Gov. Nixon signs two ag bills at Purdy dairy

Friday marked an exciting day for area FFA members when they witnessed Governor Jay Nixon sign two bills into law at Edgewood Dairy, owned by Charles Fletcher, in Purdy. Nixon signed two bills, House Bill 259, the Missouri Dairy Revitalization Act, and Senate Bill 12, an omnibus agriculture bill, into law in front of the large crowd on the sunny afternoon at the family-owned pasture-based dairy.

Before signing the bills into law, both of which had been priority pieces of legislation of the Missouri Farm Bureau in the 2015 legislative session, Nixon stated, "Agriculture is our state's number on industry and the bills I'm signing today will help to further strengthen this important sector of our economy."

Missouri Farm Bureau President Blake Hurst said, "Missouri Farm Bureau is extremely pleased that the governor signed these bills today. These pieces of legislation will benefit farmers for years to come. Agriculture is the state's largest industry and these bills will help ensure it remains strong."

The Dairy Revitalization Act serves to reimburse dairy farmers up to 70 percent of their Margin Protection Program premiums, establish scholarships and also fund producer training and a study of how to grow Missouri's dairy industry. The Margin Protection Program assists dairy farmers when the dairy margin drops below \$4. Also part of the law, up to 80 scholarships of \$5,000 each will be available for students pursing two- or four-year agriculture degrees with 2.5 GPA's when they graduates from a Missouri high school. Students will also sign an agreement to work in the agriculture industry for at least two years for every year they receive the scholarship.

HB 259 was sponsored by Representative Bill Reiboldt and passed the

House on a 110-49 vote on February 4. Missouri Dairy Association president Lloyd Gunter stated, "We thank the Governor for recognizing the needs of maintaining a local milk supply for all Missouri consumers and our processing industry by helping Missouri's dairy Gunter continued, "We farmers with their risk management program."

Gunter continued, "We hope HB 259 will help curb management program."

Barry County vets honored on C of O memorial

Ten Barry County natives will be honored as part of a special dedication of the Missouri Vietnam Veterans Memorial at the College of the Ozarks on April 22 at 2:30 p.m.. The memorial, which honors fallen soldiers during the Vietnam War, will feature over 1,400 Missourians who died while serving their country. Decorated Vietnam War Veteran Oliver North will speak at the dedication.

The memorial will stand at the college's entrance. College of the Ozarks was chosen as the site for the memorial by the Missouri state legislature during the 2014 session. The funding for the project came primarily from The Bass Pro Shops Legends of Golf at Big Cedar golf tournament, which gained them \$500,000 for their volunteer efforts. Another \$30,000 was given when they were named the Charity of the Year by the PGA Tour's Champions Tour in January, according to a press release issued by the college.

The Barry County natives that will have a place on the memorial are: James Vincent

Ballay, Galen Charles Brown, Carl Leon Bruton, Lindsey Houston Crow, William Rothrock Edmonson, Johnny Earl Frisk, Aaron Harvey Lowe, Timmy G. Mattingly, Howard Andrew Threet and Thomas Hubert Wolfe. The college extended invitations to the families of all of the Missouri men who died during the war to be present for the dedication of the memorial next week.

The Branson chapter of the Vietnam Veterans of America, Chapter 913, was also integral in getting the memorial to College of the Ozarks. Former president of the chapter, Bob Sarver, approached the state and Dr. Davis with C of O. Davis then used the golf tournament as the funding for the project. Even a College of the Ozarks graduate, Austin Meyer, designed the memorial, and it is being constructed by staff and students of the college.

The design of the memorial includes two walls of names with a statue of Vietnam Veterans in the middle. The flower bed in the shape of a "V" represents valor and will be planted with red flow-

ers to represent the blood shed by Missouri soldiers.

The ceremony is open to the public and will feature Vietnam War Veteran Oliver North, the FOX News Channel documentary host of "War Stories with Oliver North," as well as a combatdecorated Marine and best selling author. Other observances will include music from the college's choir, a 21-gun salute, and family members of the fallen will place single roses at the base of the

Barry County Vietnam Veterans:

James Vincent Ballay, 21, of Monett, was a sergeant in the Army. His tour began June 12, 1969, until he was killed in action on the ground on May 12, 1970, in Cambodia.

Galen Charles Brown, 20, of Cassville, served in the Army as a specialist four on tour of duty that began January 13, 1969. He was killed in action on the ground on May 13, 1969, in Thua Thien Province, South Vietnam.



the decline in Missouri dairies and provide opportunities for young people entering into the dairy business and furthering their education in ag related fields."

The Ag Omnibus bill increases the weight limits for trucks hauling livestock to 85,500 pounds yearround, the weights of grain trucks by 10 percent during harvest time, and repeals a state law that prohibits beef producers from voting on instituting a state beef checkoff.

Nixon stated, "Last fall, Missouri farmers saw record harvests throughout the state, but our existing weight limits hampered the ability of Missouri's Farmers and producers to get the job done. By establishing an increased limit during times of harvest, we can help Missouri's harmers and ranchers continue to feed, fuel and clothe the world.

Nixon added, "When I say that we feed, fuel and clothe the world, we do." He was referencing Missouri's

huge growth in agricultural exports over the last five years which went to more than 150 countries and increased by more than a billion dollars.

Nixon continued, "Missouri's dairy industry supports more than 23,000 jobs and contributes \$2 billion to our state's GDP. By supporting our dairy farmers and encouraging more young people to pursue careers in agriculture, the Dairy Revitalization Act will yield tremendous benefits for our rural communities and our

entire economy."



Campbell seeks public defender

Campbell was initially released from Taney County Jail on a \$500,000 bond, but his bond was revoked after being arrested on an alleged theft case in Purdy last year. No charges are currently on record with the Barry County courts pertaining

to the Purdy arrest. The Campbells were living in Purdy at the time. Robert's wife was to be charged with her involvement as well, but committed suicide last year before being taken to jail.

Campbell isn't due back in court until April 21 for a pretrial conference. Campbell was originally set to stand trial in October, but that trial was cancelled and no new date has been set.





Twister Alley runs nine classes of karts ranging from Rookie (4-6 year-olds) to Adult Clones and Opens.



The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) reports that young turkey hunters harvested 4,441 birds during the 2015 spring youth season, April 11 and 12. Top harvest counties were Franklin with 117 birds, Greene with 88 and Cedar with 87. Barry County youth had 20 total turkeys for the weekend. Young hunters checked 4,332 turkeys during last year's spring youth week-

Hunters age 6 through 15 are allowed to take one male turkey or turkey with a visible beard during the youth season. Those who harvest a turkey during the youth season may not take a second bird until the second week of the regular spring turkey season, which runs April 20 through May 10.


