

## Davis starts term as Barry County’s new Sheriff

Barry County’s new Sheriff Gary Davis described his first day in the office as “hectic but good” after stepping into retiring Sheriff Mick Epperly’s shoes. On the agenda for his first day in the administrative office? Getting the budget turned in for the Sheriff’s Department which made for a busy first day after a three-day weekend for staff.

He stated, “In general, it’s going the way I thought it would go.”

Davis said he tried to meet with as many of the staff members as possible, as well as County Clerk Gary Youngblood to go over the budget. He said, “I had the previous years’ budgets, so I had a clue on what I was doing, but it’s still always different when you put pen to paper.”

On the agenda for this week includes a staff meeting at the jail and finishing up one-on-one interviews with staff. He said, “I have met with most of the deputies and road officers in smaller groups because we work in unique shifts and didn’t want to get everyone together right off the bat until I got my feet on the ground a little bit. I’ve seen everyone but one or two, and I’ll catch up with them today or tomorrow.”

He added, “It is just a matter of getting them scheduled and the needs of the sheriff’s office which always has to come first.”

## Epperly hangs up his holster after 20 years

Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly said goodbye to the office he’s held for 20 years as the new year began on Sunday. Epperly announced he would not be seeking reelection last February, and Gary Davis took over the department after winning the November General Election.

Epperly, who began his career in law enforcement in 1989, said he never would have guessed he would serve Barry County

as sheriff for two decades. “It’s kind of an unusual thing. I had been doing some carpenter work, and I never dreamed of being a deputy. Some people dream of what they’ll grow up to be, and I had no clue that is where my years of work would go.”

Epperly was elected sheriff in 1996 and has been reelected for five terms before deciding to retire and spend more time on his farm and with his family. In the first days of retirement,

Epperly stated, “It’s a whole lot different. I’ve got plenty to do, and I’ve got my farm here. I’m going to take it one day at a time. I hope to do a lot of fishing this spring.”

Over the years, Epperly said of all the changes to the department, the biggest was technological. He said, “The biggest change was all of the paperwork when I first got started in the office, and then we went to computers. It’s a computer-world anymore, and that helped things advance quickly.

Getting that all done was great.”

He said personally he was proud to get the Missouri Sheriff’s Association to issue “In God We Trust” on patrol vehicles, as he did in Barry County. He added, “I really enjoyed stepping up and being a leader to the county and my employees. I wanted to treat my employees the way I wanted to be treated.”

Epperly became known as the people’s sheriff through his way of serving

The Cassville Lady Wildcats, led by tournament MVP Madi Stokes, fought off the hot perimeter shooting of Pea Ridge to claim the championship trophy of the third annual girls Southwest Holiday Tournament. Stokes was unstoppable, scoring 21 points and owning the boards against the Lady Blackhawks. Avery Dayberry led Pea Ridge with 21.

Cassville opened the game with a blistering 11-0 run, fueled by three point-blank buckets from Stokes.

Stokes, a rare true center in the world of high school girls basketball, punished Pea Ridge in the paint. Jennifer Anthony’s late three was all the Lady Blackhawks managed in an 11-3 opening quarter.

But Pea Ridge switched to a suffocating full court press in the second quarter. With Stokes taking a breather, the Lady Blackhawks stormed back with a flurry of three pointers and tied the game at 15-15 with 5:18 left in the half.

Stokes answered with three more short banks off the board, and Macey Parsons added the last basket of the half to give Cassville a 26-21 lead at intermission.

Despite two more scores from Stokes, Pea Ridge reeled off a 14-6 run to claim their first lead at 35-32 with 2:08 left on the third quarter clock. Cassville’s Audra Brooks and Kandace Wallace hit critical shots to regain the lead, but Anthony buried another bomb from the wing to give Pea Ridge a 38-36 lead at the final break.

# Shell Knob teen injured in wreck, arrested for DWI

A Shell Knob teen was arrested after a suspected DWI-related wreck on Saturday, December 31, morning. According to the crash report by the Missouri State Highway Patrol, River A. Phelps, 18, of Shell Knob, was driving on MO 83 two miles outside of Golden when he wrecked and totaled the 2007 GMC Yukon he was driving.

The report stated Phelps wrecked at approximately 7 a.m. when he failed to stop at a stop sign, ran off the roadway, became airborne and came to rest in a field. Phelps was northbound on MO 83 two miles west of Golden when the crash occurred.

According to the Patrol’s online arrest reports, Phelps was arrested for driving while intoxicated, failing to stop at

a stop sign and no seatbelt at 7:30 a.m. but was released for medical treatment. The crash report stated Phelps was transported to Mercy Hospital in Rogers, Ark., for moderate injuries.

As of time of press, there is no active warrant or charges by Barry County Prosecuting Attorney Amy Boxx against Phelps for the arrest.

alongside his deputies and involvement in the community. He was particularly dedicated to the D.A.R.E. program and hosted an annual bass tournament to help fund it.

Epperly said, “A lot of people say you can’t be their boss and be their friend, but I disagree with that. I kept my leadership role with what they needed to do, but they were my friends and my brothers.”

Epperly’s staff held a retirement party for him that ended up being standing room only in a courtroom at the Barry County Judicial Center last week.

Wednesday afternoon, December 28, let Barry County’s citizens say goodbye to the man who stood at the helm of law enforcement for 20 years.



# Cassville, Wheaton boys claim Holiday Tournament wins

It was no surprise that Pea Ridge bludgeoned Forsyth, 89-59, in the finals of the boys side of the Southwest Holiday Tournament. Joey Hall poured in 31 points as the Blackhawks dished up another tournament championship in Washburn on Thursday night.

Galena salvaged some Missouri pride, taking the third-place contest over Gentry, 66-61.

But for local fans, the fireworks came in the early afternoon games.

The Wheaton Bulldogs downed Ozark 7 Conference neighbor Exeter, 58-50.

After painful losses to Pea Ridge and Cassville, Exeter threw a serious scare at Wheaton in the seventh-place game. Cory Duke's Tigers lit up the scoreboard from outside, taking a 14-11 lead over the Bulldogs at the first break.

Jared Alverson, Exeter's sophomore point guard,

opened the second quarter with a pair of free throws to give the Tigers their biggest lead at 16-11. Wheaton responded with a 10-2 run to take a 23-21 lead when Klay Reed came up with a backcourt steal and lay-up with 6:24 left in the half.

Then Alverson left the game with an injury late in the second quarter, and Ethan Caddell was forced to sit with three fouls soon after. With two starters on the bench, the Tigers watched the Bulldogs spurt to a 33-28 halftime lead.

Wheaton pushed the lead to 43-35 in a low-scoring third quarter, and maintained that margin for the 58-50 final score.

Hilsden Mosely and Klay Reed both scored 16 to lead the Bulldogs.

In a rematch of their Marionville Tournament contest, Cassville met Southwest in the consolation final. There was no overtime this time around, with the Wildcats

taking a 65-60 victory.

Cassville jumped out to a 13-5 lead with Ethan Hoppes and Collin Pearman both scoring twice in the first five minutes. Two more Pearman baskets led to the Wildcats owning a 19-12 lead at the first break.

Trey Dalton led a Cassville onslaught to start the second period. His basket at the 5:19 mark gave the Wildcats a 27-14 lead. The Trojans cut the lead to 31-24 when Tanner Leonhardt converted a pair of free throws. Solomon Rainey followed a miss in the lane as time ran down to give Cassville a 35-26 halftime lead.

Tom Brady must have let the air out of the ball for the 8-8 third quarter, but the scoring heated up in the final eight minutes.

The Wildcats stretched the lead back to double digits, as two Pearman baskets sandwiched a Luke Lowery free throw for a 58-48 score with just 2:33 remaining. The

Trojans answered with a 12-5 run, fueled by three bombs from Devon Resz. Fouled on the third trey, Resz completed the four-point play to lift Southwest within a single score at 63-60.

Only 16 seconds remained.

While Davis said his first day was hectic, he also said it was a good day for the department. “We went out there and did right for Barry County today and got bad guys off the street today.”

Davis continued,”The employees have been super, and enthusiasm is great. I think everyone is really out there and ready to work.”

With the Department under the direction of Epperly for two decades, staff and deputies had a firm grasp on office operations as they had been. Davis said, “It was like a typical Monday with the holiday. One person called in sick and others had to step in to those duties since we don’t have a surplus around here. But we got it done. We had a lot of people in to renew their sex offender registrations and concealed carry permits. Which I’m glad they are, because with Missouri having Constitutional carry, you can carry legally without a permit, but if you go down to Garfield, Arkansas, that is a felony charge.”

Davis said that he hopes people continue to get the permit even with the law change. He said, “I just think it’s always good to be able to say you’ve had training.”

With his first day in the office under his belt, Davis said his plans for department improvements remain on the same track as when he began his campaign. “Fortunately, the first was a quiet day and nothing out of the ordinary. The transition has been really smooth between Mick and myself. Everyone does things a little different, but I’m getting that all under control, one block at a time, just like building a house.

“Mick has been the foundation here. There are things that can be improved after him, just like when I leave the office, and someone can improve on what I have done after my four or eight years. We can make things better for the citizens of Barry County, and that is the only reason I’m doing this job.”

## Barry Electric right-of-way maintenance begins

Barry Electric has contracted with Poor Boy Tree Service, Inc. to trim trees in the right-of-ways in the Cassville area. Poor Boy will provide forestry services to maintain rights-of-ways that include cutting, clearing, chipping, brush clearing and removal of vegetation in the right-of-way of both primary and secondary lines.

Poor Boy will begin work the first week of January and the project may take as much as eight to nine months to complete. All Poor Boy Tree Services, Inc., vehicles will be marked with their company logo and their employees will also have identification.

The cooperative has contracted with Asplundh Tree Expert Company to do individual work order right-of-way maintenance. Asplundh will be taking care of individual tree problems on the cooperative's system.

Vaught Tree Service continues to do right-of-way maintenance in the Seligman area and will begin work later this year on two circuits out of the north Cassville substation.

Safe, reliable power is Barry Electric's goal and right-of-way maintenance is a large part of meeting that goal. Lives and livelihood depend on the flow of safe and affordable power that's there when it is needed, and few things threaten flow as much as trees and other plants that grow too high or come to close to power lines.

A significant percentage of the outages that the cooperative experiences each year are caused when trees and power lines come into contact with each other. Besides the inconvenience

of the loss of power, there is a risk to the safety of the individuals, animals or property in the area.

Barry Electric asks that residents work with their contractors as they work to maintain the rights-of-ways to reduce the chance of tree/vegetation caused outages in the future.
