Barry County office filings close for Aug. 2 Election

Contested races for Sheriff, Public Administrator, Southern Commissioner

Tuesday, March 29, marked the close of filings for Barry County office positions with terms beginning in 2017. Contested races are on the books for Sheriff, Southern Commissioner and Public Administrator. The positions of Assessor, Coroner and Northern Commissioner are unopposed with incumbents, and no one filed for the Surveyor office.

The Barry County Sheriff position drew the most candidates. After Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly announced that he was not seeking reelection after a long stint in the position, six Republicans and one Democrat filed for the position.

Travis Hilburn, R-Cassville, filed for the position first. Hilburn is a former Missouri State Highway Patrol Trooper. Danny Boyd, R-Monett, James Smith, R-Aurora, and Justin Fohn, R-Cassville, all filed and are currently officers with the Cassville Police Department. Terry Meek, R-Washburn, is also running as a current officer with the Barry County Sheriff's Department, and Gary Davis, R-Cassville, is a former FBI

The Republican candi-

date will be determined by the August 2 Primary Election and will face the sole Democrat candidate, Justin Ruark, D-Cassville, a current Barry County Sheriff's Department officer, in November.

In the Southern Commissioner race, incumbent Wayne Hendrix, D-Cassville, will get the nomination on the Democrat ticket, but will be facing an opponent in the November election. Hendrix will face the sole Republican candidate, Matt Cupps, R-Shell Knob.

For Public Administrator, four Republicans filed for the nomination, but one has dropped out. When filings closed, Andy Reavis, R-Cassville, Rodney Hughes, R-Cassville, and Keith Daniels, R-Exeter, all filed their declarations of candidacy. Cindy Carr, R-Cassville, dropped out of the race after filing earlier. The August 2 Primary will determine the officer holder as there is no Democrat opponent.

Incumbents who are running unopposed in both the Primary and the November election are Assessor Sherry Sears, R-Cassville, Coroner Jim Fohn, R-Cassville, and Northern Commissioner Gary Schad, R-Purdy.

Shell Knob man killed in one-vehicle wreck on YY

A Shell Knob man was killed in a single-vehicle crash on Route YY near Shell Knob Wednesday, March 23, afternoon.

According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, Roger A. Patterson, 68, was driving eastbound about one mile southeast of Shell Knob when the crash occurred. Around 2 p.m., Patterson's 2012 Ford F150 traveled off the side of the roadway and

struck several trees. Patterson was killed. It is unknown as to whether he was wearing a seat belt at the time of the crash.

Patterson was pronounced dead by Barry County Deputy Coroner Charles McManus at 2:30 p.m. His body was taken to Fohn Funeral Home in Cassville.

This is Missouri State Highway Patrol Troop D's 26th fatality for the year.

The Cassville Area Chamber of Commerce hosted their Breakfast and Ballot Issues event on Tuesday, March 29, at 7:30 a.m. at the United Methodist Church in Cassville. During the breakfast, chamber members were invited to listen to various candidates and representatives for other

ballot issues on the April 5 General Municipal Election ballot speak.

The Chamber Board selected questions for Barry-Lawrence Library director Gina Milburn regarding the library's proposed 7-cent property tax levy increase as well as the Cassville R-IV School Board candidates about their positions. Cassville Mayor Bill Shiveley also briefly detailed the Cassville city issue about the continuation of the use tax on out of state vehicle purchases.

There are four candidates for the Cassville R-IV School Board positions. Current school board members Greg Allan and Hal Smith

Voters to consider library tax levy increase

Barry County and Lawrence County voters will have the opportunity to vote on a increase in the current library tax levy that funds the Barry-Lawrence Regional Libraries. The issue will be up for a vote on the April 5 General Municipal Election ballots in both counties.

Currently, the library system is funded by a 15-cent property tax levy to run the ten different branches. If the property tax-levy increases, the change will be an additional 7-cents, bringing it up to 22-cents per \$1,000 assessed valuation. The change would be an additional \$600,000 in funding annually for the libraries, according to information provided by the Barry-Lawrence Regional Library.

Part of the reasoning for the Barry-Lawrence Library Board seeking additional funding was the loss of 2-cents on the property tax levy after 2008. The tax levy used to be 17-cents, but due to the Hancock Amendment, the library had to roll back their property tax to last

voter-approved levy, which dated back to 1973. The library gets approximately 85 percent of their funding from taxes. The loss of the funding equated to around \$250,000 between the two counties, according to library director Gina Milburn.

Due to decreases in tax revenue, some of the library system's ten branches have had to scale back hours and staff. With approval of the levy, the library plans to increase staff and services.

For homeowners, the increase for the levy would mean an increase of around \$13.30 per year on a \$100,000 home or \$19.95 for a \$200,000 home. For vehicles, the increase would mean approximately \$2.33 per year on a \$10,000 vehicle and \$4.67 for a \$20,000 vehicle.

Opponents of the levy increase have raised questions about why the library is increasing the levy by 7-cents when their loss was only 2-cents per \$1,000 of assessed valuation. In response, the library board released information stating that the Missouri State Library as well as Missouri State Statutes say a library needs at least 20-cents in property tax levy to provide "adequate" service.

According Milburn, funds from the property tax levy will be used for a number of projects, including: more DVDs, audiobooks and books for patrons, new e-books and e-audiobooks as well as e-readers for customers to check out, streaming music and movies for checkout, digital downloadable magazines for checkout, provide Pop Up Library mobile services to underserved communities in both counties, extended branch hours at most locations based on customer needs, a wider variety of databases and job skills training, and provide upgrades and improvements to library facilities.

The Barry-Lawrence Regional Library is made up ten branches: Aurora, Cassville, Eagle Rock, Marionville, Miller, Mt. Vernon, Monett, Purdy, Pierce City and Shell Knob. For more information on the tax levy, the Monett Branch Library can be reached at (417) 235-6466.





are not seeking reelection. Candidates who filed for the positions are Chad Yarnall, Jeremy Marple, Gamon Sparkman and Damon Brown, all parents of students in the district. Yarnall, Marple and Sparkman were at the breakfast, but Brown was unable to attend.

The first question the candidates were asked was why they felt their position was as a school board member. All three agreed that the children were the most important part of the district. Marple said, "I feel like the primary role is to work with the board and to get things accomplished and the main objective is to have successful kids. You have to a have a successful board to get things headed in the right direction to keep your teachers happy to have successful children. The children are the most important

Yarnall said, "Well, I personally believe that my primary role as a school board member is not to micromanage but to make sure we've got the best people working to develop our children. As long as we have that going, we'll have successful children and happy children. That way they'll go on to be somebody and come home and grow our community."

Sparkman said, "We need to do what we need to do as a school, not only to make this the best school in the area, but in the district of southwest Missouri. I'm very proud of the area and the school."

He added, "We need to give the faculty and the staff whatever they need to be the best school in the region."

They were asked about what improvements need to be made. Yarnall said, "I feel like by getting the children to respect their teachers and to respect the authorities and to treat our school system with respect, then all we're going to do is grow."

Sparkman said, "As far

as overall improvements, I don't know that I have any improvements that need to be made. Cassville School is on the right path. I just think we need to make sure we help in any way possible."

He added, "If that means hiring a coach or adding a new program, we need to do whatever we can to get those kids involved and get them to be proud of the school and the community."

Marple said, "I think you have to have good teachers and you have to have teachers who have been in the classroom a little while. As a board, we have to figure out how to keep teachers in the district, the good teachers in the district. When you have good teachers that are motivated properly, those teachers will help your children."

They also were asked about their two goals for their Cassville School District. Sparkman said, "Two goals and basically end on the same thing, and that is to make Cassville Schools the best they can possibly be. I would absolutely like to provide those children with the best education they can possibly get and give them as much hands-on experience as they can possibly

He added, "The second thing would be pride. I want them to have pride in their community and pride in their school. I want them to think fondly back about going to school here as I did."

Yarnall said, "We want to make our school one of the best in the state. We need to have students who have respect and also pride in their community."

Marple stated, "If I was elected to school board, I'm going to do what I can to make Cassville Schools a destination. I want people

to want to move to the community and to be a part of the Cassville School system. I want it to be a destination for teachers that want to come to Cassville School because they hear, 'Man, that is a great district to work for, I've got to go to Cassville.' You've got to have good

people." "Another would be to do what we can to make sure everyone graduates," he added.

They were also asked about how to assist students in understanding the perils of social media and bullying and what they will base their decisions on as a board

The Cassville School Board candidates will be decided on the April 5 General Municipal Election ballot.





Residents of Cassville, Once again, the city council is discussing the option of flood insurance. I have to wonder who it is that stirs up the same discussion over and over again. It isn't like we haven't been there before. To start with, the option of entering the flood insurance program has some serious stipulation. As stated in this publication last week, all structures built after 1977 would have to be inspected and made somewhat flood proof or elevated on stilts in order to get them above the flood plain. Then, large retention basins would have to be built around the city in various locations in order to slow the incoming waters during heavy rains. The ironic part of this idea is the fact that the worst flooding takes place in parts of the city that was developed long before 1977. Properties that are located in this region would apparently be exempt from the

If it weren't for the fact that it is such a senseless program in the first place, it would be almost hilarious. But, in reality, it is no more than an immense taxation on property owners in order to make the option of fed*eral grants available to the city.*

insurance program.

Stop and think about it. Lets say that the city enters into this plan and all of the proper-

modified, as necessary, in order to comply. Now, after spending all this money to meet these requirements, the owners are told that they now have to buy flood insurance, which as the article stated, can easily cost \$700 a year or more. Even though these properties have been made "flood-proof," the insurance is still very costly. After all, the structures are now elevated, and flood damage is much less likely. With this kind of rationale, would it not be smarter for the citizens to simply fund the building of these retention basins with the same money that they would otherwise be paying out for flood insurance? It doesn't have to be done all at once, but rather through a long term plan which would approach the most serious problems as well as the least costly problems first. Funding would have to be through a bond issue of some type and complete results would not be achieved for years to come, but a least the heavy cost insurance would not become such a permanent burden for city property owners.

Another thing to consider is that insurance premiums don't go down, they go up. So what may start out as \$700 a year today could easily be \$1,500.00 in a few years. Not to mention

once you enter the program, you have no option to cancel this policy. If this is put into effect, you will be forced to comply permanently.

In my opinion, this issue has only been brought up because the city wants the grant money, but the only way to get it is to enter the flood program. No problem, let the property owners pay for it through flood insurance. Then, the city can have opportunity to get their hands on more "free money."

Last but not least, we should all take a look at how the city spends the funds they currently have. For years, I have complained to the city about the deterioration of sidewalks in this town. None of them have been replaced as far back as I can recall. No one in city government paid any attention to the state of Missouri offered to pay for it. Now, they are all for it. Then, there is the buildup of gravel in the creek east of town as well as the drainage ditch between 10th and 11th street. This has been a problem for the last 25 to 30 years, but no one is going to address it unless we can get someone else to pay for it. A year or so ago, there was an issue on the ballot to add an additional city sales tax for the paving of city streets. The tax has been in place for quite some time now, but how many streets have been re-paved or even repaired? They have not even done so much as repair the potholes throughout the

Dear NCAA: A Sports Editorial

The following is a letter I composed in response to the NCAA television contract that assigned the broadcast rights of the NCAA men's basketball tournament to CBS and a number of cable/ satellite providers. In case you haven't guessed, I am not happy.

Dear NCAA,

I am writing to express my extreme displeasure with the coverage of the NCAA basketball tournament. While there have been some good games so far, the real "March Madness" is the travesty of moving so many games to cable-only stations like TNT, truTV and TBS.

Seems like I wrote this same letter about ABC and ESPN back during the NCAA football bowl season. Any game worth seeing was only shown on the various ESPN channels.

I am a bonafide cord cutter. I have not had cable or satellite television in years. We survive on the free network broadcasts, a minimum of movie/dvd rentals and the wonderful collection of movies and series available for free checkout at the Cassville library. Cheap doesn't begin to describe my approach to television viewing.

For several years, we had a membership to the Mercy Fitness Center, where we often timed our workouts to coincide with specific sports events only available on cable. More than once, we went to the center JUST to watch a game and barely pretended to use the exercise equipment. A pastor friend of mine uses this as an example when giving financial counselling to young couples. I am flattered.

I think the powers-thatbe who control the sports programming and are responsible for hiding it on cable to try to force us into subscribing don't realize that once people cut the cord, they become wonderfully free and almost never return to the cable/satellite lifestyle. Games that once dwarfed other entertainment choices are relegated to just a box score in the newspaper or on the internet. Hours of watching are condensed to a few minutes of highlights on youtube.

The slippery slope of daring customers to cut the cord
