

Three arrested in Monett drug bust

Cassville's 2017 Tip-Off King and Queen crowned

A search warrant served by the Ozarks Drug Enforcement Team (ODET) and the Barry County SWAT Team resulted in the arrest of three people in Monett on Wednesday, January 25. The search resulted in the seizure of 13.5 grams of suspected methamphetamine, 51 hydrocodone pills and 37 clonazepam, according to a press release by ODET commander Chad Allison. Two suspects were arrested on drug charges and a third was arrested for a parole violation warrant out.

ODET and the SWAT Team were serving a search warrant for Danny Rogers, 64, of Monett, on Farm Road 2030 on January 25, according to the affidavit of probable cause. Once the residence was secured, officers said they found pills wrapped in cellophane in a pill bottle that Cam Banks, 46, of Monett, admitted to being his. The pills were two alprazolam. Banks also had two warrants out for his arrest.

While in the residence, officers reported to have found a .22 rifle in Rogers' bedroom, but he was not at home at the time. While speaking with people inside the house, officers noticed Rogers drive up. A search of Rogers' residence yielded a glasses case of 13.2 grams of methamphetamine, as well as a can containing 51 repressain and 37 clonazepam, according to the probable cause.

Rogers allegedly told officers he was selling methamphetamine to "make ends meet."

One other person was in the home at the time of the search. Woodrow Weatherford, 48, of Mt. Vernon, was charged with distribution of a controlled substance and unlawful possession of a firearm after a search was conducted of his residence on Lawrence 2100 in Mt. Vernon in December 2016.

On December 2, officers searched the residence and found large quantities of methamphetamine that were "dealing quantities," according to the affidavit of probable cause. Weatherford and

Tammy Annette Dodson were charged following that search.

Rogers is charged with unlawful possession of a firearm and delivery of a controlled substance. Rogers was released from the Barry County Jail after posting a \$25,000 bond. Weatherford was released from the Barry County Jail after posting a \$150,000 bond. He is charged with distribution of a controlled substance and unlawful possession of a firearm in December in Lawrence County.

Banks is still being held in the Barry County Jail on a \$15,263 bond, which includes a parole violation of nonsupport and charges of possession of a controlled substance.

Locals to make quilts for vets on National Sew Day

On Saturday, February 4, local quilters will take part in a nationwide day, volunteering their time and abilities to make quilts for active service members and veterans. The National QOV (Quilts of Valor) Sew Day is this Saturday, and local quilters are taking part at Stitches in Cassville.

The Quilts of Valor Foundation began in 2003. To date, the organization has given away over 151,000 quilts to veterans who have been affected by war. Each year, one day is set aside as their sew day to encourage quilters across the country to help sew a block together to honor veterans.

Stitches is holding their event in partnership with the Shell Knob VFW for their Memorial Day awards ceremony. Quilts made by those participating will be given away at the ceremony.

According to Sharon Smith, "You do not need to bring anything but your self, we will have block kits for you to come in and sew together, then those blocks will be put together to make quilts for our Memorial Day awards ceremony in coordination with the Shell Knob VFW."

During the event, quilters can spend as much or as little time as they would like. Smith asked for quilters to sign up in advance for a time slot to make the most of the time they have during the day. Anyone who preregisters gets assigned

a number which will be put in a drawing for prizes throughout the day.

Smith said this year's grand prize is a free admission to the QOVF annual conference in Colorado Springs, Col., and includes a gift bag and exclusive events. She added that members would not need to sign up through QOVF, and they she would take care of that through her shop's registration with the organization. Prizes also include fat quarters, quilt books, tools and accessories.

The shop will have block kits for quilters ready to sew on Saturday. Smith said, "I will have machines threaded, set up and ready to sew."

Shell Knob man in case for alleged domestic assault

A Shell Knob man was arrested last Thursday for an alleged domestic assault on Channel Cat Lane in Shell Knob. According to the affidavit of probable cause by the Barry County Sheriff's Department, Joseph S. Bickel, 36, shoved his girlfriend out of the house and wouldn't allow her back in.

Officers responded to the argument and reported Bickel had shoved his girlfriend out of the house without shoes or socks on in cold temperatures and wouldn't allow her back in. When the victim went to a neighbor's home to get warm, Bickel allegedly forced entry into the home, causing \$250 worth of damage.

Officers reported that Bickel would not leave the home.

Bickel is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$50,000 bond. He is charged with burglary in the first degree, property damage in the second degree and domestic assault in the fourth degree as a first offense.

Alleged Purdy burglar caught

A Purdy man was taken into police custody after officers allegedly found stolen items in his apartment in Purdy. David Britt Henry, of Purdy, is charged with burglary in the second degree and stealing more than \$750 in value.

According to the affidavit of probable cause, the Barry County Sheriff's Department received information from the Ozarks Drug Enforcement Team (ODET) that Henry had been burglarizing a residence outside of the Purdy city limits and was in

possession of the property on January 25.

The Barry County Sheriff's Department made contact with Henry through a traffic stop in Henry's apartment complex parking lot where they located some of the stolen property.

The home that had been burglarized was located on Farm Road 2105. Officers found evidence of forced entry, including burglary with items in disarray. The home belonged to a woman who had passed away in April 2016.

Inside Henry's apartment, officers found: a trunk with blue and white dishes, a mandolin, electric guitar, Concord amplifier, antique wall clock, afghan, three antique locks, smoking pipe, green trunk with knives and a jewelry box, antique trunk, computer, two Troy Built weed eaters/brush cutters, two antique lanterns, trunk with English brass, tool box with miscellaneous tools and two hypodermic needles that field-tested positive for methamphetamine.

Henry is being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$25,000 bond.



Cassville falls to Pierce City

The Cassville Wildcats let one get away when they played Pierce City at Friday's Tip Off game. Pierce City opened the final quarter with a 9-0 run and finished with an 11-0 spurt to earn the 56-44 victory.

Moreland scored to give the Eagles a brief lead, but Hoppes threw in a runner from the left wing to knot the score at 33-33 with 2:03 on the clock.

Pearman drove the left side of the lane and scored with an underhand scoop as time ran down, and Cassville held that 35-33 lead at the final break.

But with Wolf on the bench, Pierce City exploded with a 9-0 run to open the fourth quarter. Cassville fought back and cut the lead to 42-41 on a Lowery score with 4:02 to play. A Moreland trey and a storm of free throws buried Cassville's comeback hopes as Pierce City finished the game with an 11-0 run.

Pierce City's Hunter Tindell led all scorers with 18. Trey Dalton topped Cassville with 14.

Cabin Fever Reliever 20K produces state records

Cold weather training is tough, especially for us old guys. Speed work is out of the question, unless an unusually warm day occurs. Long runs are a challenge with daylight savings a distant memory. Dedicated distance runners do what they can, and hope to avoid a train wreck when the first race of the new year rolls around.

The Cabin Fever Reliever in Rogersville was originally scheduled for Saturday, January 14. But the predicted ice storm that had area weathermen and superintendents crying "The sky is falling" led to the race being postponed a week.

Good call. On race day, the temps were a balmy 45 degrees at 9 AM, and most runners toed the starting line in shorts and singlets.

This was just the second year for this race, sponsored by the Ozark Mountain Ridge Runners from Springfield. Ron Boyer designed the course and he assured me it was "fast and flat". It turned out to be quite hilly, but the times were fast for the middle of winter.

Springfield's Doug Assenmacher led wire to wire, winning with a time of 1:22:29. That's averaging 6:38 per mile for twelve and a half miles.

Amy Vedder, a 17-year old

runner from Rogersville, was the women's champion, running 1:32:01. She was impressive and I expect to see her running in college next year.

John Howland, of Jefferson City, is a Missouri road racing legend. John came to Rogersville holding 13 state records. I have raced John on several occasions at several different distances, and have never beaten him. Until that day at Rogersville.

We ran side by side through six miles, although John tried to drop me with planned accelerations a few times. I managed to hang on, and then he struggled going up the biggest hill. I shot by him and wondered if I could hold on for another six miles.

I could barely see Vedder ahead on the hills. To the best of my knowledge, I was running in sixth place overall. I held off Howland and couple of fast closers to maintain my position. But when I checked, the finish results showed me in fourth.

I found out later that two of the young guns who chased Assenmacher through the early going disappeared off the course. According to bystanders, one fell in love with the Gatorade at a water stop, and the other was camped in a porta potty when I went by. Life happens.

When it was all over, six men and seven women set Missouri single-age state records in this race. Despite winning, Assenmacher was not one of them. He missed Al Smith's 1982 record by over a minute. Missouri records for this race still stand from as far back as 1978.

Barry County Courts sentence 13 to prison during December

• **Gary Don Adams**, of Seligman, pled guilty to endangering the welfare of a child creating substantial risk in the first degree as a first offense with no sexual conduct. Adams received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

Adams' charges originated from an incident involving the Missouri State Highway Patrol on February 28, 2016. The Patrol were en route to assist on a pursuit coming from Benton County, west of Seligman when he heard Adams crash.

Once on scene, the Trooper found an 18 month old in the car, as well as a female passenger. The Benton County Deputy clocked Adams at speeds up to 100 miles per hour on gravel roads. The Trooper found Adams was unable to perform a field sobriety test. In the car, there were two marijuana pipes in the driver's floor board, as well as marijuana.

Adams is to serve probation until December 19, 2021.

• **Anthony Craig Ash**, of Golden, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Ash received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On September 28, 2015, the Barry County Sheriff's Department found Ash to be in possession of a bent spoon and plastic baggie that field tested positive for methamphetamine. Ash admitted to trying to hide the spoon from law enforcement to keep from getting in trouble.

Ash is to serve probation until December 19, 2021.

• **Kashina Lynn Bergesch**, of Pierce City, pled guilty to two counts of possession of a

controlled substance. Bergesch was already on probation for a guilty plea to possession of a controlled substance in 2013. Bergesch's probation was revoked and she is to serve five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

Bergesch's charges came from three separate incidents. In May 2013, she was being booked into the Barry County Jail for assault and a baggie of methamphetamine was found in her sock. Then, in May 2016, she was found to have a glass smoking pipe and a baggie of methamphetamine by the Monett Police Department. The department found her to have methamphetamine again in October 2016 when she hid a baggie of methamphetamine in he bra.

• **Nicholas Stephen Brasel**, of Cassville, pled guilty to domestic assault in the second degree. Brasel received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

Brasel was charged with the assault after grabbing his girlfriend by the throat and throwing her on the bed and strangling her.

Brasel is to serve probation until December 19, 2021.

• **Christopher Ford Cape**, of Cassville, pled guilty to assault in the second degree in 2014. His probation has since been revoked and he is to serve 120 days of shock time as part of a seven year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections.

On July 4, 2013, Cape, along with two other men, stopped another man and beat him, causing serious injuries. The victim blacked out from the assault after being hit, kicked and punched multiple times.

• **Charlie Lynn Crow**, of Purdy, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance in March. His probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve five years with the Department of Corrections.

• **Lance Aaron Curran**, of Exeter, pled guilty to DWI - Alcohol as an aggravated offender in January 2016. His probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On April 26, 2015, the Cassville Police Department pulled Curran over for erratic driving behavior. When they did, Curran was found to be intoxicated and his license had been revoked. Curran failed the field sobriety test and had multiple DWI infractions.

• **Mack Bryan Davis**, of Moberly, pled guilty to burglary in the second degree. Davis was sentenced to four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On December 28, 2015, the Barry County Sheriff's Department investigated a stolen ATM card by Davis' ex-wife. His ex-wife also found her air compressor at a pawn shop, which she paid to get back. When officers investigated, they found a wallet with multiple stolen IDs, debit cards and social security numbers.

• **Linda Maw Fleetwood**, of Golden, pled guilty to unlawful use of drug paraphernalia. Fleetwood received a suspended imposition of sentencing and two years unsupervised probation.

On November 24, 2014, Fleetwood was found to have methphatmine and paraphernalia, such as syringes in her home on Kestrel Court in Golden where a 12-year old child lived.

Fleetwood is to serve probation until December 15, 2018.

• **Anthony Michael Gen-**

narelli, of Ridgedale, pled guilty to burglary in the second degree and resisting arrest for a felony. Gennarelli received a suspended execution of a seven year sentence for the burglary and a four years for the resisting arrest charge. Gennarelli is to serve five years supervised probation.

On September 4, 2014, Gennarelli broke into a home on Farm Road 1115 in Cassville. He cut himself on the glass after breaking a sliding glass door. He was identified through DNA analysis.

Then, on October 13, 2016, Gennarelli racked up more charges when the Cassville Police Department attempted to question him and he took off on foot. Officers also found 28 syringes, and tourniquet.

Gennarelli is to serve probation until December 20, 2021.

• **Jennifer Marie Gideon**, of Lampe, pled guilty to passing a bad check of \$500 or more in 2007. Gideon's probation has since been revoked, and she was sentenced to serve five years incarceration with credit for the time she was already on probation.

• **Meredith Gould**, of Webb City, pled guilty to five counts of burglary in the second degree and four counts of theft/stealing in 2015. Gould's probation has since been revoked and she is to serve 120 days of shock time as part of

a five year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections.

Gould was arrested after a rash of burglaries around Barry County in August and September 2014. Many items, like guitars, were pawned, other items, such as checkbooks and IDs were located by officers and returned to owners.

• **Leonard Dale Hendrix**, of Washburn, pled guilty to DWI-Alcohol as an aggravated offender and operating a motor vehicle while revoked. Hendrix’s probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

• **Jeffrey D. Henry**, of Reeds Spring, pled guilty to ten counts of distribution of a controlled substance. Henry received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

Henry was arrested following practicing as an EMT for 11 days without a license. While employed at Cassville’s Mercy Hospital, he did not notify his employers that his license had expired. While working in the emergency department, he took pharmaceuticals from the automated dispensing system and distributing them to patients.

When asked by the Missouri Bureau of Emergency Medical Services in Jefferson City if he was practicing, he lied and said no. He hid his lack of licensure from his employer as well as the bureau and hid material facts to cover it.

Henry is to serve probation until December 19, 2021.

• **Cobby Robert Hood**, of Monett, pled guilty to resisting arrest for a felony. Hood received a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

On August 22, 2016, the Monett Police Department approached Hood, alerting him that he had an active warrant for his arrest. Hood then fled on his bicycle.

Hood is to serve probation until December 20, 2019.

• **Andey W. Hunter**, of Butlerfield, pled guilty to assault in the third degree. Hunter received a suspended imposition of sentencing and two years unsupervised probation.

Hunter was arrested after an assault on August 27, 2015. Hunter was one of three men who attacked another man who was sitting on his porch next to the Rowdy Beaver in Cassville on Highway 112. The man attacked him, threw him to the ground and kicked him.

Hunter is to serve probation until December 19, 2018.

• **Rick A. Johnson**, of Springfield, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance - synthetic cannabinoid. Johnson received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On October 2, 2015, Johnson was held by a property owner on State Highway Y when he and another man were on his property. Inside Johnson’s car there was marijuana, as well as several pipes and spoons. Johnson also two hypodermic needles, one filled with methamphetamine. They

also found a pistol, which he was not able to legally possess.

Johnson is to serve probation until December 20, 2021.

• **Vanessa Rae King**, of Seligman, pled guilty to aggravated stalking as a first offense. King received a suspended imposition of sentencing and four years supervised probation.

On March 5, 2016, King was harassing a Seligman resident, texting that she would burn his house down and that she would go to Arkansas and get a “throw away gun.” She also filed a false domestic violence report against him. She also wrote “I [heart] Barry” on his window.

King is to serve probation until December 20, 2020.

• **Breanna Lynn Lamphear**, of Aurora, pled guilty to distribution of a controlled substance, possession of a controlled substance in a jail and possession of a controlled substance. Lamphear was sentenced to five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On August 25, 2016, Lamphear went into the Barry County Jail with methamphetamine with the intention of trading it for commissary with other inmates. She did distribute some of the methamphetamine to another inmate who was in the jail on a self-protection hold.

• **Regina A. McFarland**, of

Cassville, pled guilty to DWI-Alcohol as a persistent offender in May 2015. McFarland’s probation has since been revoked and she is to serve three years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On July 25, 2014, McFarland was found to be driving while intoxicated, with an open beer can in her front console.

• **Brett Erron Meek**, of Purdy, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Meek received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

Meek’s charges originated when the Cassville Police Department was dispatched to L& L for an unresponsive male in a vehicle on January 6, 2016. When officers arrived, Meek was acting nervous and had an active warrant out of Monett. When he was taken into custody, he had methamphetamine in his pocket.

Meek is to serve probation until December 19, 2021.

• **Kenneth Stacy Reavis**, of Crane, pled guilty to two counts of distribution of a controlled substance. Reavis was

granted a suspended execution of a 12 year incarceration sentence and five years supervised probation.

On December 17, 2015, Reavis’ residence was the subject of a search warrant. When officers arrived, Reavis was flushing methamphetamine down the toilet to keep officers from finding it. Approximately 20 grams of methamphetamine was recovered. There were also morphine pills, baggies, syringes, digital scales and firearms at the home.

Then, on September 7, 2016, Reavus was found to have methamphetamine in his pocket during a search warrant

being served at a residence in Crane. He was also in possession of a concealed firearm.

Reavis is to serve probation until December 20, 2021.

• **James Levi Rice**, of Monett, pled guilty to a stealing related offense as a third offense. Rice received a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

On April 26, 2016, the Monett Police Department responded to a report of a stolen cell phone and charger. When officers spoke to Rice, he was holding a purse that had a syringe.

Rice is to serve probation

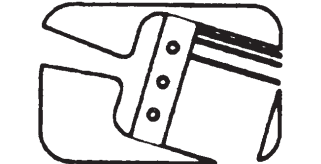

• **Jacob Don Rose**, of Joplin, pled guilty to burglary in the second degree. Rose was granted a suspended execution sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

On April 23, 2013, Rose broke into a residence on Old Exeter Roar in Cassville and stole a Dell laptop, valued at over \$500. The victim identified his nephew, Rose, as the suspect, and Rose admitted to it.

Rose is to serve probation until December 19, 2021.

• **Donald Sisco**, of Shell Knob, was ruled guilty by jury in October 2016 of sexual misconduct with a child under the age of 15 as a second or subsequent offense. Sisco is to serve 60 days in county jail.

In March 2014, the Barry County Sheriff’s Department investigated an incident where a 14 year old girl said she was getting in the shower when her mother’s boyfriend exposed himself and masturbated in front of her. The victim also said Sisco had told her she was sexy and had a “nice butt” in the past.

• **Laane Michael Sneed**, of Monett, pled guilty to two counts of receiving stolen property and two counts of burglary in the second degree. Sneed received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five year supervised probation.

In June 2016, tools, bathroom fixtures and a weed trimmer were stolen from a residence on Roosevelt Street. When officers investigated, they found some of the items pawned in Monett by Sneed.

On August 11, 2016, Monett officers investigated a theft of a television and air conditioner from a residence on Kyler. When officers found the tv and air conditioner, the people in possession said they had bought them from Sneed for \$250 each.

In October 2016, Sneed stayed overnight at a residence on Fourth Street in Monett.

When the residents left, Sneed stayed outside. When they returned, Sneed was carrying a duffle bag from the residence. He had stolen an Xbox 360 and a Sony PS4.

Sneed is to serve probation until December 20, 2021.

• **Colter Woodrow Stephens**, of Seligman, pled guilty to nine counts of forgery. Stephens received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On January 8, 2016, Stephens the Washburn Police Department investigated an incident at A & R Sales. The company had discovered that an employee, Stephens, who had been asked to drop off paid bills in the mail, was washing the checks, writing his name on them and cashing them. In all, the total stolen was \$4,950.

Stephens is to serve probation until December 19, 2021.

• **Dillon Edward Stufflebean**, of McAlester, Okla., pled guilty to theft/stealing of less than \$500. Stufflebean received 90 days incarceration in county jail.

In March 2011, the owner of a coin collection reported it had been stolen. The victim said Stufflebean had cleaned out his garage for him in December 2010. Then Stufflebean left, the owner noticed the safe had been locked, which he never locked it because he did not know the combination. When the victim called Stufflebean’s grandmother, she

found some of the coins. The overall value that was stolen was \$1,377.

• **Chad Michael Swearingen**, of Monett, pled guilty to burglary in the second degree and property damage in the second degree. Swearingen received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

In September 2015, Sweaingen tried to break into Jimmy’s Preowned in Monett, damaging the door and door-knob. Then in November, he was seen on surveillance and International Ingredient Corporation’s Monett plant, breaking into the office and stealing scratched winning lottery tickets and \$30 in cash. Swearingen damaged two filing cabinets and a door.

Swearingen is to serve probation until December 29, 2021.

• **Thomas G. Wade**, of Wheaton, pled guilty to domestic assault in the second degree. Wade received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

In Novmeber 2016, Wade was arrested after chasing an 11 year old child through the yard, causing him to fear for his life. He also struck another victim with the stock of a shotgun as well as forcing her onto the bed and on broken glass. Then Wade kicked a door into the victim and pulled her by the hair until she blacked out. Wade was intoxicated at the

time and is a convicted felon who was in possession of a firearm illegally.

Wade is to serve probation until December 20, 2021.

• **Levi Samuel James Walter**, of Billings, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance in 2013. His probation has since been revoked and he is to serve five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

In January 2013, the Missouri State Highway Patrol responded to a crash. Walter was driving, and was found to have a number of Xanax on him at the time. His license was also expired.

• **Shelby W. Wellbaum**, of Monett, pled guilty to two possession of a controlled substance, receiving stolen property and burglary in the second degree. Wellbaum received a suspended execution of a seven year incarceration sentence and five years supervised probation.

In November 2014, Wellbaum was found with syringes of methamphetamine when officers pulled him over for a broken windshield.

In September 2015, a burglary was reported where an edger, vintage truck doors and a Jeep tailgate were stolen from

a property on Farm Road 2030 in Monett.

In October, the owner reported seeing his truck doors on a vehicle. Wellbaum was found to be in possession of the edger, and the doors on the truck came from him, as well.

In December 2015, the Barry County Sheriff’s Department responded to a burglary on Farm Road 1040 in Pierce City. When the game camera was looked at, Wellbaum and another man stole things and loaded them into Wellbaum’s El Camino.

In June 2016, Wellbaum was found with a used syringe and a bag of methamphetamine.

Wellbaum is to serve probation until December 20, 2021.

• **Royle Lynn Wiseley**, of Cassville, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Wiseley received a suspended

imposition of sentencing and four years supervised probation.

In February 2016, Wiseley’s residence on Farm Road 1145 in Cassville was searched and officers found drug paraphernalia with methamphetamine residue on it.

Wiseley is to serve probation until December 19, 2020.

• **Michael Xiong**, of Exeter, pled guilty to tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree. Xiong received a suspended imposition of sentencing, 100 hours of community service and five years supervised probation.

On March 26, 2016, Xiong waited until his father was asleep and then stole a 2006 Chevrolet truck. Xiong has a history of stealing.

Xiong is to serve probation until December 5, 2021.
