Gov. Nixon casts a line at Roaring River's Opening Day

This year's Opening Day of trout season at Roaring River State Park was marked by the opening shot fired by Governor Jay Nixon. The 6:30 a.m. opening was unseasonably warm and a touch rainy.

Gov. Nixon took the opportunity to visit Roaring River for the first time to fish in a long time. As he approached the pavilion to open the day, he said, "Let's get the official duties done so I can go fishing." He took his pole to the waters with Missouri State Parks director Bill Bryan just after the

season commenced. Nixon joined over 1,500 other fishermen that day. While the Missouri Conservation Department planned for 2,000 tags on Opening Day, they came in shy with 1,578, still a decent number for a Tuesday. Paul Spurgeon, Roaring River Hatchery manager, said they stocked 6,000 fish for March 1 with 100 of those lunkers.

While the weather was warm for the start of trout season, the light rain meant that many fishermen sat in their vehicles until right before 6:30 a.m. Most of the tags sold were to the early birds. Over 1,400 tags were sold before 11 a.m., meaning the afternoon was fairly sparse in terms of anglers.

Gov. Nixon said that it was important for him to come to Roaring River this year in memory of Senator Emory Melton. He said, "This year, with the passing of Senator Melton, it's just a good time to be here to remember a fellow that really made a difference. At the Melton Lodge last night you could feel how one or two people had really put their shoulder to the wheel to make a difference, and he was a great leader not only

to this park, but for all parks across the state."

Nixon also said he had memories of coming to

Roaring River with his father as a kid. After fishing

Regal factory shut down Tuesday for bomb threat

The Regal Beloit factory on Old Sale Barn Road in Cassville was shut down temporarily yesterday afternoon when someone called in a bomb threat to Barry County E9-1-1.

According to Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly, the call came in around 2:30 p.m. "The call came in to 911 from a male subject that a bomb was going to go off at Regal between 6 p.m. and midnight. So we got officers on the scene and evacuated everyone. The first shift was almost over, so there weren't many employees on site; most of them had gone home. The supervisors got in contact with the second shift to let them know."

The Barry County Sheriff's Department, Cassville Police Department, Cassville Fire Department and Missouri State Highway Patrol all worked to close off the road, secure the area and check the building. Epperly said that they also brought in two bomb dogs, one from Springfield and one from Jasper County, to look for an explosive. Neither dog

hit on any indication of a bomb, and the building was cleared just after 6 p.m.

Epperly said, "We took the plant manager and some supervisors and did a walk through to see if there was anything out of line."

He added, "A place like that, looking for a suspicious bomb is hard because everything has motors and wires. It's like looking for a needle in a haystack." There was no indication by any part of the investigation that the bomb threat was legitimate.

Epperly said, "You've got to take it seriously even though it might just be a disgruntled employee; 99.9 percent of the time, it's nothing, but we always check." Epperly had officers patrol the area all night to be safe, even after the building was deemed safe.

Now, Epperly is having the plant manager and supervisors listen to the 911 recording to see if they recognize the voice that called in the threat.

Epperly added, "It's just good that nothing happened."

Five file for Barry County Sheriff position opening seat in 2017

After county seat filings opened on Tuesday, February 23, five candidates have entered their names in the running for Barry County Sheriff beginning in 2017.

Since longtime Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly announced that he would not be seeking reelection in the August 2 election, there has been much speculation as to who will replace him. So far, five men have entered their names in the running, all on Republican ballots: Travis Hilburn, James Smith, Danny Boyd, Justin Fohn and Terry Meek. All five candidates have experience in law enforcement in Barry County.

Smith, of Aurora, has been commissioned with Barry County since 1993 and has been a full-time police officer for 16 years. He is a former Barry County Sheriff's Department Chief Deputy and currently serves with the Cassville Police Department. This is Smith's seventh year with Cassville.

When asked why he is running for Sheriff, Smith said, "I want to see the department prosper. We have great guys, but they need some direction and training. This is for the citizens of Barry County to have good quality law enforcement."

Terry Meek, of Washburn, has been in law enforcement for 13 years with the majority of that time with the Barry County Sheriff's office. Meek said that he has focused on several areas of investigation, including forgery, fraud, assault as well as child abuse and neglect cases.

Meek stated, "I decided to run because I wanted to continue with some of the values that Sheriff [Epperly] has instilled and continue in the protection of the county. I want to serve and protect the citizens to the best of my ability."

Boyd, of Purdy, currently works as an investigator with the Cassville Police Department, where he has been for eight years. Prior to that he worked as a Missouri State Highway Patrol trooper for nine years. Boyd also served briefly with the Barry County Sheriff's Department and for a year and a half with the Monett Police Department.

Boyd said that serving as Sheriff has been a lifelong goal, but the timing didn't work out in the past. "In the last eight years, I always wanted to run, but before, I was a single parent with three small children, and my family needed me. Then I didn't feel like I could give the county my 100 percent like I can now. This is my lifelong goal, I want to serve the county."

Justin Fohn, of Cassville, has been with the Cassville Police Department since 2012. He also worked for the City of Exeter from 2011 to 2013.

Fohn issued this statement: "After being involved with law enforcement in Barry County, I have noticed a great need for a unified justice system incorporating all area law enforcement with the citizens of Barry County."

"I strongly believe that a Sheriff's Office built on honesty and integrity will provide a safe and beautiful place to live for the citizens of Barry County while maintaining transparent and accountability to the voters of Barry County."

Travis Hilburn, a former Missouri State Highway Patrol trooper, could not be reached for comment at the time of press.

Voting for Barry County Sheriff will be on the August 2, 2016, ballot. Candidates have until March 29 to file.

Washburn murders suspect extradited back to Barry County, held without bond

Christopher Paschall, 38, of Springdale, Ark., was extradited back to Barry County last week to face murder charges of a Washburn woman and her grandfather last January. Paschall had been held in the Washington County, Ark., since his arrest shortly after the shootings to face charges there.

Paschall is charged in the shooting death of his ex-girlfriend, Casey Brace, an her grandfather, Herbert Townsend, before kidnapping the two-year-old daughter he fathered with Brace. The girl was found safe in Arkansas at Paschall's parents' home the same day of the shooting.

Paschall signed a waiver of extradition after posting bond in Washington County, Ark., for charges of possession of a firearm by certain persons, possession of drug paraphernalia, theft by receiving and violating terms of a prior bond.

Once Paschall came to Barry County, a bond hearing

was held. The state was represented by Assistant Attorney General Darrell Lee Moore, who stepped in to assist Prosecutor Amy Boxx. Paschall entered a plea of not guilty to the charges he faces in Barry County. Judge Robert Foulke upheld the State's motion to revoke Paschall's bond, ensuring that Paschall will sit in the Barry County Jail until the case is tried.

Paschall faces two counts of murder, three counts of armed criminal action and one count of parental kidnapping.

According to affidavits of probable cause, the Barry County Sheriff's Department responded to a 911 call from Townsend's home in Washburn on January 5, 2015. When officers arrived, Brace had been shot to death in the home, and Townsend was still alive. Townsend later died but was able to tell officers that "Chris Paschall" had been the perpetrator.

Brace and Paschall had been romantically involved

and had one child together. Brace had other children, as well. She had taken out protection orders against Paschall in 2014 for abuse and stalking.

Paschall was arrested in his parents' home in Springdale, Ark., later that evening.

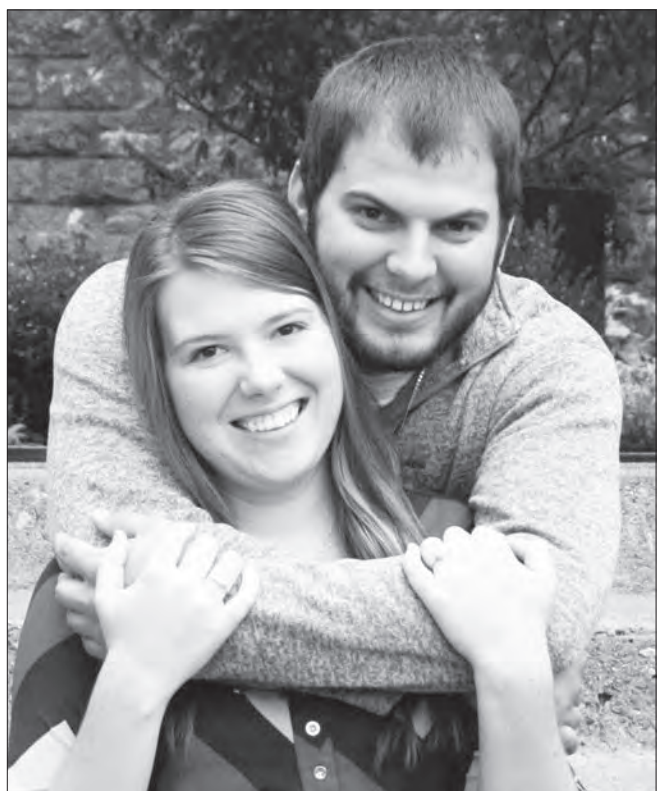



Monotauk and Bennett Springs, they camped at Roaring River in the heat of August to catch trout at the third trout park. “We were really impressed by the beauty,” he said.

Nixon also talked about the importance of the trout parks to tourism in the state. He said that was a big part of why the flood damage mitigation had to happen quickly and efficiently. “We had to get these parks

back open for people.”

“We’re really excited about the turn out. State Parks has done a really good job. We set a record attendance last year. The trout parks are the real muscle of the tourism side of this,” Nixon stated.

He added, “It’s a rite of passage of the beginning of spring across the state, and all across the state, whether people have the time to come here or not, they’re

getting up today listening to the radio or reading these stories, and they’ll plan their vacations this summer with their kids and grand-kids. We’re one of the few states in the country that has more kids hunting and more kids fishing, expanding our park system.

“This is 100 years of the National Parks, so they’re trying to do a free day in the park for fourth graders across the country, and I said we have 365 of those this year and in fact this year, we have 366 of them with Leap Day on the 29th. We’ve made our parks open and accessible.”

The legacy of fishing Roaring River on Opening Day

to cast their lines in to rushing waters of hungry rainbow trout. For many of those fishing with the same adage as the post office, come rain, snow or

sleet, the warmth of the tradition is enough to pull them out of bed while it's still dark to stake their claim at their favorite fishing hole at the park and catch their limit that first day of trout season.

Jim Williams, of Cassville, has been one of those fishermen since 1961, priding himself in only missing seven times in the past 55 years. Two of those times were excused absences by most standards while he served in the U.S. Navy during Vietnam. Williams said, "They wouldn't put the war on hold to send me home to fish."

He also excused himself last year with the snow and ice all over the roads. "My son from Carthage made it, but I stayed home. I'm older and wiser, I think," he chuckled.

Williams started the Roaring River Opening Day tradition when he moved to Barry County from Cape Fair. Since then, he's picked his favorite spot, the first spot right next to bridge so that no one casts over him from the right. He said, "99 percent of the time, I catch my limit. On Opening Day, it's almost always. If I go over 20 minutes to catch my limit, it's a bad year."

This year was apparently a slow one as it took 35 minutes to fill his stringer, but a bro-

ken rod was mostly to blame. Another fisherman stepped on his rod and broke it, but in true Roaring River Opening Day fashion, the spirit of those who brave the elements to participate in a time honored tradition, he gave Williams his rod to replace the broken one.

Kindness of strangers and a common nod of acknowledgment to the familiar faces of other anglers that come year in and year out builds a rapport that someone who hasn't been to Opening Day doesn't understand. Williams and many like him understand.

He said, "There are a group of guys from around Webb City who come every year and cook breakfast. I've gotten to talking with them, too. I've met a lot of people down there." That breakfast was extended to this journalist, too. A refill of coffee, some toast and a bit of conversation was welcome while waiting for the governor to arrive to fire the ceremonial gun was much appreciated.

Over the years, Williams has perfected his own art of fishing. And like most fishermen, he has his white whale, but he actually caught his, and it's mounted on the wall. He shared, "On Mother's Day in 1977, I caught a 34 inch, 8.75 pounder." When asked what

he was fishing with, he replied, "I've caught a lot with different things, but it was a moss green jig on two-pound test line. When you catch one that's as long as your leg, you remember."

Roaring River was a tradition for Williams, then his two sons, and now his sons and five grandkids. It's a family affair like it is for many of those at the park each March 1.

With 55 years of fishing under his belt and a whop-

per on his wall, Williams has earned his stripes at Roaring River. He said one day he fished from whistle to whistle and reeled in 101 trout. He said, "I walked back and forth all day long along the river." But now, he isn't looking for numbers.

Williams said, "I stop counting at 25 now." Sometimes, you've proven your worth and can sit back and enjoy the river without keeping score.

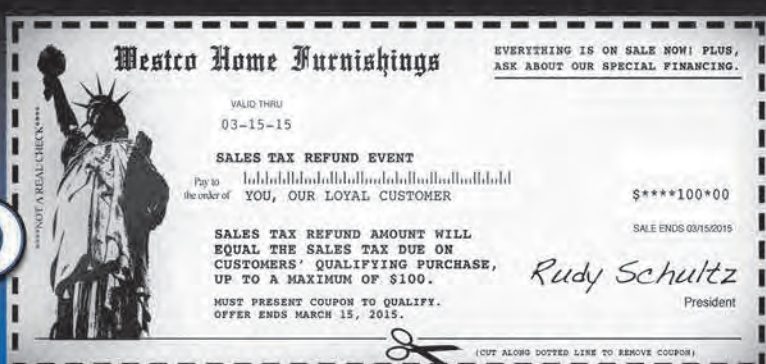

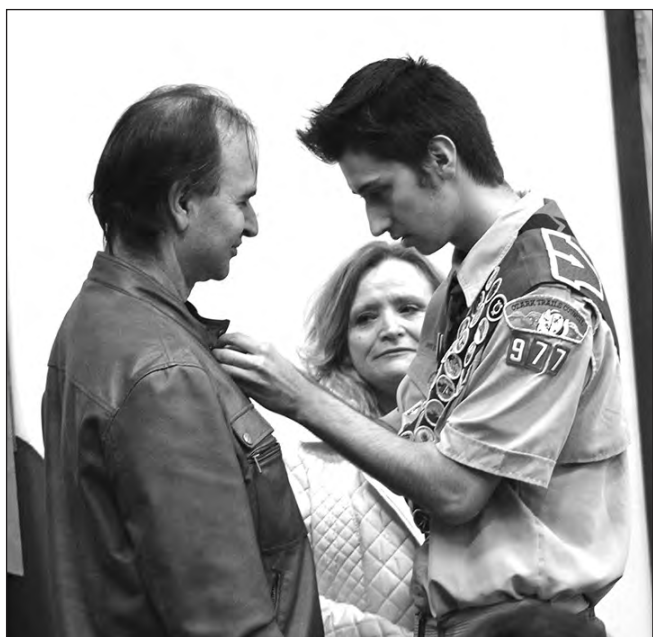

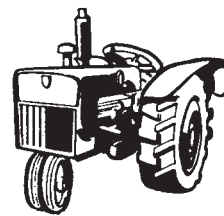

City of Cassville starts gravel removal project after creek flooding

After two extremely damaging floods in 2015, the City of Cassville is working with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to remove excess gravel in the creeks around Cassville as well as implement a creek management system to prevent future flooding.

Cassville Public Works director Steve Walensky said that the move is to return water flow to normal in the various creeks but also start a management program that will hopefully prevent such damaging floods in the future. He said that from asking other people, no major restorative work has been done in the seven valleys since the 1980's.

Walensky said the move was essential to the area with the recent damage. Some of the bridges around the city have so much gravel accumulated from the floods that water is not able to flow at all. Some 15-foot pillars are covered up to the 14-foot mark. Gravel, as well as debris, will

be removed from the creek, and then there will be catch basins dug on either side of the bridge to hopefully prevent debris and gravel build-up and flooding in the future.

At least some of the work will have to be bid out to contractors because there is not enough manpower with Public Works to remove it all.

He said, "We need bigger equipment and more stall to get this accomplished; and it's time sensitive. I'm worried if we have another flood with the way things are now."

Walensky said, "We can bid the gravel removal by the cubic yard or by hours, but it's really hard to even begin to

guess how much gravel there is. I've gotten in contact with people to help me even get an idea as to how to bid this." Walensky was in contact with the City Council members before they began the project.

"It's a huge breakthrough to get this approval from the Corps. I couldn't be happier." With the U.S. Army Corps' blessing, the City will be able to remove the excess creek gravel without a permit.

Walensky was working to get approval to start on the creeks after the July flood, but just got the final go-ahead last week from the Corps. He said, "It took getting someone down here to see what we're

dealing with to get them to understand." Once a Corps representative saw the way the city wanted to do the project, they were given the green light.

The next hurdle will be working on a funding source for the project. Walensky said that he is looking into different grant options, some city funding but also wants to approach business and property owners. Management of the creeks will ideally prevent a lot of flood damage in the future if a plan can be implemented.

He said, "It is clear that we need to take immediate action on this. I'm very concerned because another flood with the creeks the way they are now could be devastating."

Walensky added, "We aren't changing the path of creek, just restoring it. We may cut a tree during the project, but we'll leave the stump so the roots can help maintain that stabilization of the bank."

The project is a large one, and bidding out contractors to assist will be brought up at the next Cassville City Council meeting in March.

Walensky said, "There's a lot of work to do and part of the issue is that this hasn't been proactively managed. We need to change that."

Lady Wildcats win district tournament opener

Miller Lady Cardinals edge Purdy for district title

It wasn't pretty, but the Cassville Lady Wildcats posted a 43-32 win over McDonald County to open the Class 4 District 12 Basketball Tournament at Carthage on Monday night.

Cassville struggled mightily in the first quarter, a quarter that saw McDonald County take a 13-1 lead. It was an awful stretch for Chris Shore's team, arguably the worst quarter of Ladycat basketball all season. Five turnovers. Nada-for-five from the field. One for two from the free throw line. Only that Devyn Callahan free throw kept Cassville from getting skunked in the first eight minutes.

But the winds of fortune changed in the second quarter. After hitting three wide open treys in the first quarter, the Lady Mustangs faced a tougher and tighter Cassville defense. No more open threes. No more facecuts, interior passes, or dribble drives.

Along with the renewed defensive intensity came an offensive surge. Cassville buried six of eight shot at-

tempts in the second quarter, including back-to-back treys. After trailing 18-5 with 5:08 on the clock, the Lady Wildcats roared back to pull within a deuce at 18-16 when Ashlynn Howe swished a trey from the left corner in the final minute of the half.

Although Baili Nelson scored the last basket of the half to give McDonald County a 20-16 lead, the momentum was clearly on Cassville's side.

Madison Hall renewed the three-point attack for McDonald County to open the third quarter, and her bomb stretched the lead back to 7 at 23-16. But the Lady Wildcats poured on a 10-4 stretch to take their first lead of the game at 28-27. Callahan scored two buckets and free throw in that stretch, and Hallie Long hit twice from the field and twice from the line to give Cassville a one-point edge at the 1:28 mark of the quarter.

Makenzy Durossette nailed a jumper from the right wing with the clock running down, and the Cassville girls took a 30-27 lead at the final break.

Since building a 13-1 lead in the first quarter, McDonald County had only scored 14 points combined in the second and third frames. Cassville was averaging better than that per quarter since the early going. The pressure was on the Lady Mustangs to turn it around in the final quarter. They never did.

Cassville's pressure defense held McDonald County to just three points for the first six minutes of the fourth quarter. If all Cassville had scored in the fourth quarter was Howe's moneyball at the 6:49 mark, it would have been enough to win. As it was, the Ladycats scored 13 points in the final eight minutes to claim the 43-32 victory.

It was over when Long drove the lane and earned an old-fashioned triple to give the Lady Wildcats a double-digit lead with just 2:22 to play.

Cassville advances to play top-seeded Carl Junction at 4PM on Thursday, March 3.

The Miller Lady Cardinals completed their run to the Class 2 District 12 title with a 49-46 win over Purdy at Washburn on Friday night to close out an exciting week of action. This was a close game between two teams who reached the championship game in radically different fashion.

Time is more or less an absolute measurement. Entropy is a measurement of how disorderly things are. It is a guarantee that messes will become bigger messes as time goes on.

The Purdy Lady Eagles got a close up look at entropy in their district championship game against Miller. Little messes and some big misses added up to a painful 49-46 loss to the Lady Cardinals.

Just seeing Hannah Wilkerson sitting on the Miller bench was enough to give the Purdy crowd pregame jitters. Wilkerson, a card-carrying Eagle killer during her decorated career at Miller, is now the assistant to Justin Gerald at her alma mater.

Layne Skiles gave Purdy an early 2-0 lead, the only Purdy lead of the first half. Miller claimed a 5-2 lead with a trey from Lynna Hadlock and pushed to a 12-8 advantage.

Sami House bombed away to pull Purdy within 12-11, but Hadlock worked loose and threw in a wild three at the echo of the buzzer to give Miller a 15-11 lead at the first break. It was a game-defining shot for Miller. For Purdy, it was a mess, and a harbinger of things to come.

Hadlock's closing-act performance of the first eight minutes triggered a 13-0 Miller run to start the second quarter. Shayne Mallory and Hadlock opened with back-to-back treys, and even Miller's big center Jessica Estes scored from long range as the Lady Cardinals charged to a 28-13 lead.

Purdy's Zoe Brown collected her third foul during that mess, and went to the bench for a prolonged visit. The Lady Eagles only scored two baskets in that quarter, one each from Desirie Ennes and Rion Boyd, and they trailed at the half, 32-15.

In a December massacre on Miller's home floor, the Lady Cardinals ran the clock on Purdy enroute to a 61-40 win. Eli Ernst was priest, psychologist, and strategist at

halftime, preparing his Lady Eagles for a positive second half.

On offense, Purdy's focus turned to feeding Layne Skiles in the post. Skiles scored twice and House swished a long trey in an opening salvo that grew into a 13-3 Purdy run before Miller's Gerald could call for time at the 4:59 mark.

The Purdy charge continued, and the Lady Eagles claimed their first lead since the opening basket with a Rion Boyd moneyball for a 38-37 advantage.

Miller led 43-38 on an Estes basket that opened the fourth quarter. But Skiles dragged down a defensive rebound and unloaded a length-of-the-court rainbow pass to Boyd for the fast break conversion. The Montana-to-Rice flashback cut the Miller lead to 43-40.

But another score stretched the Miller mini-run well into the fourth quarter, and the Lady Cardinals led 45-40 with just 4:11 left to play.

Zoe Brown hit a baseline jumper, and House finished a fast break when Skiles dropped her in the paint to avoid a Miller defender. Purdy trailed by just 45-44 with 3:43 on the game clock.

But then Miller's Estes muscled up in the paint to score, and was fouled on the play. The true free throw gave the Lady Cardinals a two-possession lead. Then Brown hit from the left wing to cut the lead to 48-46 at the 1:32 mark.

Miller ran the clock down to a minute and called for time. The Lady Cardinals returned in full stall mode, and Purdy ran into another entropic mess. With time running down and the gym shaking from the fever-pitched crowd, the Lady Eagles failed to pick up the "foul now" signal from Ernst until just 12 seconds remained. Desirie Ennes finally sacrificed her fifth foul to stop the clock, sending Hadlock to the line.

Hadlock converted her second free toss for a 49-46 lead. Skiles missed a potential tying trey, and House fouled Estes to kill the clock.

Estes missed both shots, and Purdy called for time with 3 seconds remaining. Skiles reached halfcourt and heaved a desperation attempt, but her prayerful offering banged off the rim as the clock expired. Miller claimed the district championship with the 49-46 final.

Miller moves on to the Class 2 girls championship bracket. The Lady Cardinals will take on Crane at Nixa on Wednesday, March 2 at 6 PM.

The Cassville Wildcats saw their season end on Tuesday night with a 64-43 loss to the host Carthage Tigers in the Class 4 District 12 tournament. The Wildcats only trailed 17-13 at the end of the first quarter, but the superior height of Carthage and a 19-point performance by Alex Derryberry eventually wore Cassville down.

The Wildcats started strong, and held early leads of 2-0, 5-2, and 7-6 on a pair of Collin Pearman buckets and a jumper from Noah Hadlow. But Carthage pulled away to lead by 17-11 before Trey Dalton beat the buzzer to pull Cassville within 17-13 at the first break.

Even with liberal substitutions, Carthage put 17 more points on the board. Cassville hung in and played hard to the final whistle but could not dent the double digit lead that reached 25 late in the game.

The Warriors are big, averaging 6'4 across their front line. Chance Jackson, a 6'5 tank, comes off the bench. Sophomore guard Jake Doyle measures in at 6'2, taller than any of the Purdy starters.

Purdy is used to owning a height disadvantage, and Tommy Egan's team counters that reality with team speed and a withering defensive press that reduces play to utter chaos. Purdy held a 7-point late home lead against McAuley, before losing a 74-73 heartbreaker, and the Eagles hoped to duplicate that effort for a better result in the district championship game.

The blitz

The height-blessed Warriors controlled the opening tip but fumbled the ball away. After the turnover, Purdy's Luis Cruz drove to the basket and gave the Eagles an early 2-0 lead. Jake Doyle matched that moments later for a 2-2 tie, and then Raul Garcia drove down the lane for a 4-2 Purdy lead.

It was a theme that would

Barry County special enforcement results
