Wildcats KO Cubs in One-Sided Brawl

The Cassville Wildcats shook off a tough loss to Lamar and claimed a 50-0 shutout on Friday night at Monett to retain the Barry County Brawl trophy. The Wildcats raced to a 36-0 halftime lead and added two more scores with a running clock to humble their Highway 37 rival. Cassville improved to 4-2 with the win and saw their district seeding hopes improve as Mt. Vernon fell to Lamar.

It takes a lot of lipstick to decorate a 50-0 pig. From Monett's viewpoint, there was nothing pretty about this game. Cassville dominated in every phase and wowed the crowd with spectacular plays on both sides of the ball.

While the Wildcats skinned the Cubs on the turf at Burl Fowler, Lamar dismantled Mt. Vernon, 33-0.

While this Monett team is not in the same league with Lamar (actually they are, but you know what I mean) no one expected the brutal shutout in a game where records are usually meaningless. The battle for the Barry County Brawl trophy is always an emotionally-charged game, where underdogs can play like supermen. This was not that kind of game.

Great pass, better catch

The Wildcats kicked off, held Monett to a three-andout, and then scored in just five plays. Hayden Sink lofted a long pass from the Cassville 48-yard line that a falling Jericho Farris caught at the Monett 1-yard line. Most long high school pass plays are more run-after-catch. Sink's rainbow looked more like a youtube sensation clip, where passes are thrown over buildings into small barrels. Farris crashed into the end zone on the next play to give Cassville an early 7-0 lead.

The teams traded punts, and then the Wildcats drove 52 yards in 9 plays. Sink finished the drive with a sneak. The PAT snap went awry, but Drake Reese tracked down the loose ball and won a foot race to the pylon to push the lead to 15-0 at the 8:15 mark of the second quarter.

Who could have known that Cassville would score three more times in those eight-plus minutes?

It's official. At 8 a.m. on October 1, personnel from the Barry County E911 center in Cassville began dispatching ambulances for the Barry-Lawrence County Ambulance District (BLCAD),

"The main holdup was due to problems between the Monett and Cassville communication systems," Phil-

The communication problems, according to Phillips, were not one-sided.

According to BLCAD member, David Compton, the project was initiated when the City of Monett raised rates for their dispatching services in 2019. When the board approached Phillips about the possibility of Barry County providing dispatching services for BLCAD, Phillips and the Barry County E911 board were amenable to the idea, so Phillips shot them a cost proposal for doing so, one which

they accepted.

"First, we had to get mapping data from Lawrence County, which turned out to be incomplete for our purposes," Phillips said, "so we had to do some clean-up work on it.

"Then, we had a problem with radio communication between our systems, so they (BLCAD) began looking at options for new radio equipment. Plus, they were concerned that after they transferred dispatching to Barry County, there might be a problem with continuing to store their radio equipment at the Monett Police Department, so they began looking at other options," Phillips continued. "By the time they got back to us on their options and I got back to my board, it was March of 2020

and nothing had been decided or approved by BLCAD.

"In May of 2020, they let us know they had chosen a radio vendor (Radiophone), and then had to determine an optimal site for the equipment," Phillips said.

"In August, the new radio vendor began testing with our equipment and discov-

Preserving history, one stroke at a time

Raine Clotfelter, of Branson, is preserving America's history, one mural at a time. Capturing the spirit of small and mid-sized towns across the nation, his images - rendered in Benjamin Moore acrylic on whatever surface he's commissioned to embellish - evoke nostalgia for days past and renew hope for our nation's future.

His latest project, one which has garnered national attention, is the wrap-around mural painted on the old grain silo at the east end of Monett's Front Street. Commissioned by the Monett Main Street Committee, the intricate patriotic painting took about 18 1/2 days to com-

COVID-19 numbers increase in **Barry County**

According to the situational update released October 6 by the Barry County Health Department, COVID-19 cases continued to increase in Barry County.

The total number of cases stood at 632 on October 6; 59 of those who tested positive were in isolation. Four people are currently hospitalized; 567 people have recovered; and six have died.

There are currently 268 people quarantined at home, who have been in close contact with a positive case.


Positive cases are spread rather evenly across age demographics, but the "Under 25" age group still has the highest positive count. The numbers

- Under age 25, 173 cases.
- Ages 25 40, 143 cases
- Ages 41 60, 164 cases
- Over age 61, 152 cases

In the September 30 update, Friend Tire of Monett was added to the list of employers who reported positive cases within their facility. Last week, they had six; this week that number has increased to

Southwest Third Graders learn via internet

According to Southwest School Distirict superintendent, Tosha Tilford,

40 students in the third grade were placed in quarantine for two weeks, beginning Friday, October 2 due to their direct contact with a person diagnosed with a COVID-19. Following health department regulations, the quarantined students were dismissed early on Friday and were not allowed to ride the buses. Parents were contacted and instructed to pick their children up from the school.

"The school in general currently has 126 students and staff members in quarantine," Tilford said Monday. "Those in quarantine are not all the result of COVID-positive school contacts. Some are due

to possible exposure to family and friends outside of school.

"The school has had a total of ten students and staff members test positive for COVID-19," she continued, "although only three were the result of contact at school."

According to Tilford, the students being quarantined in their homes have access to the actual classroom through "Pride Learning."

"The students access classes as they're being taught through internet and a device with a webcam," she said.

Southwest High School students were dismissed for virtual learning on September 24 and 25, due to a shortage of cafeteria staff, Tilford

Cassville School District shows slight uptick in quarantine numbers

According to Dr. Richard Asbill, superintendent for the Cassville School District, there are currently two active positive cases of COVID-19 within the school system. Both are students, he indi-

According to the dashboard on the school's website, there are currently 46 students and/or staff members under school-related quarantine due to exposure to a positive case of COVID-19. That number is up from three, on September 28.

Asbill said he and school staff continue to work closely with the Barry County County Health Department to monitor the COVID-positive patients and trace contacts in order to quarantine those who have been close to positive cases.

"Our efforts are to maintain our wellness protocols," Asbill said. "We continue to encourage everyone to focus on personal responsibility and daily wellness checks."

ered major problems with communication; it wasn't holding audio as it should," he continued. "Radiophone reached out to the manufacturer, but they wanted us to pay for a service agreement in order for them to assist us. We went ahead and approved the \$277 purchase of the license in order to expedite the process.

"During the process, the BLCAD also had to purchase a Gateway system/link to provide an internet connection pathway," Phillips explained.

"There's been a lot of frustration on both ends, but I think I can safely speak for all of us when I say we're glad everything now seems to be working as we had hoped it would," Phillips said.

With the new transition in dispatching, Barry County taxes will cover dispatches made within the Barry County portion of the Barry-Lawrence Ambulance District. The BLCAD will compensate the Barry County E911 Center for dispatches made within Lawrence County.

Ambulance service, then and now

Although the transition in dispatching locations for the Barry-Lawrence County Ambulance District was fraught with delays, ambulance service itself has come a long way since ambulances were dispatched by a call to the sheriff's office or to a local funeral home.

Cassville funeral director Skip White remembers when ambulances were just station wagons owned by funeral homes.

"No one who drove them had medical training, and the only equipment onboard might be a bottle of oxygen," he said. "The ambulance driver's main goal was to get his passenger to the hospital as quickly as possible."

Scott Lakin, of Lakin Funeral Home in Pierce City, has his own stories to share.

"I was just a kid then," he said, "but I remember there was always a big race between funeral homes to be the first one on the wreck scene with an ambulance. It was a pretty cut-throat business. Sometimes, the ambulance from one funeral home would block the back doors

of another funeral home's ambulance.

Although neither gentleman was willing to name names, they did admit they could tell stories of times when ambulance drivers may have caused additional harm, while trying to help victims of accidents and illnesses.

Lakin and White both said they were glad to see the formation of professional ambulance districts and ambulances with trained medical personnel and equipment on board. They began appearing in Barry County in the mid-1970s.

In addition to professional ambulance districts working with the Barry County E911 Center, Barry County residents have one of only six accredited emergency call centers in Missouri. The accreditation is earned by successfully completing an intensive 20-step process, which must be repeated every three years in order to maintain that status. The Barry County E911 Center was reaccredited in 2019, after its initial accreditation in 2016.

Right to political expression fundamental, says Cupps

A resident of rural Cassville reported seeing a Biden campaign sign - an anomaly in the area - near Hilltop south of Cassville on her way home one evening. When she passed by the next morning, it was gone. She expressed the concern that maybe someone had stolen private property, because they may have considered its slogan unpopular.

Upon questioning, I learned of other disappearing Biden signs and was able to track down the identity of one of the people who had placed some of them: Cass-

ville attorney, Donald Cupps.

When asked if he was not brave putting up a Biden sign when it appears that Trump is more popular in this area, Cupps responded, "A person shouldn't have to be considered brave for expressing a political opinion in the United States; we don't live in a third-world country where we should have to worry about threats of harm for espousing differing political opinions.

"I support Vice-President Biden and because there were no Biden signs in town, I bought five of them and placed them on my property and the property of others who had given me permission," he said. "I put up one of my signs Saturday afternoon and it was stolen that night. Since then, I've been removing the remaining four signs every night myself and replacing them every morning. Yes, it's a little work, but it allows me to exercise my right to express my opinion.


"I don't understand the animosity some people hold toward those whose opinions differ from theirs," he continued. "People are saying 'my rights, my rights' like a drum-roll these days, but often those same people feel threatened by those who have a different political opinion, to the point of stealing a campaign sign. They don't understand that by stealing that sign, they're violating

someone else's rights.

"What I think would really help," he said, "is if people would turn off the 24-hour news on television and the internet and sit down and talk to each other, get to know each other. That's the only way problems are solved. Our country is dependent on civility and when we can no longer discuss ideas with each other respectfully, even when our opinions vary, we are in trouble."

Cupps said he has received varied reactions from passers-by when they see him putting up his Biden signs.

"Yes, I have gotten a few obscene gestures," he said, "but other people honk with a thumbs-up or stop and ask me where they can get a sign for themselves."







MURALIST from FRONT

With no formal instruction in his youth, other than a penchant for doodling and replicating the pencil drawings in his dictionary, Clotfelter has made a career out of his artwork. It began in an unlikely way.

After graduating from high school in the small town of Antlers, Oklahoma,

Clotfelter joined the Navy as a regular seaman, where he tried several times for placement in illustrator/draftsman training classes but had no luck

"I didn't have any background training in art," Clotfelter said. "In fact, the high school I graduated from was so small they didn't even of-

draftsman classes, so I contented myself with chipping paint on the ship.

"I was aboard the U.S.S. Newport, sailing for Casablanca," Clotfelter said, "when I got a break. The chief handed me a life-ring and asked me to paint the name of our ship on it. It had been a while since an American ship had arrived in North Africa, so our arrival was kind of a big deal. The chief wanted to give the life-ring as a gift to Moroccan port authorities.

"In the spirit of the moment," Clotfelter added, "I not only painted the name of the ship on the life-ring, but I

embellished it with a portrait of the ship and the captain, all the while supposing I was doing a good thing. When I gave it to the chief, though, he was a little upset. He told me he didn't want all that extra stuff on it. At that point, all I could do was apologize, which I did. Profusely. Later, I got a call to the ship captain's office, and I thought I was in even deeper hot water. When I arrived, I began apologizing again, but he cut me short. He asked, "Seaman Clotfelter, why are you chipping paint, when you can paint murals like this?"

Soon afterward, Clotfelter found himself on a flight to Norfolk, Virginia, where he was finally able to take the long-desired illustratordraftsman training. A 22year career with the Navy followed, which led him to the position of art director for Raytheon, a defense contractor in Dallas.

When his windowless city office became too stifling, he walked away from his Dallas position in search of a fresh start in the Ozarks. In 2003, a year or so after starting two Daylight Donut shops in Cassville, Clotfelter was called back up for a tour with the Navy in Iraq - as a technical illustrator - before retiring from the service in 2004.

He now resides in Branson with his wife, Tricia, who has encouraged him to become a full-time muralist, which is the thing he has always enjoyed doing more than anything.

"I've painted about 170 pieces so far," Clotfelter said. "About 60 percent of them are large murals for cities, museums, or anybody that wants one.

"I like painting in small or mid-size towns," he said. "People there seem to appre-

"Almost every mural I paint," he continued, "leads to more work for me. Just from painting the grain silo in Monett, I have three more jobs lined up. One of them is for a farmer in Ohio, who saw my work after his sister in Arizona sent him a photo of the silo."

Clotfelter's wife, Tricia, is his right-hand lady.

"She helps with the background colors and clearcoat," he said.

"I leave the details, like the folds on the flag, to Raine, though," Tricia said.

With the help of a public relations team, Clotfelter is working on an idea for a prospective deal with a television network to serialize his mural-painting.

For "America's Muralist," it will be yet another way to preserve America's history.

A dedication ceremony for Monett's "Freedom Silo" is planned for Saturday, October 10, at 6 p.m. at 901 Front Street, Monett. There will be food trucks, live music by the Ukeladies, and a showing of the movie "Miracle" at 6:30

Divide and Multiply

"Fall is the perfect time to share the love of flower power with neighbors, friends and family," says David Trinklein, University of Missouri Extension horticulturist.

"As spring-flowering bulbs such as tulip and narcissus grow, they produce offshoots adjacent to the original bulb. When these bulb clusters become overgrown, flower numbers usually decline. This is a good indication it is time to rejuvenate the bulb cluster by dividing it," Trinklein said.

"After lifting the bulb cluster carefully and dividing it, you can move extra bulbs to new locations or share with others. It is a great way to improve the neighborhood, make new friends and reduce the cost of having a beautiful yard," he said.

"Plant spring-flowering bulbs by the end of October. Soil is still warm enough for bulbs to establish good root systems before winter.

"Plant in well-drained soils. Most bulbs benefit from a fertilizer with a nitrogen-phosphorus-potassium ratio of 1:2:2 (such as 5-10-10) or 1:3:3. Avoid fertilizers that are high in nitrogen, which can lead to bulb rot. Some gardeners prefer bone meal, but it can attract digging animals. Manure is not a good choice unless it is well aged.

• Narcissus (daffodil)

"Nothing says spring like the sunny-faced daffodil. With adequate drainage, daffodils thrive for years in most Missouri soils.

"Known for their vigor, daffodils need at least five hours of sunlight daily.

"Space 6-12 inches apart, depending upon the cultivar and desired effect. Plant so the base of the bulb is about 6 inches below the soil surface. In lighter soils, this can be 8 inches. If dry, water the bulbs after planting and throughout the fall. Apply a mulch.

"Properly spaced bulbs need to be divided every five to 10 years or when flowers become smaller. Dig a clump of bulbs when foliage dies back but is still visible. After bulbs are dry, remove offsets from the parent bulb and store in a dry, cool location with good air movement. Replant in October."

• Tulip

"Many Missouri gardeners treat tulips as annuals, Trinklein said. "Missouri warms too early in the growing season for tulips to make enough food to naturalize well. They usually decline in vigor and bloom quality when bulbs stay in the ground or when dug in the spring after flowering for fall replanting.

"Plant tulips about 2 ½ times as deep as the bulbs are wide and space them 4-8 inches apart, depending on the cultivar. Bulbs need wa-

ter in dry autumns, but too much water causes bulb rot."

Minor bulbs

"The tendency of these plants to flower very early makes them welcome harbingers of spring," Trinklein said.

"Popular minor bulbs include crocus, Dutch iris, Glory-of-the-snow, grape hyacinth, Siberian squill, snowdrop and winter aconite.

"These small bulbs bring big pops of color when planted en masse. Plant in groups of 50 bulbs or more. Space 3-4 inches apart to a depth equal to about three times their height.

"They need loose, well-drained soil. Add organic matter to improve poorly drained soils. If soil is heavy, plant bulbs in a rock garden or on raised mounds for better drainage.







Males, Pick-up Truck Occupants Remain at Higher Risk for Traffic Deaths

Recent statistics from the Missouri Coalition for Roadway Safety show that men make up the majority of the state's traffic fatalities, often due to a lack of seat belt use, particularly among pickup truck drivers.

Preliminary 2020 data indicates male pickup truck drivers account for 77% of the pickup truck fatalities so far this year. In addition, 83% of the male pickup truck drivers killed were

As a result, the coalition and the Missouri Department of Transportation are stepping up efforts to target messaging and educational resources to males and those driving pickup trucks. Through a new video, the department hopes to encourage buckling up by outlining the consequences of not wearing a seat belt. The department will promote the video, which can be found at https://youtu.be/obmulMOYK6g, via social media and other avenues.

"We're working to tailor our safety messages to categories of drivers, such as males and pickup truck occupants, who are at higher risk of losing their lives in a traffic crash," said Patrick McKenna, MoDOT director. "Despite all that is going on, we can't lose sight of the fact that a public health crisis is playing out on our state's highways in the form of traffic fatalities."

Already, 2020 has seen 717 traffic fatalities, an increase of 76 more lives lost compared to the same time last year. Of the vehicle occupants killed in Missouri traffic crashes in 2020, 68% were unbuckled. Based on average survival rates, if everyone involved in these crashes had been buckled, more than 180 people who were killed would still be alive today, according to State Highway Safety and Traffic Engineer Nicole Hood.

As part of the messaging, MoDOT and the coalition continue to promote the state's successful Buckle Up Phone Down safety initiative, especially among men and truck drivers. The BUPD campaign, which will celebrate its fourth annual Buckle Up Phone Down Day on Oct. 16, tackles two of the most effective actions drivers can take to stay safe when getting behind the wheel - fastening their seatbelts and putting down their cell phones.

Kayaks are great ways to explore MDC areas in the fall

Whether you enjoy fishing area streams or simply like to relax by spending a day floating, the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) wants to remind area paddlers that kayaks and conservation areas go together in the fall.

The navigability a kayak offers an angler makes paddling up to a root-wad or into a secluded area not accessible from a bank an easy task that may lead to a day of fishing fun. The same holds true for floating into a marshy shallow-water area to snap a picture of a heron, egret, or some other type of wetland wildlife. Kayaking takes on added pleasures in the fall as migratory birds use streams and lakes as stop-overs on their southerly journeys.

Some people view kayaks as a stream vessel, but their navigability makes them great for exploring sloughs and other backwater areas of lakes. A list of kayak-friendly MDC areas in southwest Missouri includes:

Shawnee Trail Conservation Area: This 3,635-acre area in Barton County has Pin Oak Lake, 10 ponds and 29 strip mining pit lakes where a kayak can lead to a great day of fishing and/or nature viewing. Species that can be fished for include largemouth bass, bluegill, redear sunfish, and channel catfish.

Robert E Talbot Conservation Area: This 4,360-acre area in Lawrence County features two lakes where you can fish for largemouth bass, bluegill, and channel catfish.

Bushwhacker Lake Conservation Area: This 4,790-acre area in Vernon and Barton counties features tow lakes (Bushwhacker Lake and Willow Lake) where you can fish for bluegill, channel catfish, crappie, largemouth bass, and redear sunfish. Anglers who utilize kayaks have easier access to all of the water resources as Bushwhacker Lake is the only body of water on the area with a public boat ramp or a nearby road access.

Shepherd of the Hills Hatchery to Cooper Creek Access: This five-mile stretch on Lake Taneycomo in Taney County provides good opportunities to catch trout and great views of the bluffs that border the lake.

Bennett Springs Access to Barclay Conservation Area: This six-mile stretch on the Niangua River in Dallas County features fishing opportunities for rainbow trout, brown trout, and smallmouth bass. This stretch of river is an easy float with moderately swift runs and deep, clear pools. The fall foliage provides a pallet of color along the rock bluffs.

Kayakers should remember to always wear a life jacket. It's also best to kayak with others or, at the very least, let others know where you'll be. Get information about other MDC areas to kayak at: https://nature.mdc.mo.gov/discover-nature/


