New Creations Ministry gives women new lease on life

Sometimes what it takes for addiction recovery is a second chance and a little help from people who care. That is the basis for a new Christian-focused group home that opened in Exeter this month.

The house, called New Creations Women's Ministry, is an outreach of the ministry of the Calvary Chapel in Monett, and is spearheaded by Kelly Horner-Barnes. Barnes opened the house on April 1 after serving in the Barry County Jail ministry on Wednesday nights for 8 1/2 years.

Barnes stated, "Since I've been going in the jail to have church with the inmates, I've been so aware of the need, but I hadn't been in the position to help." However, on March 19,

Barnes says that God told her that it was time.

New Creations is a group home that can facilitate four women living there at a time. While there are no requirements to enroll in their program, they do have to be willing to participate and work toward addiction recovery. The home is managed by two women who turned their lives around after addiction by focusing on Christ. Becca White and Rebecca Chaddock each understand what the women living there are going through, which helps them to minister to their individual needs. White stated, "God's brought me up from where I was at, and I'm very thankful for that." That reasoning is why the women want to help others in their addiction recovery

The home has 24/7 staff and gives women a place to live, but also transports them to court dates, helps them get jobs and takes them to church. Barnes stated, "We are the only women's ministry that I'm aware of that doesn't require money up front. Once the ladies get jobs and start building their nest egg, they

will pay for their own ex-

penses."

The goal for each woman transitioning through the three to six month program is to cover their living expenses, have a job with benefits and build up savings to be able to cover a security

New owners Destiny and Trenton Vanzandt are eager to take over the shop and make it their own. Destiny currently works at Commerce Bank and is a 2010 Cassville High School graduate. She'll be operating the shop on her own to start. Trenton works in Exeter.

Patti shared, "I think this is going to be really great. I hope all of our old customers continue to do their business here and they get new customers, as well. It's worked out for the best. It's good for us and good for Destiny."

She continued, "We've had the store for 34 years after the Fannings had it for 34 years before us, and I hope that Destiny continues for 34 or more years."

The clothing store now known as Smith's dates back to the 1920s when it was owned by Harry Windes and his son, Russell. After many years in business, the shop was sold to a Eureka Springs, Ark., business man named Digby Walker who hired Carl and Naomi Fanning to manage it after World War II. The Fannings eventually bought Walker out in the 1960's before selling to the Smiths in 1980.

Continuing on with the local shop, the store will undergo a few changes for Destiny to make it her own. The Vanzandts will be closing the shop for a few days to make some of those changes before reopening on Saturday, May 3, for the Dogwood Car Show under the new name: Destiny's Clothing.

Destiny stated, "We'll be rearranging and eventually painting. I just want to put my own twist on the shop. We've got a couple new styles coming in for the opening, as well." For now, the plans are to keep the changes small, but Destiny has big plans for the store in the long term. She stated, "We'd like to carry a larger range of inventory and eventually carry another men's line or two. We're really excited and honored to take over a really well-managed shop in town."

Destiny's Clothing will be open on Saturday, May 3, from 9 a.m. until 3:30 p.m. The regular hours beginning Monday, May 5, will be Monday through Friday from 10 a.m. until 5:30 p.m. and Saturdays from 10 a.m. until 3:30 p.m.

Perryman pleads guilty to stolen property charges Charlea Mills

Howard Lee Perryman, 64, of Monett, pled guilty on Tuesday to three counts of receiving stolen property and one count of tampering from charges originating in 2010. According to Barry County Prosecuting Attorney Johnnie Cox, Perryman's attorney entered a guilty plea as the selected jurors were being sworn in.

Perryman is infamous in southwest Missouri for a variety of convicted and alleged crimes, including cattle thefts in other counties. Cox stated, "Perryman is one of the biggest thieves in southwest Missouri. He's like a one-man crime ring." Perryman's guilty plea was not part of a deal offered by the Prosecuting Attorney's office.

According to court documents, Perryman has over 20 convictions for various offenses and has pending charges in a variety of counties in Missouri stemming from alleged vehicle, tractor and livestock thefts in Green, Dade, Jasper, Lawrence and Barry counties. The totals for the thefts in the varying counties is hundreds of thousands of dollars.

In Tuesday's proceedings,

the tampering and receiving stolen property charges that Perryman pled guilty to stem from four different tractors and a skid steer.

In Barry County, Perryman still has two pending Barry County cases for class C felony receiving stolen property and class C felony stealing of property less than \$25,000. Each of those charges is related to livestock theft and a stolen pickup in 2013.

Investigators tied Perryman to the various thefts after pulling DNA evidence from a paper towel and clothing at various crime scenes.

Perryman is currently being held in the Barry County Jail awaiting a sentencing hearing on June 17 at 9 a.m.

Amy Burton-Liggett says This event will be held her son, Kaden, has a mood disorder which requires him to take medication and to see a counselor. She says she has had to restrain the behaviorally-challenged boy

in the past and was called by the school last week and told Kaden had been restrained by a counselor.

Accord-

ing to Burton-Liggett, school officials told her that Kaden had suffered a rug burn in the incident, but the mother says she was unprepared for got off the bus that afternoon.

Burton-Liggett says Kaden had a rug burn at the top of his head that extended down around his eyes and mouth. His gums were even bruised, she said.

Kaden told his mom that after he acted out in school, the male school counselor pushed him to the floor, put his knee on his back and held his hands behind his back to restrain him. The little boy said it was hard for him to breathe during the incident.

The counselor allegedly told Burton-Liggett that he did not put his knee on her son's back, and he got the rug burn from resisting attempts to bring him under control.

Burton-Liggett someone on her Facebook friends list made a hotline call to the state Children's Division after she posted pictures of Kaden's injuries on the social media website.

The Missouri Department of Social Services has not confirmed whether it is investigating the incident. However, Burton-Ligget says an investigator from the state is scheduled to interview she and Kaden on April 30 "to get Kaden's and I side of the story. Then she is going to investigate the counselor, and then she will let me know what happens from there."

"Kaden is scared to go to school because he feels unsafe," said Burton-Ligget. "I will be looking into homeschooling him most likely."

When contacted for a

comment, Purdy School District superintendent Dr.

Steven Chancellor issued the following statement: "We are aware of a situation in which a student received a rug burn during a student restraint and are looking into the situation to determine if it was handled properly. We take reports such as this seriously and have began a review pro-

According to Chancellor, specific staff members of the Purdy School District are trained on safe restraints to use on students who are in danger of hurting themselves or others. The district plans to make a more substantial statement once they get approval to do so.







Passenger train rides returning to County

Passenger trains return to Barry County after a 50 year gap for one of the National Railway Historical Society (NRHS) Conventions. Half a century has passed since the last Frisco Railway passenger train journeyed through Barry County, but residents can once again experience the train ride during the weekend of June 14 through 15.

NRHS will operate a series of charter passenger trains from the headquarters of the Arkansas and Missouri Railroad in Springdale, Ark. Two of the trains will be touring Barry County, a Saturday trip to Monett and a Sunday trip to Butterfield.

Those attending the train ride will also experience the passage of a special Amtrak Exhibit Train that will be displayed at the convention. The exhibit will be open for free tours on Saturday, June 14, and Sunday, June 15, next to the Springdale passenger station of the A&M Railroad. The exhibit hours are 10 a.m. until 4 p.m. both days.

"This weekend is a unique opportunity for residents of Barry County to ride a train through their home towns and to participate in a historic event hosted by Amtrak," said Barton Jennings, convention chair. "Each year we select a unique railroad community

for our convention, and this year, residents can join us in riding the rails of northwest Arkansas and southwest Missouri."

NRHS was founded in 1935 and preserves and raises awareness for America's threatened railroad heritage. The organization operates historic rail excursions and tours throughout North America and supports nearly 140 regional chapters. NRHS is a non-profit organization and has awarded nearly \$600,000 in railroad preservation grants since 1991. They also sponsor RailCamp, which is a summer orientation program offering high school youth hands-on experience in the railroad industry.

The Saturday, June 14, trip to Monett is the final official event of the NRHS convention and only a few tickets are still available online at http://www.nrhs. com/2014_Convention but are only available for members. The trip designed for non-members is the shorter Sunday, June 15, trip from Springdale and Butterfield. 



The Southwest Trojans clinched the Ozark 7 Conference baseball championship with a 10-8 decision over the visiting Purdy Eagles on Wednesday, April 23.

No surprise that the conference championship was decided in a late season collision between these two schools. The last six Ozark 7 titles belong to the Trojans and the Eagles. Southwest went back-to-back in 2008-2009 and Purdy had claimed the four-peat from 2010-

The real human interest story was that Purdy was even in the conference race. Josh Hughes saw six seniors graduate from last year's squad, and his young team dropped the first four games of this season. But Purdy came together as a unit as the campaign progressed. The young Eagles were ready to fight for a title when they stormed off the bus at Washburn to face the experienced and talent-laden Trojans.

Jamason Hartin picked up the win for Southwest, pitching better than the score might indicate. Hartin battled control problems and an opportunistic Purdy offense that just refused to go away. Nathan Young relieved Hartin in the seventh inning for the final two outs. Alex Mareth took the loss for Purdy.

MVP candidate Chad Oxford keyed the Southwest offense with a pair of doubles, and the Trojans came up with big plays in the field at the game's most crucial moments.

The Eagles jumped to a quick 2-0 lead in the top of the first inning, and should have had more. Hartin faced eight batters, walked four, and saw three more reach base on errors. But only Brent Cornman and Reese Veith touched home plate, as Hartin came up with backto-back strikeouts to end the

"We were blessed to have only given up two runs there," said Southwest's Kenny Ferguson. "The boys had a lot of nerves that first inning, they knew the conference championship was on the line. When I went out in the first inning and pulled them all in to talk, I just told them to breath, and actually made them take deep slow breaths to calm down. I told them to relax because we were going to score."
