Cassville man arrested for beating teen with axe handle

One man is in custody after allegedly breaking a teenager's legs with an axe handle on Monday.

James R. Mason, 42, of Cassville, was arrested for the crime what injured 17 year-old Tyler Pendergraft, of Purdy. According to the affidavit of probable cause, Mason lifted the rear of Tyler's truck with a skid loader to prevent Tyler from leaving his residence, also damaging the truck. Then, Mason allegedly beat Pendergraft with an axe handle, breaking both of his legs and his nose.

Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly stated, "We believe that the victim was stealing diesel from a farm tank on the property, so Mason contacted him on Monday and asked him to come out to his place to confront him."

Epperly also stated that Pendergraft was taken into surgery for his one of his broken legs on Tuesday and had serious injuries. Epperly said, "Tyler managed to drive himself to Cassville and contacted his step-dad who took him to the E.R. after the incident."

Pendergraft told officers that he believed that Mason was going to kill him, because Mason said he was going to "bury him."

According to a Go Fund Me page that has been created online to help with Pendergraft's medical expenses, his injuries include, "a broken right tibia and fibula, broken left tibia and fibula, broken left ankle, broken nose, possible broken orbital bones, possible broken jaw (too much swelling to tell just yet), severely bruised chest, and other unidentified head trauma." The page is attempting to raise \$5,000 to help the family. They also describe Pendergraft as loving rodeo, his family and friends.

Epperly stated, "No one appreciates someone stealing, but you've got to call and get law enforcement involved. You can't take the law into your own hands, that's why Mason is in the trouble he is in now." Epperly also said that he believed that Pendergraft has worked for Mason in the

Mason is currently being held in the Barry County Jail on a \$250,000 cash-only bond for assault in the first degree, armed criminal action and property damage in the first degree.

Two Barry County deputies recognized for saving man's life

Two Barry County Sheriff's deputies were awarded letters of commendation this week for saving a man's life in January.

Sheriff Mick Epperly and Corporal Kerry Headrick gave the letters in recognition of what Epperly described as "going above and beyond the call of duty." On January 27, around 2:33 a.m. Moore and Salkill responded to a call from Barry County dispatch that a man was not breathing. It was determined later that the man had tried to take his own life by overdosing on medications.

When they arrived, the

man was on the floor, unconscious and not breathing. Deputy Moore said, "When we were on our way, we knew that he wasn't conscious. I checked, and he wasn't breathing and there wasn't a pulse, so Scott started CPR, and I moved furniture out of the way." It was the life-saving efforts of the deputies that brought the man back to life. The EMT, Kael Eden, who responded to the call after the Sheriff's Department arrived, said that they would not have been able to save the man had it not been for the quick actions of Moore and Salkill.

Epperly stated, "They

never know what the calls are going to be when they go on the clock. It could be something like this, where a man tried to take his own life, or it could be as simple as someone worried about their lost dog. They have to be ready for any of those."

When asked if they felt that they went above the call of duty as Epperly claimed, Salkill stated, "No, I don't think so. It was just part of my job. I'd do it for anybody." Moore agreed with

Salkill continued, "We try to mentally prepare ourselves before we go on any

Execution date set for Purdy man who killed Barry County cop

convicted of killing a Barry County Sheriff's Deputy in 1996, will be executed in March.

Clayton, then 56, now 74, of Purdy, was convicted in a trial in 1997 of killing Deputy Christopher Castetter. Clayton was sentenced to the death penalty in 1997 in a trial in Joplin after a change of venue, and the state's high court affirmed that conviction in 1999. Clayton's attorney filed a petition for a review in 2008, but the U.S. Supreme Court denied it.

On November 27, 1996, Deputy Castetter, 29, responded to a call regarding Clayton, whom had allegedly been in a violent argument with his former girlfriend and had then driven

to the girlfriend's parents' When Castetter arrived, Clayton shot him in the head before he could exit the patrol car. According to deputies who arrived around three minutes later, Castetter's gun was still in his holster.

Castetter was taken to a Springfield hospital where he died a few hours later with his wife of eight years, Christine, at his side. Castetter left behind three girls, Cara, Julie and Bon-

Clayton was arrested at his home two and a half miles southeast of Purdy by two Barry County Sheirff's deputies. At the home, the deputies confiscated a large caliber handgun believed to have been used to shoot Castetter.

Cecil Clayton, the man house with a loaded gun. sponded in mass support In post-conviction moof the Castetter family following the shooting, which was the only officer death in the line of duty in recent memory for the county. In the December 4, 1996, issue of the Advertiser, Christine wrote a dedication about Christopher in which she closed it, saying, "Rest assured that he would have laid his life down for any one of you if that is what it took. My only request is that you please don't forget him."

> Clayton was convicted of first degree murder by a jury in Jasper County after only two hours of deliberation on Saturday, October 19, 1997. When the jury recommended the death sentence, Christine was quoted as saying, "I feel that

tions, Clayton's attorney claimed that his actions were due to a brain injury he suffered in 1972 in a sawmill accident. A clinical psychologist also testified that he believed Clayton had dementia from the injury and a social anxiety disorder and alcohol dependence, issues that should have been brought up at the initial trial. The night of his arrest, Clayton's blood alcohol level was 0.16 percent, twice the legal limit in Missouri to drive.

In the initial trial, both a neurologist and a clinical psychologist offered their findings on Clayton's brain damage. Dr. Michael Morris, a neurologist, stated that Clayton had about 7 percent brain loss in his

frontal lobe, the part of the brain that controls personality. He also said that the loss would cause "significant differences" in Clayton's behavior. However, brain damage or not, Clayton was still found guilty of the crime that led to the

installed the last of their new water meters last week. The city bought 641 that were put in over the last six months as a move to improve efficiency, not only with water usage, but also employee time.

The project, which cost just under \$93,000, \$145 for each meter, was paid for by the water department with cash available, but according to Seligman City Clerk Brian Nichols, the project will have paid for itself over the next two years just in employee expenses alone.

The new meters are radio-read meter, meaning that instead of an employee having to walk up to each meter to read them on a property, they can drive by and read them electronically from the street. What used to take four city employees two and a half days to read water meters will now take one person approximately three hours. However, Nichols emphasized that this wasn't a move to eliminate someone's job. Nichols stated, "It's all about efficiency. We aren't eliminating a job or downsizing the workforce." By freeing up that time, city employees can focus on other projects.

The decision to switch to the radio-read meters was not taken lightly. Nichols said, "We had some meters that had been in the ground 25 years, and they needed to be upgraded. We looked at the cost of the meters, the cost to read them, and found that, with the radioread, they would pay for themsleves in two years." The old way of reading meters cost the city roughly \$33,500 a year between the initial reading and followups. However, the new radio-read costs around \$1,158.00 per year in labor

Nichols said, "Aside from employee time savings, you can remove errors in recording the meter reads, this eliminates rereads, and then all it takes is a few clicks and the reads are loaded into our billing software."

The new meters have a 25-year battery in them and are under warranty and have an estimated lifespan to last for two and a half million gallons, which should be 20 years or more. The only anticipated maintenance on the meters is the replacement of the bottoms of each one every ten years.

Some customers are already enjoying the benefits of the newer meters. Nichols said the city has already had customers coming in asking questions about their water usage and are, in

turn, finding leaks in their lines that they weren't aware of before. In one instance, Nichols said the city was losing 14 gallons of water an hour that wasn't registering on a 25-year-old meter. Once the new meter was installed, the water was being registered and the customer was able to fix the leak on their end.

City of Seligman finishes replacing water meters for residents

Each of the new water meters stores four months of data by the day down to hourly usage. When a customer has an issue with their bill being too high, the city is able to tell them when an unusually high usage was reported down to the hour.

Nichols said, "The meters themselves store 120 days' worth of gallons per hour readings, and I can print out a chart to the customers that will show them exactly when a leak started or provide them with a peace of mind showing their repair job is complete. I would have been hard to explain to a customer that they simply used the water before this feature."

The city also replaced 12 of the larger meters on the main lines that will help the make sure what is being billed is matching up on each main line.

The Seligman City Council approved the purchase of the meters in stages through Infinity Meter Company through Harry Cooper Supply in Springfield. Initially, they

approved a starter package of 25 meters, installation, training and equipment in July 2014 for \$12,999. A couple months later, they voted to purchase 575 more meters. Finally, in December, they approved the purchase of the final 50 meters, which was delayed because those were different thread sizes

Nichols has only positive things to say for the system so far, "I will say, the system performs great, it's very easy to use and control, a few clicks and the routes are loaded, hit the start button and drive. When you are finished, a few clicks of the mouse transfer all of the reads to my billing software, and then it's done."

A process that used to take a week to process water bills now is done in a day and is saving the city and their customers both money and time.

the 2015 tax year, February marked a downturn in sales tax revenue for both Barry County and Cassville.

Barry County's revenue in January was up a significant 25.76 percent over 2014, but February

dipped to 3.75 percent less than the year before. This year, the county collected \$136,401.01 in revenue for the month, while February last year was \$140,785.39. In all, that means a decrease of \$4,384.38 in revenue on the 1/2-cent general revenue sales tax.

Cassville's revenue for February was \$64,780.24, a 12.98 percent decrease from 2014's revenue on the 1-cent general revenue. The city's transportation tax for February took in \$24,069.51, but since the tax is new, there is no comparison for last year. The total for the transportation tax in January was \$3,910.68 more




than February.

Overall, both the city and county are still above totals for the 2015 year for sales tax revenue thanks to a significant increase in January. For the year, Cassville is 7.7 percent above 2014's totals and Barry County is 10.78 percent over 2014.

Cassville License Office changes hands

Steve Chapman The Cassville License Office will be under new management starting on February 25, 2015. The Missouri Department of Revenue awarded the contract for management of the license office to License Office Services LLC in Jefferson City on February 6.

All local license offices are overseen by the Dept. of Revenue, but each is operated by an independent agent. They award contracts to operate license offices through a competitive bidding process, in which those competing for the contract outline the qualification of the contract manager who will oversee the office, their plans for customer service, what percentage of license fees will be returned to the state, among many other factors. Competitor bids

are evaluated and scored out of a total possible of 200 points. License Office Services received a final score of 147.92. The other competitor for the bid, Danielle Still, who has been office manager of the license office for 15 years, received a final score of 115.

Rebecca R. Brown, who is currently contracted to manage the license office, has held the position for over 34 years. She took over the position in 1981 after working at Commerce Bank in Cassville for about seven years. Both she and Still declined comment for this story. Attempts to reach License Office Services to comment on this story had been unsuccessful as of press time.

According to a press release from Dept. of Revenue, the Cassville License

Office handled over 42,000 transactions in the 2014 fiscal year, which generated \$141,514 in agent processing fees. License Office Services's contract states it will return two percent of processing fees to the state each year, an amount projected to be about \$2,830. Dept. of Revenue also said the license office will remain at its current location of 700 Main Street, Suite 1. The bid submitted by License Office Services states the office will continue to be open Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m., and it plans to retain all of the license clerks currently employed there.

Original owner of El Mariachi returns to Cassville and brings new, authentic recipes

In 2003, Adan Ortega opened El Mariachi Mexican Restaurant in Cassville with the help of his siblings, Rosabla and Israel Ortega. Six year later, he left to focus on family. Now, Garcia is back and has resumed management of the restaurant.

Adan Ortega, 34, was born in Guanatuajo, Mexico, on January 8, 1982, the fifth child of Jose Luz Ortega and Consuela Reyes. He was inspired to start his own business by Israel, with whom he helped to start a different restaurant. "He showed me what it is to cook and how to run a business," he said.

Ortega came to Cass-

ville in 1994 and decided he wanted to stay. "I came to this area because I really loved it,"

he said. "It was a small town,

a place you could enjoy with

your family."

In 2009, Ortega decided he wanted to take a break to have more time to focus on his family. He handed control of the restaurant over to Rosabla and went back to Mexico until November 2014. For their part, Israel and Rosabla started their own restaurants. Israel opened El Pueblito in Neosho while Rosabla opened Los Mariachis in Anderson.

After he returned, Ortega decided to make some changes which he felt would give his customers a better dining experience. "When I came back, I changed the seasoning of the food to improve the flavor," he said. "I also added more items to the express lunch and added a children's menu. Most importantly, I also lowered the prices of our food."

While Ortega strives to create food he knows his customers will enjoy, he also hopes to share some of his Mexican culture with them as well. "I wanted to show people what our culture is like," he said. "We have food that is prepared just like it would be in Mexico."

Some of these items include carnitas, pechuga rellena and tacos asada. Carnitas are pork tacos served with rice, beans, lettuce and pico de gallo. The pechuga rellena is a grilled chicken breast stuffed with shrimp, bell peppers and Mexican cheese. Finally, the tacos asada are corn

tortillas filled with pieces of steak, cilantro and onions.

While customers may enjoy authentic Mexican dishes, Ortega says his two most popular menu items are the volcano and fajitas texanas. "The fajitas texanas include a combination of chicken, shrimp, steak, red onions and shrimp," he said. "The volcano is served in a rock bowl and is also a combination of steak, chicken and shrimp served with ranchero sauce and cheese on top."

When he is not working at the restaurant, Ortega enjoys spending time with his wife, Maribel, to whom he has been married for 15 years, his daughter, Lena, 15, and sons, Adan, 12, and Fernando, 2. Additionally, his niece, Eloisa, and Ortega's younger brother, Jose, work with him at the restaurant.

Ortega's future plans are

very simple. He just wants to keep El Mariachi going as long as possible. "I like it here in Cassville," he said, "and I want to keep serving the people here food they'll enjoy." He is also grateful to the customers who continued to eat at El Mariachi while he was gone. "Because of them, we still have a business," he said.

On February 14, Ortega hopes everybody will come to El Mariachi for the restaurant's Valentine's Day special.

After 4 p.m., customers will be treated to free drinks and free sopapillas, and all couples will also receive free ice cream.

El Mariachi is located at 482 St. Highway 76 in Cassville. Restaurant hours are 11 a.m. to 9 p.m., Monday through Saturday, and 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Sundays. Call (417) 847-5565 for more information.





Hunters donate their extra venison to participating meat processors who then prepare the donated venison by grinding it into one-pound packages that are given to food banks and food pantries for distribution to those in need.

Processing fees are covered entirely or in part by numerous local program sponsors, along with statewide sponsors that include MDC, CFM, Shelter Insurance, Bass Pro Shops, Missouri Chapter Safari Club International, Missouri Chapter National Wild Turkey Federation, Midway USA Inc., Missouri Food Banks Association, United Bowhunters of Missouri, Missouri Trappers Association, and the Missouri Hunter Education Instructors Association.

Since the program started in 1992, Share the Harvest has provided more than 3.3 million pounds of lean, healthy venison to help feed Missourians in need.





Cassville's Connor Annecharico proved he is a wrestling contender on Saturday, February 7, at the Missouri Nationals Tournament.


Annecharico won a classic heavyweight battle in the championship match at the Cowan Civic Center in Leba-







Missouri Extension Office seeks Century Farms Families

If your farm has been in your family since Dec. 31, 1915, you can apply to have it recognized as a Missouri Century Farm.

To qualify, farms must meet the following guidelines: The same family must have owned the farm for 100 consecutive years. The line of ownership from the original settler or buyer may be through children, grandchildren, siblings, and nephews or nieces, including those through marriage or adoption. The farm must be at least 40 acres of the original land acquisition and make a financial contribution to the overall farm income.

"It is important to honor and respect our history," said Michael Ouart, vice provost for University of Missouri Extension. "These farms represent both Missouri's cultural heritage and the good stewardship that our farmers strive for."

In 2008, the Missouri Farm Bureau joined MU Extension and the MU College of Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources as a program sponsor.

"Missouri Farm Bureau is a proud partner in the recognition of century farms," said Blake Hurst, president. "We applaud the hard-working farm families that have kept us fed and clothed for generations. They represent an important part of our heritage and laid a foundation for the bounty Americans enjoy every day."

Applicants certified as owners of a 2015 Missouri Century Farm will be recognized by the local MU Extension office in the county where the farm is located. Applicants are presented with a sign and a certificate.

Since Missouri began the program in 1976, more than 8,000 century farms have been recognized.

For applications received by May 1, a \$65 fee covers the cost of a certificate, farm sign and booklet for approved applicants. If the application is received between May 1 and May 15, the cost is \$75. Applications must be postmarked by May 15, 2015, to be considered.

Deer harvest up 8,000 over last year

Missouri's 2014-2015 deer-hunting closed Jan. 15 with the conclusion of the state's archery season. The Missouri Department of Conservation reported that the total deer harvest for the current season was 260,552, which is 7,978 more than the 252,574 deer checked during the previous year.

Hunters checked 51,755 deer during the current archery season with top counties being Jefferson with 1,080, St. Louis with 1,063, and Franklin with 1,032.

2014-2015 The harvest for the previous sed Jan. 15 year's deer archery season sion of the was 1,248 fewer at 50,507.

The 2014-2015 archery turkey season also closed Jan. 15 with a total of 2,587 birds checked compared to the previous year of 2,546 birds checked. Top counties were Greene with 64, Franklin with 60, and Callaway with 54.

MDC also reported 14 hunting incidents during the 2014-2015 deer hunting season. Four were fatal and involved a fall from a tree stand, a heater explosion in a deer blind, a gunshot wound from another hunter, and a heart attack while hunting.

Dates for the 2015-2016 firearms deer season are: Urban portion – Oct. 9

through 12 Early youth portion –

Nov. 14 through 24

Early youth portion –
Oct. 31 and Nov. 1
November portion –

Antlerless portion - Nov. 25 through Dec. 6

Alternative-methods portion - Dec. 19 through

Late youth portion – Jan. 2 and 3

The 2015-2016 archery deer and turkey season will run Sept. 15 through Jan. 15, excluding the November portion of deer season, Nov. 14 through 24.
