# Crowder College celebrates completion of \$2.2 million addition

In just under a year, the entire face of Crowder College in Cassville is changed for the better. The local community college officially unveiled its new \$2.2 million addition which added functional space, a bigger bookstore, more study spaces, bigger classrooms and more. Crowder celebrated the occasion by hosting a Cassville Area Chamber of Commerce First Friday Coffee and ribbon cutting on Friday, February 7.

Cassville Crowder College director Angela Seymour said the change is huge for the students and faculty alike. "I walk in, and I'm just in awe. It's just beautiful. The old building completely changed on the inside. You can't even picture it anymore. It's amazing and really changed the look and feel of everything," she said.

The addition was on the

entrance of the college built out into what was parking lot and added approximately 5,000 square feet to the administrative building. The new addition connects the second building so there will be one central entrance to administration offices and classrooms. It also adds a new campus bookstore, new classroom space and study areas. The new front gives the campus a face lift.

During the First Friday Coffee and ribbon cutting, students, community members, representatives of the architectural team and construction team attended along with representatives from both Missouri State University and Drury University, two four-year universities who offer degree tracts through Crowder, celebrated the official completion of the project. The lobby was packed to standing-room only.

#### WWII soldier from Barry County identified, to be buried at Arlington

One of the harshest realities of war is the spectre of death. Many men and women from Barry County have had the honor of serving the United States Armed forces in the past, and in that endeavor, many have fallen. One soldier, the son of a Barry County family, was lost during the Pacific Theater in World War II. That man was U.S. Army sergeant John Phillips.

After joining the Army

at the start of World War II, Phillips became one of thousands of American soldiers to never return from the Pacific Theater. Now, nearly 80 years later, thanks to the forensic efforts of the United States Armed forces, Phillips' body has been found.

Phillips was born in the early 1900s in Barry County before his family moved to California during the Great Depression. Soon after the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, Phillips and his brother, Zane Phillips, enlisted in the United States

While his brother Zane would return home and begin his own family, John lost his life attempting to retake the Philippines from the Japanese.

John has several relatives still living in both California and the Barry County areas, notably his first cousin,

#### Local girl donates to area fire department to help kids going through trauma

Just over eight years ago, a Seligman family lived out a nightmare. Abby Corn, 23 months old at the time, was spending time with her grandparents and tragedy struck via a Copperhead. Abby was bitten, and her grandmother Jo Nell Corn rushed into action, calling 911.

Now, the better part of a decade earlier, Abby wants help other kids going through horrible trauma to find some comfort. When Abby was bitten, the first responders on scene gave her a stuffed animal to hold. The bunny became known affectionately as Rescue Rabbit, and Abby clung to the toy in the ambulance on the way to the hospital.

The story of the comfort Rescue Rabbit provided stuck with Abby through retellings of the story from her family over the years. Recently, Abby took it upon herself to donate over 35 stuffed animals to the Seligman Fire Department to give to kids going through a hard time.

While Abby had other stuffed animals she was attached to, she clung to Rescue Rabbit in the ambulance and the emergency room.

Abby is now 10 and lives in Bentonville, Ark., with her

parents, Sarah and Jared Corn. Her grandparents still live in Seligman and she comes back to visit regularly. Since Seligman Area Rural Fire Association were the first on scene to help her in her time of need, Abby wanted to give back in a way that would help others in the area.

Abby's mother said the idea came up when they sat her down and told her she needed to find something to do with the large collection of stuffed animals she had accumulated over the years, Sarah said, "We were discussing about what to do with the amount of stuffed animals. She had accumulated quite a few, so we started talking about what she could do with them instead of getting rid of them. When we started talking, she suggested police or fire stations and after talking for awhile, we thought maybe we could do it for Seligman first responders since that was who helped her when she was bit by a snake when she was two."

Her mother wasn't surprised that Abby chose to donate them to help others. She added, "She is very empathetic and caring for other people, so it wasn't any surprise that she would want to help other people."

Abby explained it was an easy decision. She said, "I had gone through that time and I wanted other people to feel the way I did and to feel that comfort through hard times."

Abby donated some of her own stuffed animals, but she also invited her friends to donate, and they added to the collection. She also asked the Titanic Museum in Branson if they would donate a couple of stuffed animals from the gift shop, and they agreed to as well.

Jo Nell said Abby told her the impact of a specific story from the Titanic Museum trip. She said, "At the Titanic museum, there is a story about a boy with a polar bear the night of the Titanic that really affected Abby. They found his polar bear under a life boat, and later, his mother wrote him a book about the adventures of polar bear.

"She knew how that had helped him and how Rescue Rabbit helped her."

This is the second time Abby's done this drive. Before, she donated to the local ambulance district when her family lived in Jefferson City.

After taking up the collection of animals, Abby spent a lot energy preparing a speech for the fire department before

mother received from him was in November of 1941. After that, it was a while until he was reported missing."

According to Ragain,

"They were so outnumbered that they didn't get to capture the Philippines," explained Ragain. "They were on that march for 70 miles to the camp. Apparently, he survived the march and died at the camp, where he was buried."

American and Filipino sol-

diers. These soldiers were

captured by Japanese forces

and forced to endure a 70-

mile walk to a fortified en-

emy encampment.

Phillips was held at the Cabanatuan POW camp where he and an estimated 2,500 other American soldiers lost their lives.

According to Ragain, after losing contact with John in 1941, his family was in the dark about what had happened until being informed by the military at the end of the war.

"[His family] didn't even know what happened to him until the war was over," continued Ragain. "In either 1944 or 1945, they found out that he had died in the prison camps down there."

John, as well as anywhere from 5,000-18,000 other prisoners of war, was buried in the Philippines in a common grave. He was 25 years

After the war, when the U.S. and the Filipino nationals were able to take the country back from the Japanese, Phillips and his fallen allies' bodies were exhumed and taken to a temporary mausoleum in Manila. Despite prison records indicating his burial location and the date of his death, Phillips was unable to be identified due to extensive decomposition.

A ray of hope would eventually shine through for the family of John Phillips. In 2018, the military began exhuming the remains of the soldiers who were buried at Cabanatuan. According to Ragain, thanks to the cooperation of his brother Zane's children, Phillips was able to be identified.


"A few years later, his nieces got their father (Zanes)'s DNA," explained Ragain. "The military was investigating with DNA. They were excavating a grave that had 18 other soldiers and they were able to match Zane's DNA with Johnny's and proceed from there."

Now that Phillips' remains have been identified, his body has been returned to the United States. Soon, the family members will be invited to attend a burial ceremony where Phillips will be buried among the other fallen heroes at Arlington National Cemetery in Washington D.C.

"They intend to either have it on July 26 or 27, which will be the anniversary of his death," continued Ragain. "The military, at their own expense, is flying a few of the family members over there to attend the funeral."



taking her donation.

Sarah said, "I was very proud of her because she had worked for a week or so before in writing out what she wanted to say when she dropped them off. She had been working on that. Even though she was a little nervous, she was brave and was able to speak clearly, and you could tell based, on the responses from who was there, that they were grateful and very pleased she would want to come and donate something to them."

Abby said speaking did make her nervous, but she powered through because it was important. She said, "It was very nerve-wracking, but also it was awesome to give the animals over because I knew it would help a child in need."

Jo Nell helped Abby put stuffed animals in individual

Jo Nell helped Abby put stuffed animals in individual bags before they took them to the fire department. That wasn't the only way Abby got the animals ready, though. Abby put PS 91 on every single tag before taking the stuffed animals.

Jo Nell explained, "When she was in the hospital, it was extremely terrifying for her family in Mercy. We had come home to get clothes and feed animals, and my son called me [from the hospital] and said, 'Mom, I want you to stop and read Psalms 91.""

Jo Nell said she'd read Psalms 91 and tried to argue with him, but he insisted she read it again. She said, "It says you will tread on the lion and the adder. I told him to read that scripture over Abby's leg because there is power in that.

So, Abby wanted to PS 91 on every tag of animal."

Abby wrote on every tag and asked her family to pray over the stuffed animals before they took them to the fire department.

Abby said, "My animals were at the house [when I was bitten], and I didn't have anything when they were rushing over there. I had no clue what was going on, but [Rescue Rabbit] gave me comfort. I thought that might help kids."

When asked what Abby would tell kids going through a traumatic experience like she did, she said, "I would tell them, "This is why I have done this. It's because I've heard from kids who have problems in the hospital or have accidents like I did, and I want to care for them and help them. I want to tell them it will be okay."

As far as Rescue Rabbit? She wasn't included in the donation. Abby said, "It is at my grandma's house right now, but I still have her."



in the them with teachers changing up the layout and determining the best way to utilize their new space. The bookstore, which is a brand new addition, is 90 percent functional and now offers students food and beverage options on campus if they don't want to leave.

Seymour said, "We have three times the space in the new bookstore. Now, we can offer food and fountain pop and sandwiches that we are still getting in. We have refrigerators for sandwiches and iced tea and all of those more healthy foods that students can grab between classes. They don't have to leave if they want to stay and study but also eat."

While the school had a book store, it didn't have food and beverage options. She added, "The convenience store section is all new. We didn't have that before."

So far, the feedback on the project is overwhelmingly positive. She said, "They've been very excited. They love the space. It looks beautiful, and the study rooms get used a lot. I was surprised. At first, I don't think students knew they were study rooms, so we put notes on the walls."

Once students learned the new study rooms included glass that doubles as a white board and gives them quiet space to study, the space has been utilized consistently. Seymour said, "It's nice to see students using them. Tutoring happens a lot in there. Then, students in the lounge can hang out and play pool. I was surprised to see how often the study tables down the hallway. There will be a group of students at every single table. It's great to give them a place to sit, access wifi and study in the rooms. It's been a big change and really nice."

While the college had study areas available before, Seymour said the quiet space is a good atmosphere shift to make those areas more student-friendly.

The design team was from Paragon Architecture and the construction team was R. E. Smith. Seymour said there were challenges to do such a large-scale project on a building that would continue to be used throughout the construction phase, but the team was very helpful. She said,

"I was so happy with the architectural team and the contractors. They were fantastic. They communicated really well and made sure we were meeting all the needs of what we needed but also keep things under budget as much as possible and really build things with student-use and staff-use in mind. They aren't used to having to work in a space that is occupied, and safety was the first priority.

"It was a little rough on everyone with the dust and noise, but we kept thinking it would be amazing when it's done, and it's surpassed everything."

Even smaller aspects of the project seem to have a big impact, like the fact that students no longer have to go outside to change classes. When the weather is bad, that's been a big improvement for student satisfaction, according to Seymour.

They only remaining elements of the project are some technology installations, which will take place

over the spring break. Seymour said they are utilizing some temporary equipment in the meantime.

#### Barry County Circuit Court to use new juror communication system

Beginning next month, prospective jurors in Barry County can choose to communicate with the court by text or email, as the Barry County circuit court implements the new Show-Me Jury system.

The Barry County circuit court will mail new Show-Me Jury questionnaire letters or postcards starting February 15, 2020, for jury service beginning March 16, 2020.

"A big benefit to the public will be the ease of contacting and communicating with the courts, and in particular, the jury supervisor's office," Craig Williams, Circuit Clerk, said. "Although Show-Me Jury is not completely paperless, it allows our potential jurors to do more online and choose how they want the court to let them know if they have been excused or disqualified for serving or if their service has been postponed or canceled. It really has made jury service so much more convenient for our citizens."

Here is how Missouri's new Show-Me Jury system works:

• The circuit court will send a letter or postcard through the postal mail to the juror notifying them of their service.

- When potential jurors receive the letter or postcard, they will be directed to go online at www.courts.mo.gov/ ejuror to complete their juror qualification forms. This online questionnaire lets them choose their preferred method of communication with the court - whether by postal service, e-mail or even text message. For prospective jurors who remain in the pool of qualified jurors after completing their questionnaires, this means the local court could send the summons for jury
- duty electronically. • Potential jurors who believe they are not qualified for jury service under state law can follow the online instructions to submit their necessary documentation electronically.
- For potential jurors who provide the appropriate contact information, the circuit clerk's office can notify them by text message or e-mail before they report for service if their service no longer is needed.

For potential jurors who do not have access to a computer, they can come to the circuit clerk's office to fill out their questionnaire on the public access terminal. Potential jurors may also have a family member or friend that has access to a computer help them fill out their questionnaire online.

If a juror has a question concerning jury duty, they can call the court's automated telephone messaging system at 417-847-3133 option 1 or check the court's website: www.barrycountycourt.com for information.

Missouri courts do not require anyone to provide confidential information over the telephone or by e-mail. The Show-Me Jury system is designed to give citizens a choice how they want to communicate with their local courts about potential jury service. Any telephone call or e-mail threatening the recipient with fines or jail time for failure to comply are fraudulent, are in no way connected with Missouri courts and should be reported to local law enforcement officials.

"Juries are a hallmark of he American iustice system and we truly appreciate the willingness of our citizens to serve as jurors," Williams said. "Through the Show-Me Jury system, we hope to make that service much easier and more convenient."

The new Show-Me Jury system was piloted in the St. Louis City Circuit Court beginning in February 2017.





Just a year after girls wrestling was introduced in Cassville, a group of wrestlers is making history. After a series of victories at their district matches in Columbia, three female wrestlers will go on to state finals to compete against the best wrestlers in the state.

The three wrestlers, freshmen Kailey Artherton and Annie Moore and sophomore Kelsey Harris, had a long road to victory last weekend, battling both their opponents and the limitations of their weight class.

"Girls wrestling began just last year," explained Cassville wrestling coach Nathan Fortner. "It's more than doubled in size this year. In guys' wrestling, there's four classes, but in girls, there's just the one. They had to wrestle just to get into their bracket."

One wrestler, Moore, was convinced early in the competition that she was defeated. After a loss in Friday's match, Moore was slated to face the tournament's second seed for the chance to go to state. Sensing his wrestlers' apprehension, coach Fortner took some time to reassure her.

"In the very beginning, I lost a match and put into a bubble match. It was really nerve-racking," explained Moore. "I was going against the second seed and coach Fortner told me that who I was up against was really bad."

Moore explained that this misdirection was all that it took to feed her engine to victory. Soon after her stunning upset, the rest of the team rallied, dominating the remainder of their competition.

"Two of us lost on Friday night," explained wrestler Kelsey Harris. "We were both really nervous to go into Saturday knowing that if we lost it was the end."

After Moore's upset of the second seed secured her place in state, wrestler KaileyArtherton wowed the crowd by winning her match in the final three seconds.

"It was really exciting," said Artherton. "There were lots of hugs and lots of tears."

In yet another explosive feat, wrestler Kelsey Harris took on five matches on Saturday, most of them directly following one another.

"I compare a wrestling match to an entire football game," said Fortner. "These girls did matches that intense back to back all day on Saturday."

The Cassville girls wrestling team will go on to compete in the 2019-2020 MSHSAA state wrestling finals from Friday, February 20, to Sunday, February 22, in Columbia. Tickets to the event are currently on sale for \$9.

"They made history," explained Fortner. "They're the first girls team to ever qualify and we were lucky enough to have all three punch their ticket the same year."




