## Wreck near Purdy claims life of **Stone County resident**

A single-vehicle wreck one mile south of Purdy on Highway 37 claimed the life of Jarett T. Crouthamel (19), of Lampe, Sunday morning, April 4.

Crouthamel was killed when the southbound 2007 Chevrolet Silverado he was driving left the right side of the roadway and overturned. He was pronounced deceased

at the scene at 4:29 a.m..by Barry County coroner, Gary Swearingen, and his body was transported to Fohn Funeral Home.

The totaled Silverado was towed by Brice's Towing, of Cassville.

Two passengers in the vehicle, Trey G. Sturgell (21), of Cassville, and Cade O. Hammen (23), of Purdy, suffered moderate and serious injuries, respectively. Sturgell sought his own treatment. Hammen was taken by ambulance to Cox South Hospi-

None of the three were wearing a safety device.

The crash, which was investigated by Msgt. J. Givens, of the Missouri Highway Patrol, was the 28th fatality accident for Troop D this year.

A benefit for the Crauthamel family was held Tuesday, April 6, at Four State Stockyards in Exeter, where Cade Hammen, one of the injured men, is a co-owner. A feeder calf and cow donated by local livestock owners and bags of feed donated by the Exeter Feed Store were auctioned off for the fundraiser. "After the ballot is officially certified, which will happen Tuesday, April 13, a


