Four month sentence for intoxicated driver in fatal wreck

An Exeter man was sentenced to 120 days of shock incarceration with the Department of Corrections for a drunk driving wreck that killed his passenger. Christopher Stogdill, 30, was the driver in the crash on Route CC at Farm Road 1072 on July 18, 2015.

According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report from the incident, Stogdill was driving a 2006 Chevy Impala three miles north of Exeter when he ran off the roadway and overturned. His passenger, Leanna M. Terry, 32, of Butterfield, was ejected and pronounced dead at the scene of the crash.

According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol, Stogdill was

arrested for probable DWI before being released for medical treatment for moderate injuries. He was tested for alcohol by the Patrol pursuant to Missouri State law regarding fatal crashes.

In the complaint filed by Barry County Prosecuting Attorney Amy Boxx, Stogdill was driving under the influence of alcohol, which resulted in Terry's death, a criminally negligent offense.

Stogdill pled guilty to involuntary vehicular manslaughter while intoxicated on December 20, 2016. Stogdill's sentence was five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections, but he will only serve 120 days of shock time. Stogdill's sentence is to run from February 21, 2017, to June 29, 2017.

Cassville mom arrested for alleged assault of autistic son

A Cassville mother is in jail after an alleged assault of her autistic son. According to the probable cause by the Cassville Police Department, Candie Leann Getson, 40, of Cassville, bit and pushed her son to the ground after an altercation. Getson has been charged with assault in the third degree of a special victim.

On March 3, the Cassville Police Department responded to an altercation at a residence on State Highway Y. Officer Danny

Boyd reported that Getson went into her son's room to tell him to get up so they could leave. Her son allegedly got upset and Getson yelled in his face, further agitating him.

The report continues that Getson bit him on the arm, leaving a mark, and pushed him to the ground, giving him a carpet burn on his neck.

Getson is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$15,000 bond.


Bill Horner, lifelong resident of Barry County, passed away in his home on Monday, March 6. Horner was well known and respected in the community after multiple business endeavors including dairy cows, diesel hauling and a chainsaw business.

In Horner's decades in Barry County, he built many friendships and had many experiences which he shared in the Lifetime of Memories series released by the Barry County Museum. Bill and his wife, Adella's, story is in the 19th volume of the book.

Bill shared tales of growing up in the dairy and farming family business, as well as how life changed during his time, including when his family first got electricity at their home. He attended the Horner one-room school until sixth grade when he went on to Cassville School where he graduated.

Horner's tales included his battle with diphtheria as a child, taking cattle to Oregon. Copies of the book are available at the Barry County Museum.

Letter to the Editor

To the voters of Cassville,

Such is the case with the \$10.3 million dollar Sewer and Water Bond issue to be voted on by YOU, the Cassville voter, this coming April.

You will recall that back in 2012, your water and sewer rates were increased by around

50%. Prior to the increase, the water and sewer department was taking in around \$850,000 a year. This was not enough to cover the actual costs incurred each year, so it was being supplemented with funds from the general account. We were told that by tolerating this increase, there would be enough money coming in to the water and sewer department to cover the entire cost of running it, freeing up the funds previously used from the general account. The funds which would be freed up in the general account would then be used to start the major task of overhauling the city sewer lines, as well as water lines. To stop the influx of rainwater in to the sewer, as well as the loss of 30%

of the drinking water pumped from city wells. The increase was approved by the city council and went into effect in early 2012.

Then in July of 2012, a newspaper article published here in Cassville reported that the city would need to come up with \$2.5 million in order to repair the city sewer to meet Missouri Department of Natural Resources (DNR) requirements. Keep in mind, that's 2 1/2 million dollars. But the city did nothing! Even with these new water and sewer increases in place, and the increased funds coming in, they still did nothing!

But it gets better! Now, just because they like spending your money so much, you get to vote to approve a bond issue in which they now want over \$5.4 million! That's right. Now they want over twice as much as was estimated back in 2012, only 6 months after the utility rate increase! Perhaps they thought if they waited a few years, the cost would go down?

But the real irony of this entire issue is the fact that if the

proposed bond issue passes, and this money is borrowed, how do you know the money will only be spent on the actual cost of water and sewer line replacement? Stop and think about it. When they persuaded you to pass the sales tax to re-surface all the city streets, a great deal of the funds got spend on new city vehicles. The funds to pay for these vehicles was allotted from the sales tax that was collected for street resurfacing. These vehicles are being used every day for general use by the employees of the city, even though there is no resurfacing going on. But to really put the icing on the cake, they haven't even repaired pot-holes on most streets. But the sales tax is still coming in.

In the four years since the sewer rates were increased, the city has taken in at least 1.6 million dollars as an end result. How many feet of sewer lines do you think they have replaced since the rate increase 4 years ago? I'm guessing the correct number is "zero"!

To anyone who is a Cassville

voter, my advice is don't be fooled again. GO TO THE POLLS IN APRIL! VOTE! If you like the way the city is handling your dollars, vote for the bond issue. If you want responsibility in your municipal government, if you want to stop the wrongful manipulation of dollars from the city treasury, if you want the city to hold true their original agreements, vote it down! Insist on an appointed independent auditor, to approve or deny every dime spent! This is the only way you will get what you are promised! Otherwise, you are simply contributing to the cities "toy chest."



Motel freak out leads to drug charges

An Anderson man is in his third tangle with law enforcement after a call to 911 during an alleged drug episode at the Super 8 Motel in Monett. Joseph Derek Cramer, 28, of Anderson, was charged with possession of a controlled substance and unlawful use of a weapon.

According to the affidavits of probable cause, Cramer called saying he was "freaking out" after taking something. When officers arrived, Cramer was in the lobby, concerned that his girlfriend was missing. Officers said Cramer became less cooperative as time passed.

Cramer also allegedly told officers he had a hand gun in his room, but could not find it. When they searched the room for the missing girlfriend and another person, they saw a glass meth pipe and a marijuana bong on the table. After obtaining a search warrant, officers found the pipes, a handgun, as well as suspected methamphetamine, marijuana and synthetic marijuana. The

methamphetamine field tested positive for the drug and weighed in a 1.6 grams.

This is the third run in with law enforcement for Cramer, who was also charged in a drug bust at an apartment on State Highway 112 in Cassville. Then officers found suspected explosives in his car following that incident. According to that probable cause statement from January, Cramer's car had three explosive devices,

military/tactical vest, flexible handcuffs, methamphetamine and hydrocodone pills.

Cramer is also charged with unlawful possession of an illegal weapon, unlawful use of a weapon, endangering the welfare of a child, two counts of possession of a controlled substance, one count of possession of marijuana and one count of delivery of a controlled substance.





MO Patrol's Spring Aboard encourages training for boaters

Lieutenant Colonel Sandra K. Karsten, acting superintendent of the Missouri State Highway Patrol, announces the Patrol will participate in the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators' (NASBLA) Spring Aboard campaign. Developed by NAS-BLA, and produced under a grant administered by the U.S. Coast Guard, the annual Spring Aboard campaign informs and motivates boaters to prepare for the boating season by providing information on how to enroll in a boater education course. The campaign emphasizes enrollment in approved courses which meet the national

U.S. Coast Guard statistics indicate that of the accidents where the level of operator education was known, 80% of boating deaths occurred on boats where the boat operator had never received boating education instruction.

The Spring Aboard campaign encourages boaters to register

for a certified boating educational course during the week of March 19-25, 2017. Fortynine states and U.S. territories require some form of boater education.

Missouri law requires everyone born after January 1, 1984, who operates a vessel on Missouri lakes to possess a certified boating safety education card and photo ID. This includes personal watercraft operators.

Boaters have the opportunity to sign up for a certified course in a classroom or take an online course by visiting the Patrol's website at www. mshp.dps.mo.gov. Look under

boating educational standard.


the boater ID card costs \$15. Additional fees apply to the online course, which is provided by Boat-ed.com. "Everyone looks forward to warm weather and the ability to spend time outdoors," said Lt. Col. Karsten, "and Missouri's many beautiful waterways provide endless opportunities for relaxation and recreation. The Patrol encourages those who have not already

taken a course to sign up for a boating safety class now, before the season starts." Watercraft operators must consider the effect their actions have on others. Share the waterway and use common sense, good judgment, and courtesy to ensure the safety of all. Life jackets save lives.
