Eagle Rock man arrested on molestation charges

An Eagle Rock man was arrested on Saturday evening after being accused of child molestation and sexual abuse involving two minors earlier that day. Edward Lee Resz, 51, of Eagle Rock, was arrested on charges of sexual abuse in the first degree, endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree, child molestation in the second degree and sexual abuse in the second degree.

According to the affidavit of probable cause by Barry County Deputy Alvin Zabala, Resz was driving a vehicle near his home on Highway M with three passengers, an 18 year old female and the other two minors. According to the victim statements, Resz sexually abused the 18 year old in the vehicle and would not stop when she told

According to the victims, Resz touched one of the minors inappropriately over her clothing and suggested she swim in the creek naked.

Resz also allegedly groped the 18 year old victim both under and over her clothes

Resz had a revoked drivers license at the time of the incident, and according to a victim's statement, the 18-yearold female in the truck had to drive even though she did not have a drivers license because she feared for their safety because of Resz's level of intoxication. Resz has two prior convictions for driving while revoked in Barry County from 2009.

Resz is currently being held in the Barry County Jail on a \$20,000 cash-only bond.

City of Cassville continues flood insurance program discussion

The Cassville City Council is still in discussion regarding whether the city will opt to enroll in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) after last year's devastating floods. At the council meeting on Monday, March 14, Dale Schmutzler, a state coordinator for the program, answered the council's questions to help them make an educated decision.

Controversy surrounds the decision on whether the city should enroll in the NFIP,

which would make most residents and business owners with homes and businesses on the designated flood plain required to purchase flood insurance by their lending institutions, which can be a pricey endeavor for many. Beyond that, buildings constructed after 1977 would have to pass flood inspections, as well, which means that those buildings would either have to be flood proofed or raised on stilts to be in com-

Cassville's City Council is

looking at the decision very carefully because of the ramifications to individuals and businesses alike. However, the main issue is that without enrollment in the NFIP, the city will not qualify for grants or special funding to work on improvements that will preemptively deal with the flooding of the seven valleys.

In 1977, Cassville suspended from the program, and in order to be re-enrolled, the city

Voters to decide on two taxes on April 5 ballot

Barry County voters have two county-wide issues to decide on for the April 5 General Municipal Election around the corner. One ballot issue is the continuation of a 1/2 cent sales tax the county uses for improvements on the county's roads and bridges. The other is a local use tax that would allow Barry County to continue to collect local sales tax on motor vehicles and boats purchased outside of the state. Neither ballot measure is a new issue, instead they are continuations of current taxes.

The local sales tax measure is asking voters to decide if they wish to continue the 1/2-cent sales tax designated for capital improvements for another five years. The 1/2cent tax was put in place in 1986. Voters chose to continue the tax in 1991, 1996, 2001, 2006 and 2011.

Funds collected through the capital improvement tax for roads and bridges are dispersed among the 25 special road districts and one common district within Barry County.

Barry County presiding commissioner Cherry Warren said, "This is not a new tax. It is just time for the vothave money for roads and

According to a press release from the Barry County Commission, the tax provides for 49 percent of the money that road districts receive from the county. Barry County Treasurer Lois Lowe said that the 2005 tax brought in \$2,031,478.74.

Warren said, "It would be devastating to our County road system if the tax extension doesn't pass. Our money for roads and bridges would be cut close to one half."

The other issue voters will vote on is impacting both the county and the city of Cassville. The local use tax has been collected for many years, but recently, terms were changed and voters have to approve to continue to collect it. The local use tax

allows the county and city to collect tax on vehicles like cars, boats, trailers and outboard motors that are purchased outside of the state.

The state currently colers to approve another five lects use tax, but the countyyear extension so we can level collection must be voted on to keep it in place.

Warren said, "We think it's a big disadvantage to go out of Cassville to buy a car. It's not an increase, it'll just keep what we have."

If the local use tax is not extended, the county and city will lose sales tax revenue on vehicles purchased outside of the city or county. Essentially, it would be cheaper to go across state lines to purchase a vehicle which would negatively impact the local economy.

The Barry County and Cassville use taxes are separate on the ballot.

The April 5 General Municipal Election absentee voting is already open. For more information about voting absentee, see page 10A.



Southwest School Board MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

As part of continued efforts in keeping patrons informed, the Southwest R-V School Administration provides monthly information concerning Board Meetings.

A recap of the March 17, 2016 Regular Meeting is as fol-

The Board convened for its meeting at 7:01 p.m.

The Board approved the Consent items which included accepting the resignations of middle school teacher Melissa Brewen, Title I reading teacher Gary Brown and vocational agriculture teacher Chris Hunt. Also approved was the hiring of Carl Hendrix as high school science teacher. Hendrix and Kelli Roberts were also approved as additions to the district's substitute teachers' list.

There was no old business to address.

New business items included the approval the 2016-2017 district health insurance plans. There will be no increase in premiums and the district will once again provide a monthly benefit of \$430 for those qualifying employees who enroll in one of district plans.

Also approved was the purchase of 198 Chromebooks and three storage/charging carts from Imported Brands of Canada and Trinity 3LLC, respectively. The cost of the Chromebooks will be \$210 each, while the individual carts are priced at \$1,285. These devices will expand the district's One:One initiative into the 4th grade, as well as supplement middle school.

Under administrative and program evaluations, the Board reviewed the district health services program report submitted by Gayla Treadwell. Also reviewed were the monthly maintenance and administrative reports. Superintendent Walker presented information concerning current student assessment tools and reading programs, as compared to other available resources. The Board approved the selection of STAR for K-12 bench mark assessments, as well as the reading program Accelerated Reader 360 for grades K-4, for the 2016-2017 school year. The total cost for these resources will \$23,262.90. Approximately half of this expense will be covered

The Board was in executive session for one hour and 53 minutes discussing various personnel items.

The next Regular Meeting is scheduled for April 14 at 7 p.m. in the high school library.





MoDOT construction begins Mar. 28 on Hwy. 60

A project to improve an 18.5 mile stretch of U.S. Route 60 between Monett and Marionville begins the week of March 28, the Missouri Department of Transportation

The project includes resurfacing, bridge improvements and guardrail replacement along Route 60.

Beginning Monday, March 28, drivers can expect traffic to be reduced to one lane around the clock at the bridge over the Missouri and Northern Arkansas Railroad east of Aurora on Route 60. Temporary signals will be installed at each end of the bridge to allow alternating one-way traffic for approximately 10-days while contractor crews replace the current guardrail with concrete barrier walls on the outside of the bridge.

Elsewhere, drivers can expect lane closures and occasional traffic delays while the contractor lays new asphalt on Route 60 between Missouri Route 37 in Monett and Missouri Route 14 in Marion-





MDC's new look for hunting, fishing permits

Hunters, anglers, and trappers in Missouri have been buying permits online through the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) website since 2011 and through the free MDC "Mo Hunting" mobile app since 2014. Retail stores, convenience stores, and other places that sell permits will catch up to this online technology starting March 15.

In mid-March, places that sell hunting, fishing, and trapping permits will switch from selling the familiar plastic-backed, rectangular, yellow permits to selling paper permits. They will also move from selling permits through a special machine connected to a phone line to using a regular computer or laptop with Internet access and a standard printer.

"The most noticeable change for permit buyers will be that permits bought from vendors will be printed on a regular sheet of paper instead of the familiar plastic-backed, yellow tag," said MDC Permit Services Supervisor Nathan Bess. "These paper permits from permit sellers will be the same as the ones people have been buying online since 2011."

Bess added that another noticeable change for permit buyers will be no more processing fees.

"With the old permit system, the third-party provider charged permit buyers a \$1 convenience fee for each transaction, every time they bought permits," he explained. "Permit buyers will now save a few dollars because there are no

buy permits either directly online or from a permit

Bess said that the move to online permit sales was prompted by both a need to replace outdated technology and to keep up with future needs.

"Selling permits using the old phone-based system compared to online permit sales is like sending someone a message using a fax machine compared to an email or text," Bess said. "Online permit sales are more convenient, current, and reliable for both sellers and buyers."

He added that MDC staff started letting permit vendors know about the switch three years ago so they would have plenty of time to prepare.

"Permit vendors are important to us and we have been helping them move to the online permit system," Bess said. "We've offered them financial incentives to help them buy any equipment they may need and have also provided plenty of training and support."

People can buy Missouri hunting, fishing and trapping permits all around the state at many gas stations, convenience stores, sporting-goods stores, large retail stores, and other vendors - and at many MDC offices and all MDC nature

People can also buy permits directly online from the MDC website at mdc. mo.gov and right from their smartphones through the MDC free "MO Hunting" mobile app. One popular and convenient feature of

processing fees when you the app is that no paper permits are needed. The app lets users upload electronic copies of all their permits to the mobile device to show as needed.

People can also buy permits over the phone by calling 800-392-4115, using a credit card, paying a \$1 fee, and waiting a week for permits to arrive by mail.

Permit sales account for about 18% of MDC revenue and support a wide range of conservation activities around the state, such as raising and stocking millions of sport fish every year, research and management of native game animals and other wildlife, habitat improvements, maintaining and improving shooting ranges, and more.

"More and more people are buying more and more online," Bess explained. "Being able to sell and buy permits online will help maintain conservation funding in the future."







Exeter man arrested for statutory sodomy

An Exeter man is in jail after allegations of child sodomy that happened during an almost-two year span. Buck Nelson, 42, of Exeter, is charged with statutory sodomy in the first degree and endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree.

According to the affidavit of probable cause by Barry County Sheriff's Deputy Chris Hutson, the case was investigated after a hotline call of suspected abuse was placed on March 19 of this year. The allegation of sexual contact be-

tween Buck and a 13-year old victim was investigated by the Barry County Sheriff's Department and an interview was done by the child advocacy center in Monett.

According to the affidavit, Nelson engaged in inappropriate touching and sexual acts with the victim but that the abuse stopped five months ago after he "found religion."

The abuse allegedly took place between January 2014 and October 2015. The victim's mother stated that she made contact with Nelson, and that he had admitted to the abuse.

According to the report, Nelson has a criminal history. He is currently being held in the Barry County Jail on a \$50,000 cash-only

"If it's too dangerous for them to do it, they need to find a different way to do



Local resident enrolled in **Highway Patrol Academy**

Colonel J. Bret Johnson, superintendent of the Missouri State Highway Patrol, announced that 41 people reported to the Missouri State Highway Patrol Law Enforcement Academy on January 4, 2016, to begin the 25-week training course to become a trooper. The 102nd Recruit Class is scheduled to graduate on June 24, 2016.

As of February 18, 2016, 28 recruits remain in the Academy. The average age of the members of the 102nd Recruit Class is 26 years. Six of the recruits have attended some college, two have earned an associate's degree, seven have credits that total more than an associate's degree, 10 hold bachelor's degrees, and one is working on a master's degree.
