Cassville Schools decide on \$4M bond projects

The Cassville School District is preparing for changes coming in the summer months and into the beginning of the new school year as projects are decided and decisions are made regarding the \$4 million bond issue that was passed by district voters in the April 8 election.

Of the \$4 million bond issue, around \$950,000 qualified for Qualified Zone Academy Bonds (QZAB) as zero-percent interest through the Department of Education. The remaining funds have been marketed and will be sold with local parties having the first opportunity. Superintendent Richard Asbill stated, "In the past, we've been fortunate to have local investors like Security Bank, Commerce Bank and Freedom Bank do lease purchases for the school. We won't know who purchases the bonds because that is a private transaction, but local investors always have the first opportunity."

So far, the School Board has decided on \$3.147 million of the bond allocations to go for projects bid by CTS. The company will be mak-

ing a variety of changes and updates within the schools as part of the issues that the School District educated the community on for the bond issue. CTS will be doing bathroom renovations in the Middle and Elementary Schools, including new flooring, new toilets with automatic flushers, new sinks with timed faucets and more. The company will also be completing electrical upgrades, putting in new HVAC units, including a unit in the game gym and competing new paving projects for students safety.

Another element of improvements and projects this summer will include the gae gym and the District offices. Office staff have been temporarily displaced while repairs are made from when a water line burst in January causing extensive damage. The Board room, gym floor and offices will all receive repairs. Most of the gym and office will be covered under insurance claims, but some projects are included with the bond issue, including new bleachers and changes to the windows. As-

Viney Creek reopens under Missouri State Parks

State Rep. Scott Fitzpatrick today announced that the Viney Creek Recreation Area near Golden opened for Memorial Day weekend beginning Friday, May 23, at noon. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers had originally targeted the campground for full closure, but Fitzpatrick said outdoor enthusiasts can now make plans to utilize the area's many attractions.

"As a member of the House committee responsible for oversight of the Department Natural Resources and the Division of State Parks, and as State Representative for the Golden area, I am pleased that the Division of State Parks has stepped up to the plate to ensure camping and lake enthusiasts will continue to have access to Viney Creek Public Use Area," said Fitzpatrick, R-Shell Knob.

Fitzpatrick noted that the recreation area, which is located on Table Rock Lake, offers several picnic sites as well as campgrounds, water access, a playground, and a boat ramp.

Campsites will be available on a first come, first serve basis through June 30. Starting June 1, visitors will be able to make reservations for July 1 arrival online at mostateparks.com or by calling 1-877-ICampMo. "This is an example of

state government working well, and state and federal authorities cooperating. would like to thank Jim Sandberg and Greg Oller with the Corps of Engineers Table Rock Project Office and State Parks Director Bill Bryan for their work to ensure this public use area that so many enjoy, myself included, will remain open for the 2014 season. I am optimistic that this partnership between state and federal agencies will be able to continue beyond the initial one year trial lease period," added Fitzpatrick.

Fitzpatrick encouraged anyone interested in learning more about Viney Creek or any other Missouri state park to visit mostateparks.

Rickard retires from Extension office

After 32 years in the area, Tony Rickard is saying goodbye to the University of Missouri Extension Office. Rickard has served in the Barry County Office for 25 years as a dairy specialist and director of the southwest region, and he will be missed by those in the office and also the com-

Rickard stated, "I'm going to miss it. Who would've imagined in 1982 that I'd end up staying all of these years. There are wonderful people in this county and I'll miss them all."

As one of only three dairy specialists in the state, Rickard worked with a lot of people from across Missouri dealing with dairy issues and answering questions. However, his job here never pertained just to dairy cows, but rather anything that he could find the answers to or help with. He said, "The Extension is all about meeting the needs of the people. We have such a network of experts that if I don't know, I can find someone who does. At first, it might have been hard dealing with the questions that I wasn't familiar with, but over time, you start to know all of those things that you'd never have guessed at the begin-

Rickard's last day in the office will be tomorrow, May 29. As far as retirement, his greatest challenge will be slowing down. He said, "It's going to be a challenge to maintain and find a purpose. This has been my entire career. I've had requests to be a consultant in and out of state, so I might do some of that."

The Extension is already looking for a replacement. Rickard said, "I hope they find someone quickly, when I took this job in '82, it had been open for a year, but I think they have the ball rolling now."

Rickard and his wife, Carol, plan to travel after Thursday. He said, "I'm going to take off for two and a half months. My wife is from Connecticut and we are going to spend time in the northeast with family and friends. Then I'll spend some time with my father in Kentucky. I'll go back to the family farm with all of those fence rows and get around to doing all of those things that my dad couldn't and the boys weren't around to do over the years."

Rickard said he is very lucky to have always had a career that he enjoyed. He said, "It's been a wonderful

career. I've never had a job. I always tell my sons, never take a job, a job is something that you have to do everyday. A career is something that you look forward to doing. I took my responsibilities very seriously, but I loved what I

He continued, "It's not about the money. If that's your goal, you can be really miserable. Find something you love to do."

Rickard's job was to help grow the dairy industry in this part of the state and help farmers with anything they needed to ensure they have productive and healthy farms. He said, "The county has been very supportive of us. The cooperative is an

No drunk driving arrests in City

The Cassville Police Department didn't make any DWI arrest during the recent May 1 - 12 drunk driving crackdown.

Officers did issue the following traffic citations: two driving while suspended. There were a total of 10 vehicles stopped during the crackdown, which the Cassville Police Department participated in.

Missouri law enforcement participated in the crackdown on underage drinking to ensure Missouri youth celebrate safe and sober so they could Arrive Alive at prom and graduation.

It is illegal for someone under the age of 21 to possess or consume alcohol in Missouri, yet youth make up



a significant proportion of drunk drivers causing traffic crashes on Missouri roadways. Missouri has a Zero Tolerance Law. If you are under 21, your license will be suspended if you're caught driving with even a trace of alcohol in your system.

The sobering fact is that impaired driving contributes to 28% of all Missouri traffic fatalities. Between 2011 and 2013, 85 people were killed and 318 seriously injured in Missouri roadway crashes involving an impaired driver under the age of 21.





Two sentenced for child endangerment

Barry County residents were recently charged with endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree based upon the following facts. Department of Family Services Jalainey McMahon and Lieutenant Terry Meek responded to a child abuse hotline report at the Washburn Middle School. While at the school, Lt. Meek reported that the child in question, to

be known as V, had a large black and blue bruise on her backside.

After more investigation, the child stated in a forensic interview that her parents, dad Richard and stepmother Rachel, smoked marijuana in the home while all the children were present. There are five children in the home, all under the age of eleven. The child then stated that they used a bong to smoke the marijuana and described the bong as a triangle at the bottom with a large tube. V advised that the neighbors come over to smoke as well, and the children have to stay in the bedroom.

She also stated that she has to take care of ten month old sibling while her parents smoked pot with the neighbors. Lt. Meek and McMahon were told that her stepmother beat her with a flip flop shoe because she lied to her about a letter involving her con-

duct at school. Lieutenant Meek went to the home of the abuse case and seized the shoes, a bong and pipes, and a small baggie of stems and seeds from the home. The children were taken out of the residence for their safety during the investigation.

Richard Atkins, from Seligman, was charged with endangering the welfare of a child in the second degree. He pled guilty and received a suspended imposition of sentence. This resulted in two years unsupervised probation and 20 hours of community service. Rachel Duckett, Seligman, was charged with endangering the welfare of a child in the second degree and the class C felony of abuse of a child. Duckett received a suspended imposition of sentence for two years, unsupervised probation and 40 hours of community service.


remarked, "Not for \$10,000."
