Roaring River preps for Saturday's Opening Day

People are gearing up for one of the most memorable days of the year, trout season opening day at Roaring River State Park on March 1.

This year, the big day falls on a Saturday, making the anticipated crowd larger than years past. Last year, 1,609 tags were sold to anglers at Roaring River. This year, the park is preparing for 2,600 to 2,700, according to hatchery manager Paul Spurgeon.

The hatchery staff will be stocking the waters with 8,000 trout, around three per anticipated fisherman, during the week leading up to opening day. Spurgeon stated, "We're expecting a bigger turn out than last year since opening day is a Saturday."

Each of the hatcheries at the four trout parks across the state use previous years' records to make determinations on how many fish to stock the waters with prior to March 1.

Among the 8,000 trout stocked will be 100 lunkers. Lunkers are classified by their weight of three to six pounds. The winners of the largest fish in the men and women's divisions will be awarded \$50 in Cassville Cash by the Cassville Area Chamber of Com-

Hatchery staff made some changes in preparation of the season this year, most related to the heavy flooding experienced during last season. High flood waters damaged a variety of areas of the park, closing some campgrounds and areas for a short time.

Spurgeon stated, "We've dug a lot of gravel [out of the river] lately from all of the floods. We've also repaired the baffle dams over the winter, and added boulders in the catch and release area as new habitat. So, people can be on the look out for those changes."

This year, the opening gun will be fired by longtime Roaring River volunteer Leo Steinbrecher. Steinbrecher has a long history of volunteering at RRSP events such as Kids' Fishing Day. He has been fishing at the park for over 30 years. Steinbrecher will be celebrating his 93rd birthday on opening day.

Fishing tags will be available for purchase begin-

ning on Friday, February 28, at 9 a.m. at the at the Park Store. The store will be open through the night until 7 p.m. on March 1. The restaurant will be open from 5:30 a.m. to 7 p.m. on opening day.

Volunteers with the Cassville Chamber of Commerce will be on-site at the Les Jacobs Ford tent giving the first 1,000 anglers a free coffee mug filled with hot coffee to combat the chilly morning.

Currently, almost all of the campsites available to re-

serve are booked for Friday and Saturday nights. The Inn's recently upgraded rooms are also full. The Inn upgraded rooms to queen-sized beds and installed energy-efficient HVAC units. The park also anticipates that the first-come, first-served campsites

The Weather Channel is predicting a high of 36 degrees on Saturday, meaning the morning will have a chilly start. However, skies should be clear and sunny with no chance for rain which bodes well for the turnout.

Filings open for Barry County offices

Tuesday, February 25, marked the first day that candidates could file for various county offices with positions up for election in the August primary.

All positions have at least one candidate who filed on the first day, including a contested race for the Presiding Commissioner seat currently held by Cherry Warren.

Terry Burgess is seeking election as the Presiding Commissioner as a Republican. Burgess has resided in Barry County for 12 years, was a Sheriff's Deputy, serves as the chairman of the planning and zoning committee in Seligman and is a parttime Police Officer for the City of Washburn.

Burgess also is a business owner in Seligman. This would be his first elected position with the County.

Cherry Warren, Republican, has served as the Presiding Commissioner for five terms and was originally elected in 1994. Warren served for 11 years as the county Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation

Services (ASCS) director, as well as being a business and farm-owners and working in the Cassville banking industry for 18 years.

Following the retirement announcement of Victor Head, Johnnie Cox, current Barry County Prosecuting Attorney, filed for the position of Associate Circuit Judge Division I as a Republican. Cox has served as the Barry County Prosecuting Attorney for three terms. He was first elected in 2002. Cox is currently the only candidate.

Robert Foulke, Republican, is seeking reelection for Associate Circuit Judge Division II. Foulke is serving his first term in the position and was first elected in 2010. Foulke was the only candidate to file on Tuesday for the seat.

Janice Varner is seeking reelection for a fourth term as Collector of Revenue. Varner was first elected in 2002 and is running as a Republican. She is currently running unopposed.

Craig Williams filed for reelection for a fourth term

for the Circuit Clerk/Recorder of Deeds seat with the county. He was first elected in 2002 as a Republican. He was the only candidate to file on Tuesday for the position.

Gary Youngblood, Republican, is seeking reelection for the seat of Clerk to the County Commission. Youngblood is serving his fifth term and was originally elected in 1994. No one else has filed for the seat so far.

J. Patrick Sullivan, Republican, is seeking election as the Prosecuting Attorney. Sullivan has worked as a part-time Assistant Prosecutor in Barry County for 15 years. He is currently running unopposed.

Lois Lowe, current Treasurer, is seeking reelection for her sixth term. Lowe was first elected in 1994 as a Republican. She is currently the only one who filed for the seat.

Candidates can continue to file for the county office openings until March 25, 2014. The Primary Election will be held on August 5, 2014

In the 26 years that Mary Jane Flynn has worked in the Barry County Assessor's Office, many things have changed. Not only did they change in the office, but in her life as well. After many years of service, Flynn looks forward to her retirement, but she will be missed.

Flynn began working in the Assessor's Office in a temporary position through a contracted company, but left when her contract expired in 1985. Flynn stated, "Then in 1988, [Deputy Assessor] June Smith called me when a position opened up."

Flynn said that things have changed significantly in the office over the years, making her job easier than it was originally. Flynn's position with the county was to plat legal descriptions on maps, as well as splitting acreage or combining land when properties changed hands.

GIS (Geographic Information System) is the new technology that utilizes satellite images to help plat legal descriptions. Prior to the system that was introduced around 2008, if there was a question about the way land was described, Flynn had to contact the abstract compa-

ny or lawyer to have them show her on a physical map. However, now it is easier to see landmarks when mapping out properties.

Even with GIS, Flynn still got to work closely with others working on deeds and surveys. Former Senator Emory Melton stated, "Mary Jane has been very accommodating and pleasant with the folks who have needed to do business with the Assessor's Office over those 26 years."

Flynn has served under three different Barry County Assessors in her time at the old courthouse. From 1988 to 1990, Glen Dale Nickell was the Assessor. June Smith took the position for two terms from 1990 to 1988, and her daughter, Sherry Sears, has been elected to two terms since, beginning in 2008.

When reflecting over how things have changed in those years, Flynn stated, "The records have tripled in that time. The work is a lot more, but the computers make it much easier than it used to be."

Flynn's favorite part of her work was both the people she got to serve with, and also the work of platting legals themselves. She enjoyed her job in all capacities. Flynn said, "All the people I've worked with were the best. I've gotten to work with three great assessors as well. It's just been a great environment."

While Flynn will miss her job with the County, she said she plans to take the time to do things that she hadn't had time for, like quilting. Flynn said, "My family has wanted me to retire for awhile, so I'm going to get to the things that I haven't had a chance to over the years."

Mary Jane Flynn is a widow to William and has two living children, Steve Flynn and Linda Tully. Her son Vernon passed away. She also has seven grand-children, one of whom attends school at the University of Missouri - Columbia.

Marbut made his own independent place in the emerging discipline of soil science, but his concerns became more than the scientific facts of soils and their classification. His subjects at professional meetings and in publications became more international in scope. His presidential address to the Association of American Geographers in December 1924 dealt with the Malthusian theory. He also examined Soviet soils and the capacity for that country's wheat production potentially to rival that of the USA. The AGS, in awarding him the Cullum Medal in 1932, its highest distinction, described his achievements in the following words: "For geographical works on the study of soils – the foothold of all things." He also received honorary doctorates from UMC in 1916 and Rutgers in 1930. He wrote that all his recognition and achievements were important only as they could be used to strengthen his position and influence to bring to the countries of the world knowledge of their soil resources and, thereby, self-sufficiency in agricultural production so that food would not be a reason to wage war. He wrote that he believed it was his duty and responsibility to do all one man could do to ensure that the countries of the world could feed themselves without having





to rely on other countries for food. Marbut shared his unspoken goal of knowledge in the service of humanity, in his correspondence. Curtis Fletcher Marbut is mentioned along with Russian Vasilli V. Dokuchaev and American Eugene W. Hilgard when speaking of the 'founders' of modern soil science. He was a pivotal person – wellknown as a teacher and promulgator of ideas. Marbut had to battle provincialism

to achieve acceptance of the Russian ideas in the USA that he believed necessary to the advancement of the science. He was the world authority on soils in the 1920s and 1930s. Marbut became a scientist in demand worldwide for his knowledge, a circumstance that prompted US President Franklin D. Roosevelt to grant Marbut three yearly extensions beyond the mandatory retirement age




Jail time for local trespasser

Barry Farmers eligible for disaster loans

The Administrator designated Arkansas counties as primary agricultural disaster areas making certain farmers and other agricultural producers in primary and contiguous counties eligible for low-interest emergency loans from USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA).

Four Missouri counties were designated as contiguous disaster areas due to damages and losses caused by excessive snow and ice which occurred Dec 5, 2013, through December 9, 2013. The counties are: Barry, Ozark, Stone and Taney.

All counties listed above

were designated disaster areas on January 31, 2014, making all qualified farm operators in the designated areas eligible for low interest emergency (EM) loans from FSA, provided eligibility requirements are met. Farmers in eligible counties have eight months from the date of the declaration to apply for loans to help cover part of their actual losses. FSA will consider each loan application on its own merits, taking into account the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability.

Loans for severe physical losses must be used to replace or repair damage to buildings, fences or to compensate the farmer for losses of basic livestock, stored crops, or supplies on hand, equipment, etc., that was lost due to the disaster.

In order to qualify, a farmer must have suffered an actual physical loss that was essential to the successful operation of the farm.







Pesticide applicator training Mar. 10 in Cassville

A private pesticide applicator training program has been scheduled for Monday, March 10, in the courtroom of the Barry County courthouse on the square in Cassville, according to Tony R. Rickard, Dairy Specialist in the Barry County Extension Office. Attendees have the option of attending one of two identical sessions, 1:30-4:00 pm or 6:00-8:30 pm. Persons interested in attending are asked to contact the Barry County Extension Office at (417) 847-3161.

Missouri law requires all purchasers and users of restricted-use pesticides for private use to attend a training session in order to be certified. The license is good for five years. This training is open to producers of agricultural commodities who need to obtain private pesticide license and those who need to renew their existing license. There is no cost for the training, although you are now required to purchase the Missouri Private Pesticide Applicator Reference Manual. The cost of materials is \$15 including the manual. If you already own a manual and can bring it with you to the session and save \$12.

Tim Schnakenberg, University of Missouri Agriculture/Rural Development Specialist in Galena, will be the instructor for the program. This program is sponsored by the Barry County University of Missouri Extension Council and Barry County Commission.


