Roaring River CCC Lodge renovation nears completion

After a year of work, the renovation of the CCC Lodge at Roaring River State Park is almost complete, just past the original deadline of Opening Day 2016. Bill Bryan, Missouri State Parks director, visited the site on Friday, February 19, to look over progress and get an inside look at the \$1.37 million project.

Bryan said, "It should be done by the end of March. We had a couple of delays, like termites that need to be treated and a foundation issue that they are repairing, but we're almost there. We're very excited, and the work looks great."

He also noted that the project came in under budget. The initial budget was \$1.37 million, but Bryan estimates the final total will be right around \$1.2 million. They'll know the final cost once the foundation work is completed, which should be soon.

While the seven suites and gathering space will be completed in late March, there is not a set date for when the rooms will be ready to rent, nor have the room rates been determined at this point. Bryan said that the public can anticipate State Parks to hold a ribbon-cutting event once the renovations are complete. At that point, more information will be available regarding room rates and when reservations will open.

The CCC Lodge, as it's been known for decades, was a project that continued the efforts of the Conservation Civilian Corps and was completed as a Works Progress Administration project in 1938 as part of President Roosevelt's New Deal. Construction of the unique lodge took place from 1936 to 1938.

Patrons continued to rent rooms there until the late 1960's. Over the years, it's

Behind Opening Day: Spawning trout at Roaring River

Next Tuesday marks arguably one of the most important days of the year for the community: Opening Day of trout season. An occasion so monumental that school is out, because let's be honest, so many kids would be absent, it wouldn't be much of a school day anyway.

For a Barry County transplant, Opening Day is a foreign experience that can't quite be understood. That is, until you actually wake up before dawn, suit up with multiple layers of clothes and head down to the park to hear the opening gun

shot as anglers cast their lines into the frigid waters at the park. It's unforgettable.

This year, I was offered the opportunity to get to experience what is involved behind the scenes of Opening Day, and I jumped on it. Paul Spurgeon, Roaring River Hatchery manager, asked me last fall if I wanted to come down and help them spawn trout when the time came. So I asked myself, do I want to don waders, shove my hands into the icy waters of the breeder pool at the park, and grab big slimy fish to help make the fish that people reel in each year? The

answer to that question should be painfully obvious to anyone who knows me.

So, a couple weeks ago, I met Brad Farwell, assistant hatchery manager, at the park to get the full experience. I was joining a team of four: Brad, Roaring River staff Caleb Beuterbaugh and Jake Sizemore, and Brandon Grass, from Bennett Springs' hatchery.

But before I go any further, let me share some details that many people don't realize. The planning that goes into the trout you see being reeled in on Opening Day starts two

Burn ban issued for county after fire influx



Multiple fires burned all across the county since last Wednesday because of low humidity and high winds. Above, a controlled burn in Jenkins spread over 50 acres. According to Jenkins Fire Chief Brian Sisco, the landowner did not know there was a burn ban in effect. Sisco confirmed that the fire department watched the fire to ensure that it was contained and stated, "It was logistically impossible for the fire to spread beyond the property. The land owner took all of the necessary precautions, including fire breaks."

The Barry County commission issued a burn ban

last week after an increasing number of fires burned across the county.

David Compton, Barry County director of Emergency Management said that the burn ban began Friday, February 19, and continues until Friday, February 26.

He said the decision came from the number of fires that had occurred between Wednesday and Thursday last week.

According to Mike Phillips, Barry County E9-1-1 director, there have been

more than 40 fires since last Wednesday. Compton said that on Thursday alone, there were 18 separate fires, two of which were structure



Now, the lodge will return to its glory days a special destination for park goers.

When the lodge was first built, the first floor contained 11 guest rooms that rented out for \$6 per night. When the lodge is reopened the first floor will have three suites. Bryan said, "Today's guests wouldn't have wanted rooms like the original. They would have been tight."

However, many of the features were preserved as closely to the original as possible, including replacing the oak floors with new oak. On the exterior of the building, even original doors were kept for appearances, even if they were not used for functional purposes. Bryan said, "It was critical to maintain the outer

Two injured, one air lifted in Seligman wreck

Two Barry County residents were seriously injured in a single-vehicle crash near Seligman early this week.

On Monday, a 1995 Dodge Dakota Pickup was traveling westbound on DD Highway three miles west of Seligman. According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, the truck, driven by William A. Rickson, 25, of Seligman, went off the roadway, struck and tree and overturned.

William and his passenger Kenny D. Rickson, 48, of Washburn, were seriously injured in the crash that occurred just after midnight. Kenny was transported to Northwest Hospital and Bentonville, Ark., and William was transported to Cox South Hospital in Springfield by air ambulance.

Neither of the Ricksons were wearing seat belts at the time of the crash. The Dakota was totaled and towed from the scene by Wilson's Wrecker.

historic architecture since this building is on the National Historic Register. We're very proud of that."

While historic integrity is being preserved, State Parks took guests' desires into consideration with the new layout of the interior. The seven suites are spacious and all have one or two bedrooms, plus a Murphy bed that pulls down for extra guests. Three of the rooms have gas fireplaces that utilize the existing chimneys that were part of original construction. In all, the lodge will be able to accommodate up to 28 guests at any given time.

The gathering space downstairs will also be a draw for guests. Bryan said, "This will offer an indoor location for people getting together for reunions and other events instead of the outdoor pavilions we already have." The space will also have a gas fireplace to make it more inviting.

Certain elements of the original lodge were upgraded for energy efficiency and guest comfort. While the design of the windows throughout is the same, all of the glass has been replaced with double-panes. New heating and air units allow for complete temperature control, and existing insulation was replaced.

When construction began inside, the crew found traces of the original workers' in many places. On an outer beam, names were carved in with dates going back to 1937. When they worked on the walls, they also found the original insulation: trout chow feed sacks stuffed in the walls, showing the waste not-want not mentality of the post-Depression era.

While the lodge will maintain the historic look on the outside, the rooms inside will be more spacious and accommodating, surely making the lodge a popular destination for park goers wanting overnight accommodations. The seven suites will offer beautiful paneling and original exposed beams bringing harmony between modern convenience and historic feel. One room will be completely American Disability Act (ADA) compliant and two





always change.

Last year, even in the middle of a blizzard, the masses still showed up to the icy banks of Roaring River as part of the annual tradition.

With the park's loyal following and tourists visiting from all over, it takes a lot of trout to keep the waters abundant with fish hungry for anglers' bait. On average, the park stocks 265,000 trout in the river annually.

Collection Process

After suiting up in waders,

a rain coat and some heavy duty rubber gloves, I was ready to help the crew spawn some trout. Spoiler alert: I was not prepared for this.

At first, Brad told me to watch how they did it, take pictures and ask questions, then I'd have the opportunity to get my hands dirty and help.

The process starts with a tub of icy water pulled from the river that gets treated with a sedative powder. Then, a few fish at a time get pulled from the round breeder pool and dumped into the tub. After a few minutes, as unnerving as it looks, the fish are sedated and floating upside down, ready to be handled and spawned.

The males' milt is collected first. The fish are taken by hand into the hatchery building one at a time. While one person holds the trout, another person has three test tubes and a towel in the other, After drying off the underside of the trout (sperm is activated by water, causing them to die in a few minutes if there isn't an egg present), the handler holds him on his side and slightly toward the ground, lifts the tail end and gently squeezes his underside. The other person catches some of the sperm stream in the test tubes, then the fish's weight is recorded, and he is taken back to the breeder pool to wake up.

So repeat this process around 60 times and you've got enough sperm to fertilize a couple buckets of roe. It takes way less time than I'd imagined. It is also much easier than I had mentally prepared myself for, as long as you are able to either hold test tubes with relative steadiness or manage a big slippery trout without dropping it.

Occasionally, a trout would need to be culled, meaning that it would be removed from the breeder pool and moved out as a lunker. Typically, trout are viable as breeders for four or five years. After that, the males sometimes stop producing altogether or it's extremely watery. Based on how the milt looks and the size of the trout (older fish are bigger), Brad determined whether he would be put back out with the breeders or turned out to pasture

(turned out to river, I guess).

As we wound down to the last few trout, I got to try out



my skills after watching the experts. After bringing in a few trout, I've decided to add "trout spawner" to my future resumes.

After the milt was stored in airtight bags and put in a cooler, we moved on to the females. This process was much more involved and slightly terrifying.

The females were brought in the exact same way, but the process to collect the roe was more involved

This time, when the handler applies pressure to her underside, a group of orangey yellow eggs are expelled, which Brad caught in a small dish to determine their viability.

If her eggs were determined to be bad, he would decide either to cull the fish out or just have the handler strip all of her eggs into a bucket and put her back in the breeder pool to try again next year.

If the dish of eggs looks good, the trout is taken to a table with a bucket with a hole cut in the lid. A net inside the hole catches all of the eggs as they are expressed. However, most trout need a bit of air injected by a needle into their egg cavity to push them all out. Each female produces anywhere from 10,000 to 15,000 eggs at a time.

When it was my turn to inject the air, a look of sheer terror washed over my face, and I think I actually apologized to her. Good news: I didn't mess up, her eggs were excellent looking, and she was fine in the end and released back to the swirling waters of the pool.

Fertilization

Once a big rubber bowl was filled with roe, it was time to fertilize them, which was pretty simple. I poured the milt in a circle on top of the eggs, Caleb added some salt water, and then I used my hand to stir the eggs until it was all mixed together. Your hand being surrounded by thousands of fish eggs is a surprisingly cool feel-


The eggs were then added to a big bucket with more water, and then that bucket was set into one of the hatchery's troughs of water to keep cool. For two hours, we waited.

Next, Brad rinsed the eggs



by slowly filling up the bucket with water and pouring off what floated to the top. All of the extra milt and bad eggs floated to the top and eventually, the fertilized eggs were clean.

Next an iodine solution was added to the bucket to disinfect them. From there, Brad and I counted the eggs to determine how many roe were in a single ounce. By counting them half a dozen times, the numbers could be averaged to



When you cast your line into the waters on Opening Day, take a moment to pause

to finish. The process was both complex and simplistic all at once. But it was a process that keeps the park going year in and year out.

Hatching fry

It will take the fertilized eggs 21 days to hatch. Then, the fry are extremely needy, as most newborns are, needing to be fed hourly for the first couple weeks, meaning the hatchery has to have 24-hour staff. It'll be up to four months before the fry will be moved outside to continue to grow until next year when they'll be released into the cool waters

Not all of the eggs will hatch. Roaring River's hatchability numbers are around 60 percent, but parks with cooler waters have higher rates. Some parks spawn twice a year. Some, like Roaring River, just

your catch.

In the short time I was at the park, I'd helped spawn around 67,000 trout. Much to my disappointment, I wouldn't be able to follow my babies' progress over the coming year; this batch went back to Bennett Springs with Brandon. But don't worry, he promised to let me know how they are doing and send pictures.

dren, siblings, and nephews or nieces, including through marriage or adoption. The farm must be at least 40 acres of the original land acquisition and make a financial contribution to the overall farm income.

"One hundred consecutive years of family ownership of a farm is a milestone to be recognized from a cultural and stewardship perspective," said Tom Henderson, interim vice provost for University of Missouri Extension.

In 2008, the Missouri

Farm Bureau joined MU Extension and the MU College of Agriculture, Food and Natural Resources as a program

"Missouri Farm Bureau is a proud partner in the recognition of century farms," said Blake Hurst, president. "We applaud the hardworking farm families that have kept us fed and clothed for generations. They represent an important part of our heritage and laid a foundation for the bounty Americans enjoy every day."

Applicants certified as owners of a 2016 Missouri Century Farm will be recognized by the local MU Extension center in the county where the farm is located. Applicants are presented with a sign and a certificate.

Since Missouri began the program in 1976, more than 8,000 century farms have been recognized.

For applications received on May 1, a \$65 fee covers the cost of a certificate, farm sign and booklet for approved applicants. If the application is received between May 1 and May 16, the cost is \$75. Applications must be postmarked

by May 16, 2016, to be considered.







Local students advance to State DECA competition

Paddlefish season opens March 15 on Table Rock Lake

Missouri's annual spring paddlefish snagging season is a popular pastime for thousands of anglers. The state's major paddlefish snagging waters include Lake of the Ozarks, Truman Lake, and Table Rock Lake with the season running March 15 through April 30. The season for the Mississippi River is March 15 through May 15 with a fall season of Sept. 15 through Dec. 15.

Also known as "spoonbills" because of the shape of their snouts, paddlefish take seven or eight years to grow to legal size. The fish feed on plankton and other microscopic prey. These filter feeders therefore do not take bait from hooks and must be snagged using large hooks that catch in the mouth, gills or other areas of their bodies.

The success of paddlefish snagging is dependent on weather conditions, primarily water temperature and flow.

"The best snagging conditions occur when water temperature reaches 50 to 55 degrees and there is an increase in water flow," MDC Fisheries Management Biologist Trish Yasger said. "This prompts them to move upstream to spawn. We don't usually see a lot of big fish being caught on opening day. Harvest early in the season is typically dominated by local fish and small males with the occasional large female. As water temperature and flow increase, you will start seeing more of the larger

females."

Stocking Efforts

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) makes paddlefish snagging possible in the Show-Me State through annual stocking of up to 38,000 fingerlings raised at Blind Pony Hatchery near Sweet Springs. The fingerlings are released into Lake of the Ozarks, Truman Lake and Table Rock Lake, plus the Black River. The annual stocking is necessary because dams and other barriers to spawning areas have eliminated sustainable natural reproduction in the lakes.

"Without annual stocking by MDC staff, this popular pastime and food source would go away," said Yasger. "And we need help from snaggers to learn more about and to better manage this popular game fish."

Yasger added that MDC released an especially large number of fingerlings into Lake of the Ozarks, Truman Lake, and Table Rock Lake in 2008. The more than 164,000 fingerlings released are now eight years old and should start providing good numbers of fish for snaggers to harvest.

Snag A Tag - Get A Reward

MDC is beginning its second year in a five-year tagging project to help monitor paddlefish numbers and improve species management. Department staff are placing metal jaw tags on up to 6,000 paddlefish

netted in Lake of the Ozarks, Truman Lake, and Table Rock Lake and up to 1,000 netted from the Mississippi River. Yasger encourages all snaggers to help out by reporting tagged paddlefish and to NOT remove tags from undersized paddlefish.

"We will send a special 'I caught a Missouri paddlefish!' t-shirt to each snagger who returns or reports their first tag on a legal-sized fish," Yasger explained. "All returned and reported tags will be placed into an annual drawing for cash prizes with a grand prize of \$500."

Tags or photos of tags from harvested paddlefish must be submitted for rewards. Snaggers must include the following information with each tag:

Date caught

Location of catch including reservoir or river, mile marker, and county

Tag number

Fish length from eye to fork of the tail

Snagger's name and complete address

Report tags by calling MDC at 573-579-6825 with the information, or mail the information with the flattened tag to: Missouri Department of Conservation, 3815 East Jackson Blvd., Jackson, MO 63755. Learn more about the tagging project from MDC online at http://on.mo.gov/1VA1E6B.

Report Transmitters

MDC biologists are also

implanting ultrasonic transmitters in adult paddlefish at Truman Lake, Lake of the Ozarks, Table Rock Lake, and the Mississippi River to track their movements and gain other important information. MDC asks that all snaggers who harvest fish with a transmitter to report it by calling 573-579-6825 or by e-mailing Trish Yasger at Trish. Yasger@mdc.mo.gov. It is important to return transmitters so they can be implanted in other fish.

Help smaller fish survive

Yasger reminds snaggers to help undersized snagged fish survive to grow larger.

"Do not land paddlefish with gaffs. This can fatally injure sublegal fish. Use large landing nets," she said. "Remove hooks carefully and get sublegal fish back into the water as quickly as possible. Wet your hands before handling fish and avoid

excessive handling. Do not pass them around for photos and hold fish firmly to avoid dropping them. Never put fingers in the gills or eyes."

Regulation Requirements

Unless exempt, anglers must have a current fishing permit to snag or to operate a boat for snaggers. The daily limit is two paddlefish and snaggers must stop snagging after obtaining the daily limit on Lake of the Ozarks and Truman Lake and their tributaries, and the Osage River below Bagnell Dam. The minimum legal body length for paddlefish at Lake of the Ozarks, Truman Lake, Table Rock Lake, and their tributaries is 34 inches, measured from the eye to the fork of the tail. The minimum legal body length is 24 inches on the Osage River below Bagnell Dam and in other Missouri waters. All paddlefish under the legal minimum length must be returned to the water unharmed immediately after being caught.

The Wildlife Code of Missouri requires the head, tail, and skin to remain attached to all paddlefish while on the water so paddlefish should not be cleaned until off of the water. Also, extracted paddlefish eggs may not be possessed while on waters of the state or adjacent banks and may not be transported. Paddlefish eggs may not be bought, sold or offered for sale. Additionally, paddlefish or their parts, including eggs, may not be used for bait.
