UTV kills one, injures three others

Tamara D. Corn, 31, Cassville, was killed in a utility vehicle crash during the late hours Saturday night. William Bomar, 33, of Springdale, Ark., was driving a 2013 Polaris Razor on Farm Road 2155 five miles east of Cassville.

Bomar lost control of the UTV on a curve, ran

off of the road on the left ner Jim Fohn. and struck a tree. Corn was ejected from the vehicle. Bomar, his wife, Misty D. Bomar, 31, Springdale, Ark., and James V. Coffman, 27, Butterfield, are all in serious condition at Cox South Hospital in Springfield. Corn was pronounced dead at the scene at 1:00 a.m. by Barry County Coro-

Bomar was tested for alcohol as stated by Missouri State law. None of the people in the UTV were wearing seat belts at the time of the crash. No charges have been filed as the Missouri State Highway Patrol is still investigating the wreck.

Stella man pleads guilty to sex crime with minor

Tony Yang, 45, of Stella, pled guilty last week to taking a 15 year-old girl from Minnesota and bringing her to Missouri for sex. Yang pleaded guilty to the charge of transporting a minor across state lines for illicit sex, according to a statement released by Tammy Dickinson, United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri.

Yang was indicted by a federal grand jury on January 21. He entered his guilty plea at the U.S. District Court in Springfield to the charge. Yang admitted to picking up the 15-year-old on December 7 in a statement in court before U.S. Magistrate Judge David Rush.

Yang described the details leading up to the exchange. After sending her a Facebook friend request, he asked the girl to come live with him in Missouri where he owned his own business. The girl went to her mother's home to retrieve some of her personal effects before she asked him to come pick her up on December 6.

Yang then picked the girl up in front of her mothers' home after she snuck out and transported her across state lines back to Missouri. The

two stopped in Neosho at a hotel where they engaged in unprotected sex.

The case is being prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney Patrick Carney. It was investigated by the Cassville Police Department, the Neosho Police Department, U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement's (ICE) Homeland Security Investigations (HSI).

Yang faces a mandatory minimum ten years in federal prison without parole, up to life imprisonment and a fine of up to \$1 million. A sentencing hearing will be scheduled after the completion of a presentence investigation by the United States Probation Office. Yang also has pending drug trafficking charges in Barry County.

Exeter caboose sold, moved for restoration Gen. Assembly Roaring River preps

A familiar sight on Front Street in Exeter is now gone after the City Council decided to sell the historic caboose residing there since the late 1980s.

The Exeter City Council was approached by Paul Slevens, member of the Frisco Railway Historical and Modeling Society. According to Slevens, members of their group, that connects mostly online, had made suggestions to try and purchase the caboose for a number of years. Finally, the group decided to make an offer. Myrna Fischer, Exeter City Clerk, said, "We weren't looking to sell it, but when they came looking, it

Golden Rural Plumbing brought up the discussion." Fischer continued, "The caboose was given to the City, but we were responsible for upkeep. It was going to be quite a bit to make the repairs it needed just for maintenance." The caboose was originally gifted by the Burlington Northern Railway. The end result was the City Council approving the transaction during their April 9 meeting.

Frisco made arrangements to have the caboose picked up last Thursday. It

was placed on a semi trailer and moved to Tulsa, Okla., where the it will be restored. The group of members donated to this cause privately to make the purchase happen. Exeter received an offer of \$11,300 for the initial purchase, but Slevens says they will invest around \$75,000 total by the time everything is complete.

Slevens stated, "We've hired a bunch of different people to do the work on it. One group is replacing the glass, another is sandblasting and so forth." The caboose will eventually be used as part of a tourist ride in Baldwin City, Kansas. The pleasure ride is 18 miles and back for train enthusiasts. The group anticipates the caboose will be used in the next May through October tourist season in 2015. Slevens stated, "Everything is going smoothly, so we think it'll be completed by May."

While many in the community were sad to see the caboose go, Fischer offered her perspective, "Only five of these cabooses are in existence today. This way it will be back in use and restored to what it should be."

Gen. Assembly overrides Governor veto

The General Assembly voted to override Governor Jay Nixon's veto of income tax cutting Senate Bill 509 on Tuesday morning. The governor had been a harsh critic of the bill which local legislators Representative Scott Fitzpatrick and Senator David Sater were both in favor. Both voted in favor of the override.

SB 509 is a five phase income tax cut that will affect all Missourians who pay taxes and eliminate income tax for those earning less than \$9,000 annually. In order for each phase to take effect, the income tax revenue must increase by \$150 million. At each phase, the income tax will be cut by \$120 million, still netting the state \$30 million in revenue extra each year, but slowing the growth of revenue while the phases take effect.

Gov. Nixon stated, "While [SB 509]'s many authors may have delayed its impact, Sebate Bill 509 remains a very real threat to principles of fiscal discipline that have helped us maintain our spotless AAA rating for decades. As I have from day one, I will continue to manage the budget with the resources available and keep our state moving forward." No tax cuts will take effect until Gov. Nixon is out of office.

Roaring River preps for Kids' Fishing Day

Roaring River State Park will be the familiar site of Kids' Fishing Day again on May 17. The event, hosting by the Park and sponsored by the Missouri Department of Conservation, Department of Natural Resources and a variety of local organizations and businesses, will offer free fishing to kids that come for the family event from all over. This year, fishing begins again at 6:30 a.m. and continues until 8:15 p.m.

All children 15 and under can fish for free during the day with a helper. Kids can pick up their free trout tags on Friday, May 15, at the hatchery office or any time during the event on Saturday. BC Museum holds volunteer appreciation luncheon







Family permaculture farm on a mission to healthily feed community

The Phaneuf family spends most of their day working in their gardens, feeding their animals and spending time together in their small country home just outside of Cassville. However, stepping on to their farm is an education; every single element has a purpose and works together for the bigger picture.

The proper term for their way of living is known as permaculture: a movement

to care for people, care for the earth, and provide a fair share to the community. The principal being that the permaculture system are to use nature with nature to support everyone's way of life and provide better food in a chemical-free way that is eco-friendly. Charlie Phaneuf is the driving force behind their farm, a certified permaculture designer who puts his principles to work on the land. Charlie said, "Everything works together in a relationship. Companion planting is when one plant will give nitrogen to its neighbor that needs it, and then you grow enough to share." Sharing in their way of farming means people, and animals. Charlie continued, "Sure, that bird might eat some of your strawberries, but they are eating pests, too"

Charlie and his wife, Elaine, care for their small farm with their two children, Charlie, 4, and Elisabeth, 14. The family moved to Barry County in 2005 from Delaware, seeking a lifestyle that all of them would thrive in on a small farm. When they visited the Ozarks, they knew it would be their new home.

Charlie held a variety of jobs, learning the value of hard work that has helped him on all facets of his life on the farm. Eventually, he worked his way up to director of maintenance at a hospital, a job that he knew he had to give up to fulfill their family dreams, even if they weren't so sure of what that was yet. He said, "I was completely separated from what I wanted to do [when I was working at the hospital] even though I didn't know what that was yet."

The more Charlie and Elaine researched permaculture, the more convinced they became of the benefits. Then they were faced with a choice. Elained shared, "Charlie really wanted to take this two week permacul-

ture class in Illinois, but the hospital would only let him take one week of vacation at a time. So he quit."

Charlie's experience in Illinois would launch them into their farm full force. He said, "It was life-changing. I knew that this is what I had to do. I had to show people an alternative to growing food for themselves the way they'd known." The goal on the farm is for the Phaneufs to learn through applying permaculture principles and passing that knowledge on to others.

As the Phaneufs set up their farm, Charlie repurposed as many things as he could in the process. The greenhouse that the family uses to start their seedlings in Charlie fashioned from an awning that was going to be sold for scrap at the hospital he worked at. Charlie said as soon as he saw the frame, he knew he could use it. He paid the hospital the same they wold have gotten from the salvage yard and gave it a new use. Elaine said, "Charlie looks at a pile of junk, and he sees potential. Most people don't see that."

From there, the family made plans to garden in an environment-friendly way and offer that food for others. They decided to start offering Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) shares, a popular idea especially in bigger cities where people might not have space to garden for themselves. A CSA share al-

lows customers to buy in to the farm crops for a season. For \$500, members will receive a 3/4 bushel of a variety of vegetables each week for 20 weeks during the year. The cost averages out to \$25 a week for a large quantity of food and ends up being better than what one would pay locally for produce.

Charlie said, "Everyone needs this food and income should have nothing to do with it." All of the food grown on the farm is natural, pesticide and herbicide-free. Along with the share of veggies and fruits each week, CSA members also have the opportunity to buy overrun before the Phaneufs sell it at the Farmers' Market.

The family will have over 60 varieties of produce to offer this year in their CSA shares including peas, tomatoes, strawberries, beans, melons, squash, onions, potatoes and the list goes on.

The family is excited about offering their best to people in the community. Charlie said, "I had someone come up and tell me that I would be charging so much more for the food by selling it at the Farmers' Market, but I want people to be able to afford quality food. I want to grow the best quality, safest foods and also be affordable for people in the Cassville, Eagle Rock and surrounding areas."

For those interested in a CSA share or what more finormation about the Phaneuf Permaculture Farm, their website is Phaneufs-Farm.com and by phone at (417) 846-0108. The CSA shares are available on a customer's schedule for pick up or the family will deliver to any location with four or more members wanting to pick up there. Deliveries will begin in late May and will run until mid-October.

Chief Justice Roy S. Moore graduated from Etowah High School in Attalla, Alabama, in 1965, and from the U.S. Military Academy at West Point in 1969. He served in the U.S. Army as a company commander with the Military Police Corps in Vietnam. Chief Justice Moore completed his Juris Doctor degree from the University of Alabama School of Law in 1977.

During his legal career, Chief Justice Moore became the first full-time Deputy District Attorney in Etowah County, Alabama, and served in this position from 1977 until 1982. In 1984, chief Justice Moore undertook private practice of law in Gadsden, Alabama.

In 1992, chief Justice Moore became a judge of the Sixteenth Judicial Circuit of Alabama and served until his election of Chief Justice of the Alabama Supreme Court in 2000. In 2003, chief Justice Moore was removed from his position by a judicial panel for refusing to remove a Ten Commandments monument that he installed in the rotunda of the Alabama Judicial Building to acknowledge the sovereignty of God.

From 2003 until 2012, Chief Justice Moore served as President of the Foundation for Moral Law in Montgomery, speaking throughout the Country and filing amicus curiae briefs regarding the United States Constitution in Federal District Courts, State Supreme Courts, U.S. Courts of Appeal and the United States Supreme Court.

Chief Justice Moore was overwhelmingly re-elected by a vote of the people of Alabama as Chief Justice in November of 2012 and took office in January of 2013.

Chief Justice Moore and his wife Kayla have four children and three grandchildren. They are members of First Baptist Church in Gallant, Alabama.







Barry County Law Day results in 16 sent to Department of Corrections

• Brianna S. Bettencourt, Cassville, was sentenced to five years supervised probation with a suspended imposition of that sentence following a guilty plea to possession of a controlled substance.

Bettencourt was originally arrested following an investigation by the Southwest Missouri Drug Task Force November 19, 2013. An agent made contact with her and requested to search her vehicle. Bettencourt was in possession of 4.5 grams of marijuana and 3 clonazepam pills in a wallet in her vehicle. Bettencourt is set to serve her sentence until April

• William Newel Bowen was sentenced to 60 days in the Barry County Jail for a misdemeanor and four years incarceration for each of two felony charges with the Department of Corrections. Bowen pled guilty to felony tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree, felony resisting or interfering with an arrest for a felony and misdemeanor DWI-Al-

Bowen was originally arrested following an event on March 21, 2014. Bowen took a 1994 GMC truck from Purdy. Bowen then drove the vehicle while intoxicated and had a revoked or suspended license. While driving, Bowen failed to drive in a signal lane and almost hit an oncoming car in another lane. He refused to follow orders and fled the scene when ordered to exit the vehicle by officers with the Barry County Sheriff's Department.

• Lindsay Victoria Butler-Olson, Seligman, was sentenced to five years incarceration with the imposition of that sentence suspended and must serve 100 hours of community service on or before April 21, 2015. Butler-

Olson pled guilty to possession of a chemical with intent to manufacture.

Butler-Olson was arrested following an investigation on January 23, 2013, by the Southwest Missouri Drug Task Force. She and a few other people went to the Cassville Walmart where she purchased a box of pseudoephedrine. Other people she was with also purchased ingredients for making methamphetamine. When officers arrived on the scene, they were looking at the lithium batteries. Butler-Olson is set to serve supervised probation until April 21, 2019.

• Bonnie Christine Cape was sentenced to five years supervised probation with a suspended imposition of sentence. Cape also must complete 100 hours of community service, obtain her G.E.D. and engage in educational programs as recommended by probation and parole.

Cape was arrested on August 10, 2013, following a stop made by the Missouri State Highway Patrol. The car she was driving did not have a front license plate displayed. Cape consented to a vehicle search where Trooper Craig found two alpraxalim pills in a baggie. She then admitted to having methamphetamine in her bra, which she turned over to the trooper. Cape is to serve her probation until April 22, 2019.

• Greta M. Cargile-Coronel, Monett, had her probation revoked for possession of a controlled substance charge that she pled guilty to in 2007 after a subsequent arrest for resisting/interfering with an arrest for a felony. Cargile-Coronel is to serve four years incarceration for the offense.

Cargile-Coronel was arrested for felony warrants. After being placed in a patrol car, Cargile-Coronel attempted to flee from Conservation Agent Daniel Shores by pulling away after being removed from the patrol car and then falling to the ground. From the ground, she then proceeded to kick the officer before being subdued and taken into the Barry County Jail.

· Carla Rejean Costlow, Cassville, was sentenced to five years incarceration with the execution of the sentence suspended in favor of supervised probation. Costlow pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance stemming from an arrest in August 2012 with a separate charge for possession in

Costlow was originally arrested and transported to the Barry County Jail for domestic assault. When taken into the jail, Costlow was found to have a glass pipe and white powdery substance that tested positive for methamphetamine as well as 20 hydrocodone pills hidden. Costlow is to serve supervised probation until April

• Stephanie Marie Crase, Crane, received five years supervised probation with the imposition of that sentence suspended and must serve 100 hours of community service on or before April 22, 2015. Crase made an Alford plea to possession of a controlled substance stemming from an arrest in November

Crase was arrested after the vehicle she was riding in was stopped by the Missouri State Highway Patrol. She was found to have an empty syringe that tested positive for methamphetamine. Crase will serve supervised probation until April 22, 2019.

• Dakotah Gene Crown, Springfield, was sentenced to serve 120 days of shock incarceration as part of a four year incarceration sentence. Crown pled guilty to DWI-Alcohol as a persistent offender after an arrest made in February 2014.

Crown was arrested after the Barry County Sheriff's Department was dispatched for an assault in McDowell. He had struck the victim numerous times on the face and eye causing serious injury. Crown's shock time is set to end on August 12, 2014.

Denney, Seligman, had his probation revoked and was sentenced to six years on a possession of a controlled substance charge from 2006 and seven years for possession of a controlled substance charge and possession of a chemical with intent to manufacture a controlled substance charges from 2010.
- Adan Diaz, Monett, was sentenced to three years incarceration with the execution of that sentence suspended in favor of five years supervised probation. Diaz must also complete 480 hours of community service on or before April 21, 2015.

Diaz will serve supervised probation until April

• Britten Cole Ebert was sentenced to five years supervised probation with a suspended imposition of sentence and 100 hours of community service. Ebert pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance.



Ferguson was originally arrested after entering a garage in Cassville with the intent to steal. He was arrested by the Cassville Police Department on June 28, 2013.

• Kari Dann Freeman, Joplin, was sentenced to five years supervised probation and 100 hours of community service. Freeman pled guilty

with the intent to manufacture a controlled substance and possession of a controlled substance.

• Jason Shane Gillow, Joplin, was sentenced to three years unsupervised probation after entering an Alford plea for stealing.

Gillow was arrested following an incident at Benchmark Healthcare in Monett on October 12, 2012. He had taken a paper from a file and assaulted a staff member while visiting the facility where one of his relatives resided. Gillow's grandmother had been placed in the facility by the Department of Family Services and Gillow was attempting to take her against the judgement of DFS. from officers as they were approaching the jail door. Seeley is to serve probation until April 21, 2019.

- Jonathan Jacob Smith, Cassville, was sentenced to two years incarceration after pleading guilty to failure to register as a sex offender. Smith was originally charged with sexual battery involving a four-year-old girl in Topeka, Kansas.
- Nathan Welty Smith, Aurora, was sentenced to four years incarceration when his probation was revoked. Smith originally pled guilty to DWI-Alcohol as a persistent offender in 2012.

Smith was found in a stuck vehicle on Farm Road 1165 near Verona when officers arrived on April 4, 2012. The vehicle he was operating was stuck. 
