Aurora man accused of Kansas City shootings

Frazier Glenn Cross has long been a controversial figure in southwest Missouri. He blanketed southwest Missouri in the 2000's with a newspaper he operated that spewed hate filled rants against Jews and people of color.

Cross was also known as Glenn Miller to many due to a name change as being part of the Witness Protection Program since the 1990s, according to court documents.

Cross/Miller, who lives between Aurora and Marionville, is the former head of the KKK and is known throughout the Ozarks as Glenn Miller. He faces three counts of murder after he allegedly opened fire at the Jewish Community Center and a Jewish run assisted living center near Kansas City on the eve of Passover.

It appears federal murder charges will be filed against the 73 year-old man as federal prosecutors say they are pursuing the matter as a religiously motivated “hate crime.”

Those charges would apply if the murders Cross/Miller is accused of were motivated by the victims’ “race, color, religion or national origin.”

The Jewish Community Center was a hub of activity

on Sunday as rehearsals for a performance of “To Kill A Mockingbird” were scheduled and auditions for “KC Superstar,” an American Idol type competition to find the best high school singer in the Kansas City area, were set to begin.

William Corporon, 69, had driven his 17 year-old grandson, Reat Underwood, to the center to audition for the singing competition. They died after they were ambushed in the parking lot. They were both Methodist.

Two other people that Cross/Miller shot at were not injured.

After shooting Corporon and Underwood, Cross/Miller then went to the Village Shalom Senior Living Facility, where he shot and killed Terri Hastings LaManno who was going to visit her

Marple sworn in on Cassville City Council

At Monday's Cassville City Council meeting, the aldermen and city said goodbye to Darrell Ledenham, the North Ward Alderman. Ledenham gave his seat to newly elected Jerry Marple, the write-in candidate with the most votes in April 8's election. Ledenham was not seeking reelection.

The Council presented Ledenham with a plaque for his service to the City and his name plaque from the Council Chambers. Marple was sworn in shortly thereafter by Deputy Clerk Jennifer Evans.

The Council addressed other issues during the meeting, including renewing their contract with MDC of Monett, a technology company. MDC currently provides the computers, monitors, printers and battery back-ups for all of the Cassville City equipment on a lease-option.

The new contract signed with MDC will also include the City's server for next three years and save the City around \$1,800 over that time period. The cited advantage to the lease-option for the City equipment is that there are no unforeseen technology costs for replacements or upgrades.

Instead, the City has a set budget for the lease with MDC with the company Lenovo and all equipment comes with a three-year warranty.

The City also made ordinance changes, including updating the water leak code to the previously discussed changes.

Farmers' Market returns to the square this Saturday

After a five-month break, the Garden Sass Farmers' Market Association is returning to the square in downtown Cassville on Saturdays. The farmers, crafters and bakers will bring their wares each Saturday beginning April 19 from 8 a.m. until noon each week.

According to Garden Sass Interim President Steven Burcham, the farmers group gained a few members this year with most of the previous vendors returning as well. This early in the season, shoppers can expect plenty of canned goods, bakery items, and a few cold weather crop produce selections like greens. Produce will pick up significantly in the coming weeks. Craft vendors will also have a variety of options to choose from, as well.

Garden Sass is the longest running farmers market in Barry County. The association has been running since

Part of the drive to support local events this year is Garden Sass's pairing with the Cassville Main Street Association. Burcham stated, “We are encouraging people to shop local, not just with

their food, but also with other shops around the square.”



Increased tax revenue for County in March

For the month of March, Barry County received a significant increase in sales tax revenue for the month. This year, March's 1/2 cent general revenue tax resulted in \$158,198.06 for the county. The total was \$19,575.47 over March 2013's revenue. The county's overall general revenue tax is up 5.99 percent for 2014 over 2013 after a slow start in January.

The County's relatively new 1/8 cent tax increase that went into effect in October 2013 also jumped for the month compared to previous months. Each full month that the 1/8 cent tax has been collected, revenue has hovered between approximately \$30,000 and \$34,000 monthly. For March, that total rose to \$37,519.80 collected.

While the County re-

ceived a big increase in revenue over last year, the City of Cassville's tax remained stable when compared to last year's figures. The total taxes collected for the City is equal to two cents and was up a little less than one percent from last year. For the month of March, Cassville collected \$137,340.76 in total for the month. That was just a little over \$1,000 more than March 2013.

The City of Cassville will see more revenue beginning in October when the new 3/8 cent transportation tax passed by voters at April 8th's General Municipal Election goes into effect. The transportation tax funds will not come into major play for the City's budget until 2015 after funds have been collected for a couple months.

Exeter Council turns down bar in city

The Exeter City Council was approached in March by a resident appealing a city wide ordinance against the consumption of liquor on any premises.

Walter Berry, of Exeter, was considering opening up a bar and restaurant on East Commercial Street. Exeter has not hosted a bar within city limits for over 50 years.

The ordinance states that the City of Exeter may only issue one liquor license per 500 residents. It also prohibits any establishment from selling alcohol that is not packaged and sealed. The town hosts 700 residents, and one liquor license is already issued to L&L Stop

and Shop.

It was possible for Berry to open the business outside of city limits. However, he voiced his concern about staying in city limits in order to generate tax revenue. The establishment would have also needed to make \$250,000 per year according to a Missouri state statute for bars that serve food.

If the council were to approve a liquor license for Berry, he would then have to pass through additional limitations presented by the town.

Many citizens and aldermen and women voiced concerns about having a bar in town. Many shared personal opinions of the bar causing

issues for the area.

The discussion was brought up again in the April 9th City Council meeting, where the council decided to let the ordinance stand as is. Berry will not be receiving a liquor license for the city limits of Exeter which could lead to a revision in plans for the business.

mother. She was Catholic.

Last week, the Anti-Defamation League said it warned of the increased possibility of violent attacks against community centers in the coming weeks, "which coincide both with the Passover holiday and Hitler's birthday on April 20, a day around which in the United States has historically been marked by extremist acts of violence and terrorism."

Police in Overland Park say Miller is the founder and former Grand Dragon of the Carolina Knights of the Ku Klux Klan and the White Patriot Party. Both organizations operated as paramilitary groups in the 1980s, according to the Southern Poverty Law Center, which monitors hate groups.

The Center, which has kept tabs on Cross/Miller for several years, says he spent time in federal prison for plotting to kill the founder of the center and for planning various robberies.

In 2010, Cross/Miller ran for the U.S. Senate for Missouri as a write-in candidate. He released several hate-filled commercials in Missouri that the Missouri Broadcasters Association found offensive.

The FCC sided with the Missouri Broadcasters Association and said broadcast media outlets did not have to run the ads.

Cross/Miller's son, Jesse Miller, was involved in a shootout with police that led to his death on March 28, 2008. Jesse Miller was involved in an accident with Joseph Rich near Marionville. When Rich stopped, Miller gunned him down. Jesse Miller then shot Marionville Police Officer Andy Clark, who returned fire killing Miller. Clark suffered a shoulder wound in the shootout.

Miller is being held on a \$10,000,000 bond. If Miller is convicted of a hate crime, under federal law, prosecutors could pursue the death penalty.



Campbell commits suicide following perjury charges

The woman charged with lying to a Taney County grand jury about her involvement in the double homicide of Becky and Rusty Porter has committed suicide in her Purdy home.

Perjury charges were filed against 59 year-old Carolyn Campbell on Tuesday, one day after Windy Friend was found guilty of two counts of first-degree murder for her part in the couple's deaths.

Court documents say Carolyn Campbell lied about her knowledge of a stolen tractor that was found on property owned by her and husband of 35 years, Robert Campbell, who is facing two counts of first-degree murder for the Porters' deaths.

They also say she lied about contact with her nephew, Phillip Friend, who has pleaded guilty to second-degree murder for his part in the Porters murder for hire.

Taney County prosecutor Jeff Merrell says Robert Campbell offered his brother-in-law, Tony Friend (Phillip's father), \$100,000 "for two birthdays."

Campbell was released from the Taney County Jail at 2:30 p.m. on April 2, 2014.

Barry County Chief Deputy Leonard Collins said Willard Taylor found his mother "unresponsive" in her Purdy home about 10:30 a.m. "She left a suicide note," he said.

Her body, which had no visible wounds, according to Collins, has been sent to Southwest Missouri Forensics in Springfield for autopsy.

Tony Friend pleaded guilty to two counts of first-degree murder and is serving two life without parole sentences.

Dusty Hicks, the Friends' cousin, will be tried for his part in the slaying in August.

Robert Campbell, Carolyn's husband, is scheduled to stand trial in October.

Windy Friend will be sentenced to two life without parole sentences on June 12.


10 years ago

Reeds Spring claims 10-8 victory over Cassville

The Reeds Spring Wolves scored five late runs to earn a 10-8 comeback victory at Cassville on Friday, April 11. With two outs in the pivotal sixth inning, Ryan Tinnes teed off on a Noah Hadlow fastball for a 2 RBI double to give the Wolves the lead and ultimately the game.

It was a disappointing loss for the Wildcats.

After spotting the visitors a 4-0 lead, Cassville scored six runs in the bottom of the second inning, chasing starter Joe Studer in the process. Thirteen Wildcats batted in the inning, and the shift in momentum was obvious.

Marcus Weatherman led off with a single to left, Chase Jackson stroked a single to center, and Hadlow walked to load the bases with just one out. Andrew Whitham's single sent Weatherman

home for the first Wildcat run.

With two outs, Alex Dyer's single found the gap between center and left to score a pair of runs. Then Brady Blissard's routine ground ball filled the bases again when Dyer outran the Reeds Spring shortstop to second base.

Ty Craig took advantage of the fielding lapse, ripping a 3-2 fastball for a single as two more runs scored to give Cassville a 5-4 lead. Weatherman's hard grounder forced an error, and then Jackson walked as the lead grew to 7-4.

Noah Cherry came on in relief of Studer with two outs and the bases loaded, and the big lefty coaxed an inning-ending 5-3 groundout off the bat of Hadlow.

Hadlow relieved Whitham to start the third

inning, and he and Cherry turned the scoring rampage into a pitching duel in the middle innings. The Wildcats stretched the lead to 8-5 when Craig popped a two-out RBI single to plate Whitham.

The score remained 8-5 until the Wolves erupted to take the lead. Trailing by two runs, the Wildcats had a chance to answer in the bottom of the sixth. Weatherman led off with a single, and Alex Vanderpool drew a one-out walk to bring the lead run to the plate.

Reeds Spring brought on yet another left-hander in relief, as Jake Wright replaced Cherry on the mound to face Hadlow in a critical situation. Noah's at bat was scuttled when he lined out sharply to third, and then the whole ark sank when Weatherman was doubled off retreating to second base.

The Wildcats had one more chance in the bottom of the seventh and final inning. Whitham led off with a weak dribbler that died in the in-field grass, and the tying run came to the plate. But Wright struck out Jordan Fisher, and then Dyer hit into a force that saw Weatherman erased to record the second out.

Wright's rally-killing

strikeout of Blisard ended the game, and the Wolves chalked up a 10-8 road victory.

Cassville slipped to below .500 on the season. Losing to Republic and Reeds Spring in the same week saw the Wildcats emerge with a 5-6 overall record.

"Reeds Spring never stopped playing and we couldn't answer," Kyle Wood said of the Friday loss. "We had seven errors and ended up losing by just two runs. I feel like if we score eight runs, we should always win."

The Wildcats start conference play this week with games against Lamar and Carl Junction.

"We can't let one bad game ruin the next week for us," said Wood. "Baseball is such a fast-moving season that you can't linger too long on the good or the bad. We just have to try to control what we can take care of and keep getting better."

Group hopes to save native Chinquapin

The highly regarded Ozark Chinquapin was brought to the attention of landowners, conservationists, state and federal employees on Friday at the Emory Melton Inn and Conference Center located in Roaring River State Park. In hopes to raise awareness about the tree in Barry County, recollections of the Ozark Chinquapin tree and accomplishments in replenishing the species were discussed.

The large Chinquapin trees once covered a large portion of the Ozarks. It was once drought tolerant, grew to heights of 65 feet and two to three feet in diameter on acidic dry rocky soils on hill-tops and slopes. The trees also produced a bounty of nuts every year without fail. It was sought out as a food source for not only animals, but many Barry County residents.

Many locals shared their fond memories of the trees and stuffing their pockets full of nuts. One father even attributes the tree to saving his kids' lives who had been infected with whooping cough. He brewed the leaves of the tree into a tea to soothe their ails.

Logging originally affected the population of the Ozark Chinquapin before they were later taken over by the chestnut blight which is a plant disease caused by the fungus Cryphonectria parasitica. The chinquapin was nearly wiped out and mostly blighted stumps remained of the Ozark tree, with the number of surviving stumps continuing to shrink.

The Ozark Chinquapin Foundation has been working to restore the tree to its native range. "We have a partnership with state parks in order to spread information

on the blighted chinquapin," stated Steve Bost, a naturalist at Montauk State Park and founder of the Ozark Chinquapin Foundation. Bost heard about the tree in the late 1990's. "I was told by many experts that I was wasting my time. We've come a long way since then, currently working with 37 trees that have shown some sort of resistance to the blight," stated Bost.

Bost began a journey in order to cross-pollinate and fight against the blight hoping to one day breed a tree resistant to the disease. His goals include restoring the tree to its native range, establishing a viable seed base, developing a 100 percent pure Ozark chinquapin that is disease-resistant, and to raise public awareness.

Bost planted many Ozark Chinquapin trees in front of the Ozark Chinquapin Foundation building in Roaring River State Park. Each seed was taken from a tree that showed resistance to the blight and was replanted in hopes to carry on a full life without being infected.




