Two dead in Washburn shooting, kidnapped child found safe

The man accused of killing a woman and her grandfather and kidnapping a two year old was arrested Monday evening and is awaiting extradition back to Barry County.

Christopher Lee Paschall, 37, Springdale, Ark., allegedly showed up at Herbert Townsend's residence on Farm Road 1055 near 8th Street in Washburn and shot his ex-girlfriend Casie Brace, 29, and her grandfather, Townsend, 76, before kidnapping he and Brace's daughter, Alli Paschall, and taking her back to Springdale.

The Barry County Sheriff's Department received a call from the residence on Monday, January 5, but according to the affidavit of probable cause, the dispatchers could not understand what the male caller was saying. When Deputy Bill Watkins entered the home, he saw Brace on the floor but could not find her pulse. He heard Townsend moan from across the

room. Townsend was holding a rifle but dropped the weapon when he saw Watkins.

When Watkins asked, "Who did this?", Townsend told him it was Chris Paschall. Paschall and Brace had a tumultuous relationship, according to Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly. He said that Paschall had been stalking Brace for months. He also confirmed that she had taken out an order of protection against him but the stalking hadn't stopped.

According to court records, Paschall had an order of protection filed against him for adult abuse stalking in October and was charged twice with violating that order since then. Paschall was charged in October for violating the order and then again on December 15.

Without Townsend's keeping his wits about him, officers would not have found the child safe and taken Paschall into custody as quickly as they did. Sheriff Mick Epperly stated,

"I had one of his family members say that he was a hero, and he absolutely was. He was shot four times and still was able to reach a phone and call 911. Even though he was suffering, he was able to pass along that information on what we needed. What a hero."

An Amber Alert was issued for Alli around 4:38 p.m. on Monday afternoon but cancelled shortly after when Paschall was found at his parents' house in Springdale, Ark. Epperly said that they relied on a cell phone signal from the immediate area of his parents' residence, but his car was parked some distance from the home. Epperly said, "When officers reached the house, Chris's father said that he was upstairs, and they saw the little girl there safe, which was a blessing." He said that Paschall was taken into custody without incident.

Paschall now faces three charges in Barry County: class A felony murder in the first degree, class A felony assault in the first degree and felony armed criminal action. His warrant includes a \$1,000,000 bond, but Paschall is still held in the Washington County Jail.

Townsend was taken to a hospital in Springfield for treatment, but succumbed to his injuries later that night.

Brace was the mother of three children, two of them with Paschall, according to Epperly. The two older children were not in the home during the shooting because they were at school. Epperly said that the youngest, Alli, is currently in child protective custody in Arkansas, but the other children are with family members, he believes.

Paschall is currently being held in the Washington County Jail in Fayetteville, Ark. According to jail records, Paschall is facing possession of a firearm, possession of drug paraphernalia and theft by receiving in Washington County, Ark., Circuit

Court. Epperly said that he isn't sure when he will be brought back to Barry County to be arraigned.

Epperly said, "If he didn't have any charges against him down in Arkansas, we would probably get him back here this week assuming he signed the waiver of extradition without any issues. But since he has charges there, too, I'm not sure when he'll be brought up here. We will get him arraigned as soon as possible."



A substantial fish kill in Monett was linked to Monett's Tyson plant and charges were filed against the company.


A SWEPCO rehearing looked promising to Barry County residents that the power line would not pass through the county.





• Roger Dale Balch, 20, Cassville, pled guilty to property damage in the first degree, tampering with a witness in a felony prosecution, and assault in the third degree. Balch was given a suspended imposition of sentence, 100 hours of community service, and restitution on the charges related to property damage and tampering with a witness. He received a suspended imposition of sentence and two years supervised probation for the assault charge.

On July 21, 2014, the Cassville Police Department took a report regarding property damage at the Cassville City Park. A picnic table's securing cable had been ripped out, the top of the table had been burned and the pavilion had carvings in the wood.

In October, an officer questioned three subjects at the park and asked if they knew who had done the damage. One of them had seen Balch damage the tables. Later, Balch threatened the witness, and said that if she didn't recant her story, he would stab her. He also showed her a knife that he had on him.

• Gary Barnett, 45, Monett, pled guilty to burglary in the second degree and delivering a controlled substance to a jail. Barnett was sentenced to four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On March 25, 2013, the Monett Police Department found Barnett in possession of a spool of copper wire stolen from the City of Monett worth around \$158. Barnett was planning to strip it and

Then, on October 9, 2014, Barnett entered the Barry County Jail while in possession of marijuana, resulting in the charge for attempt to possess a controlled substance in a jail.

• Hollister Benz, 35, Purdy, pled guilty to domestic assault in the second degree. He was sentenced to three years in the DOC.

On August 4, 2014, the Barry County Sheriff's Department was dispatched to a domestic violence call on Farm Road 2115 in Purdy. Benz had attempted to cause serious physical injury to the victim by repeatedly punching her and giving her two black eyes, a cut under her upper lip, under her tongue and a broken nose.

• Brianna S. Bettencourt, 24, Monett, pled guilty to two counts of possession of a controlled substance in 2013, her probation has since been revoked. She originally received a suspended imposition of sentencing. That has been amended to a suspended execution of a seven year sentence and five years supervised probation.

On June 30, 2012, the Barry County Sheriff's Office responded to a call at an address on State Highway 76 in Cassville. While at the residence, they found a pipe in plain sight that field-tested positive for methamphetamine. In the burn pile, there was also a cut lithium battery and a bag of methamphetamine and a tin-foil pipe

in Bettencourt's purse.

Then, on November 19, 2013, Bettencounrt had 4.3 grams of marijuana in her purse along with three Clonazepam pills.

Bettencourt is to serve probation until December 2,

• Justin Edward Branham, 31, Marionville, pled guilty to DWI-Alcohol as an aggravated offender, driving while revoked as a subsequent offense and failing to wear a seat belt. Branham was sentenced to four years incarceration and a \$10 fine for the seat belt violation.

On November 3, 2014, the Missouri State Highway Patrol pulled Branham over for going 68 miles per hour in a 55 mph zone on Route Z. Branham then identified himself, stated that he did not have a license and that he had at least five beers before driving. His blood alcohol level was 0.13 percent.

Sarah Leighann Brooks, 19, Garfield, Ark., pled guilty to stealing a motor vehicle, burglary in the second degree, and possession of a chemical with the intent to manufacture a controlled substance. Brooks received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

In March of 2014, Brooks

and her boyfriend broke into a residence in Barry County and stole over \$500 worth of items, a .22 caliber rifle and a 1990 Lincoln Town Car. Officers found the car and some of the property during a search at a residence where the couple was staying in Garfield, Ark.

On October 29, 2014, the Southwest Missouri Drug Task Force found burnt lithium strips, Sudafed blister packs and a burnt shaken-bake container for making methamphetamine at the residence where Brooks

Brooks is to serve probation until December 16,

• Charles R. Brown, 42, Purdy, pled guilty to DWI-Alcohol as a persistent offender. He was sentenced to three years incarceration with the DOC.

On March 16, 2014, Charles Roy Brown was arrested after hitting a pedestrian with his vehicle in a parking lot of an apartment complex on South Hill Street in Wheaton. According to evidence and witnesses, Brown slid in his vehicle and hit the victim who was transported to Cox Hospital in Monett with injuries to his lower leg. Brown refused a breath test, but officers received a warrant for a blood alcohol test. Brown had two prior DWI convictions and one felony involving a motor vehicle on his record.

• Jeremy A. Cape, 31, Cassville, pled guilty to three counts of possession of a controlled substance related to three separate incidents. His probation has since been revoked. Brown is to serve

five years incarceration with the DOC.

Cape was found to be in possession of methamphetamine on three different occasions in July 2013, March 2014, and June 2014.

· Cody Wayne Cherry, Purdy, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and received a suspended execution of a four year sentence and supervised probation.

The Cassville Police Department searched a residence on Farm Road 1142 on January 5, 2014. While conducting a search, Cherry had a backpack in his possession that contained a piece of tin foil with white residue and cut straws. Cherry also had a marijuana pipe in his pocket and a baggie of methamphetamine in his wallet.

Cody is to serve probation until December 19, 2019.

· Kathryn Reane Dailey, Seligman, pled guilty to two counts of theft/stealing, two counts of possession of a controlled substance and one count of manufacturing a controlled substance since 2009. Her probation has since been revoked.

In 2009, Dailey was arrested for stealing a trailer from a residence on State Highway NN in Seligman. In May 2010, Dailey was found to be in possession of a small amount of methamphetamine and paraphernalia. In March 2011, the Southwest Missouri Drug Task Force arrested Dailey again for methamphetamine during a meth lab bust in Seligman on Farm Road 1050.

Finally, in 2013 Dailey was caught on a game camera stealing a flat bed utility trailer, antique and metal items with two other people.

• Trevor W. Davis, Pierce City, pled guilty to two counts of receiving stolen property from an arrest in 2010. His probation has since been revoked and he is to serve three years incarceration with the

In July 2010, Davis and two other suspects attempted to pawn two guitars that had been stolen from the Chapel of Grace Church and Faith Church, both in Monett.



The Southwest Trojans have always been painted as the underdog when they play Cassville. Just like the Arkansas-Texas rivalry, Southwest gets jacked up to the tenth power for the chance to play their Barry County neigh-

The Trojans have pulled off some memorable wins over the Wildcats. On Tuesday night, they did it again.

In a foul-plagued game that was most remarkable for the lack of scoring in the first half, Southwest came to life in the fourth quarter and then took control in overtime as Rusty Roe's squad claimed a 69-65 win at Washburn.

Blake Barnes led Southwest with 19 points, Robbie Randall scored 18, and Brad Daniels added 16. Riley Lekarczyk led Cassville with his game-high 21 points.

The Trojans are known for their inside-outside scoring duo of Daniels and Barnes. Against Cassville, the outside touch just wasn't there. Barnes connected twice from outside the arc and that was all Southwest could muster from long range. Daniels was saddled with early foul trouble and retired from the game in the fourth quarter.

The Wildcats had their own share of shooting woes though and could not take advantage. Danny Powers watched his team take an 11-9 lead at the end of the first quarter when Josh Brown nailed a right-wing jumper to beat the buzzer.

Both teams struggled in the second quarter. The Wildcats churned to an 18-11 lead at the 3:58 mark, but

the the Trojans pulled within two points when James Sellars tipped in a miss by Orion Lawyer to create a 24-22 game. Then Speakman scored late in the paint for Cassville, and the Wildcats held a 24-20 lead at intermission.



The Barry County Health Department is announced that 20 food establishments in Barry County are recipients of the 2014 Silver Spoon award. The awards are presented to food establishments in Barry County that did not have any priority or core health violations between January 1 and December 31, 2014.

This is the sixth year that the health department has recognized establishments for demonstrating excellence in public food safety through the Silver Spoon award. The frequency of inspection of each food establishment is determined by public health priority, which is calculated by a risk assessment worksheet. Establishments are rated as high, medium or low priority.

The Central Crossing Senior Center in Shell Knob, the Cassville Intermediate School, and Jack Henry Cafeteria in Monett are recipients of the 2014 Silver Spoon Award. These establishments are all rated high and are inspected a minimum of three times per year.

Kountry Kitchen Katering and The Red Barn Antiques, both in Shell Knob, and Daylight Donuts in Monett have medium priority ratings and are recipients of the Silver Spoon Award. Establishments with a medium priority rating are inspected a minimum of twice a year.




"This long-running conference will look at researched-based tions to address common production issues on area farms. The information will provide 'tried and true' management tools to support local farmers who feed the rest of us," said Tim Schnakenberg, an agronomy specialist with University of Missouri Extension in Galena.

The planning committee, which was made up of Lawrence County farmers, has planned topics that should be of interest to both livestock and crop producers in 2015.
