Drug Court participants give back with Christmas cheer



November's General Election ballot had the Missouri Parks, Soils and Water sales tax renewal pass with the highest margin since its inception. Missouri had 80 percent of voters approve the measure, ensuring funding to parks for the next ten years.

In 2009, Governor Jay Nixon set a goal to have attendance at Missouri State Parks hit 20 million. This year was the first time the goal was met. Nixon's initiative was to reverse the decline in state park attendance over the ten years prior to 2009. Nixon also encouraged park improvements to aid in attaining

A Monett woman was arrested after allegedly throwing drugs out of her car during a traffic stop. Justine McCaffrey, 29, of Monett, was charged with possession of a controlled substance, distribution of a controlled substance and unlawful use of drug paraphernalia.

According to the affidavits of probable cause by the Barry County Sheriff's Department, McCaffrey was pulled over for failing to maintain her lane of travel and failure to use a turn signal on Tuesday, December 20, on Highway C in Purdy. When Deputy Lombard approached the vehicle, he observed McCaffrey throw items out of the passenger window.

Deputy Lombard reported that McCaffrey had thrown three clear plastic bags, a digital scale, six Clonazepam pills and a bag of 15.07 grams of crystal substance that field-tested positive for methamphetamine. When questioned, McCaffrey allegedly admitted she was transporting the methamphetamine to someone else for distribution.

McCaffrey is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$40,000 bond.

Moore was driving a 2002 Honda Civic northbound on Highway 248 when he fell asleep. The car traveled off the roadway and came to rest in a ditch.


Moore was transported to Mercy Hospital in Aurora for serious injures he sustained in the crash. He was not wearing a seat belt at the time of the crash.



the Barry County SWAT team served a search warrant at 403 4th Street in Purdy on Monday, December 19. The residence belonged to Bill Estes Dotson, 27, and his girlfriend, Larinda Mikkelson, who were not home at the time.

She stated, "They really enjoyed it. It was the most fun they'd had doing community service."

She added, "They really got to show how good they are at certain things. A couple of my clients rewired the lights. It really amazed me to see how good they were or how creative they were with their painting. It just let them showcase their talents."

Eisenbraun said that some community members have noticed the revamping of the decorations and commented about it. "The Merry Christmas sign across the street is the main one people notice," she noted.

Scott said, "The mayor was happy that someone would even offer to do something like that for the city. They don't have as many volunteers and a lot of the city's decorations are hand-me-downs. I've already heard from people talking about how nice it is."

In all, around 15 of the Drug Court's participants helped on the project. Total, they have between 35 and 40 in the program.

Scott said, "It was just so nice to see the decorations no longer look old and tattered." She also said they definitely plan to look for similar projects in the future that will help the community as well as participants in Drug Court.




