## Hobbs sentenced for \$2M fraud at Butterfield Feed Mill

A man from Exeter was sentenced to almost three years in federal prison for his part in a scheme that cost his former employer over \$2 million.

Prosecutors say Jeffrey Hobbs, 41, created bogus scale tickets to Cargill for loads of corn that were paid for but never actually delivered to the company's Butterfield Feed Mill.

Hobbs worked as a scale operator and pellet mill operator at Cargill's Butterfield Feed Mill from December 1999 until March 2013. When a delivery truck would arrive at the Feed Mill, Hobbs was responsible for weighing each truck and its contents. Once the truck was weighed, Hobbs created a scale ticket for the company that delivered the grain, corn or feed. A copy of the scale ticket was sent to Cargill's headquarters in Minneapolis, Minn., for processing

and payment to the trucking company.

Bob True Beisly, III, 40, of Nevada, and Ronald Bunn, 45, of Deerfield, were sentenced in separate appearances before U.S. District Judge Gary A. Fenner. Beisly was sentenced to two years and 11 months in federal prison without parole (to run consecutively to his state criminal cases) and ordered to pay \$559,616 in restitution to Cargill. Bunn was sentenced to two years and three months in federal prison without parole and ordered to pay \$754,564 in restitution to Cargill. In a separate, but related case, Jeffrey Hobbs, 41, of Exeter, was sentenced on Nov. 21, 2013, to two years and eight months in federal prison without parole and ordered to pay \$2,334,180 in restitution to Cargill. Each of the three defendants will be held jointly and severally liable for the restitution payments.

Beisly pleaded guilty on August 6, 2013, to one count of wire fraud and one count of mail fraud. Bunn pleaded guilty on November 12, 2013, to two counts of mail fraud. Hobbs pleaded guilty on May 20, 2013, to one count of wire fraud.

Beisly and Bunn approached Hobbs in 2002 about creating fictitious scale tickets for non-delivered loads of corn as a way to make money and ultimately defraud Cargill. Hobbs began creating completely fictitious scale tickets for Beisly and Bunn for the delivery of loads of grain, corn or feed that did not truly exist.

Beisly owned and operated K&B Grain. Beisly obtained contracts with Cargill for the delivery of a set number of grain loads that were supposed to deliver grain, corn or another type of product to the Butterfield Feed Mill. Beisly admitted that he received numerous

fictitious scale tickets from Hobbs for deliveries that were never actually made. Beisly also admitted that at least once a week, he received a fictitious scale ticket from Hobbs that claimed he had delivered a shipment of grain to the Butterfield Feed Mill, when in truth and fact, no such shipment or delivery was made. Shortly after the fictitious scale tickets were created by Hobbs, Beisly received a payment from Cargill.

Bunn owned and operating RB Grain. Bunn was contracted through the Scoular Company to transport shipments of wheat, corn and grain to the Cargill Feed Mill in Butterfield. Bunn also admitted that he received numerous fictitious scale tickets from Hobbs for deliveries that were never actually made. Once Scoular received a payment from Cargill based on the submission of a fictitious scale ticket, Scoular issued a check to Bunn based on the delivery of wheat, corn or feed that was never delivered.

Hobbs initially received \$300 in kickbacks for each "ghost load," which was later increased to \$500 in cash for each "ghost load."

Cargill officials discovered the fraud when the amount of grain, corn or feed that was being paid for was inconsistent with the amount they actually received. Over a span of nine years, this fraud scheme caused losses to Cargill of approximately \$2 million.

The FBI assisted the Missouri Highway Patrol in the investigation, according to a news release.

## Filings close for August Primary

Voters in Barry County will have a few choices when it comes to their selections for the August 5, 2014, Primary Election. While many of the seats opening did not draw any opposition, the races for Prosecuting Attorney and Presiding Commissioner have taken interesting turns.

Scott Fitzpatrick, District 158 State Representative, is running unopposed for his seat in the State House of Representatives. This will be Fitzpatrick's second term.

Johnnie Cox, current Prosecuting Attorney for Barry County, is running unopposed for the Associate Circuit Judge for Division I, a position held by Victor Head. Cox announced his intention to run shortly after Head decided to retire instead of running for another term.

Robert "Bob" Foulke, incumbent for the Associate Circuit Judge Division II seat

is running unopposed. This will be Foulke's second term in office.

Incumbent Craig Williams is running unopposed for his seat as Circuit Clerk/ Recorder for the County. This will be Craig's fourth

Collector Janice Varner is also running unopposed for her fifth term in office. County Clerk Gary Youngblood was the only filer for his seat, as well. Youngblood will be serving his sixth term after being elected originally

To round out the unopposed races, Lois Lowe, County Treasurer, has no compeition for her seat. This will be Lowe's sixth term.

Two additional men are seeking the seat of Presiding Commissioner of Barry County, a position filled by Cherry Warren for the last five terms. Terry Burgess, a business owner from Seligman, and Eddie Davison, of Meeks Lumber in Shell Knob, have both officially filed for the Warren's seat. Warren has held the position of Presiding Commissioner since 1994.

After Cox announced his intention to run for Judge instead of seeking reelection as Prosecuting Attorney for a fourth term, J. Patrick Sulivan, the part-time Assistant Prosecuting Attorney for the County, threw his hat in the ring. However, Sullivan officially withdrew from the race last week. Three candidates are all vying to the position vacated by Cox. Steve J. Dunker, of Cassville, Mathew Thomas Weatherman, of Golden, and Amy Boxx, of Monett, all filed for

## Cassville District pushes for \$4M bond issue

In preparation for the upcoming April 8 General Election, the Cassville School District is working to educate voters on the need for the proposed \$4 million noincrease bond issue on the ballot.

Superintendent Richard Asbill stated, "Now is the time to act on this bond, and the Board has worked to en-

sure that things are in place for this to work for our District." The bond issue would allow the Cassville School District to take out a \$4 million bond to make renovations and improvements to the school buildings that have been postponed during the FEMA buildings con-

Asbill said, "The goals we've made are reasonable for us to attain, and all of the needs we've mentioned in the bond issue are needs that will have to be met in the near future. This would just make it on a better time table."

Some of the things that need renovations include an upgrade to the HVAC system in some of the buildings, new sidewalks, upgraded electri-


## **Barry County inmate** hangs himself in cell

A Barry County Jail inmate is dead after hanging himself in his cell on Monday evening. Arnolfo Quintana-Morales, age 58, was arrested following a traffic stop by Missouri State Highway Patrol Trooper Zach Bryan on Friday, March 21, around 6:30 p.m.

Quintana-Morales was found to be wanted on a drug smuggling warrant out of San Bernadino County, California, with a \$5 million cashonly bond. After being taken into custody, he appeared in Barry County Court on Monday, March 24, to sign a waiver of extradition so that he could be transported by California authorities. Later that evening, Quintana-Morales went into his cell during the time that inmates are allowed out of lock-down and hanged himself.

Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly was out of town attending the Sheriffs Conference, so Chief Deputy Leonard Collins and Detectives Doug Henry and Terry Meek were called to investigate the suicide. Collins stated, "He hadn't shown any indication that he was sui-

cidal or a danger. If we have a subject that we thought was going to harm themselves, we do a cell check every 15 minutes."

After Quintana-Morales was discovered, the area was secured by the Barry County Jail staff, notified 911 and called the Sheriff's deputies. Deputies Mike Moore and Scott Salkill performed CPR until first responders arrived on scene, but he was pronounced dead by Deputy Coroner Charlie McManus.

Quintana-Morales's autopsy was scheduled to be done on Tuesday, March 25, at 2 p.m., but the results were not available at the time of

#### Shell Knob teen charged with bomb possession felony

A teenager from Shell Knob, who is facing felony charges after he allegedly brought home a potential explosive device from Blue Eye High School two weeks ago, was released from jail after posting \$10,000 bond.

Stone County Prosecutor Matt Selby charged Clayton Scott Wells with unlawful possession, transport, manufacture, repair or sale of an illegal weapon for the incident which allegedly began at the school.

According to the probable cause statement, the boy's stepmother alerted Barry County authorities after the 17 year-old brought "incendiary" device home. Wells told his stepmother another student gave him the device and "she" was shown how to make it by another student.

Wells later admitted to lying and stated he received the device from another juvenile on the bus on the way to school. He told investigators that he stored the device in his backpack at school before he took it home.

Stone and Barry County Deputies, the Missouri State Fire Investigators Office, the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF), and the Springfield Bomb Squad all responded to Wells' Shell Knob residence.

The device was examined and deemed inert by the Springfield Bomb Squad, according to Stone County Sheriff Doug Rader.

Rader says investigators found two similar devices at two residences of juveniles, one in Stone County and another in Barry County. Those cases have been

turned over to juvenile authorities, according to Rad-

"Blue Eye High School has been cooperating during the entire investigation," said Rader. "They were not aware of any type of device at the school until they were notified by the Sheriff's Department."

Wells's attorney, Joe Passanise, successfully got his client's bond reduced last week. Judge Alan Blankenship ordered that Wells have no contact with the school district or staff, that he not possess any weapons, and undergo mental health assessment within two weeks.

Wells, who is also facing misdemeanor charges of making a false report, is scheduled to return to court on April 29.

## **County Commissioners hope to save Viney Creek**

With the news of the slated closure of Viney Creek Park on Table Rock planned, the Barry County Commissioners are hearing concerns from county residents about the issue.

As it stands, the Commissioners plan to do everything they can to keep the park open to the public, even if the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is unable to with recent funding cuts.

Viney Creek was tabbed for closure after the recreations budget was cut by \$500,000 for the year. Viney Creek is the least visited of Table Rock's 14 parks, taking in around \$13,000 less than what it costs to run the park each year, according to Laurie Driver, public affairs specialist for the Army Corps of Engineers.

Cherry Warren, Presiding Commissioner for Barry County, stated, "We would love to see the Corps keep it open, and we've been talking to them about that. It isn't final that the park will be closed." However, in the event that Viney Creek is closed, Warren says the Commissioners plan to do everything in their power to





### keep it open.

Warren stated, "We've had a lot of support from the Golden community in particular about keeping the park open if the Corps closes it." He went on, "We would prefer that the Corps keep it open, but we feel that if they don't, we owe it to the Golden and county residents to

the campgrounds there." The County has already contacted the Corps about their intent to lease it if the decision to close Viney Creek is finalized. Warren stated, "If Viney Creek is closed, the county is interested in leasing it from the Corps and then subleasing it to a con-

cessionaire. We already have some interested parties in a sublease agreement." Plans for how the lease/sublease agreement would work are in early planning stages and won't continue unless Viney Creek is officially closed.

Warren did say that the county would not be investing any revenue into running the park. He clarified, "The park would be self-sufficient, so county tax dollars would not be used."

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is required by their regulations to notify Indian Tribes, Federal agencies, state, county and/or local governments in the event that a park closes to establish if there is any interest in a lease-option for the park.

# ocal farmers harvest crop for clean energy

With so many pushing for cleaner energy and more green practices in farming and industry, there are ample opportunities for farmers to get involved in the growing trend. Gene and Alene Swadley own 70 acres of land just outside of Cassville. Two years ago, the Swadleys decided to try a new farming

plan; instead of raising cattle, they planted Giant Miscanthus, the plant that is converted into ethanol fuel.

Gene stated, "We were looking for something to make a little money without all of the labor that goes along with cattle." The Swadleys entered into a five-year contract with MFA Oil Biomass to raise the crop and a contract with the Farm Service Agency to plant it.

Alene said, "All we had to do was prepare the land. It just needed to be cleared and tilled." Then, MFA came out and planted the rhizomes, a four-inch root, on the land. Around 5,000 rhizomes are planted per acre. At that point, Gene said it takes care of itself. Gene stated, "We planted it the year we had the really bad drought, and it withstood it really well." The fields also have to be sprayed with a herbicide in the spring for weed control.

Alene stated, "It's so bitter that nothing likes to eat it, but we do have deer and rabbits lie in it to keep warm,

though." Gene added, "Even the grasshoppers left it alone during the drought."

The first year the crop grows, it cannot be harvested, but the second year and each year after, it is harvested after the stalks dry and all of the leaves fall off. The plant will grow to be up to 18 feet tall once fully mature. This year, the Swadleys' fields were around eight to ten feet

MFA Oil cut and baled the 70 acres. The Swadleys will keep the bales in their barn until it is ready to be sold, probably in June or July.

The bales of Giant Miscanthus will go on to be made into a variety of products, including ethanol gasoline. The stalks are also turned into pellets for wood stoves, chicken litter and particle board.



## Rare hawk rescued from Cassville garage

Last week, two local men got the chance to free a rare bird from a garage in Cassville. Gail Purves came home to a Cooper's Hawk resting in his garage. He promptly called Merle Rogers, 31-year retired employee of Roaring River State Park as a naturalist, to aid him in freeing the hawk from the building.

Purves originally thought the hawk was a Red-Tailed, but after more investigation, it was found to be a female Cooper's Hawk. They are known to be one of the bird world's most skillful fliers and are a common woodland bird. This type of hawk captures their prey from cover or while flying quickly through dense vegetation and striking smaller birds with their chest or catching with talons in order to capture prey.

Cooper's Hawks were, at one time, heavily hunted for preying on poultry. Now, the hawks are federally protected from hunting as a bird of prey, but they still face one imminent threat: the degradation and loss of habitat. Activities such as logging threaten the hawks' natural habitat and make it unsuitable for breeding.

"This specific type of bird is not common in the area, it's a rare sight. It was very unusual if I spotted one or two a year," stated Rogers of his time as a naturalist. He suspects the reason for the bird being in town relates to winter time bird feeding attracting the smaller birds that the Cooper's Hawk feeds

on. This then brings the hawk into town in order to hunt an abundance of prey.

Rogers arrived at the house to remove the bird from the garage. "At first, she was trying to get out of the garage, flying around everywhere. Then it would calm down and sit in the window," he stated. Eventually, Rogers was able to pick up the bird by its feet in order to protect its wings with safety gloves on. The bird wasn't injured in the rescue and flew away up into a tree once released. "It looked right at us once it was in the tree. Almost like it was saying, 'thank you," stated Rogers.

Rogers has experience rescuing many animals after working for Roaring River State Park over the years. "The most important part about rescuing a wild bird is making sure you're concerned about protecting the animal as well as yourself," he warns. He also advises to leave it to a professional. If someone finds a bird in danger or injured, it's suggested to contact your local conservation agent, the Nature Center at Roaring River to receive advice, or take it to the Animal Clinic in Monett. The clinic now has a federal permit that gives them permission to rehabilitate wild birds.

The Cooper's Hawk has been known to live as long as 12 years in the wild. With Rogers' help, this hawk will now have the chance to live out the rest of its years.

## Dogwoods could bloom early this year

With anything resembling normal weather, Missouri could see dogwood and redbud blossoms earlier than usual this year. But all bets are off if the thermometer continues the yo-yo behavior seen over the past month.

Nick Kuhn, forestry field programs supervisor for the Missouri Department of Conservation, says extremely cold weather can actually cause flowering trees to blossom earlier than they might under more normal condi-

"Nothing about this year's weather has been normal so far," says Kuhn, "but if things take a turn toward more average spring weather, we could start seeing redbud blossoms very soon, and dogwoods not far behind."

Serviceberry and redbuds typically start blooming in late March. Dogwood flowers typically open in mid-April, though the actual date in any given year can vary by as much as three weeks. Kuhn says he would not be surprised to see dogwoods blooming in early April this year if the weather remains average or warmer.

"The timing of tree flowering and green-up is affected to some degree by day length," says Kuhn, "similar to the behavior of many animals. But weather plays a pivotal role, too. Assuming there is no late cold snap, the rapid shift from late extreme cold to unseasonably warm weather is likely to speed up flowering and associated changes in all trees, not just dogwoods and redbuds."

Kuhn says accelerated blooming schedules also could shorten the time when spring breezes are laden with tree pollen, great news for allergy sufferers.

across much of Missouri are well on their way to recovering from the extremely stressful drought and heat of 2012. Missouri received more rain last year, and the summer was not nearly as hot as in 2012.

"If this year's summer weather is bad I would still only be somewhat concerned for tree health," he says. "If this year is not bad or even if it goes bad, in mid-August or later, trees that went into the summer healthy would get along pretty well."

He went on to say that landscape trees in parts of the state that experienced drought in both 2012 and

According to Kuhn, trees 2013 will need supplemental watering well into the summer months to regain their

"If they made it this long, they must be tough, so give them water and mulch, but do not fertilize other than low rate, slow-release fertilizer this spring."

Kuhn cautioned that high-nitrogen fertilizer, which typically is used on lawns, can cause excessively fast growth in trees. This rapid growth often can't be sustained in hot, dry weather, causing the trees to look poor later in the summer. Regular watering, deep soaking every two weeks, can prevent this.

and lighting projects. At March's School Board meeting, the Board heard Asbill discuss the possibility of an even better opportunity for the bond issue. Around \$2.1 million of the \$4 million total qualifies for a special zero-percent interest bond called the Qualified Zone Academy Bond (QZAB). This step would save the District substantial money during the bond repayment.

While the District isn't guaranteed to get all of the \$2.1 million as a QZAB (dependent on how many schools qualify), but they should know shortly after the April election how much they qualify for. The bond that the District hopes to get approved will be repaid over a 15-year period ideally. The interest rate won't be determined until the bond is sold, but Asbill said that rates are very low currently.

To determine the importance of the projects on the list of bond issues, Asbill said they had three rounds of surveys distributed to the administration, Board mem**BOND** from front page.

bers and staff. Asbill stated, "We're impacting students everyday with some of these issues. We've moved some things up in importance because they so greatly impact students, parents and teachers."

#### Washburn deals with water/sewer issues

At March's Washburn City Council meeting, the Utility Superintendent, James Libertus, reported on the previous week's sewer line smoke testing. The sewer lines need to be inspected every five years to be sure the lines are working and in safe condition. Smoke testing the lines is a common way to find leaks in houses or other areas where sewer lines might be located, such as fields.

Many leaks were found during the test and pipes were replaced or suggested to be replaced. One pipe that was broken in a field outside of Southwest Schools by the lagoon was replaced and a dried out trap in a residence was also repaired. In order to keep the community safe from broken sewer lines, the issues must be found and immediately fixed. If not, greater issues can occur, such as a trap getting dried out, which allows air into the line causing sewer odors to leak out.

A yearly regular maintenance is scheduled, rotating line checks around town. It

is important for the City to check the pipes because leaks can lead to rainfall going into pipes and causing more damage. The rain infiltration leads to safety issues because when the rain water enters the pipes, it makes the sewer system work harder as there are no storm sewers in Washburn to deal with the overflow. The City budget for repairs is from the sewer fund and the general allowance for all repairs is \$9,950 per year.

Another issue brought up during the meeting was concern about the water towers located in Washburn. There are currently two water towers in use set up on a balance system in order to maintain water supplies in the town. The system is set up where the two towers take care of water usage in different parts of town, separated by the railroad tracks. It was also adjusted where the new water tower, that holds more, would run more often in order to prevent it from becoming stagnant.

During the month of February, water tower two was out of commission for eight days. The first tower was then operating on its own for that time. Later, tower two kicked back on by itself because of the balance system. The city is still investigating why one tower was not running for eight days.



ing able to ensure the safety and well-being of children in the 39th District even though I had to make decisions that could have affected families for the rest of their lives," stated Cooper.

"I liked knowing that the child would be well taken care of and have the family that every child deserves," he states.

The biggest changes Cooper witnessed during his career were advances in technology and an increase of paperwork. He also noted stricter laws that governed children in care. "Most people don't realize the number of physical and sexual abuse cases that occur in our communities and surrounding communities," stated Cooper about his time in the field. For those interested in joining this field of work, he advises them to be prepared for changes that they would never expect to encounter.

Cooper attributes many people for the positive influence on his career, such as: William H. Pennell, J. Edward Sweeney, Craig Williams, and, last of all, his wife, Mary. "My loving wife has been through all the trials and hardships that all law enforcement spouses have to endure and being in my life for the past 45 plus years," Cooper reflected.

The Barry County Health Department will be able to offer more vaccine choices and save on personnel with a new contract they've entered

The BCHD Board voted in January to sign an agreement with VaxCare to simplify the billing and ordering processes of the vaccines offered by the clinics. VaxCare offers the needles and vaccines for a variety of immunizations in a more manageable way to decrease the amount of time spent on billing Medicare and insurance.

Through VaxCare, the clinics will be able to order the vaccines they need and have them delivered just as they have been in recent years. However, it'll pop up instantly on the computer system whether or not that immunization particular is covered by a patient's insurance, and VaxCare is responsible for billing, not the Health Department staff. That helps by cutting the amount of clerical work the staff will be responsible for, an important advantage, especially during flu season.

According to Roger Brock, Barry County Health Department Administrator, "It will definitely cut down on personnel issues, but also cash flow so that we don't have to invest \$30,000 to \$40,000 up front on vaccines." VaxCare also takes back any unused

Carol Landstad, Public Health Programs Coordinator, spoke with other counties who have implemented VaxCare before suggesting it as a viable option to the Barry County Health Board. According to Landstad, Newton, Taney and Jasper counties all use the company and have had success in their clinics with it.

With the new agreement, the clinics will now be able to offer a pneumonia shot along with the influenza shot. Even with VaxCare providing the vaccines, the clinics will still be able to offer the four-strain flu shot as opposed to the three-strain that most clinics and offices offer. The 2013 flu season was the first year that the clinics offered the fourstrain version, and that was not something that the health board members wanted to sacrifice with the switch.

On the financial side of the agreement, the Barry County Health Department receives \$10 from each immunization, and VaxCare receives the rest

BC Health Dept. makes vaccine switch to cover vaccines cost, supplies and billing. Prior to the VaxCare agreement, the clinics still received the \$10 administration fee, but different reimbursements varied by vaccine. Brock stated, "Most of the time, the insurance we billed paid for the vaccine cost and the \$10 administration fee; some were a bit more, but some were a bit less." The Health Board anticipates that the financial benefit will be about even when taking into account the new pneumonia vaccines available in the upcoming flu season. Financial constraints prevented the clinics from offering it unless it was specifically ordered on an individual basis in prior

Initially, the Health Board members were hesitant to enter into a contract, but Brock stated, "The VaxCare contract allows either party to get out of it with 30 days notice, so if it doesn't work out, we aren't locked in for long."

Eight different vaccines will be provided through VaxCare, including the influenza and pneumonia immunizations. Vaccines for Children, a government subsidized immunization program, will not be included in the new agreement.

## Check scheme strikes close to home

A Purdy woman almost fell victim to a check cashing scheme after responding

to a job posting targeting the area. Barbara James, Purdy, recently responded to a local Craigslist ad for a personal assistant position. Everything seemed to be in order with the man, Harry Deeds, asking standard employ-

ment-based questions. The position in question involved purchasing and holding goods in a storage unit to ship to various vendors for a company based out of China. James was asked to find out the cost of a local 5 by 5 foot storage unit rental for five months. At first, everything seemed to be in order for the position, but once money was involved, James saw red flags.

James stated, "I was supposed to use [the money] to purchase fabrics for his clients in America and store it in a storage unit until it was to be delivered."

Deeds wanted her to get a credit union account and share with him the login information so that he could monitor how she was spending the money he sent. When James was ineligible for the account he wanted her to get, he attempted to get her to share her PayPal account information, which she refused. He finally opted to send her a cashier's check instead.

James received the \$35,500 check via FedEx. According to James, "He wanted me to deposit it in my account and immediately withdraw as much as I could, and if it was less than half and would take more than 48 hours to clear, I should 'demand they give me half of it now' so I could send it to the company so they could get started on work."


Instead of cashing the check, James opted to check into the companies supposedly involved in the deals she was to coordinate. While everything checked out with those businesses, something still didn't seem right. James

showed the check to a friend in law enforcement and contacted the bank that had issued the cashier's check.

When James wasn't returning calls to Deeds, his demeanor changed drastically. James stated, "The next day, the man kept texting and calling because I did not answer his text or calls. He even threatened to report me if I didn't respond."

When James contacted the issuing bank, Canon National Bank out of Canon City, Colorado, the woman assured her that the check was fraudulent. The bank has been dealing with the issue in their area for a few months, but recently, it was popping up in other states. The day that James called, four other people had contacted the bank about it.

"It's a shame that people desperate for a job are being targeted with this scam," James stated. The bank assured James that they are working to pursue the perpetrators of the crime.
