Next Wednesday marks a near-holy day in Barry County: Opening Day. On Wednesday, March 1, fishers of all ages, sexes and experiences will take to the shores of Roaring River in the local state park to catch their limit of Rainbow Trout, a time-honored tradition for decades.

Roaring River's Hatchery manager Paul Spurgeon said his staff plans to stock the waters with around 6,100 trout for the first day of trout season across the state.

Perhaps the most exciting draw of this year's season is this is the first Opening Day for which the river is completely back to normal after devastating floods in 2015. Spurgeon said, "The big news this year is the stream is completely rebuilt from the back-to-back floods, and it's fixed and back

Cassville assistant chief honored with state award

For Cassville Fire Protection District's assistant chief Derek Acheson, a recent major award from the state came as a shock. Acheson was bestowed the Training Officer of the Year award, selected by Missouri's State Fire Marshall. Two officials from the Missouri Division of Fire Safety were on site at the Cassville Fire Station to hand deliver Acheson's plaque yesterday, February 21.

When asked about how he felt about the award, Acheson replied, "I had no idea. I'm just humbled."

Acheson received the award from Becky Trapani, deputy chief of training and certification, and Greg Landwehr, program manager, both with the Missouri Division of Fire Safety. Trapani said Acheson was nominated by Shane Anderson, of Monett Fire. She added, "He wrote a very heartfelt and beautiful nomination for him."

While Trapani and Landwehr made their recommendations after receiving countless nominations from across the state, the ultimate decision is made by the Fire Marshall, and this year, Acheson made the cut.

Acheson has been fighting fires for ten years. For the past seven, he's been an instructor, teaching others how to stay safe. Acheson said he began instructing

because he felt there was a need. "There was a need in this area. It was a gradual step for me. The class was offered, and I decided to do it and it just went from there."

According to Trapani, approximately 82 percent of Missouri's firefighters are volunteer. The training and certification process are completely voluntary in the state, but give firefighters more knowledge to deal with various scenarios

when out on calls. Prior to classes being offered locally, local firefighters, both paid and volunteer, had to drive outside of the county to be able to take classes and complete training.

Recently, Acheson paired with Crowder College and made firefighter training much more affordable and feasible for area firefighters and departments. His work in expanding the possibility of the voluntary training contrib-

uted to his nomination. Through the partnership with Crowder, firefighters can take Firefighter I and II at the college for less than half of what they would pay otherwise, as well as what is saved in travel for it being a local class.

Through a bit of ingenuity and the right people coming together, Crowder College became an official location for the class after trainings were held there for some time. Acheson

to normal."

In July and December 2015, Barry County experienced devastating flooding that led to evacuations and a state of emergency for not only the park, but other areas as well. Roaring River experienced significant damage to park grounds, but also to the stream itself, which provides a habitat for not only trout, but other creatures, as well. After intensive restorative efforts, everything is business as usual in the park. The park is prepared for up to 2,000 anglers, but Spurgeon said he anticipates a bit below that. He said, "It's hard to say with the weather, but the way it is and everything we should have 1,700 to 1,800, and that's probably a conservative estimate."

Each year, the number varies based on the day of the week, the weather and other factors. Opening Day falling on a Wednesday usually means lower numbers, but there won't be an ice storm to contend with...or at least we hope.

Trout tags will be available at the park store beginning at 9 a.m. on Tuesday, February 28. The store will be open through the night and all day Wednesday.

This year's opening gun will be fired by representatives from Mako Fly Fishers at 6:30 a.m. Fishing will continue until 7 p.m.

Missouri's trout season runs from March 1 to October 31 each year.

Wife charged in Cassville molestation case

The wife of a man accused of child sodomy and molestation has subsequently been charged in the case for allegedly trying to force the child to redact her statement. Tausha L. Brock, 26, of Cassville, is charged with tampering with a witness in a felony prosecution.

According to an affidavit of probable cause by Cassville Police Department office Jonathan Cherney, Brock mentally and physically abused the victim in a pending child molestation case. Brock's husband, Danny Brock, 39, was charged with statutory sodomy, child molestation and child endangerment after the girl came forward about the


According to the affidavit, Brock tried to convince the girl she had lied about her husband, and she should redact her statement to the Child

Advocacy Center so Danny could return home.

The victim told officers she did tell Brock she had lied about the abuse after Brock began punishing her, and that statement was recorded on a cell phone.

According to the statement, the girl had red marks on her buttocks from Brock whipping her with a belt.

Brock was arrested on the charges and released from the Barry County Jail

Cassville man arrested for domestic assault

A Cassville man was arrested on Valentine's Day for domestic assault after Cassville Police officers found the victim under a pile of blankets, clothing and a large bean bag. Darren Brian Carnefix, 34, of Cassville, was charged with domestic assault in the second degree.

According to the affidavit of probable cause, officers went to Carnefix's home on Townsend Street after a hang up call was made to the 911 Center. Officers reported they were outside of the home for 20 to 25 minutes, knocking on doors and windows, to check on the welfare of a woman inside. Officers

said there had been previous issues with domestic assault in the home.

Officers saw Carnefix in the residence, but he refused to answer the door, according to the affidavit. Finally, officers reported that Carenefix answered the door, claiming he had been asleep, despite officers saying they had seen him. When they inquired about the woman in the residence, he told them she was at a girlfriend's house.

When officers searched the home, they found the victim under a pile of clothing, blankets and a large bean bag in the bedroom. She had lacerations on her face and head and there was a large amount of blood smeared on the walls and bed spread, according to the report.

The victim told officers she had fallen in the bathroom; however, based on officers' experience and an examination by a doctor at Mercy Hospital, her injuries were consistent with being struck, not falling.

Officer also found a cell phone in the home with the battery removed. When they replaced the battery and requested the 911 Center call the hang-up call number, the cell phone rang.

Carnefix was taken into police custody and booked into the Barry County Jail. He is still currently being held in the jail in lieu of a \$20,000 bond. Carnefix has two other pending charges for domestic assault in the second degree from last year.

Toxic tall fescue renovation school offered locally

Livestock producers have known for many years the animal production issues associated with toxic Kentucky 31 (KY-31) tall fescue. The endophyte fungus that grows between infected plant cells produces chemicals harmful to animals, but the fungus is beneficial to the fescue plant.

Researchers developed varieties of tall fescue that did not have the endophyte fungus, but these endophyte free varieties lacked persistence required for strong pasture stands in Southwest Missouri. Additional research has discovered novel or friendly endophytes. These novel endophytes do not produce animal toxins, but provide plant protection benefits, and thus have the potential to be more persistent than their endophyte free counterparts. New tall fescue varieties have been developed that contain these friendly endophytes and are available to livestock producers.

In order to establish novel endophyte tall fescue, the toxic KY-31 tall fescue must be killed before the new fescue variety can be seeded. Information about this renovation process has been condensed into a one-day school. During 2017, renovation schools are being held in Kansas, Missouri, and Kentucky and are being sponsored by the Alliance for Grassland Renewal with additional support from the University of Missouri, Kansas State University, and the University of Kentucky.

Locally this pasture renovation school is offered on Tuesday, March 7. The University of Missouri Southwest Center, 14548 Highway H, Mount Vernon.

The Alliance for Grassland Renewal formed in 2012. The current board members are from Georgia, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Oregon, and Front row: Sora Oberbeck, Missouri. The goal of the Alliance for Grassland Renewal is to work together in replacing toxic tall fescue grass with a tall fescue that hosts a nontoxic endophyte. This goal is pursued through four objectives: education, seed quality control, incentives, and promotion.

The renovation school is developed by the Alliance in order to help forage producers understand why fescue renovation is important, and the steps required for a successful transition from toxic to non-toxic tall fescue pastures and

said that in three years, he's trained 46 people in the course.

Crowder's other locations already offered the course as an official course for those wanting a degree, but by making it a community education class, Crowder director Angela Seymour said the class was more affordable since the firefighters didn't need a transcript if they weren't seeking a degree. She added that she believes Anderson approached the college about the possibility of the official location initially. Seymour said, "We tried a long time ago to do something like this, but we hit a lot of roadblocks. So, we stepped back, and now it's all come together."

Since then, much of the training equipment has moved to Cassville from Webb City to further the program. Crowder even has a firetruck for the program.

Trapani said, "It isn't just Derek that made this happen. He has to have support from the department and the community for this to be successful, and he does."

"He's technically knowledgeable. This program is hundreds of hours and you've got to have heart to lead them through it," she added.

Landwehr said, "It's 300 plus hours of just instructional time. It's a huge commitment, and he has really made it work."

Cassville's long-time chief Millard Andrews said, "He's so dedicated. It's really incredible."

Today, approximately 75 percent of the firefighters in the Cassville Fire Protection District have completed the course, according to the department. A large part of that is thanks to Acheson's dedication to firefighter education.

Acheson lives in Cassville with his wife of 20 years, Missy, and their son Zac, 14.
