barnes connected from the deep right corner for three points as Southwest climbed back to trail just 32-28 at the half.

Randall bullied his way into the paint to open the third quarter, and the Trojans pulled within a single score. Barnes and Daniels scored 6 apiece in the frame, but Purdy answered with big

shots from Kelton Mattingly, Cornman, and Mareth to hold the hosts at bay.

Mareth's baseline jumper gave Purdy a 44-40 lead with just 54 seconds left in the quarter, but Seth Delossantos rolled in his only field goal of the night, and then Barnes swished two free throws to establish a 44-44 tie at the final break.

Barnes missed to open the last period of play, but Randall followed to give the Trojans their first lead since 3:25 on the first-quarter clock. The lead grew to 49-46 before Mareth hit a trey from the left corner to tie with 5:32 to play. The Eagles then regained the lead when Mareth came up with a steal and rambled coast-to-coast for a layup.

Daniels tied the game at 51-51 with a baseline drive, then Mareth scored again from the right block. Barnes drew a foul, and his free throws created a 53-53 tie with 2:54 to play.

Brad Daniels owned the final two and a half minutes of this game. His steal at half court and subsequent layup put Southwest in the lead, 55-53. Cornman's free throws tied the game momentarily, but Daniels smoked an answering jumper to put Southwest in front for good.

Barnes then fed Malon McIntire for a fast break layup that gave the Trojans a 59-55 lead in the final minute.

Brent Cornman kept Purdy alive, scoring on a baseline drive with 18 seconds left and cutting the lead to 60-57. Then the Eagles gained the ball following missed free throws, and Purdy's Tommy Egan called timeout to draw up the potential tying play.

On the inbounds play, Daniels contested the pass and knocked the ball off a Purdy player out of bounds with 13 seconds left. It was the biggest play of the game.

Daniels closed out the win with a pair of free throws and Southwest prevailed over Purdy, 62-57.

# Seligman Council hopes to change city chicken ordinance



Seligman City Aldermen hope to change the current city ordinance to accommodate chickens within the city limits while also protecting neighbors from offensive sounds and odors.

Feathered friends in Seligman might be subject to different rules later this year pending a decision by the Planning and Zoning committee.

The Seligman City Council meeting on Monday, February 10, included an item on their agenda about the possibility of changing the

city's ordinance related to chickens kept within the city limits. However, discussion was postponed since the decision's approval is in the hands of Planning and Zoning, a committee that won't meet again until April to discuss the matter.

The current code regarding chickens in the city of Seligman states that there can be no more than 50 chickens within the city limits as part of their Animal Regulations City Code. However, the Nuisance City Code restricts chickens to the agricultural zones only.

The Aldermen that sit on City Council want to allow chickens, according to Brian Nichols, City Clerk and member of the Planning

and Zoning committee, but they also want to establish guidelines. Currently, they are checking with other cities to establish what an appropriate ordinance might look like.

The cities of Cassville and Wheaton do not allow chickens within their city limits at all. Cassville only allows for cattle and horses within city limits, and then only in agriculturally zoned areas. The City of Exeter also has an ordinance limiting livestock in the city limits. However, according to Myrna Eisenbraun, Exeter City Clerk, that ordinance is outdated and not the way they feel about it today.

Eisenbraun stated, "We have many people with chickens and other animals inside the city limits. As long as no one complains, we don't do anything about it. As far as I know, we haven't received any complaints about anyone."

Purdy's city ordinance reads that chickens cannot be running loose, but doesn't restrict the number allowed otherwise. Purdy, like Washburn, would use their Nuisance ordinance if someone's backyard fowl were getting out of hand.

Larger cities, like Springfield, have drawn a lot of heat in recent years on both sides of the issue after the City Council allowed for no more than five chickens per household within the limits, as long as they did not have any roosters. With Barry County being a more rural area, most people don't question their neighbors keeping a small backyard brood within reason.

Seligman's discussion was sparked by a citizen complaint within the city. Nichols stated, "The neighbor was breeding chickens, and the odor was offensive. They could not resolve the issue between themselves, and they reported it to the Police Department." After the Police Department responded, they property owner was notified that they were in violation of the Nuisance Ordinance.

Nichols went on, "They were given 10 days to comply, which they did by removing the chickens." The Aldermen on council don't want everyone to have to remove their chickens, but

obviously there need to be guidelines in place to control noise and odor issues related to livestock within the city.

Currently, if someone fails to comply to a Nuisance violation within the 10-day period, they are ordered in front of the Board for a public hearing. Nichols stated, "If the nuisance is valid, they will be given a time frame to comply. If they fail to comply, a special tax bill (tax lien) will be issued on the property for the cost associated to abate the nuisance. In the instance that the Board of Aldermen cannot resolve the issue, a citation could be issued by our Police Department and the property owner would have to appear in court."

Seligman's Planning and Zoning committee will meet in April to discuss the matter and how the ordinance would be best changed to protect chicken owners and their neighbors. There currently isn't a time frame for when the changes might go into effect.

Dr. Martin Greer, Jr., former art teacher at Purdy Schools, recently published an animation book featuring artwork of students from the

Animation in the Schools is the second edition of the eBook geared for Kindle users and focuses on how Greer taught basic animation skills to students over the years when they have little to no experience. Greer's students at Purdy focused mostly on animation for a zoetrope, a circular animation tool that was the forerunner of the motion picture machine. Students drew twelve images with small differences, then when they were placed in the zoetrope and spun, it created a simple animation.

However, Greer's accomplishments extended far beyond the zoetrope animations. Greer went on to teach students more complicated animation, including short films to Ray Stevens hits like "Guitarzan" and "Harry, the Hairy Ape" with his Van Buren, Ark., High School students. Ray Stevens gave special permission to the Van Buren students to use his songs, even going as far as to compliment them on the work once they were done and had sent him copies of their movies.

Perhaps the greatest accomplishment that Greer gained from working with the students wasn't the animation, although it was impressive for students with no experience, but the way the students worked together and how Greer supported the art programs in schools where funding was an issue.

Greer stated, "We only had maybe \$350 in the budget for the entire year for supplies, so we started showing the films we made to other schools, charging ten cents admission to raise the money for the art department. Over 2,500 kids saw the film The Emperor's New Clothes." It isn't uncommon for schools with fund-


The Wheaton FFA Chapter has had another busy and successful school year thus far, and the busiest time of the year is quickly approaching.

The FFA Chapter would like to thank all of those who help to make our chapter successful.










