# Sater's abortion waiting period bill passed

Missouri women seeking an abortion could face a 72-hour waiting period after Cassville's Senator David Sater's abortion waiting period bill was approved by both the House and Senate last week.


The bill adds to Missouri's already competitively comprehensive abortion laws by requiring women seeking an abortion to wait 72 hours between when they have an initial consultation with the physician performing the procedure and when the procedure is actually done. Currently, women must wait 24 hours before the procedure. They are also provided informational material about the risks of an abortion, how it is going to be performed, and contact information for adoption agencies and groups who help with pregnancy and newborn needs. Women are also given the opportunity to see an ultrasound of the baby and hear its heartbeat, if audible. If Gov. Nixon signs the bill into law, Missouri will join two other states, Utah and South Dakota, in having the three-day waiting period.

Sen. Stater stated, "This is an important victory for unborn children in Missouri. Three days is not unreasonable or an undue burden in deciding whether to bring a child into this world." The House version of the bill was sponsored by Representative Kevin Elmer of Nixa and Representative Keith Frederick of Rolla as companions to the bill prefiled by Sater before the legislative session began.



Roaring River State Park was filled with children of all ages on Saturday for their annual spring Kids' Fishing Day. The park gave out 1,107 free kids tags to those who showed up to cast their lines on a chilly day at the park.

Paul Spurgeon, Roaring River Hatchery Manager, said that the hatchery staff stocked the kids' hole with 2,500 trout averaging 12-1/2 inches in preparation for Saturday's big day. 
# One sign creates a big fuss in Cassville

For one business, trying to put up a new sign has turned into a six month ordeal due to Cassville's regulations.

Rick Steiner, the manager at Cassville Bowl, has been trying to get approval to put up a new sign at the bowling alley since November, and as of May's City Council meeting, he still isn't able to. Steiner said, "Putting up a new sign has been a lot of passing back and forth because no one seems to know what to do."

The sign in question would be an LED addition to the iconic Cassville Bowl bowling ball and pin sign mounted beside the parking lot. Steiner said, "At first, the City wasn't sure what I should

Bowl sign does not meet the current City standards. The bowling alley is located in a C-2 commercial district, which does not allow pole signs of any kind, and also limits signs to a maximum height of 10 feet. Cassville Bowl's sign is over 16 feet from the ground, making it a non-conforming sign for its district. Leaving the sign as it is isn't the problem as the sign is grandfathered in due to it being within code when it was originally erected in 1961 when the alley opened, but there is debate as to whether adding an LED sign would be modifying it, which would be against code unless the sign is lowered by over six feet.

Steiner said, "I don't mean to criticize the council at all, I think they're all really conscientious about their jobs. I just think they were unprepared with how to deal with this."

When Steiner initially contacted the City about putting up the LED sign, he was directed to Planning and Zoning. From there, it's been an issue bouncing back and forth between the City Council and Planning and Zoning. Initially, Steiner said that planning and zoning thought they needed an ordinance that allowed LED signs, now he has been directed to get a special use permit. At May's City Council meeting, Alderman



Ann Hennigan attempted to get the other council members to allow Steiner to put up the sign that he has already purchased. She stated, "I really feel like he's waited long enough." However, Alderman Terry A. Heinz voiced his concerns. Heinz stated, "I believe we all took an oath of office to uphold the laws of the State of Missouri and the ordinances of the City of Cassville. If we try to bend the rules for this, I feel we should all walk away from our positions." Heinz went on, "It is my contention that you'll have to lower the sign to ten feet before we can approve this."

Steiner replied, "I don't want to circumvent the system or your oath of office, but I'm not going to change that sign. Why would you ask me to do that or why would you ask any business to do that?"

During an interview, Steiner explained, "This place

and the sign out front has been here 50 some years. That's why I want to keep the sign the way it is. The older you get, the more you value you things, or at least I do. You don't like throwing things away, you fix them." Along with that same line of thinking, Steiner has left many things in the alley original, including the wood lanes, pin setters, ball returns and lockers.

Steiner went on, "Why anyone would even suggest that I alter or chop that down? I just can't imagine it."

At the request of the Council, Steiner filled out all of the necessary paperwork they've asked for regarding his sign, but he still hasn't received a clear answer to move forward. The next Planning and Zoning meeting will be held on June 6, and Steiner plans to be there. He hopes that something will be decided that can be presented to the City Council at their regular meeting the following week.

Steiner said, "The sign ordinances have to protect the welfare of the citizens. They don't want a sign to be unsafe, and that's good. However, sign ordinances that don't have to do with the welfare of citizens restricts our rights. It cannot interfere with the welfare of other people or the individual rights of citizens."

Cassville Mayor Bill Shiveley stated, "At this point, he will apply for a special use permit and then planing and zoning will make a recommendation whether it should be approved by Council or

He added, "I think we should be a little less restrictive on our signs and more pro-business to attract more commerce."





# Missouri voters to decide on transportation sales tax

Later this year, Missouri voters will determine the fate of a transportation sales tax that would raise \$500 million annually for roads and other transportation projects.

The House came through with an approval last Wednesday, meaning the bill that would raise the general sales tax by 3/4 cent will be placed on the November ballot unless Governor Nixon decides to have it voted on sooner.

If approved, the sales tax would take effect in 2015 and stay in place for ten years. Currently, Missouri's roadways are maintained with user fees, like motor fuel taxes, registration fees, and taxes on the sale of vehicles within the state. According to officials with the Department of Transportation, the tax is a necessary step in maintaining existing roads and bridges as well as new construction.

They fear that the budget will not be enough in coming years.

The current budget for roads and bridges is \$685 million and it is projected to dip to \$325 million by the time the 2017 budget is decided. Five years ago, the annual budget was \$1.3 billion.

This initiative marks one of many attempts to provide better funding for transportation in the state, including a failed attempt at a one-half cent sales tax increase and four-cent motor fuel tax from

At the end of ten years, it would require another vote by citizens to keep the sales tax measure in place. The money is to be split 90 percent for state transportation needs and the remaining 10 percent would go to cities and counties for transportation projects.

Chief Justice Roy S. Moore graduated from Etowah High School in Attalla, Alabama, in 1965, and from the U.S. Military Academy at West Point in 1969. He served in the U.S. Army as a company commander with the Military Police Corps in Vietnam. Chief Justice Moore completed his Juris Doctor degree from the University of Alabama School of Law in 1977.

During his legal career, Chief Justice Moore became the first full-time Deputy District Attorney in Etowah County, Alabama, and served in this position from 1977 until 1982. In 1984, chief Justice Moore undertook private practice of law in Gadsden, Alabama.

In 1992, chief Justice Moore became a judge of the Sixteenth Judicial Circuit of Alabama and served until his election of Chief Justice of the Alabama Supreme Court in 2000. In 2003, chief Justice Moore was removed from his position by a judicial panel for refusing to remove a Ten Commandments monument that he installed in the rotunda of the Alabama Judicial Building to acknowledge the sovereignty of God.

From 2003 until 2012, Chief Justice Moore served as President of the Foundation for Moral Law in Montgomery, speaking throughout the Country and filing amicus curiae briefs regarding the United States Constitution in Federal District Courts, State Supreme Courts, U.S. Courts of Appeal and the United States Supreme Court.

Chief Justice Moore was overwhelmingly re-elected by a vote of the people of Alabama as Chief Justice in November of 2012 and took office in January of 2013.

Chief Justice Moore and his wife Kayla have four children and three grandchildren. They are members of First Baptist Church in Gallant,

The Chief Justice will be speaking on God & Country, our Constitution and its connection with God and the role of government under the constitution.





stated that law is aimed to make women feel shamed or guilted into keeping an unwanted pregnancy. They also noted that a woman from Springfield wanting an abortion would have to stay in St. Louis, the only city with an abortion clinic in the state, for at least three days which limits the availability of an abortion to poor women.

Rep. Elmer stated, "This bill is an effort to balance the rights of the mother with the rights of the unborn child. We are not denying the mother her rights, but simply asking her to give more thought before making a decision she may later regret."

Gov. Nixon has already

hinted that he plans to veto the bill. He said, "I've had pretty consistent positions on this. I think everyone knows, obviously, which way I lean on it." Nixon's main complaint about the bill was that it does not have an exemption for situations of rape or incest

Sater stated, "The decision to abort a child is a life-changing and irreversible one. An additional 48 hours gives a mother time to process the information she receives through the informed consent process or seek help and advice from family members or a counselor. There were more than 9,000 abortions performed in Missouri

last year and that's 9,000 too many. I believe the passage of this bill will result in more women bringing their pregnancies to full term and more children having an opportunity for life."

Sen. Sater is confident that should Nixon veto the bill, an override will happen. The bills passed with a veto-proof 111-39 in the House, but was one vote shy of the two-thirds majority in the Senate on the initial vote of 22-9. Nixon has until July 14 to either sign or veto the bill. At that point, the legislature could consider a veto override in the September annual veto session.

# Two students make perfect attendance a top priority

Two students had a mission for high school: not to miss a single day in all four years. While maybe not what most students have on their minds, that is precisely what Katelyn Pitts, of Cassville High School, and Douglas Trager, of Southwest High School, achieved.

When interviewed, Trager was at school, obviously, but the surprising part? He didn't have to be. His school year was over, but the next day, he was still at the school, helping the high school secretary, Jackie



Burns. Trager said, "Jackie needs help in the office, so I wanted to help."

Trager said that in all four years of high school, he hasn't been sick during the session, nor did he skip or play hooky. He said, "People call me weird because I haven't missed any days, but I'm lucky because I've only gotten sick on holidays or when school's not in session." For Trager, it wasn't that he enjoyed school any more than the next kid, he just thought that attendance was an important goal. He said, "I didn't used to like school, but when high school came around, I became more involved. It wasn't my favorite thing, but I set a goal to have perfect attendance, and I made it."

Pitts said that the last week before graduation, she was afraid that she wouldn't be able to finish out her goal of perfect attendance. She stated, "I got sick this last week, but I said to myself, 'I've gotta go.' I only had two days left." Meeting that goal also meant missing out on Senior Skip Day. She said, "I stayed here and helped in the office, but I wasn't the only one, some kids stayed for their grades."

Pitts is attending the University of Central Missouri this fall to study Speech pathology. She wants to go into a career where she can help people. Pitts said, "I like to talk to people and be there for them. Maybe that got me in a little too much trouble while I was in school." After graduation from college, she plans to move back to the area and start a business. She said, "I love working with kids, and I'm a people person. I want to help as many people as I can."



A big group of fourth grade Cassville Intermediate students spent the morning on Friday at the Barry County Museum looking at exhibits and sitting in on special talks in different areas as an end of the year treat.

In the implement barn behind the museum, two classes taught kids about farming in the present and in the past. Jay Reed and Steven Burcham, of Garden Sass Farmers' Market Association, talked to the kids about different kinds of seeds. The kids learned about the differences between heirloom, hybrid, and GMO seeds and what each means for the future of farming and gardening. Finally, the kids visited with Guy Brown and his son Jackie, who talked all about wild turkeys. Kids learned how turkeys live in the wild, hunting techniques and even got to practice turkey calling.

At the end of the day, the kids had a good time and learned a lot about historical life in Barry County with hands-on activities.







The 4-H program in Barry County will hopefully see some positive changes after the extension office hired a new part-time 4-H youth program assistant. Anna Klem began her duties this week and will work toward helping to create strategies to promote the program and extend their outreach in the community.

Klem was very active in 4-H growing up and attributes it to a lot of her successes. She said, "I was in Adair County 4-H and Clover Kids, and it's been a huge part of who I've become. She said, "I think the leadership program was the most beneficial to my development. I never would have had the confidence or skills to even apply for this job without my background in 4-H."

As far as the importance of the program, Klem feels that the program really helps children prepare for life in the adult world by preparing them for interviews, employment and hard work. She said, "A lot of what I learned was helping to give me life skills and independence. Personally, I think the leadership guidance helped me the most, and I want the kids to experience that."


# **Exeter FFA** holds annual banquet



# Southwest School Board MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

As part of our continued efforts in keeping our patrons informed, the Southwest R-V School Administration will provide monthly information concerning Board Meetings.

A recap of the May 15, 2014 regular meeting is as follows: The Board convened for its meeting at 7:41 p.m., following the 8th grade Promotion ceremony.

Consent items were approved, including accepting the resignations of elementary music teacher Christina Campbell, high school business teacher Vick Irsik, library aide Pam Hutson, and softball coach Tony Eagleburger who is resigning from his coaching duties only. Sharesa Rodgers was hired to fill the business vacancy. In addition, the following reassignments were also approved: Christine Littrell to library aide, Gary Brown to title reading, Teresa Alverson to high school special education, and Taci Lawrence to elementary special education.

Under old business, the Board approved contracting with the Scott Regional Technology Center for the 2014-2015 school year and L.J. Hart & Company in respect to a Lease Purchase. This \$300,000 financing at 1.75 percent interest will allow the district to secure technology equipment, including Promethean Kuno tablets at the middle school and Dell Chrome books at high school.

New Business items included the approval of the low bid of \$8,042.31 from Jeff Smith in respect to an electrical project in the K-2 building. This work will increase the number of receptacles in classrooms. The board also approved the district Program Evaluation Plan for the 2014-2015 school

Under Administrative and Program Evaluations, the Board reviewed the monthly maintenance and administrative reports. Principal Tosha Watson reported that the high school will be represented in the state Bass Fishing tournament, a new even sanctioned by the Missouri State High School Activities Association. Although high school students are eligible to participate, two member teams must have the capability of providing a boat driven by an adult captain. Funding for this particular activity comes from private contributions. In addition, Superintendent Bob Walker informed the Board that the elementary buildings had been elevated to "Gold" status in respect to the Positive Behavioral Interventions and Support (PBIS) program. Mr. Walker also mentioned that the district is pursuing a National Institute of Justice Grant and will be considering a possible Missouri Pre-school Project grant when its information is released next month.

The Board moved into Executive Session at 8:40 p.m. for approximately 45 minutes to discuss various personnel items, reconvening in open session and adjourning at 9:26

The next regular meeting is scheduled for June 12, in the high school library, at 7 p.m.





Once a bit off of the beaten path, The Little Store just reopened right on the main drag in downtown Cassville and is filled to the brim with eclectic, funky and creative

treasures. The shop was once a 500 square foot hole in the wall, but today it boasts 2,500 square feet of unique offer-

The Little Store was opened three years ago by

Sherry Johnson in a tiny space on 7th Street in Cassville, hence the name choice. Johnson said, "I've always wanted to own my own business, I just didn't realize that was what I wanted to do until fifty years down the road. But now I've found my niche."

This year marks the 100 year birthday of the Edmondson building which is owned by Johnson's father, R.G. Edmondson. The character of such a historic landmark is unmistakable from both the outside and inside.

Iohnson has been garage saling and attending auctions since she was 16. Her love of antiques, knickknacks and the unique gave her a leg up in the business. When Johnson decided that she wanted to expand, she turned to the talents of Jay Reed and Steven Burcham of Ozark's Home Gardens. The two spent countless hours painting, remodeling and sprucing up the shop, giving it character and curb appeal. Reed stated, "Sherry told us that she wanted a cool little shop in Cassville. Many hours of labor

later, she has it."

From brightly colored walls to unique displays filled with gemstones, antiques, glassware and clothing, the shop has a little to offer anyone who walks in. New to the store are lines of clothing from Ed Hardy and Aeropostale; returning are many glassware pieces, purses and figurines.

With all of the extra space, Johnson has also been able to carry items from local artists and crafters. Penny Hilburn has beautiful twisted wire sun catchers displayed as you first walk in. Hilburn began making them when trying her hand at wire-wrapping quartz. She said, "I was laid up for awhile after being in the hospital and I have to stay busy. So I started wrapping and beading these and it just sort of exploded in my mind." The sun catchers Hilburn makes are mostly trees with beads or gemstones, definitely unlike anything seen in most

pottery and rope creations by David Vaught. The shop also has crafts and artisan canned goods from Ozark's Home Gardens

The draw of the shop doesn't stop at the goods they offer. The historic building also has the only operating three-story dumbwaiter in the county. Johnson said that her father and grandfather salvaged the elevator from the old Barry County Hospital. Then it sat for 60 years, waiting to be put in.

Exploring the upper floors of the building holds ghosts of times past, including leftover inventory from when a shoe store occupied the space and original light fixtures hanging from the ceiling upstairs. Hopefully, one day the whole building will get a makeover, but for now, it's one step at a

The old location of the The Little Store is still connected with the bigger shop. The old space is now H and W Antiques, owned by Hal and Wilma Miller, and offers a variety of antiques ranging from furniture to smaller pieces.

Johnson shared a big part of why she enjoys owning the shop, "I like seeing the people coming in and out and seeing old friends. I grew up here, so I know a lot of people and enjoy having them stop by." On top of that, Johnson really loves the items that she finds and puts in the shop. She even still has the first thing that she bought when she was a teenager. The doll sits proudly on a shelf in the store as a reminder of her beginnings in collectibles. Johnson said, "To me, she is worth a lot of money, even priceless. I thought that she was so unique that I just had to have her, and that's where this all started."






