Wheaton Robodogs robotics team headed to State for first time

For the first time, the Wheaton Robodogs are headed to State. The team of nine students will compete in March to try to earn a spot at Worlds only four years into the school's robotics team's career.

The robotics team is coached by Wheaton teacher Pam Peterson. However, Peterson looks at her role more as a supervisor and adviser, the team is led by students, each one of them fulfilling a specific role to aid in the team's success.

This year's team consists of the following students: Cade Woolaway, senior, head builder, engineer and programer; Jacoby Butler, senior, lead documentation of the robot and human player; Tasha Graves, senior, engineering notebook and lead outreach; Brittany King, senior, engineering notebook and team

coach; Zane Smith, sophomore, making 3D prints, helps drive the robot and is learning documentation; Coy Harper, sophomore, designing 3D prints and various roles; Ian Castro, sophomore, 3D designer; Lilly Allen, senior, coprogramer; and James Booth, junior, builder.

For competition, teams are scored on not only their robot's ability to navigate a function and complete the challenges, but the team is also judged on their documentation of all that they have learned and how they have designed and changed their robot for competitions. On top of the competition items, the team also uses a 3-D printer to design keychains and other items to sell to help fund their robot each year, so some marketing and community outreach goes into it, as well.

This year, the Robodogs went to five competitions with

the last being the Western Qualifier Conference in Kansas City. It was in Kansas City that the team learned they had earned a place at State.

Peterson said, "I think we knew we could make it at our last match when we were at Drury. We knew the robot was running really well then. We were one place out at that point [to qualify for state]. We were excited about the Western Qualifier Conference at Kansas City."

She added the team did well this year thanks to the documentation efforts. She said, "It's kind of a 50/50 split on if your robot runs really well or do you have everything documented really well. This year, we were able to have everything documented really well. We have a full two notebooks of documentation. We learned the hard way if some-

Cassville's wrestling program may be one of the newer programs in Barry County, but that isn't stopping the 'Cats from taking down the competition and heading to state. Last week, three girls earned spots at State competition. This weekend, four Cassville boys wrestlers earned the right to compete at State competition this week.

"They wrestle before and after practice. They work hard, and I am excited about the future," said head wrestling coach Nathan Fortner. This year, Cassville wrestling had four boy wrestlers qualify for state, which is the most they have ever had qualify since the program began.

Logan Tolbert, Gabe Hunter, Zach Coenen and Akhilleus Arguelles all quali-

fied, however Tolbert will not be going to state due to a shoulder injury. Hunter also a shoulder injury, but was luckily cleared right before district competition where he earned his spot at state.

Hunter attributes his success to the coaching team. He said, "The coaches need a lot of the praise, they push us boys and always have a game plan. They always take extra time to insure the kids have moves down and are using the right techniques."

Arguelles is the first freshman wrestler from Cassville to advance. "They are all good, young, and will be back next year," said Fortner.

Habitat for Humanity donates to area schools

Habitat for Humanity builds houses. Habitat for Humanity ReStores raise money to build houses. But Habitat for Humanity is more than that, and its reach extends far beyond and into the community. The South Barry County chapter of the Habitat for Humanity recently reached out to schools to donate items collected at their ReStore to help students.

For Monett and Purdy Schools that meant golf clubs for their golf teams for members who can't afford sets of their own. For Cassville Middle School's woodworking program, that meant a huge selection of wood pieces for students to use in class.

Tabetha Smith, vice president of the South Barry County Habitat for Humanity of South Barry board, was the one who thought to donate the golf clubs. She said, "We'd had some of these golf clubs for going on 10 years. I looked at them one day and said, "There has to be a better way of dealing with these."

She continued, "Some people come in and buy them and use them as curtain rods or decoration, really creative things, but I knew we have some kids in the area who don't have the finances to buy a set and want to learn."

Smith consulted with board president David Hermann and suggested it, and he wholeheartedly agreed. She said, "So, Dave and I talked about it and decided to get in touch with athletic directors and coaches at the schools to see if they could use them." The reaction from the coaches was overwhelmingly positive.

About a month ago, Monett golf coach Brian Cox and Purdy golf coach Richard Wagner picked up the clubs for their teams.

Cox said, "Every year I have kids who need clubs that don't have them and want to get started playing, but their parents can't afford clubs, so it'll help a lot of kids get started."

He coaches both boys and girls golf, but the girls program is new this year. He plans to use the several full sets and individual clubs they received to help support and grow that program. "The girls program is new this year, and luckily I had a couple sets already, but hopefully as the program grows, I'll be able to help get more kids started. I also do a summer program.

My goal is to get more younger kids below high school age to give golf a try and I'm trying to take out every excuse a parent might have to get a kid out there. The donation helps a lot."

Wagner said, "There are several very beneficial impacts of the donation. First, many of our players have never played golf before. They, of course, have no clubs of their own. Last year, we had to scrape up a few dollars selling snacks to buy a left handed set for a new player.

"Habitat's generous donation allows us to have several sets and individual clubs from which these players can select, right and left handed, and even change throughout the season. If they decide to pick up the sport for life, they have had the opportunity to use many different clubs before making any kind of investment on their own. If they do not plan to play beyond high school, this donation more than doubled the number of clubs we have available for players to use. In short, we can have a student with no experience join the team at no cost, and give them the opportunity to try it out."



Barry County court sentences 11 to incarceration in January

• Danny Montreal Allen, of Cassville, pled guilty to domestic assault in the second degree on April 16, 2018. Allen's probation has since been revoked, and he was sentenced to seven years incarceration with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

On December 20, 2017, the Cassville Police Department was dispatched to the Cassville Heights Apartments for a domestic disturbance. Allen grabbed the victim by the throat, leaving red marks and bruising. The victim was unable to breathe. There were also red marks and bruises on her arms. This all happened in front of the victim's two small children.

Allen is to serve probation until January 22, 2025.

• Lloyd Brandon Anderson, of Purdy, pled guilty to domestic assault in the second degree. Anderson received a suspended imposition of sentencing.

According to the report from the Barry County Sheriff's Department, Anderson provided alcohol to a minor and touched her private areas at a residence in Purdy on March 24, 2019.

• Trenton James Bohanan, of Purdy, pled guilty to resisting arrest by fleeing - creating a substantial risk of injury or death to any person and resisting arrest for a felony. Bohanan received a suspended execution of a four year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

On September 10, 2018, Bohanan was near the Dutch Maid Laundry in Monett, and officers recognized him as having active warrants. When asked to stop, Bohanan fled on foot from officers.

Later, on November 11, 2018, officers recognized Bohanan and another suspect for having active warrants on 6th Street in Monett. Bohanan fled on foot again.

Bohanan is to serve probation until January 21, 2025.

• Nicholas Stephen Brasel, of Mt. Vernon, pled guilty to domestic assault in the second degree. Brasel received a suspended execution of a seven year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

On November 22, 2015, Brasel grabbed the victim by the throat and threw her on the bed while strangling her. He continued to strangle her and threw her against a wall. Brasel then ran off with a minor child.

Brasel is to serve probation until January 21, 2025.

• Charlie Joe Casper, of Cassville, pled guilty to two counts of possession of a controlled substance on April 15, 2019. Casper's probation was revoked, and he is to serve 120 days of shock time as part of a seven year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections.

On May 11, 2017, the Cassville Police Department was dispatched to a business on Old Exeter Road for Casper being suspected of using narcotics in the rest-

room. Officers located him in his vehicle in the parking lot. During a search, officers found a hypodermic needle for oxycodone, a one hitter for marijuana and a half a white pill. The pill was a Clonazepam, and Capster said the residue in the syringe was oxycodone.

• Tyler Yancey Collins, of Exeter, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and delivery of a controlled substance. Collins received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On February 6, 2019, Collins was located in Sears in Cassville while having an active warrant. When officers transported him to the jail, they found a plastic baggie of methamphetamine on his person.

Collins is to serve probation until January 21, 2025.

• Joseph Derek Cramer, of Anderson, pled guilty to two counts of unlawful use of a weapon - possessing a weapon and a felony controlled substance, three counts of possession of a controlled substance, and one count of delivery of a controlled substance on August 21, 2017. Cramer's probation was revoked, and he is to serve 120 days shock time as part of a seven year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections.

On January 3, 2017, officers were conducting a drug investigation that coincided with a juvenile well-being check at an apartment on State Highway 112. Cramer

was one of the people inside the residence where officers found methamphetamine, and Cramer had a revolver on him at the time. In the home, there was also paraphernalia, marijuana, hydrocodone and

On February 28, 2017, Monett Police were dispatched to the Super 8 Motel for a person acting confused. When they arrived, they located Cramer in the lobby who said he had been held in his room by someone for hours and he was concerned about his girlfriend. When officers investigated, they found a handgun in the room along with methamphetamine, marijuana and paraphernalia.

• Jody Brian Douglas, of Cassville, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Douglas received a suspended execution of a 10 year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

On April 2, 2019, officers saw Douglas riding on a bike and knew he had an active warrant. When they attempted to stop him, he fled, eventually abandoning his bike and fleeing on foot. On the bike, officers found a bag that contained methamphetamine, spoons and a hypodermic needle.

Douglas is to serve probation until January 22, 2025.

• Shawna Dawn Ellison, of Pierce City, pled guilty to felony possession of a controlled substance and misdemeanor driving while revoked/suspended as a first offense on November 20, 2018. Ellison's probation was revoked, and he is to serve five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections

On March 20, 2018, officers stopped Ellison for a traffic violation. Ellison admitted she had a methamphetamine pipe and a baggie of methamphetamine.

• Jennifer Dawn Fisher, of Fairview, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Fisher received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On March 15, 2019, Fisher was in the driver's seat of a vehicle stopped on the side of the road. When officers searched the vehicle, they found methamphetamine in two syringes and residue in a third syringe.

Fisher is to serve probation until January 21, 2025.

• Elizabeth Diane Inman, of Exeter, pled guilty to two counts of felony possession of a controlled substance and misdemeanor unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia. Inman received a sus-

pended execution of a seven year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

On March 23, 2018, officers pulled Inman over, who pulled into a residence's drive where she does not live. When officers asked, she said there may be illegal drugs in the car. Officers found burnt spoons with oxycodone residue

On April 27, 2019, officers stopped Inman, who did not have a drivers' license. Inside her purse, officers located an oxycodone.


Inman is to serve probation until January 21, 2025.



tion until January 21, 2025.

• James Ray Larson, of Washburn, pled guilty to resisting arrest for a felony - creating a substantial risk of injury or death to any person on May 22, 2018. Larson's probation was revoked, and he is to serve 120 days shock time as part of a three year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections.

On November 20, 2016, Larson was driving at a high rate of speed in Seligman. Laron crashed the car and then ran on foot from officers. Larson had multiple prior driving related offenses.

• Christopher Lee Lehman, of Seligman, was found guilty by the court of a sex offender physically present within 500 feet of a park with a playground, pool or museum as a first offense. Lehman received a suspended execution of a four year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised probation.

On July 4, 2018, the Selig-

man Police Department observed Lehman standing near the Fourth of July parade. Lehman is a registered sex offender and was standing less than 500 feet from playground equipment. Lehman was convicted of incest perpetrator over 21 victim under 16 on August 16, 2000, in Arkansas.

Lehman is to serve probation until January 22, 2025.

• Nathan Cole Liggett, of Huntsville, Ark., pled guilty to tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree and possession of a controlled substance. Liggett received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On August 4, 2019, Liggett was found in possession of a stolen car. Officers found methamphetamine in his pocket when they took him into custody.

Liggett is to serve probation until January 22, 2025.

• Dillon Ray Mayes, of Cassville, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and damage to jail property on March 20, 2017. Mayes' probation was revoked, and he is to serve 120 days shock time as part of a four year incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On September 1, 2016, officers in Monett investigated an alleged assault. When officers interviewed Mayes, he said he confronted the victim for being "creepy." When officers attempted to talk to Mayes, he became disruptive. When taken into custody, Mayes was found to have a baggie of methamphetamine.

On September 3, 2016, Mayes damaged the sprinkler in his jail cell, leading to flooding and destruction of jail property.

• Eric Scott Merritt, of Webb City, made an Alford plea to forgery on January 30, 2015. Merritt's probation was revoked, and he is to serve four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On October 16, 2014, Merritt cashed a payroll check that he had altered from \$72.00 to \$172.00.

• Brandon John Mestas, of Purdy, pled guilty to felony possession of a controlled substance and misdemeanor driver failure to wear a seat belt. Mestas received a suspended imposition of sentencing, a \$10 fine and five years supervised probation.

On October 18, 2018, Mestas was stopped for speeding. Officers found a glass marijuana pipe and a methamphetamine pipe.

Mestas is to serve probation until January 21, 2025.

• Michael Brandon Moore, of Granby, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and property damage in the first degree on a motor vehicle with the intent to steal on December 18, 2018. Moore's probation was revoked, and he is to serve five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On July 7, 2018, Moore was stopped for having active warrants. When stopped, officers found two glass smoking pipes and two baggies of methamphetamine.

On May 11, 2018, the New Site Baptist Church reported gas theft from someone breaking off gas caps and stealing fuel. Moore was identified as the one who stole \$200 of fuel and did \$125 worth of damage to gas cans

• Tabitha Ann Mortell, of Wheaton, pled guilty to two counts of possession of a controlled substance on May 15, 2017. Mortell's probation was revoked, and she is to serve four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On November 23, 2016, officers conducted a search warrant at Mortell's residence. Officers located eight used syringes, a baggie of methamphetamine and multiple items of paraphernalia and with residue on them.

• Aaron Wayne Olson, of Prairie Grove, Ark., pled guilty to stealing \$750 or more on April 16, 2019. Olson's probation was revoked, and he is to serve 120 days shock time as part of a seven year incarceration sentence.

On May 17, 2017, Olson was stopped for shoplifting at Walmart. He had put \$1,037.84 in merchandise in his cart and attempted to leave without paying. He also stole thousands in merchandise from a Rogers, Ark., Walmart.

Street is to serve probation until January 21, 2025.



Trial was in arrears on child support by \$16,743.26 for one minor child.

• Kenneth Austin White, of Zephyhills, Fla., pled guilty to domestic assault in the second degree as a prior and persistent offender. White received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On May 5, 2018, White hit his spouse with a closed fist multiple times that resulted in head trauma. He also punched another family member in the face and pushed him off of a porch causing injuries to his left hand, left elbow, left knee and right ear.

White is to serve probation until January 21, 2025.

Tree seedling ordering available for Shoal Creek landowners

The Nature Conservancy (TNC) is accepting orders for tree seedlings from private landowners in northwestern Barry County along Shoal Creek and its main tributaries.

"Bur Oaks, Red Oaks, Swamp White Oaks and Persimmon, are the tree species that we'll be ordering on February 25th," said Drew Holt, TNC's project manager. "The tree seedlings are free to landowners with property along upper Shoal Creek, as well as along Capps, Joyce, Pogue, and Woodward Creeks," added Holt.

Landowners interested in receiving free tree seedlings should contact Holt at (417) 838-1939 or via email at drew.holt@tnc.org by Monday, February 24.

The streamside tree planting initiative is part of TNC's upper Shoal Creek watershed riparian buffer restoration and enhancement project that was launched last summer when awarded a \$207,395 grant from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources. "In addition to trees, streamside landowners along upper Shoal Creek and its main tributaries are eligible for voluntary cost-share programs offered through this grant," said Holt.

"Identifying potential locations for projects, such as fixing bank erosion, protecting established streamside buffers, and restoring riparian corridors, has begun and is coordinated with programs offered by the Barry County Soil and Water Conservation District and Missouri Department of Conservation," added Holt.

The three-year voluntary cost-share grant program's best management practices include streambank stabilization, re-establishment of trees/grasses and fencing for cattle exclusion and alternative water systems.

Besides preventing valuable farmland from eroding away, healthy vegetated buffers next to streams reduce sediment and nutrient pollutants from entering waterways while also serving to improve aquatic habitat and restore aquatic communities.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Region 7, through the Missouri Department of Natural Resources, has provided partial funding for this project under Section 319 of the Clean Water Act.



Any candidate filing on the first day should be in the County Clerk's Office no later than 3:30 p.m. in order to complete all the required forms before the 4 p.m. closing time. No declaration of candidacy will be accepted after the 5 p.m. deadline on the last Tuesday of March.

Also, all candidates will be required to file a Personal Financial Disclosure Statement with the Ethics Commission. The deadline is fourteen (14) days from the closing date (March 27) of filing for candidacy. Your Personal Financial Disclosure Statement must be received no later than 5 p.m. on the fourteenth day following the closing date for filing for candidacy, or postmarked the day previous to the deadline to be considered timely filed. The time period covered by the statement should be the twelve months previous to the closing date for filing for candidacy.

Candidates are required to file a Candidate's Affidavit of Tax Payments prior to filing for County Office. 


