Two dead in Washburn shooting, kidnapped child found safe

The man accused of killing a woman and her grandfather and kidnapping a two year old was arrested Monday evening and is awaiting extradition back to Barry County.

Christopher Lee Paschall, 37, Springdale, Ark., allegedly showed up at Herbert Townsend's residence on Farm Road 1055 near 8th Street in Washburn and shot his ex-girlfriend Casie Brace, 29, and her grandfather, Townsend, 76, before kidnapping he and Brace's daughter, Alli Paschall, and taking her back to Springdale.

The Barry County Sheriff's Department received a call from the residence on Monday, January 5, but according to the affidavit of probable cause, the dispatchers could not understand what the male caller was saying. When Deputy Bill Watkins entered the home, he saw Brace on the floor but could not find her pulse. He heard Townsend moan from across the

room. Townsend was holding a rifle but dropped the weapon when he saw Watkins.

When Watkins asked, "Who did this?", Townsend told him it was Chris Paschall. Paschall and Brace had a tumultuous relationship, according to Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly. He said that Paschall had been stalking Brace for months. He also confirmed that she had taken out an order of protection against him but the stalking hadn't stopped.

According to court records, Paschall had an order of protection filed against him for adult abuse stalking in October and was charged twice with violating that order since then. Paschall was charged in October for violating the order and then again on December 15.

Without Townsend's keeping his wits about him, officers would not have found the child safe and taken Paschall into custody as quickly as they did. Sheriff Mick Epperly stated,

"I had one of his family members say that he was a hero, and he absolutely was. He was shot four times and still was able to reach a phone and call 911. Even though he was suffering, he was able to pass along that information on what we needed. What a hero."

An Amber Alert was issued for Alli around 4:38 p.m. on Monday afternoon but cancelled shortly after when Paschall was found at his parents' house in Springdale, Ark. Epperly said that they relied on a cell phone signal from the immediate area of his parents' residence, but his car was parked some distance from the home. Epperly said, "When officers reached the house, Chris's father said that he was upstairs, and they saw the little girl there safe, which was a blessing." He said that Paschall was taken into custody without incident.

Paschall now faces three charges in Barry County: class A felony murder in the first degree, class A felony

assault in the first degree and felony armed criminal action. His warrant includes a \$1,000,000 bond, but Paschall is still held in the Washington County Jail.

Townsend was taken to a hospital in Springfield for treatment, but succumbed to his injuries later that night.

Brace was the mother of three children, two of them with Paschall, according to Epperly. The two older children were not in the home during the shooting because they were at school. Epperly said that the youngest, Alli, is currently in child protective custody in Arkansas, but the other children are with family members, he believes.

Paschall is currently being held in the Washington County Jail in Fayetteville, Ark. According to jail records, Paschall is facing possession of a firearm, possession of drug paraphernalia and theft by receiving in Washington County, Ark., Circuit

Court. Epperly said that he isn't sure when he will be brought back to Barry County to be arraigned.

Epperly said, "If he didn't have any charges against him down in Arkansas, we would probably get him back here this week assuming he signed the waiver of extradition without any issues. But since he has charges there, too, I'm not sure when he'll be brought up here. We will get him arraigned as soon as possible."



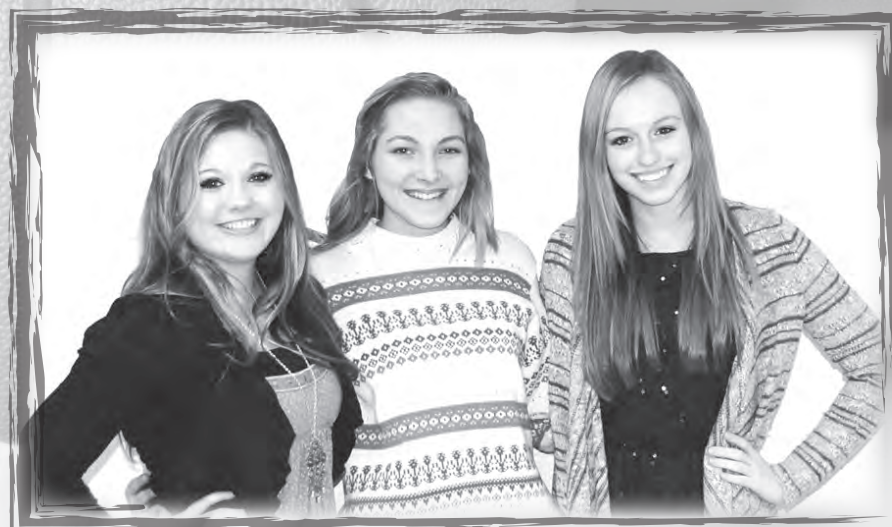

Southwest powers past Cassville in OT

The Southwest Trojans have always been painted as the underdog when they play Cassville. Just like the Arkansas-Texas rivalry, Southwest gets jacked up to the tenth power for the chance to play their Barry County neighbors.

The Trojans have pulled off some memorable wins over the Wildcats. On Tuesday night, they did it again.

In a foul-plagued game that was most remarkable for the lack of scoring in the first half, Southwest came to life in the fourth quarter and then took control in overtime as Rusty Roe's squad claimed a 69-65 win at Washburn.

Blake Barnes led Southwest with 19 points, Robbie Randall scored 18, and Brad Daniels added 16. Riley Lekarczyk led Cassville with his game-high 21 points.

The Trojans are known for their inside-outside scoring duo of Daniels and Barnes. Against Cassville, the outside touch just wasn't there. Barnes connected twice from outside the arc and that was all Southwest could muster from long range. Daniels was saddled with early foul trouble and retired from the game in the fourth quarter.

The Wildcats had their own share of shooting woes though and could not take advantage. Danny Powers watched his team take an 11-9 lead at the end of the first quarter when Josh Brown nailed a right-wing jumper to beat the buzzer.

Both teams struggled in the second quarter. The Wildcats churned to an 18-11 lead at the 3:58 mark, but

the the Trojans pulled within two points when James Sellars tipped in a miss by Orion Lawyer to create a 24-22 game. Then Speakman scored late in the paint for Cassville, and the Wildcats held a 24-20 lead at intermission.

The game became a foul fest in the third quarter, which helped keep the scoreboard moving for both teams. Southwest fell behind by 7 again at 29-22, but clawed back to a 36-36 tie when Barnes nailed a bomb to finish a fast break with less than a minute on the clock.

Allen Lambell reclaimed the lead for Cassville, hitting the front end of a pair of free throws, but then Barnes threw in a long trey to give Southwest a 39-37 lead at the end of the third quarter.

Momentum seemed to be clearly on Southwest's side until Daniels fouled out with 2:27 to play in the fourth quarter and the game tied at 47-47.

Rusty Roe has been there before. When the race cars sputter, Roe turns to the diesel.

Robbie Randall, Southwest's burly center, took over the remainder of regulation. Randall nailed two freebies to give the Trojans a 51-49 lead at the 1:26 mark, and added a field goal in the final minute. But Josh Brown and Gabe Kirk met the challenge for Cassville, and the score stood at 53-53 with 15 ticks left on the clock.

Barnes hit two big free throws for Southwest, and then Brown scored with an offensive rebound to tie the game with two seconds left.

Overtime.

Randall scored half of his team's 14 points in the four-minute overtime stanza to propel the Trojans to the win.

Barnes went one-on-one to open the period, scoring with a pretty scoop shot in the lane before Speakman scored three the hard way to give the Wildcats their last lead at 58-57. Free throws by Randall and Sellars put the Trojans back in front to stay, and Roe's troops hit six of eight pressure-packed free throws in the final minute to seal the victory at 69-65.

For the game, Southwest hit 19 of 30 free throws, and Cassville connected on 17 of 23 tosses.

"We found a way to win a sloppy game," said Southwest's Roe after the contest.

Southwest evened its record at 5-5 with the win, while Cassville dipped to 3-8.

The Barry County Health Department is announced that 20 food establishments in Barry County are recipients of the 2014 Silver Spoon award. The awards are presented to food establishments in Barry County that did not have any priority or core health violations between January 1 and December 31, 2014.

This is the sixth year that the health department has recognized establishments for demonstrating excellence in public food safety through the Silver Spoon award. The frequency of inspection of each food establishment is determined by public health priority, which is calculated by a risk assessment worksheet. Establishments are rated as high, medium or low priority.

The Central Crossing Senior Center in Shell Knob, the Cassville Intermediate School, and Jack Henry Cafeteria in Monett are recipients of the 2014 Silver Spoon Award. These establishments

are all rated high and are inspected a minimum of three times per year.

Kountry Kitchen Katering and The Red Barn Antiques, both in Shell Knob, and Daylight Donuts in Monett have medium priority ratings and are recipients of the Silver Spoon Award. Establishments with a medium priority rating are inspected a minimum of twice a year.

A total of fourteen establishments with a low priority rating achieved the Silver Spoon. Low priorities are

inspected at least once a year. In Monett, Mr. B's Frozen Yogurt (Bruner's Pharmacy), Monett Plaza 8 Theatre, Show-Me-Twice the Ice, La Duranguena, Herd's General Store, and Modern Variety were all recipients. In Cassville, Nita's Cakes, Cassville Bowl and Roaring River State Park Store received the award. Other recipients included Lakeside Marine and King's River Golf Course in Shell Knob, The Calico Goose in Eagle Rock, Lucky T's in Seligman and J & S Flo-

ral in Exeter.

The Health Department congratulated the establishments and presented them with certificates, hoping to encourage all food establishments to strive to provide the safest food to Barry County residents.

Soils and Crops Conference

The 91st annual Lawrence County Soils and Crops Conference will be held from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m., Thursday, Jan. 8, at the Southwest Research Center located at 14548 State Hwy H, southwest of Mt. Vernon.

"This long-running conference will look at researched-based solutions to address common production issues on area farms. The information will provide 'tried and true' management tools to support local farmers who feed the rest of us," said Tim Schnakenberg, an agronomy specialist with University of Missouri Extension in Galena.

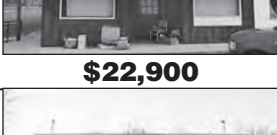

Pizza Hut offering new menu choices CASK plans for new year's events

Diners who have been to Pizza Hut in Cassville may have noticed some new items on the menu lately. In addition to new individual apple pies and an expanded kids' menu, the restaurant is now offering several new pizzas, sandwiches and appetizers.

WingStreet buffalo wings are one of the most popular new appetizers appearing at the restaurant. According to Deborah Johns, manager of the Cassville Pizza Hut, demand for the wings has been steady since they were introduced in November. "They are selling very well," she said. "The demand for them has been picking up."

The wings come in three styles: traditional, bone-out and breaded bone-in. There are also eight flavors available, ranging from the mild Honey BBQ to the super-spicy Buffalo Burnin' Hot. The flavors are: Naked, Sweet Chili, Garlic Parmesan, Spicy BBQ, Honey BBQ, Honey Sriracha, Buffalo Mild, Buffalo Medium and Buffalo Burnin' Hot. An order of eight wings costs \$6.99.

Another new appetizer is the fried cheese sticks. These deep-fried mozzarella sticks come with a marinara dipping sauce. An individual order of five sticks costs \$5, while a family order of 10 is \$8.

Three new sandwiches have also made an appearance on Pizza Hut's menu. Customers can now choose from the Honey BBQ Chicken, Chicken Parmesan or Roasted Turkey Provolone sandwiches when they sit down to order at the restaurant. The Honey BBQ Chicken and Chicken Parmesan sandwiches cost \$7, while the Roasted Turkey Provolone is \$6. According to Johns, all of the sandwiches now come with fries.

A new line of pizzas can also now be found at the restaurant. According to Johns, one of the most popular is the Giddy-Up BBQ Chicken pizza. This pizza comes with BBQ sauce, smoked chicken, bacon and onions with toasted cheddar on the crust's edge and a BBQ drizzle. Others include the Pretzel Piggy and Sweet Sriracha Dyna-

mite.

Pizza Hut is now offering lower-calorie pizzas they call Skinny Flavors. According to Johns, these pizzas have only 250 calories or less per slice. These include the Skinny Beach, which has crushed tomato sauce, grilled chicken, fresh red onions, Peruvian cherry peppers and fresh spinach. There is also Skinny with a Kick for those wanting something spicier, Skinny Luau, Skinny Italy and Skinny Club. All pizzas cost \$13 for a medium and \$15 for a large.

To satisfy diners with a sweet tooth, Pizza Hut now offers individual apple pies which cost \$4 for an order of six, and for the younger members of the family, they offer a kid's meal that includes chicken tenders and fries.

Pizza Hut is located at 34 Main Street in Cassville. Store hours for the Cassville location are 11 a.m. to 10 p.m. Sunday through Thursday and 11 a.m. to 11 p.m. Friday and Saturday. For more information, call (417) 847-5503. All menu items can also be ordered online at pizzahut.com.
