Iconic Christmas lights honor couple who started them over 50 years ago

Driving the stretch of Highway 76 east of Shell Knob brings a familiar, aweinspiring sight every year: a huge Christmas light display on a house on the north side. People from the area look forward to the display each year, but few know the story behind them.

Ricky and Lanetta Ray are the current masterminds behind the Christmas display, but it didn't start with them. It was Ricky's father who started the tradition 57 years ago, when electricity was first powered on in the area.

Lanetta said, "My fatherin-law loved Christmas, and he bought his first string of Christmas lights when there was first electricity in the area. He wanted his little boy to have lights."

Over the years, Loya and his wife, Dora, kept adding to their display. Sometimes that meant making decorations, sometimes that meant buying them.

Now, Lanetta and Ricky,

along with their son, Rick, his wife, Rachel, and their grandsons, Ryan, 14, and Roman, 12, spend a month each fall putting up the lights and decor, adding to them as they go along.

Lanetta said, "We have

our grandsons that help now, and we like keeping this tradition alive." The Rays have two other sons, Joshua and Brian, and their wives, Telisha and Tanja, as well as five other grandchildren, Andrew, Tiana, Nymeria, Brooke and Conner.

It isn't just their family that they are keeping the traditional live for, though. A big part of this is in memory of Loya and Dora, but the community looks forward to it, too.

"We see the smiles on people's faces in the community, and people really look forward to it. People start coming up to us in the fall, 'Are you doing the lights?' 'When are you turning them on?' We have to continue it,"

School board elections open for candidates

Area school boards opened up for candidates to file for the April election on Tuesday. Cassville, Exeter, Purdy, Southwest, Shell Knob and Wheaton all have two seats each open for candidates to file for. As per the State Statute, each of the districts have opened the filings beginning on Tuesday, December 15, at 8 a.m. and are closing on January 19, 2016, at 5 p.m.

Cassville's current board members in those positions are Greg Allen and Hal Smith. At the end of the first day of filing, candidates Chad Yarnall and Jeremy Marple filed for the open seats.

Exeter's current board members in those seats are Brad Porter and Eric O'Neill. Porter refiled for his seat, but no others thus far.

Purdy's seats that are open for filings are currently filled by Ed Mareth and Todd Schallert. Both incumbents filed for their seats.

Southwest Board members' seats filled by Bobby Stephens and Brian Robbins are up filing. No one filed for either seat the first day. Shell Knob's seats occupied by Robert Grassino and Rusty Rickard are up for election. The first day of filings, Grassino filed as well as William Kenagy III.

Wheaton's two seats are currently occupied by Kendall Haynes and Dan Goostree. No one filed for the seats the first day.

Applicants can file for their candidacy at their district's superintendent's office during regular business hours. Each of the district offices will be closed during the winter break. This year's election will be held on Tuesday, April 5, 2016.

Wreck near Monett injures four, including pedestrian

Four people were injured last week when a car was rear-ended on MO 37 two miles south of Monett. Three people were injured in the crash and, after, the wreck, a fire tanker was not put in park and rolled into a pedestrian.

According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash reports, Devin L. Fischer, 36, of Verona, was driving a 2007 Dodge Ram 3500 and was stopped to make a left turn and was rear-ended. The second driver, Jerod R. Black, 19, of Seligman, was driving a 1997 Ford Escort that was totalled in the wreck.

Black, though wearing a seat belt, received serious injuries and had to be transported to Cox South Hospital in Springfield. Fischer and his passenger, an 11-year-old boy, were taken to Cox Hospital in Monett. Fischer received moderate injuries while the boy's injuries were minor. Neither were wearing a seat belt at the time of the crash.

An additional injury occurred when a fire tanker on the scene rolled into the Ford Escort and a pedestrian. The tanker was not put into park and it rolled forward, causing moderate injuries to the pedestrian, Zona M. Williams, 43, of Monett. Williams was taken to Cox Hospital in Monett.

ERGM Fire Department earns safer rating

For residents in the Eagle Rock-Golden-Mano (ERGM) Fire District, a new safety classification could mean lowered homeowners' insurance rates.

The Department issued a press release this week, stating that their Insurance Services Operations (ISO) rating went from a level 7 Protection Class

ISO ratings are determined by a variety of factors. According to Assistant Chief Pam Stilwell, those ratings relate to water resources, the equipment on the trucks and the number of training hours they complete.

Some of the effort that

of a new fire station. Stilwell said, "We built a new station on Farm Road 1195 which covered a bunch of people. We chose that spot in particular because the saturation of people outside of a five-mile radius of a fire station. The population was the greatest there for the impact." Stilwell said that many of the people in that area went from a Class 10 rating to a Class 6. Others went from a Class 7 to a 6, which she said is still a huge improvement.

In addition to the station, the department worked on other aspects to improve that rating, as well. "We were able to accumulate some impressive training hours, as well. There are other aspects, like

testing our hoses every two years, and all of that plays into the ratings," she said.

Water access was a huge factor. "We have several accesses to water availability so that we can keep our tankers full. We also got a grant a couple years and ago, and we were able to equip our other trucks to draft water to our tankers, which means we can keep water on the fire continuously."

The Eagle Rock-Golden-Mano Fire Department has two full-time and one parttime firefighter as well as 24 volunteers. Station 1 is open Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.




Southwest FFA holds food drive



Neosho came to Cassville on Friday night and won the battle of the Wildcats, scoring a 76-44 victory on the strength of a 23-0 run in the final period. It was a disappointing finish to Cassville's home opener and Barrett Milleson's first home game as Cassville's head coach.

Nine years ago, Jason Horn was the new coach on the block in southwest Missouri, taking over a Southwest program in disarray and slowly rebuilding the Trojans into a conference and district contender. Now, Horn is in his fourth season at Neosho and that program is gaining the same kind of momentum that his system produced at Southwest.

Cassville opened the game with a three-bucket outburst from Tyler Speakman to claim a 6-2 lead with 3:55 on the first quarter clock. Neosho grabbed the lead at 9-8 when Ethan Siler drilled a trey from the top of the key a minute later.

Even though it was early, that was the tipping point of the game. Milleson's troops would not lead again in the contest.

A Speakman free throw tied the game at 9-9, but Neosho pulled to a 13-10 lead to finish the quarter.

Both teams caught fire from the field in the second quarter. After Neosho built a 21-11 lead, Tyler Arndt poured in three treys to lead Cassville to a 28-28 tie. But a Conner Johnson bomb helped Neosho to a 37-33 halftime advantage.

The third quarter was a scoreless affair until Devin Hames finished a Neosho fast break with a running teardrop to give the visitors a 39-33 lead with 5:36 on the clock. Noah Hadlow answered with a trey for Cassville, but Neosho's Siler and Lucas Werneke hit back-to-back threes to answer. Arndt threw in another bomb for Cassville to cut the lead to 45-39.

Neosho's Tanner Mitchell and Hadlow traded baskets, and Cassville trailed by 47-41 with less than a minute to go in the quarter.

The hometown Wildcats would not score again until the 2:36 mark of the fourth quarter as Neosho exploded

on a 23-0 run. A game that looked like it could turn Cassville's way turned into a running clock disappointment as Neosho took a 76-44 road win.

Cassville falls to 2-4 with the loss and will play at Carthage on Friday night. The next home game will be on January 5 when Cassville hosts Southwest. Neosho improves to 4-1 with the win.

Barry County courts send 9 to prison in the month of November

• Chritopher P. Amsden, 41, of Nixa, pled guilty to resisting arrest. Amsden was sentenced to 60 days jail incarceration with credit for 60 days already served and to pay court costs.

On June 20, 2012, officers with the Monett Police Department were dispatched to the Harlin Fruit Company in Monett regarding fuel being stolen from a semi-truck. • Lee Howard Boyette, 43, of Purdy, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and possession of a chemical with the intent to manufacture a controlled substance in 2010. Boyette's probation was revoked and he was sentenced to five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections of which he will serve 120 days of shock time.

In November 2008, Boyette got into a heated argument with his mother in which she threatened to call the Sheriff's Department. He told her not to because he had a methamphetamine lab in the barn. When officers arrived, they found multiple chemicals used in the manufacture of methamphetamine as well as pill residue and drug paraphernalia.

Officers also found syringes of methamphetamine and more paraphernalia and methamphetamine precursor chemicals in his bedroom and vehicle.

• Louis T. Briley, 44, of Berryville, Ark., pled guilty to possession of a chemical with the intent to manufacture in 2012. His probation has since been revoked and he is to serve seven years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

In January 2011, the Barry County Sheriff's Department was dispatched to 22394 Farm Road 2280 for a burglary in progress. When he arrived, Briley was inside the residence where he had removed a window screen. Just below the window were trash cans with materials consistent with the manufacture of methamphetamine. In Briley's bedroom of the residence was a pill grinder.

• Anthony Dale Buck, 46, of Purdy, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Buck was sentenced to three years incarceration with the Department of Corrections of which he will serve 120 days shock time.

In September 2014, Buck pulled out in front of a tractor and trailer on MO 37, nearly causing a collision. Buck then swerved onto the shoulder to allow the tractor to pass. Buck did not have a drivers' license because it had been suspended for alcohol. At the time, Buck was on probation for methamphetamine, and a baggie of methamphetamine and syringes were found in his vehicle.

• TJ Eric Carter, 27, of Shell Knob, pled guilty to burglary in the second degree. Carter was granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

In February 2015, Carter broke into the Pizza Hut in Shell Knob. Carter said that he was unable to open the register and only gained \$10 from the drawer. He also got into the floor safe, which was unlocked, but it was empty. Carter was a Pizza Hut employee at the time.

Carter is to serve probation until November 18, 2018.

• Chad Colba, of Carthage, pled guilty to stealing leased or rented property. Colba was given a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised proba-

In December 2014, Colba purchased two laptops, two Xbox Ones and a Playstation 4 from Payless Rental and Sales in Monett. Colba stopped paying for the merchandise and attempts to reach him when unanswered.


Colba is to serve probation until November 16, 2020.

• Derek James Cole, of Deltona, Fla., pled guilty to two counts of assault in the second degree - operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated resulting in an injury. In 2011. His probation has since been revoked and he is to serve 120 shock time of his 5 years incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections.

In June 2014, Dumas unlawfully entered the Rowdy Beaver in Cassville to engage in a fight with a man inside. Dumas jammed his finger in the victim's eye and pulled a knife, attempting to stab him. Dumas then threw a woman's phone before shoving her against walls, causing a cut on her arm.

Dumas is to serve probation until November 19, 2018.

• Dakota Ray Dunham, 22, of Union, pled guilty to sexual misconduct involving a child under the age of 15 as a first offense. Dunham was granted a suspended execution of a four year incarceration sentence and four years supervised probation.

In early 2015, Dunham took pictures of his genitals and sent them to a thirteenyear old girl on his cell phone.

Dunham is to serve probation until November 24, 2109.

• Jessica M. George, 26, of Seligman, pled guilty to two counts of possession of a controlled substance. George was granted a suspended execution of a five years incarceration sentence and will

Lowe found Holmes and another person carrying the items away from the home.

In July, Holmes filled a blue tote with items at the Monett Walmart and then walked out without paying for them. The value of the items was over \$500.

Holmes is to serve probation until November 24, 2019

• Michael Payne Huston, 37, of Garfield, Ark., pled guilty to theft/stealing and possession of a controlled substance. Huston was granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

In June 2013, Huston stole several radiators from vehicles on a property on Farm Road 2300 in Seligman. When arrested, Huston was in possession of a glass pipe in his truck that tested positive for methamphetamine.

Huston will serve probation until November 16, 2020.

• Chelsey D. Kinkead, 19, of Aurora, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and three counts of endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree. Kinkead was granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On June 8, 2015, Kinkead was found to be in possession of marijuana and a syringe of methamphetamine by the Wheaton Police Department. The drugs were in her home with three children under the age of 17.

Kinkead is to serve probation until November 25, 2020

• Anthony M. R. Merritt, 26, of Cassville, pled guilty to burglary in the second degree. Merritt was already on probation from guilty pleas in 2012 to three counts of property damage in the first degree and two counts of burglary in the second degree. Merritt's initial charges varied for four to six years incarceration on each charge. He was sentenced to two years incarceration with the Department of Corrections on the most recent burglary

On March 21, 2012, Merritt was questioned about a burglary at Lucky Strike earlier that month. Merritt admitted to cutting the wires of a security camera and the phone wires. Merritt could not pry open the doors at

Lucky Strike, but admitted to breaking into Thorco, as well. Merritt also broke into an RV parked inside Ken's Collision Center where he stole clothing and other items as well as causing damage.

Then on September 28, 2015, Merritt broke into Barry County Ready-Mix by breaking in a window. He stole a flashlight and charger as well as an air-chuck. Officers with the Cassville Police Department matched Merritt's shoes with a print left on the desk as well as bicycle tire tracks that matched his bicycle.

• Cody Lane Oplinger, 25, of Seligman, pled guilty to two counts of possession of a controlled substance. Oplinger was sentenced to four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

In September 2014, the Missouri State Highway Patrol found Oplinger's car parked on the Big Sugar Creek bridge illegally. Oplinger and his passenger were found hiding in brush in the woods. When officers searched the car, there were two baggies of methamphetamine in an empty cigarette box in the front seat.

Quick's charges originated in November 2014. Officers with the Cassville Police Department found a car parked with the passenger slumped over in the seat. Quick then drove off before officers pulled him over. Drug paraphernalia was seen in the vehicle and Quick admitted to using it to take Diladid.

• Clay A. Richardson, 44, of Aurora, pled guilty to DWI-Alcohol and driving while revoked or suspended. Richardson was sentenced to three years incarceration with the Department of Corrections with the execution of that sentence suspended and four years supervised proba-

Richardson was found passed out behind the wheel of a crashed pickup on Farm Road 2020 in Aurora. Richardson was heavily intoxicated at the scene and also admitted to smoking marijuana. Richard's drivers' license had been revoked for a ten-year minimum denial. The damage to the fence he hit included 28 fence posts before he stopped. His blood alcohol content was .306 percent. He was also found to be in possession of marijuana.

Richardson is to serve probation until November 25 2019


