## Cassville's American Legion Post to sell land, building

Since 1936, Cassville's American Legion Post 118 was a fixture in town. From the group's annual tractor pull to the bingo nights and carnivals of years past, the Legion focused on giving the community a safe place to gather and host events that serve the whole family.

According to Darrell "O.B." Hovland, finance officer for Post 118, regulations on bingo as well as a drop in membership has led the group to take drastic action in order to maintain their presence.

"The American Legion has dropped in membership and there are a lot of new state regulations on bingo operations for non-profits," said Hovland. "We had to cut our bingo operation,

therefore we don't have the funds to upkeep all the American Legion property we currently have. So, it was voted on by our members to downsize so that we can still maintain a post in Cassville and not have the financial burden, because we can't afford it."

Hovland stated that legion's bingo operations ceased in 2015, with their main source of income from that point on being the annual truck and tractor pull.

According to Hovland, the state taxes on bingo was an ongoing issue for Post 118, as well as many other bingo operations in the area.

"The state over-taxes on bingo operations, and they're basically killing any non-profit operation

that runs a bingo operation," said Hovland. "That was one of our main ways of making money that we could give back to the community."

At their July meeting, Post 118 unanimously voted to make arrangements to sell off a significant portion of their grounds in order to cover the cost of continuing operations.

"We officially voted to sell a portion of the American Legion grounds with the post keeping Memorial Park and some of the grounds behind the American Legion building," said Hovland. "We do a lot of things in the community, and we can't afford to maintain the property and still give back to the community in the way that we would

like to."

Hovland went on to explain the does not yet know what the plans are for the

future of the tractor pull as this agreement involves them releasing ownership of the grounds where it is

held.

## Two charged with burglary, assault at Cassville home

Two were arrested after a break in and assault on two people in Cassville last week. According to the affidavits of probable cause, Amy J. Walker, 31, of Cassville, and Zachary D. Blay, 34, of Cassville, forced entry into a mobile home on Wayne Drive in Cassville and assaulted two people.

Officer Taylor Lombard, of the Cassville Police Department, was dispatched to the address for a disturbance on Friday, October 4. One of the victims called 911 to report he was running from Blay and Walker and another person said he was assaulted.

The victims and witnesses reported that Blay and Walker forced their way into the home where three people were inside. Blay and Walker allegedly hit two of the victims

in the face multiple times. Blay was also reported to have armed himself with a knife and told one of the victims he would kill him and "take his face off."

One victim suffered from a nose injury that was bleeding. The other victim suffered a swollen right eye and a fractured wrist from the assault and had to be transported to Mercy Hospital in Cassville for treatment.

The door jamb to the mobile home was also damaged in the incident, needing about \$80 worth of repairs.

Both Walker and Blay were located in the residence and taken into police custody. Blay is charged with two counts of assault in the second degree, one count of armed criminal action, one count of burglary in

## Exeter students in need to receive clothes thanks to Security Bank donation

Over the last few years, Security Bank of Cassville has made donating to local organizations a priority. Since June 2017, the bank donated over \$6,700 in aid to local charitable projects. The most recent recipient was Exeter Schools to help purchase clothing for kids in need.

According to Security Bank of Cassville president, Jon Horner, the money for these donations comes directly from the bank's employees. Employee donations total anywhere from \$200 to \$300 on a monthly basis. Horner explained that for their donation, employees gained access to a special incentive on a weekly basis.

"What we do is, on Fridays, we let our employees wear jeans, but in order to do so, we ask that they donate \$5," explained Horner. "At the end of the month, we select an organization that we think is worthwhile, needs assistance and works within the community."

According to Horner, since 2017, the bank has

The health department will change the days of operation at the Monett location to Tuesdays and Wednesdays the first two full weeks of each month, Wednesday on the third full week of each month, and Tuesday on the fourth full week of the month. All hours will be 7:30 a.m. to 6 p.m.

WIC services and vital

records (birth/death certificates) will be the only services available at this location. All other services will be provided at the Cassville office. This includes all immunizations (childhood, adult, influenza, etc.), family planning supplies (pills, depo, ring, etc.), pregnancy services (testing, temp Medicaid, case management, etc.), STD/HIV testing, lead testing, communicable disease surveillance/investi-

gation (TB testing), health education, environmental services (water testing, waste water issues, food and lodging inspections, etc.), and emergency preparedness planning.

Exeter man charged with sodomy after alleged assault

A registered sex offender from Exeter is charged with sodomy after an alleged sexual assault on a victim in July. According to affidavits of probable cause, the victim was underage and staying with the suspect temporarily to work.

Jody Frank Miller, 54, of Exeter, is charged with sodomy in the first degree and was booked into the Barry County Jail for the charges on October 6.

According to affidavits of probable cause by detective Angela Cole with the Barry County Sheriff's Department, the incident happened sometime between July 10 and July 11 at Miller's residence on Farm Road 2190 in Exeter. Miller allegedly had the victim, who was under the age of 18, in his home because the victim was staying at the residence to make money in the hay field.

According to the victim, Miller provided alcohol and, after the victim fell asleep, he sodomized him. The victim reported waking up with his pajama pants and underwear pulled down as Miller was committing the assault. The victim reported being too afraid to move because of Miller's tendency to violence.

The affidavits of prob-

able cause state that Miller had three prior convictions for statutory sodomy in the second degree from 2006 on a 14 year old male. Miller is required to register as a sex offender.

Miller is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$30,000 cash-only bond.

## MU Extension helps woman farmer grow cattle and hay operation

Like many girls raised on farms in the 1970s, Marcia Moreland learned to cook, clean and iron. Men and boys in the family tended to farm duties.

It was no different at school. FFA was for boys. FHA and home economics classes were for girls.

Today, Moreland owns and manages Moreland Farms in Barry County. She credits University of Missouri Extension specialists for teaching her the ins and outs of cattle and hay.

Moreland submitted her first entry at the Ozark Empire Fair Hay Show in 2012. She finished dead last. Disappointed and determined to learn how to grow quality hay, she asked MU Extension specialists for help. This year, she became the first woman champion at the show. She placed first in the dry hay class, with a relative forage quality of 207 on alfalfa cut April 19.

"I got my tail kicked that first year," she says. "But I wanted to learn how to grow and make quality hay. I lost my dad 30 years ago, so I didn't have that influence to

guide me or learn from. So I had to find that knowledge elsewhere."

MU Extension specialists in beef, dairy, agronomy and business—Eldon Cole, Reagan Bluel, Tim Schnakenberg and Wesley Tucker—helped her through classes, phone calls, farm visits and referrals. She also "looked over the fence" for advice from successful farmers and ranchers. She regularly looks at the MU Extension website for articles and publications that provide practical free help along with the findings of extensive studies by University of Missouri researchers.

Moreland planted 10 acres of conventional alfalfa in 2018. She recently put up her fifth cutting. She currently grows hay for her and her husband's beef cow-calf operation, but she plans to provide small bales to a few customers in the future.

To improve her business skills, she took classes offered by Annie's Project, an educational program for women farmers that is available in Missouri through MU Extension. "It was an

eye-opener to the business side of farming," she says. "I learned how to budget and plan from my FHA classes in high school, but farming enterprises were a bit different."

Moreland and her husband run a commercial herd of black cows with a whiteface bull influence. They have worked diligently to have a gentle herd that responds to the call of "baaaaay-beeee." "They are our employees," she says. "They have to work in order to earn their bed and breakfast."

When it's time to wean the calves, they use 'fence-line' weaning. This means mothers and calves spend several days in adjacent paddocks, separated only by a fence, before the calves are removed entirely. This makes the transition less stressful for the cattle and improves the health of the calf crop.

She moved the herd's calving date to April 1, which lets her put cattle on fresh spring fescue when it is at its nutritional peak. She found that spring calves

grow faster than calves born in January or February. It suited her operation and improved profitability of the cattle enterprise.

Moreland, known as "Mimi" by grandchildren and students, drives a school bus route. The break between morning and afternoon routes gives her time to manage more of the farm.

In addition to hay and cows, she raises sunflowers at the request of local florists. She grew cotton this year as an experiment and grows pumpkins for her grandchildren.

At 60, she has no plans of slowing down. She wants to buy more cattle and land for future generations of her family. She also wants to be an advocate for agriculture, teaching others what she learned through extension and life on the farm.

"I used to think being a farm kid was a bad connotation, but now I embrace being raised on a farm," she says. "I know how blessed I am."

## CBD oil and arthritis

Health-conscious consumers have no doubt encountered advertisements for CBD oil at some point in recent memory. Supplement stores, pharmacies and even gyms may promote CBD oil, prompting consumers to wonder just what CBD is and how it may or may not play a role in the treatment of certain conditions, including arthritis.

According to the Arthritis Foundation®, two kinds of the cannabis sativa plant, hemp and marijuana, produce cannabinoids, which Harvard Medical School notes is the second most prevalent of the active ingre-

dients of cannabis. People unfamiliar with cannabidiol, or CBD, a type of cannabinoid, may assume it gets users high like marijuana. However, CBD doesn't get users high, as another cannabinoid, a psychoactive part of the marijuana plant known as THC, is responsible for that effect.

Advocates for CBD often note its potential to alleviate pain associated with arthritis. While animal studies have supported those claims, the Arthritis Foundation notes that such studies do not always translate to humans. In addition, the Arthritis Foundation notes that, thus far,

human studies examining the potential efficacy of CBD in treating arthritis pain have produced mixed results, and the Harvard Medical School notes that more studies are necessary to determine the potential of CBD in treating pain, including that caused

by arthritis.

Laws also vary regarding the legality of CBD, though many places allow some form of CBD. Consumers should first consult with their physicians regarding their conditions and whether or not CBD might help them.



King Cemetery, located between Washburn and Seligman on Farm Road 2265, is one of the oldest cemeteries in Barry County. Its earliest occupants date back to the 1840s, just five years after the formation of the county itself. Now, in 2019, nearly 160 years after the cemetery came into being, one of its most important landmarks is being retired.

The red oak tree that rests in the center of the grounds is scheduled for removal sometime later this month. The tree is speculated to be one of the oldest in Barry County, having been recorded as being part of the grounds since before the first bodies were laid to rest beneath it.

According to Wendell Bishop, who has served as the president of the King Cem-

etry Board for 26 years, the tree is estimated to be over 100 feet tall with a measured circumference of 17 feet and a diameter of 8 feet 3 inches.

"It's a big, beautiful tree," said Bishop. "It might be just about the oldest in Barry County."

Bishop explained that the tree is most likely part of a forest that was cleared to make room for burial plots. As it currently stands, the tree is one of just a few inside the cemetery grounds.

According to an article titled "Legend of King Cemetery One of County's Earliest" from the Cassville Democrat in June of 1970, one of the earliest accounts of burials on the grounds implied that before the grounds were explicitly a cemetery, much of the area was wooded. This would mean that the tree at the center

of King Cemetery is the last of a pre-Civil War forest.

Bishop went on to explain that the tree has special meaning to the cemetery itself. According to him and King Cemetery secretary Carolyn Richardson, the tree was once the site of annual memorial day meetings on the ground.

"Families would eat lunch under the tree after they met there," said Richardson. "Then they would spend the day tending the grounds and trimming the weeds away from the headstones."

Efforts to keep the tree alive began nearly a decade ago. In that time, according to Bishop, the tree has been trimmed, pruned and everything in between to keep the dead ends away and keep the living parts of the tree healthy and prosperous.

While numerous efforts

have been made over the past decade to keep the tree alive, time has finally taken its toll. While half of the tree remains healthy and vibrant, the other half is visibly withered from root to leaf. Its continued existence on the grounds could be detrimental to the occupants.

"It could fall over any day now," said Bishop. "When that happens, it will cause serious damage to the graves and headstones under it."

While the plans for the tree's removal haven't been set in stone, the eight-member board of King Cemetery has made arrangements with local logger Justin Beeff to begin removal of the tree at the end of October.

"We're going to use a couple of cranes and take it out piece by piece," explained Bishop. "That way we don't disturb any of the graves and we can make sure we don't hurt any of the headstones."

The tree will not be entirely removed from the grounds, however. Though some believe the tree to be hollow in many spots, Bishop believes that enough of the insides of the tree still remain to make it a suitable replacement for something that was lost long ago.

The tree once featured large stones under its shade that were used as public seating. According to Bishop, some time before the turn of


the century, those stones were stolen by vandals.

Bishop hopes that enough of the trunk will remain intact to turn the stump of the tree into a new public seating area on the grounds.

King Cemetery is located on Farm Road 2265, just off of Business Highway 37 between Seligman and Washburn. The board of King Cemetery is empowered to maintain the grounds and make changes such as this through donations.

### Highway Patrol reminds: Watch for deer

Colonel Eric T. Olson, superintendent of the Missouri State Highway Patrol, reminds drivers that deer are more active and create hazards for Missouri motorists this time of year. Drivers are reminded that an attempt to avoid striking a deer could result in a more serious crash involving oncoming traffic. Try to remain calm. Panicking and overreacting usually lead to more serious traffic crashes. As soon as you see a deer, the best course of action is to reduce your speed. Other drivers may be doing the same, so be sure to pay attention to traffic patterns.

Last year, drivers in Missouri experienced 4,090 traffic crashes where deer-vehicle strikes occurred. One deer strike occurred every 2.1 hours in the state. In these crashes, there were six fatalities and 415 people were injured. The majority of deer strike crashes occur in October and November each year, with the largest number taking place in November. Although deer strikes can occur at any time, most occur between the hours of 5 a.m. and 6:59 a.m., and then again from 6 p.m. to 8:59 p.m.

Remember: Rural areas are not the only place where deer/vehicle strikes occur. When you see a deer, slow down and proceed with caution. Deer often travel in groups--stay on guard after a close call or when you see a single deer. Natural features also affect deer movement. In areas where there are streams or wooded corridors surrounded by farmland, look for more deer to cross roadways. At night, watch for deer eyes to reflect your headlights, which could give you more time to react to their presence.

Deer behavior changes due to mating season, which may cause an increase in sightings and roadway crossings. Hunting and crop harvesting may result in these animals being in places they aren't usually seen. Drivers are urged to remain alert. If you strike a deer, call 9-1-1 or \*55 on a cell phone and report it.

The only 100 percent survivable traffic crash is the one that never happens. Make sure everyone in the vehicle is properly restrained in a seat belt or child restraint. Every day as we travel on Missouri's roadways, we trust that every driver on the road is going to obey the speed limit, pay attention, and drive sober. "Don't Violate The Trust"

# Local man fights cannabis stigma after 2018 arrest

With the climate surrounding marijuana changing after the legalization of medical cannabis, many patients with criminal charges prior to Amendment 2 passing are left with questions about what the state will do. One local man is speaking out about his experience and working to help others with the same issues.

Dana Bland, of Purdy, said his life changed after a relative reported him for growing marijuana in 2018. Bland said, "I got turned in by a relative. I heard the helicopter when they came in."

Bland's arrest was detailed in an article in the Barry County Advertiser on August 8 of that year. Something he said changed even his pastor's feelings toward him.

Essentially, the Ozarks Drug Enforcement Team (ODET), along with the Barry County Sheriff's Department, showed up and arrested both Bland and his wife, Suzanne Bland, who has a mental handicap.

Bland said, "They charged me like I was a drug dealer. I was only growing my own medicine."

Since, the charges against

his wife were dropped entirely, and Bland's felony manufacturing a controlled substance charge was dropped to misdemeanor possession of marijuana charge. He still didn't plead guilty and instead entered an Alford plea to the charge. If he serves six months unsupervised probation successfully, he won't be formally sentenced. He received a suspended imposition of sentencing and six months unsupervised probation.

Barry County prosecuting attorney Amy Boxx said this case is not representative of how her office is treating marijuana charges. She said, "The prosecutor's office has not changed its stance on misdemeanor marijuana charges nor does the issuance of a medical marijuana patient card impact the decision on prosecution at this time. This particular case had 4th Amendment issues with the search that was conducted on the Bland's premises. As a result, plea negotiations were necessary. Each case is unique and the outcome of this particular case should not be consid-

ered a reflection of this office's overall position."

However, this does warrant asking what the state plans to do regarding former charges for marijuana when the person is now a medical marijuana patient card holder. In other states, charges are often expunged, but the Missouri Legislature has not yet made any decisions regarding cases like Bland's.

He explained some of what he went through with his experience. He said, "I was hooked on opiates through the VA, and cannabis got me off of that. I was on 25 different medications. Three years ago when I ended up in the hospital with a severe lung infection, it ended up being medications that caused it."

It was then that Bland turned to cannabis to treat himself. He said he never grew it to sell to other people or abused it in any way. Since the ordeal, he's turned to CBD-only products until he is no longer on probation and will be able to acquire his medical cannabis legally.

When he heard the heli-

copter, Bland said, "I cut it all down and gave it to them. I knew they were coming to get it."

"We had 15 Ozark Drug Enforcement Team officers come in with guns."

Bland said that even though he and his wife are both disabled and were cooperative, it was a harrowing experience for both of them. He said, "People were on the streets that day screaming not to arrest [my wife] because she had a mental handicap."

Bland said he has maxed out credit cards and used all of his money to fight the charges from 2018, but that doesn't restore his reputation. He said, "I was a firefighter for 20 years, worked on a rescue team and on the ambulance service. I'm a decorated veteran. This happens all the time, and people go broke and their reputation totally destroyed because of a plant. Luckily, I had the money to fight it."

Since his arrest, Bland began working in advocacy, using social media as a platform for information for patients. He also started a local chapter for The Human Solution International, a grassroots movement to protect civil rights of people involved in similar situa-

tions.

Bland said his decision to enter an Alford plea instead of fight is charges to the end was due to his illness, and he wants to protect others from the same fate. He said, "I'm too sick. I can't wait two years to go to trial. We didn't do anything wrong other than save my life by using natural medicines. I couldn't take pharmaceuticals anymore because they were killing me. I was in kidney failure and was on life support for a month."

"I had to grow it for myself because there was no other option. I didn't want to buy it from a drug dealer."

Moving forward, Bland is hoping the state works toward changing laws to help patients. "They need to expunge records of medical cannabis patients period for non-violent, not just for misdemeanors but felonies, as well."

"These people had done nothing but use something that was a plant that was used for medicine for 15,000 years. It's only been illegal recently."

Bland said the local chapter of The Human Solution International will be more public in coming months with rallies and informational events.

# Cassville blitzes McDonald County, 48-6

The Cassville Wildcats scored on their first seven possessions on Friday night, piling up points enroute to a 48-6 drubbing of McDonald County at Anderson. Only a failed extra point attempt and a late turnover that led to Mac's only score kept this from being a perfect outing for Cassville.

The Wildcats mauled the McDonald County offense in a textbook display of Lance Parnell's defensive scheme.

For three quarters, the Mustangs never snapped the ball in Cassville territory. The Mustangs managed two first downs on the game's opening possession before punting, then struggled through a string of three-and-outs as the Wildcats built a 34-0 half-time lead.

As good as Cassville's defense was, the offense was even better.

Cassville's offense was a model of efficiency. After the Mustangs burned half of the first quarter with an 11-play drive that sputtered at midfield, the Wildcats scored in just four plays.

DJ White set up the O-unit with a 42-yard punt return, and Deven Bates sneaked in from a yard out to give Cassville a 7-0 lead.

Just minutes later, Zach Coenen blasted through the line and raced 40 yards for a

score and a 14-0 lead.

Midway through the second quarter, Jericho Ferris rumbled 6 yards for another score, and Cassville claimed a 21-0 lead.

Deven Bates finished an amazing first half, throwing a 28-yard touchdown pass to an uncovered Bowen Preddy for Cassville's fourth touchdown of the game. Bates looked like he was auditioning for Tom Brady's job on Friday night, completing all six of his attempts for 120 yards and a score.

Then the Wildcats hurried down the field on an 8-play, 38-yard drive to score again with just 24 seconds left in the half. A bad snap doomed the PAT attempt though, leaving Cassville with a 34-0 lead, a point shy of a running clock to start the third quarter.

The Wildcats wasted no time in revving up that running clock. Bates found Ferris deep in the secondary with a 50-yard rainbow to set up a Preddy touchdown. Drake Reese scored his fifth PAT of the night to push the lead to 41-0 with 10:25 on the clock.

Ferris would add a short scoring run at the 2:54 mark of the quarter as Cassville boosted the lead to 48-0.

Just twelve minutes stood between the Wildcats and their second shutout of the season.

But the reserve offense

fumbled on its first snap of the game. The Mustangs, unable to reach Cassville territory for three quarters of play, suddenly had the ball at the Wildcats' 40-yard line.

The Mustangs converted a 4th and 10 to keep the drive alive, and then sophomore quarterback Cole Martin wove his way into the end zone from 4 yards out. The try for 2 failed, but the Mustangs averted the shutout with the late score.

Cassville killed the remaining clock with a pair of genuflections, and claimed the 48-6 victory.

Stats showed just how much Cassville dominated this contest.

Bates was perfect through the air, 6/6, 120 yards, and a touchdown

Zach Coenen: 7 carries/75 yards and a touchdown

Jericho Ferris: 11 carries/69 yards and a touchdown

Bowen Preddy: 6 carries/41 yards and a touchdown

Deven Bates: 6 carries, 33 yards and two touchdowns

McDonald County had less than 60 yards of total offense in the first half, and under 120 for the game. The Mustangs fell to 2-4 and will face Lamar in their next outing.





# SBA amends Disaster Declaration for Barry County

Low-interest federal disaster loans are now available to certain private nonprofit organizations in Benton, Boone, Callaway, Clay, Cooper, Dunklin, Gasconade, Howard, Lafayette, Lincoln, Pulaski, Scott, St. Charles and St. Clair counties; and St. Louis City following the amendment to President Trump's July 29, 2019, major disaster declaration for Public Assistance as a result of severe storms, tornadoes and flooding that occurred April 29 - July 5, 2019, announced acting Administrator Christopher M. Pilkerton of the U.S. Small Business Administration. Private nonprofits that provide essential services of a governmental nature are eligible for assistance.

Although the deadline to apply for a disaster loan for physical damages was Sept. 27, 2019, private nonprofits in Benton, Boone, Callaway, Clay, Cooper, Dunklin, Gasconade, Howard, Lafayette, Lincoln, Pulaski, Scott, St. Charles and St. Clair counties; and St. Louis City may apply with an explanation that they were not eligible until this Sept. 30, 2019,

amendment to the declaration. SBA may lend private nonprofits up to \$2 million to repair or replace damaged or destroyed real estate, machinery and equipment, inventory and other business assets. SBA can also lend additional funds to help with the cost of improvements to protect, prevent or minimize the same type of disaster damage from occurring in the future.

In addition, private nonprofits of any size may apply for SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loans of up to \$2 million to help meet working capital needs caused by the disaster. "Economic Injury Disaster Loans may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable and other bills that cannot be paid because of the disaster's impact. Economic injury assistance is available regardless of whether the private nonprofit suffered any property damage," Garfield said.

Economic Injury Disaster Loans are available in Adair, Andrew, Atchison, Barry, Barton, Bates, Benton, Bollinger, Boone, Buchanan, Caldwell,

Callaway, Camden, Cape Girardeau, Carroll, Cedar, Chariton, Clark, Clay, Cole, Cooper, Dade, Dallas, Daviess, Douglas, Dunklin, Gasconade, Gentry, Grundy, Harrison, Henry, Hickory, Holt, Howard, Howell, Jackson, Jasper, Knox, Laclede, Lafayette, Lewis, Linn, Lincoln, Livingston, Macon, Maries, Marion, McDonald, Mercer, Miller, Mississippi, Monroe, Montgomery, New Madrid, Newton, Nodaway, Ozark, Pemiscot, Perry, Pike, Pulaski, Putnam, Ralls, Randolph, Ray, Saline, Schuyler, Scotland, Scott, Shannon, Shelby, St. Charles, St. Clair, Ste. Genevieve, Stoddard, Sullivan, Taney, Texas, Vernon, Wayne, Webster and Wright counties; and St. Louis City.

The interest rate is 2.75 per-

cent with terms up to 30 years. The deadline to apply for economic injury is April 29, 2020.
