South Barry County Ambulance District makes final push for sales tax

In a final push for the passage of a 1/2-cent sales tax for the South Barry County Ambulance District (SBCAD), the Board has hosted numerous open houses and forums to answer community questions. Board members visited the Cassville Area Chamber of Commerce's Ballot Issues luncheon, the Cassville Library for a community Q and A, the Cassville Senior Center and the Central Crossing Senior Center to explain their position on the sales tax.

Main questions that have come up in the community have been regarding why the current funding is insufficient for the service, what does the district pay for, and how much money will be generated with the tax money if the sales tax passes.

On April 7, voters will determine the fate of the proposed rollback, which would eliminate the current real estate and personal property tax levy in place, which generates around \$220,000 annually, and replace it was a 1/2-cent sales tax that would apply to sales

within the District. Monett and Purdy would remain unaffected by the tax if it passes because they are both part of the Barry-Lawrence Ambulance District.

Recent estimates provided by the SBCAD would have the 1/2-cent bringing in between \$560,000 to \$615,000 annually. For 2013, the tax would have generated \$569,421 and in 2014, the tax would have generated \$614,650. Earlier estimates had the number lower because tax estimates were not yet available for

Some confusion in the community led to questions about what the ambulance district pays for and what Cox Health, the current ambulance contract holders, provides. The ambulance district owns the six ambulances that are split between the Cassville ambulance barn and the Shell Knob ambulance barn. The district owns the facility in Cassville, but the other facility in Shell Knob is owned by Central Crossing Fire Department. The district is responsible for the ambulances, the upkeep of

the equipment within the ambulances, such as the cots and other life-saving equipment, like Cardiac Moni-

Aging equipment is an on-going concern for the district because of the high cost of replacement. Cardiac Monitors run around

the facilities, and most of \$35,000 each and ambulance refits are around \$130,000. Out of six ambulances, two have over 200,000 miles on their odometers and two others are nearing 300,000 miles. The district says that an increased call volume is primarily responsible for the need for additional funding. Last year, the ser-

vice travelled 315,417 miles between the six ambulances.

Of the approximate 3,000 calls each year, nearly one-third are for nonresidents. Ken Cieslinski, chairman of the board, said, "One of the biggest issues is that the residents are paying for

April 7 election nears, multiple races contested

As the April 7 General Election nears, multiple races have been garnering local attention, including the Cassville R-IV School Board seats, the Cassville City Council seats and the proposed South Barry County Ambulance District Sales Tax initiative. also be decided on Tuesday's election.

Voters in the South Barry County Ambulance District, which consists of all of Barry County except Purdy and Monett, will be voting on a 1/2-cent sales tax increase for the operation of the district. It will replace a smaller general tax levy and is expected to produce between \$560,000 and \$615,000 annually.

Cassville School Board incumbents John Sullivan and Carolyn Bowen are facing opponents Wade Hermansen and Dale Phelps. Each of the two seats open are for threeyear terms.

The Purdy School Board has a challenger for one of the opening seats. Currently, incumbents Ken Terry and Randy Rex Henderson are

serving on the board. Newcomer Carla Schad is also vying for one of the seats. Each of the two seats have threeyear terms.

Mayoral races are primarily uncontested this year. Bill Shively, Cassville, James "Rusty" Reed, Exeter, Steve J. Roden, Purdy, John Tiede-However, other races will man, Washburn, and David Shockley, Wheaton, are all running unopposed for mayor of their respective cities on Tuesday.

> Three different road districts have commissioners up for election. In the Ash Special Road District, incumbent David Dalton is facing opponent Gary Hendrix. In the Flat Creek Special Road District, incumbent Carroll Craig is facing challenger Kenny Tucker. Finally, in the Purdy Special Road District, Ernest Head and Rick Scott are facing off as newcomers.

> The City of Butterfield has two alderman positions open this year. For the east ward, Mark Thomas is running unopposed. For the west ward seat, there will be a write-in



Seligman mayoral race heats up as April 7 election approaches

With the April 7 election rapidly approaching, one race in particular is heating up. The three candidates for the position of Seligman mayor have been campaigning and stating their positions, including what they hope to bring to the city if they win the election.

Current Seligman Mayor Jerry Montgomery, serving his second term, is facing two challengers in this election, Belva Stepp and Joe Foster.

When asked why she was running for mayor, Stepp said, "I thought I could do my town some good. Mainly, it's probably what it'll take to keep our local library open. I'd like to clean up our town and get some businesses in here and make it more inviting to people. I think once we get the town looking presentable, maybe we could start encouraging people to bring businesses in." Stepp is currently the volunteer librarian for the city and has lived in Seligman for 11 years.

When asked the same question, Foster said, "Somebody has to do it and I think I can make a difference here in town. I talked to a lot of people, I used to run a bar, I closed it about six months ago, and I've heard what the people have to say and someone has to speak for them."

Montgomery was the last to put his hat in the ring for the election. When asked

why he decided to run, he said, "I decided to run because I don't want to turn the city over to just anybody. I really didn't think my opposition would be good for the

The next question was what they felt was the most pressing issue for the city of Seligman currently. Foster said, "We need to get our water and sewer system straightened out. We've got problems there. Pretty much, what I want to do is get the people and government back together as one. A lot of people think there are some crooked things going on. I personally don't believe that, but we need more transparent government. The City Council and City Hall don't like it when you question anything, and a lot of people are convinced if you question too much, you'll be harassed. I don't believe that's true, but that's the general consensus of what I've been told."

Foster said that to make a more transparent government, he hopes to make some policy changes regarding the way city employees are expected to conduct themselves, and that, in turn, will get the people of Seligman more involved. He said, "First of all, a few policy changes to city hall need to happen where there are better people skills, for lack of a better term, and also getting people more involved in the city council meetings. A big part of the problem is that people won't go to the city council meetings for fear that they'll be harassed in some way, but I don't believe that is true. Citizens just don't show

In response to Foster's comments, Montgomery said, "I don't think there are any issues with harassment. People in Seligman don't show up for meetings because they don't feel like they can make any changes. I believe they can. If they come to the meetings and express their thoughts, we are going to listen."

When asked about the biggest issue in his opinion, Montgomery shared, "Getting new water lines in the ground is very important, and we've been working on that awhile. That's the main concern right now."

Stepp had a different opinion about the biggest issue for the city. She said that park improvements have

been dramatic, but other areas need attention. She stated, "The only thing I can tell from when I go to the meetings is there are budget problems. I don't know why, but I know a lot has to do with grants coming in, but I'm not sure how all of that works. I'm sure I'm going to learn."

Stepp also mentioned that she has been looking into how to encourage an Urgent Care facility to come to the city and issues with the state of the streets in town. "We have roads that need to be fixed, but it's not within the budget to get them fixed."

Stepp currently serves on the Parks and Recreation Board for the city. She also ran for alderman last year. She said, "My biggest gripe is, 'Who is our mayor?' I guarantee I will be seen. I want people to know who the mayor is. I'll also keep up

with the library as one of my main priorities in the community."

Foster currently serves on the Planning and Zoning Board for the City. He feels that his experience in the private sector will help him if elected. Foster said, "I worked for civil engineering for five years, and I understand the water and sewer system a little better than some might."

Montgomery has lived in Seligman for over 20 years. When asked about his time as mayor, he said, "Since I've been mayor, the best part was seeing the city grow, like bringing in Walmart. It was a big plus to have Walmart come in. Now, I'd like to see a fast food restaurant move in, like Sonic. I think that would be a real good step for the


Couple puts together time capsule to benefit local charities

actly what Seligman couple Tommy and Susan Canada



in Cassville, decided that they wanted to put together a time capsule that would benefit the two charities that they already support. Tommy said, "We already donate \$1,000 a month to both the Haven of the Ozarks and the food kitchen, and we figured, when we're gone, why not give them something else to have 50 years from now. So we built the time capsule for them to split."

Inside the time capsule contains many items like a 100-year-old gold pocket watch that the couple picked up on their travels, a 1902 Sears catalog, some DC Comics posters, a 9 mm handgun, vintage toys and uncirculated collectible coins. The couple didn't want to divulge all of the items in the time capsule but did say that the total value of the items, at the present market value, is around \$45,000. So, fifty years from now, the value should go up substantially.

Tommy said, "When it's opened, half will go to the no-kill animal shelter Haven of the Ozarks and half will go to the food pantry at the Methodist Church."

When asked why they chose those two particular charities, Tommy said, "Animals have to eat, it's not their fault that they are there. Kids need to eat, and it's not their fault that they're in that position. You've got to take care of families."

The time capsule itself is impressive on its own. The couple purchased it from a company that guarantees the contents will remain pristine for 1,000 years. Tommy said, "The gas that they use inside of it was developed by the Air Force." The only places that can seal the time capsule are located in New York, California and Pennsylvania. The Canadas had their time capsule sealed by the Pennsylvania company at the same time as the Little Rock, Ark., time capsule was sealed and the company was

in the area. Once the time capsule was sealed, it was encased in eight inches of concrete and eventually decorated and placed above the ground on

the couple's property.

The Canadas are having an attorney draw up paperwork to ensure that the time capsule is split between the two charities, or if they are no longer in existence, another no-kill shelter and food pantry. While the couple doesn't seek recognition for their charity work, they chose to speak to a news outlet to protect the time capsule itself. Tommy said, "We wanted to make sure there was record of this so that people know it exists and what it was for."

set up displays.

Church members also provided the missionaries with places to stay during GIC. Of the ten missionary families that attended the event, nine were on furlough from their mission fields. The tenth family conducts their ministry in Barry County. One family was given lodging at a house First Baptist keeps for visiting missionaries, and the other eight were taken in by church members who volunteered their homes.

Leland May, associate pastor of First Baptist and one of the church members who took in a missionary family, said he enjoyed the five days he spent with his guests. "It was a terrific experience learning about other cultures and experiencing a world without borders," he said.

During the five days, a variety of activities provided church members with a number of opportunities to learn about global ministries. During the church's kick-off service on March 18, keynote speaker Gracia Burnham spoke about her ordeal in the Philippines when she and her husband Martin were kidnapped and held by terrorists. After a year of constant starvation and exhaustion due to being moved from place to place, Burnham was eventually freed during a gun battle between her captors and the Philippine military. Tragically, Martin did not survive the battle.

In addition to Burnham's presentation, those attending GIC services at the church had the opportunity to speak with the missionaries and view displays detailing their work. The exhibits included pictures, tools, clothing, jewelry and other items from the countries where the missionaries were working. Church members gained a better understanding of these foreign cultures, as well as the challenges the missionaries faced.

There were also opportunities to meet and speak with the missionaries outside of the church. On Friday evening, the missionaries met with their sponsoring Sunday school groups for dinner.

Saturday morning provided another chance to speak with the missionaries. The men met at Cassville Bowl while the women had a morning brunch at the church building, and the youth had a cookout.

On Monday, Weaver said the members of First Baptist did an excellent job of hosting and encouraging the missionaries during

The Chain O Lakes Village has three two-year trustee seats up for election. Candidates Carol Nelson, Roger Thomas, Barbara Wolfe, Brenda Pierce and Mike Strother are running for those positions.

Washburn's City Council has three seats opening. In the one alderman at large race, Jeremy Johnston and Mary Roller are running as incumbents unopposed. In the other alderman at large seat, no one filed, and it is write-in only.

Wheaton also has two city council seats with no opposition. For the east ward alderman seat, Gary Bates is running. For the west ward seat, Naomi Young is unopposed.

The mayoral position and three city council seats are up for election in the city of Seligman. In the mayoral race, incumbent Jerry Montgomery is facing opponents Belva Stepp and Joe Foster. For a two-year west alderman position, Robert (Bob) Hughes is running unopposed. For the one-year west alderman position, Michael Avers is running unopposed. For a two-year east alderman position, Ralph E. Marshall is running against incumbent Ron Corn.

Finally, the Washburn Fire Protection District has five seats open for their board of directors. Five people filed for the position: Charles Cutberth, Ken West, Billie Brown, Rusty Griffis and Brenda Treadwell. Also affiliated with the fire protection district, there is an issue asking voters whether the Washburn Fire Protection District can collect a levy of up to 30 cents per \$100 assessed valuation to fund the district. This would do away with membership dues for the district.

Direct-care clinic to offer family-friendly healthcare in Cassville

For people in the Cassville area, a new healthcare option will be available beginning June 1. Dr. Lisa Roark, M.D., is opening a direct-care clinic at 1101 Main Street in Cassville.

The purpose of a directcare clinic is that it allows individuals and families without insurance to purchase a membership and, in turn, get services for free or significantly less than other offices. According to Dr. Roark, direct-care is a way for the community to get back to a less complicated form of healthcare. She said, "It's going back to the days where it was just the doctor and the patient. It's no longer the insurance controlling companies healthcare. It's the doctor and the patient."

By not spending the extra funds to deal with insurance billing, the clinic is able to pass on the benefits to members. It makes the entire process less complicated for both the doctor and the patients.

Dr. Roark became inspired to open the clinic after attending an American Academy of Physicians Conference in Washington D.C. She said, "I heard all of these doctors talking about getting to go back to just caring for the patient, and I got excited. I thought,

'I've got to do this. We need this."

By paying a monthly fee, individuals or families enrolled in membership in the clinic are offered unlimited office visits during business hours, unlimited access to the physician, including phone, text and email, as well as physicals, chronic disease management and much more. Another advantage is that the visits are longer and more comprehensive, generally lasting 30 minutes to an hour.

If a patient needs a medication, it is provided at the clinic's cost, which is a huge savings over using a pharmacy. Labs ordered and drawn at the clinic are also offered at cost to process them. For example, a cholesterol test would normally cost a patient \$133, but for a member of the direct-care clinic, the test is \$3. For patients needing Amlodopline, a blood pressure medication, it would cost around \$62 at a pharmacy, but only \$0.66 at Roark Family Health.

Dr. Roark said that most patients don't know what something will cost them when they go to the docotr, and she wants to eliminate that secrecy. "It's all smoke and mirrors. You get healthcare, and then you get a bill in the mail. People have no idea what it is going to cost them. With this way, there are no more smoke and mirrors. It's all right there on the website."

Dr. Roark said that the biggest reason that she opted to open the clinic is to support the community where she lives. She said, "I want to work where I live. My kids are in the Cassville school system. I want to support my community."

After completing her

residency at Cox in Springfield, Dr. Roark went on to work for CoxHealth in Aurora since then. However, she wanted to be back in Cassville full-time instead of driving back and forth.

She went on, "Basically, I feel like the Affordable Care Act has left a huge portion of our population without affordable health insurance. They basically don't have primary care. We have lots of people with high-deductible insurance, and they are paying out \$3,000 to \$5,000 out of pocket in deductibles before they have any coverage and can see their physi-

Legislation just passed in the House of Representatives at the Missouri State Capitol to allow membership in direct-care clinics as exemption for the federal health insurance requirement under the Affordable Care Act. Next, it will go to the Senate for a vote. Representative Scott Fitzpatrick has been supportive of the legislation. He said, "I'm hopeful that HB 759 makes it to the finish line. This bill is a perfect example of taking down governmental barriers to consumer choice in receiving healthcare. During a time when traditional healthcare delivery options are skyrocketing in cost, more consumer choice will generate more competition. When there is more competition, consumers win."

The dynamic of the community also plays into the need, according to Dr. Roark. With the number of farmers and small businesses in the area, she said many are paying out of pocket for healthcare because there isn't affordable insurance. She said, "So what it comes down to is, with the Affordable Care Act, most of our community in southwest Missouri is left where they have no primary care access. I see it in my clinic all the time, and my patients are really hurting for it. I see it as a need. I see it in my family and my friends, and I think I can help."

Dr. Roark's husband, Griff, an architect, did the remodelling of the clinic.

Dr. Roark said, "I'm so lucky that he has been able to get the clinic ready. It's really exciting."

funding and ensure we have the life-saving equipment we need to get people where they need to go."

Without funding to replace equipment, the board says that services will definitely decrease. Currently, the ambulance service transports 22.1 percent of people to the local Mercy Hospital in Cassville. Other transports are based on the level of emergency or the preference of the injured party based on their insurance coverage. For example, if the ambulance service transports someone to Springfield, currently Cox receives around 7.9 percent of the transfers and Mercy Health receives 16.7 percent of the total transports.

For the SBCAD, Cox-Health EMS provides the consumable supplies within the ambulance as well as fuel and maintenance to run the ambulances and utilities at the two facilities. Cox also provides the personnel for the ambulances, including salaries and benefits for 16 full-time EMTs and Paramedics, two PRN EMTs and

one PRN Paramedic.

The SBCAD pays Cox-Health an annual \$95,400 to help mitigate the costs to provide the staff and supplies to keep the ambulance service running, however, the service runs at a deficit for Cox. So when questions arise regarding why residents still receive a bill for an ambulance ride when their property tax funds the district, the answer comes down to money. CoxHealth is presently running at a \$77,600 deficit for first five months of the 2015 Fiscal Year, a trend that is ongoing due to a fairly low percentage of collections on billing (around 33 percent) and the high cost of running emergency medical services. The deficit provided doesn't include administrative, education or billing staff that also runs the ambulances.

Ricky Savage, regional manager for CoxHealth EMS, stated, "If you run ambulances to be profitable, you wouldn't have any ambulances." Even so, the service maintains a high-level of accountability for their staff. Savage said, "Each zone of the county has a different time limit for when we need to arrive. For the suburban area, we have 12 minutes, 25 minutes for the zone outside of that, and 45 minutes for the outlying zone. We are the only ambulance service in Missouri that does that." On top of that, the staff has one minute to leave the station once a call comes in.

Once the ambulances leave the stations, they are updated with notes from Cox dispatch on a tablet so they are prepared once they get to the scene. To ensure coverage, the ambulance service makes sure that there is one ambulance at each station with staff ready to go while the other ambulance is out on a call. However, increasing call volumes are making that harder to accommodate. Savage said, "We're needing to add another ambulance if the Board sees fit to do so. We really need more coverage based on the services we're providing."

Cox uses previous call history to determine how many staff are on site at all times. Savage said, "We know we're more busy during vacation season when

people are all down around the lake, so we plan for that." However, without the equipment and the staff, the board and Cox say that services will suffer. CoxHealth, which is a

non-profit entity, issued a statement regarding the tax initiative. They said, "Cox-Health absolutely supports the SBCAD's sales tax initiative. We have seen the positive results with the Dade County Ambulance District and Douglas County Ambulance District. Douglas County (Ava) passed their sales tax in the early 2000's and, as a result, was able to double their ambulance coverage. Douglas County is now able to provide their ambulances with top of the line equipment and upgrades which ensures their citizens are receiving the absolute best care possible. We are very excited and ready to show the people of South Barry County Ambulance District those same positive results."

Savage said, "We have identified that at times we do not have enough ambulances on duty to respond to all the emergencies. Our call volume has continued to climb as so have Mercy Cassville's patient census for the Emergency Department. They are seeing more people than ever, and some are very sick. This means more people need to go to a higher level of care such as hospitals in Rogers, Joplin or Springfield. Mercy understands we have a limited amount of ambulances, and we work together as a team very well. We meet on a regular basis and progressively work out kinks in the system to provide the best service we can with limited resources. Without the good relationship and teamwork that wouldn't be possible. The South Barry County Ambulance District also does a fantastic job at making sure the needs and the safety of the citizens stays our first priority."

If the tax passes, the funds would begin to be collected this year, probably in October, and the property tax levy would rollback once the tax is in full-effect

Jenkins Chili Supper raises over \$1,100 for fire department

The Jenkins Fire Protection District held a chili supper at their fire station near Flat Creek to raise money to buy new equipment for their volunteer firefighters. The event, which was attended by over 100 people, raised a total of \$1,139, according to Sandy Rainwater, the district's treasurer.

Those attending the chili supper paid a donation for their admission. In return, they were treated to all they could eat homemade chili, hot dogs, stew, drinks and freshly-baked desserts. Ozark Mountain Revival, a local band, played gospel and country favorites while the guests ate.

According to Ruby Vincent, who acted as chairman of the chili supper, about 40 people, including firefighters, their family members and other supporters, gave of their time to get the fire station ready for the event. "A lot of them came this morning and cleared up the building, moved the trucks out and set up the tables," she said.

Several volunteers also helped to prepare the food served. According to Sara Parker, the district's secretary, six women made the chili and others also baked the desserts while Parker herself made a vegetable-beef stew that was very popular. Additionally, volunteers donated the condiments and drinks that were served dur-

ing the meal. "Everything was donated but the hot dogs and the buns," Parker said. The food was delicious as there were people seeking seconds and thirds.

The dinner was not the only fundraiser. Toward the end of the evening, 21 pies and cakes that had been baked by area supporters were sold during a pie auction and guests were also invited to enter a 50/50 drawing. Combined, the pie auction and the drawing raised \$245 for the fire district. Jack McComack, of Jenkins, purchased two of the desserts being auctioned off and also won the 50/50 drawing but donated his winnings back to the fire department. Asked why he did this, McComack shrugged and said, "To support the fire department."

Brylee Wilson, 12, was among the many volunteers who served food during the supper. Brylee said she volunteered to give back to those around her. "I wanted to help my community," she said.

While everyone had a good time, the money that was raised through the chili supper went to meet some very serious needs. According to Tyler Roberts, the district's assistant chief, the volunteers are in dire need of new equipment. "Right now, there are several people who have older gear that needs to be replaced," he said.

According to Brian Sisco,

the district fire chief, there is also a need for manpower as well as money. Currently, the district has 25 volunteer fire-fighters, but Sisco would like to see that number increase to 45 to 50. "You can never have enough volunteers," he said.
