New Creations Ministry gives women new lease on life

Sometimes what it takes for addiction recovery is a second chance and a little help from people who care. That is the basis for a new Christian-focused group home that opened in Exeter this month.

The house, called New Creations Women's Ministry, is an outreach of the ministry of the Calvary Chapel in Monett, and is spearheaded by Kelly Horner-Barnes. Barnes opened the house on April 1 after serving in the Barry County Jail ministry on Wednesday nights for 8 1/2 years.

Barnes stated, "Since I've been going in the jail to have church with the inmates, I've been so aware of the need, but I hadn't been in the position to help." However, on March 19,

Barnes says that God told her that it was time.

New Creations is a group home that can facilitate four women living there at a time. While there are no requirements to enroll in their program, they do have to be willing to participate and work toward addiction recovery. The home is managed by two women who turned their lives around after addiction by focusing on Christ. Becca White and Rebecca Chaddock each understand what the women living there are going through, which helps them to minister to their individual needs. White stated, "God's brought me up from where I was at, and I'm very thankful for that." That reasoning is why the women want to help others in their addiction recovery

journeys.

The home has 24/7 staff and gives women a place to live, but also transports

them to court dates, helps them get jobs and takes them to church. Barnes stated, "We are the only women's ministry that I'm aware of that doesn't require money up front. Once the ladies get jobs and start building their nest egg, they will pay for their own ex-

penses."

The goal for each woman transitioning through the three to six month program is to cover their living expenses, have a job with benefits and build up savings to be able to cover a security

Smith's changes hands after 34 years

After 34 years, Patti Smith, of Smith's Clothing Store, is passing on the keys to new owners. Patti and her husband, Mark, will turn the store over to new owners on May 1.

Patti stated, "I've worked six days a week for 34 years; that's a long time. It's time for someone else to come in younger with new perspective." Patti plans to spend her time off vacationing and seeing her two-month old grandson. She stated, "This new grandbaby really changed my perspective. I couldn't get off at 3 p.m. on a Saturday and make the 4 1/2 hour drive to visit and then come home Sunday. We've only had three vacations in 34 years. It was time to go."

New owners Destiny and Trenton Vanzandt are eager to take over the shop and make it their own. Destiny currently works at Commerce Bank and is a 2010 Cassville High School graduate. She'll be operating the shop on her own to start. Trenton works in Exeter.

Patti shared, "I think this is going to be really great. I hope all of our old customers continue to do their business here and they get new customers, as well. It's worked out for the best. It's good for us and good for Destiny."

She continued, "We've had the store for 34 years after the Fannings had it for 34 years before us, and I hope that Destiny continues for 34 or more years."

The clothing store now known as Smith's dates back to the 1920s when it was owned by Harry Windes and his son, Russell. After many years in business, the shop was sold to a Eureka Springs, Ark., business man named Digby Walker who hired Carl and Naomi Fanning to manage it after World War II. The Fannings eventually bought Walker out in the 1960's before selling to the Smiths in 1980.

Continuing on with the local shop, the store will undergo a few changes for Destiny to make it her own. The Vanzandts will be closing the shop for a few days to make some of those changes before reopening on Saturday, May 3, for the Dogwood Car Show under the new name: Destiny's Clothing.

Destiny stated, "We'll be rearranging and eventually painting. I just want to put my own twist on the shop. We've got a couple new styles coming in for the opening, as well." For now, the plans are to keep the changes small, but Destiny has big plans for the store in the long term. She stated, "We'd like to carry a larger range of inventory and eventually carry another men's line or two. We're really excited and honored to take over a really well-managed shop in town."

Destiny's Clothing will be open on Saturday, May 3, from 9 a.m. until 3:30 p.m. The regular hours beginning Monday, May 5, will be Monday through Friday from 10 a.m. until 5:30 p.m. and Saturdays from 10 a.m. until 3:30 p.m.

Perryman pleads guilty to stolen property charges

Howard Lee Perryman, 64, of Monett, pled guilty on Tuesday to three counts of receiving stolen property and one count of tampering from charges originating in 2010. According to Barry County Prosecuting Attorney Johnnie Cox, Perryman's attorney entered a guilty plea as the selected jurors were being sworn in.

Perryman is infamous in southwest Missouri for a variety of convicted and alleged crimes, including cattle thefts in other counties. Cox stated, "Perryman is one of the biggest thieves in southwest Missouri. He's like a one-man crime ring." Perryman's guilty plea was not part of a deal offered by the Prosecuting Attorney's office.

According to court documents, Perryman has over 20 convictions for various offenses and has pending charges in a variety of counties in Missouri stemming from alleged vehicle, tractor and livestock thefts in Green, Dade, Jasper, Lawrence and Barry counties. The totals for the thefts in the varying counties is hundreds of thousands of dollars.

In Tuesday's proceedings,

the tampering and receiving stolen property charges that Perryman pled guilty to stem from four different tractors and a skid steer.

In Barry County, Perryman still has two pending Barry County cases for class C felony receiving stolen property and class C felony stealing of property less than \$25,000. Each of those charges is related to livestock theft and a stolen pickup in 2013.

Investigators tied Perryman to the various thefts after pulling DNA evidence from a paper towel and clothing at various crime scenes.

Perryman is currently being held in the Barry County Jail awaiting a sentencing hearing on June 17 at 9 a.m.

Purdy Elementary student allegedly injured by counselor

A nine year-old boy from Purdy is recovering from injuries he allegedly received from his school counselor last Friday, April 25.

Amy Burton-Liggett says her son, Kaden, has a mood disorder which requires him to take medication and to see a counselor. She says she has had to restrain the behaviorally-challenged boy

in the past and was called by the school last week and told Kaden had been restrained by a counselor.

According to Burton-Liggett, school officials told her that Kaden had suffered a rug burn in the incident, but the mother says she was unprepared for what she saw when her son got off the bus that afternoon.

Burton-Liggett says Kaden had a rug burn at the top of his head that extended down around his eyes and mouth. His gums were even bruised, she said.

Kaden told his mom that after he acted out in school, the male school counselor pushed him to the floor, put his knee on his back and held his hands behind his back to

restrain him. The little boy said it was hard for him to breathe during the incident.

The counselor allegedly told Burton-Liggett that he did not put his knee on her son's back, and he got the rug burn from resisting attempts to bring him under control.

Burton-Liggett says someone on her Facebook friends list made a hotline call to the state Children's Division after she posted pictures of Kaden's injuries on the social media website.

The Missouri Department of Social Services has not confirmed whether it is investigating the incident. However, Burton-Liggett says an investigator from the state is scheduled to interview she and Kaden on April 30 "to get Kaden's and I side of the story. Then she is going to investigate the counselor, and then she will let me know what happens from there."

"Kaden is scared to go to school because he feels unsafe," said Burton-Liggett. "I will be looking into home-schooling him most likely."

When contacted for a

comment, Purdy School District superintendent Dr. Steven Chancellor issued the following statement: "We are aware of a situation in which a student received a rug burn during a student restraint and are looking into the situation to determine if it was handled properly. We take reports such as this seriously and have began a review process."

cess."

According to Chancellor, specific staff members of the Purdy School District are trained on safe restraints to use on students who are in danger of hurting themselves or others. The district plans to make a more substantial statement once they get approval to do so.

Passenger train rides returning to County

Passenger trains return to Barry County after a 50 year gap for one of the National Railway Historical Society (NRHS) Conventions. Half a century has passed since the last Frisco Railway passenger train journeyed through Barry County, but residents can once again experience the train ride during the weekend of June 14 through 15.

NRHS will operate a series of charter passenger trains from the headquarters of the Arkansas and Missouri Railroad in Springdale, Ark. Two of the trains will be touring Barry County, a Saturday trip to Monett and a Sunday trip to Butterfield.

Those attending the train ride will also experience the passage of a special Amtrak Exhibit Train that will be displayed at the convention. The exhibit will be open for free tours on Saturday, June 14, and Sunday, June 15, next to the Springdale passenger station of the A&M Railroad. The exhibit hours are 10 a.m. until 4 p.m. both days.

“This weekend is a unique opportunity for residents of Barry County to ride a train through their home towns and to participate in a historic event hosted by Amtrak,” said Barton Jennings, convention chair. “Each year we select a unique railroad community

for our convention, and this year, residents can join us in riding the rails of northwest Arkansas and southwest Missouri.”

NRHS was founded in 1935 and preserves and raises awareness for America’s threatened railroad heritage. The organization operates historic rail excursions and tours throughout North America and supports nearly 140 regional chapters. NRHS is a non-profit organization and has awarded nearly \$600,000 in railroad preservation grants since 1991. They also sponsor RailCamp, which is a summer orientation program offering high school youth hands-on experience in the railroad industry.

The Saturday, June 14, trip to Monett is the final official event of the NRHS convention and only a few tickets are still available online at http://www.nrhs.com/2014_Convention but are only available for members. The trip designed for non-members is the shorter Sunday, June 15, trip from Springdale and Butterfield. 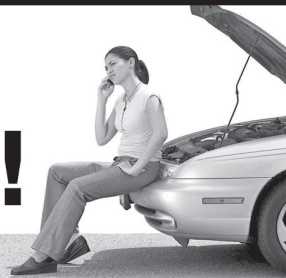

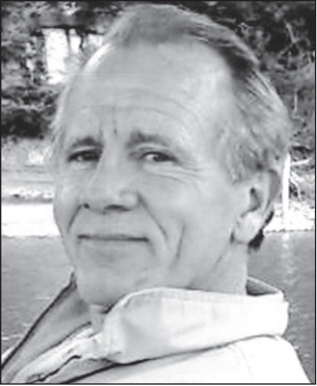

Anastasia, Paisley, Drake and Karrington; and his brother, Richard Wulz.

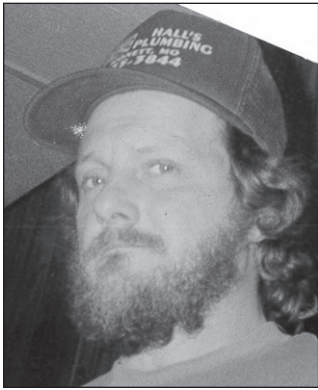
He was preceded in death by his grandparents and his sister, Susan Renee.

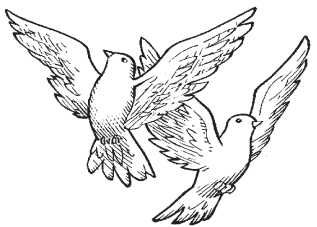

deposit and two months rent for their new home in a safe neighborhood. Barnes said, "Our main goal is to show women to live beyond addiction, and that the only way through that is with Jesus Christ." The women pray at meals, attend church, and also go to step-based Christian addiction meetings.

For the most part, the facility is just like any other home. Manager White stated, "We split the responsibilities and share in what needs to be done. It someone cooks, then someone else will do the dishes and so on." Chaddock added, "When there's a need, we just fill in and that's worked so far."

The residents enjoy living in the house, even if there are small squabbles. One resident, Kathryn Dailey, stated, "My favorite part is that I've started going to church again. It's a stipulation to be here, but it helps when you're willing. I'm learning how to let God guide my life." Their other current resident Cindy Beck added, "The best part is definitely the church because I've never done anything like that in my life before."

Dailey shared why she was interested in the program, "My choices in life weren't good choices, but I'm learning here." She continued, "Me and Cindy knew each other when we were using, and we did a lot together. Now, it's cool

to have someone to go through this with together." Beck added, "We share a room and we're both sober. It's good to know that you're not alone."

The home works on recommendations from Drug Court and probation and parole officers for residents. Barnes stated, "We have rules, but this isn't a lock-down facility. They are there because they want to be there. They want a fresh start." Currently, two women are residents, and there are two open beds. Barnes said, "We're preparing to expand already."

White commented, "If they don't want it for themselves, it's not going to work. They have to be ready for this." Chaddock agreed, "We're not here to be a warden, we're here to help them from walking down that easy road that they've taken before." One thing that everyone agreed on, it is definitely a lot of work.

The New Creations Women's Ministry is a non-profit group. Their facility is run strictly on donations with \$300 in monthly fees per resident to cover rent, utilities, food, trash and transportation. All donations to the ministry are tax-deductible and can be made out to New Creations or Kelly Barnes. The facility is also seeking a chest or

upright freezer, twin beds and bedding, a washer and dryer and kitchen items. For more information, contact Kelly Barnes at (417) 342-4155.

A group of home schooled students from the Eagle Rock area are gearing up for their end of the year open house to showcase the work they've completed throughout the year. Their art teacher, Pam Natarus, stated, "This has gotten to be such a big deal for them. 

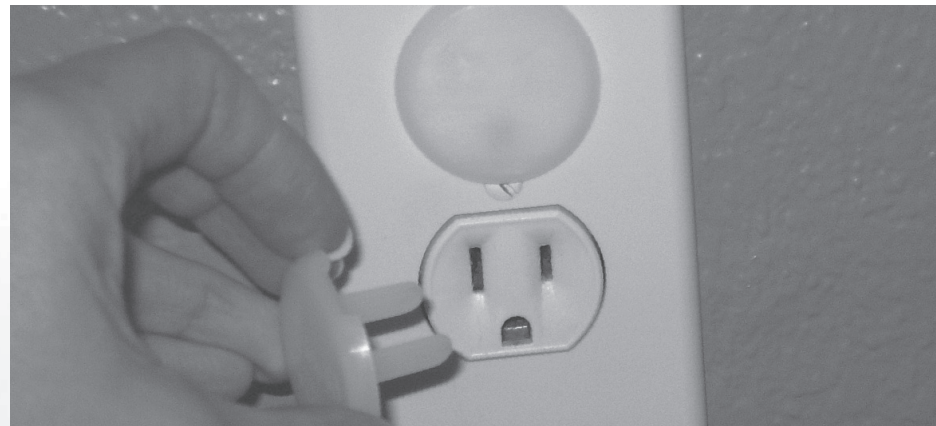
