Purdy man arrested for arson of own home

A Purdy man is in police custody and charged with arson after allegedly burning down his own home due to bankruptcy. James L. Peters, 65, of Purdy, is charged with arson in the first degree.

According to affidavits of probable cause, the Barry County Sheriff's Department was dispatched to the scene of a house fire on Private Road 1065 in Purdy on Monday, April 16. When officers arrived, they spoke with Peters and his wife, who own the home. Peters allegedly set fire to the home without telling his wife, who is considered to be a victim in the crime.

The officer reported the victim was upstairs when Peters allegedly set a fire to the wall behind the downstairs bathtub with gasoline as an accelerant as well as the headboard of the master bedroom on the first floor.

According to the victim's statement, Peters then went upstairs as if nothing was wrong. Then the victim noticed the smoke and went downstairs to investigate, she informed Peters the home was on fire. Peters allegedly said, "Okay," and grabbed a lockbox.

When law enforcement arrived, Peters informed them the home was insured for \$279,000, and he was filing bankruptcy. The insurance agent arrived on scene shortly after, according to law enforcement.

When interviewed, Peters did not admit to setting the fire, however, he told officers, "If you have to put me in jail, I am okay with that."

Peters is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$75,000 cash-only bond.

Three arrested for prescription drug dealing in Cassville

Three people were arrested in connection with a drug deal in Cassville last week. The effort was a partnership with the Ozarks Drug Enforcement Team (ODET) and the Cassville Police Department.

On April 12, ODET were conducting a mobile surveillance on John Caldwell, 50, of Purdy, after they received information about his being involved in narcotics sales. Officers with ODET reported to have observed Caldwell exchange something that officers believed to be drugs for money with two other individuals.

VOICE program gives Purdy kids career exposure

This week marked the first of a special new OACAC (Ozark Area Community Action Corporation) event to help introduce elementaryaged children to different career choices. The VOICE Experience program, which stands for Vocational Opportunities Inspiring Children in Elementary, gives kids the chance to meet professionals in a variety of careers to give them a glance at different jobs they might not otherwise be aware of. The first school in Barry County to participate in the program was Purdy.

Gail Reed, director of OACAC in Cassville, said, "I thought it was wonderful. It went very well. I was impressed with the volunteers who came to speak about their careers and impressed with the students and how they were engaged and enjoying it. I was really pleased with the whole thing."

At the school, secondary counselor Tiffany Costello was one of the staff orchestrating the event. She said she thought the experience was really helpful based on the feedback she has received. "I thought it went well. After talking to the teachers after, we found out the kids went home and talked to their parents about it. It seemed like a really positive response and got all of the kids thinking about careers.

"We really want to help students begin dreaming big about what they could be or

could do in the future. We feel that opening up their knowledge and experiences to expose them to different careers that maybe they haven't come in contact with or know much about, helps them to see how school aligns with what they want to do in the future."

The VOICE experience is set up to allow small groups of kids to speak with each presenter at the event, and then rotate to the next volunteer. Representatives from different career fields spoke with groups of six to ten students for about ten minutes each. Groups moved from one table to another around the elementary gym, learn-

ing about each field and participating in activities before getting their "Passports" stamped. The passports served to give them a visual reminder of the different career fields they learned about, but also to show their parents and open up conversations about different careers they might be interested in later on in life.

Reed said, "A lot of the time, kids have a very limited exposure to different vocations and professions. So, we are trying to give them a place to think outside the box, to think of something else they maybe haven't thought about before. I realize they are young kids, but

we are planting a seed and seeing where it goes."

Costello echoed that sentiment. She said, "We want them to constantly be exploring what they might want to do. I think a lot of students are doing school because they are supposed to, not fully understanding that there is an end goal instead of just graduating or making it to the next grade. This gives them a different level of motivation. It plants the seed. The more we can expose them to all different careers, they can explore and grow from that. You don't know what you aren't exposed to.

"It gives a why behind school and helps expose

Family of Washburn murder victim await justice

It's been over six months since Christopher Paschall was found guilty of murdering Washburn resident Herbert Townsend and his granddaughter Casey Brace. A jury handed down a guilty verdict on six different charges against him. However, he still hasn't been sentenced, and Townsend's family says they don't have justice because of delays.

Townsend's sister, Linda Jester, said the delay is taking a toll on the family. She explained, "The judge set the sentencing [for December 19, 2017]. We all went up there; Herbert has 10 brothers and sisters. We all went up to the courthouse and sat there a long time, then all of a sudden, the lawyers go back there with the judge and then tell Herbert's daughter Kathy that there would be no sentencing today.

"We're all older. It's hard. I'm 70, and my oldest sister is 90. There is no closure or finish for

us. It's like for the bad guys there are no consequences to their actions."

The case against Paschall isn't unusual for murder cases. Typically, attorneys file appeals and requests for new trials. The timeline for this case is not different, however, that doesn't make it any easier on the family.

On September 28, 2017, Paschall was convicted of two counts of first degree murder, three counts of armed criminal action and a single count of parental kidnapping for the deaths of Townsend and Brace and the kidnapping of he and Brace's two year old daughter. Then, on October 13, Paschall's attorney Andrew Miller filed a motion for a new trial, before sentencing was handed down by the judge.

Since, additional hearings and requests have postponed the actual sentencing. Most recently, judge Jack Al Goodman has approved two mental evaluations on Paschall, the most recent

Dementia Support Group helps caregivers in Shell Knob

For anyone who hasn't had to care for a loved one with Alzheimer's disease, it's hard to understand the woes of the caregiver. They might not understand the aversion to showering or odd food habits. They might not even see how bad the memory issues are. However, if you've been there, you remember, and it's helpful to have others around you who understand and give support. It was that concept that led to the creation of the Alzheimer's support ground in Shell Knob, and it's a need that was met in the community that is vitally important to those going through it.

It was that need that Sheila House felt needed to be filled almost five years ago. Now, the group is going strong and meets at the Cen-

tral Crossing Senior Center in Shell Knob. House, who serves as volunteer facilitator, said, "I went from running the Shell Knob Chamber of Commerce to running a long-term care facility for memory care. I worked for a company out of Idaho, and went there for training. I started thinking about all of the people in Shell Knob I've known who've been my friends who now have a spouse who are dealing with Alzheimer's.

"I thought it would be advantageous for the community to have a support group."

So, House set out on a journey to start a support group in Shell Knob and hoped it would catch on. Nearly five years later, an average of 10 to 12 people meet monthly to listen to speakers, make friendships, and maybe most importantly, be around people who understand what they are going through.

To form the group, one of only two in Barry County, House reached out to the Alzheimer's Association for training and information. However, House is in charge of meetings, and she plans the nonprofit group based on what the group needs.

Some members have been going for a number of years. Some of them are in the early stages of caring for a loved one with Alzheimer's or Dementia. Some have loved ones who have already passed away. It's a wide array of people who attend the monthly meetings.

One member, Donna Mulkey, of Shell Knob, has been going to the group for years. She said, "You know you're not alone when you are meeting with the group."

Mulkey's husband, Glen, passed away at 78 years old

after they had been married 55 years. Mulkey still participates by going to the meetings. She said, "I still attend the meetings because they are friends. I feel I can be helpful to them by telling my

House went on to explain how the atmosphere is cathartic for the people who attend. "We laugh and cry and try to form relationships so when you're having a bad day, you've got a friend to call who understands what you're going through."

That spirit and com-

miseration is a huge asset to those caring for loved ones who are suffering from a disease without a cure. Sometimes, you just need to hear that someone else understands what you're going through. However, the group isn't solely dedicated to sharing. They also have guest speakers each meeting. All of the people who speak are volunteers, but they are experts in their fields.

House said she usually chooses the speakers based on what issues come up in the group. She said, "I plan it by listening to the group speak. What we typically do is we have a guest speaker at least ten out of 12 months. I work in long-term care, so I have a lot of contacts. I try to listen to the group and plan

"The members of the group will ask related questions. They'll ask about attitude or nutrition or things they are going through. Then, I seek people who can answer those questions at a later meeting."

that way.

While there are many different types of dementia, a lot of the characteristics are the same, so the speakers usually have something that applies to everyone in the group. For example, if group member's loved ones are experiencing behavioral issues, House will bring in someone who specializes in

that. At least twice a year, she also brings in a grief coun-

House explained, "It's a grief process. Alzheimer's is 100 percent terminal 100 percent of the time. It's the only disease in the top leading causes of death that has no cure, no prevention and no way to slow it down. They call this a disease with two deaths because the person is gone before they actually pass.

"Five years ago, statistics said every 68 seconds someone was diagnosed with Alzheimer's. Now it's every 65 seconds."

Mulkey agreed that the grieving is a multi-step process, "He was gone a long time ago before he physically died. It is like two deaths. You lose them earlier in the stages of Alzheimer's and then again when they are physically gone. The person you loved is no longer there. Their body is there, but their

Heritage Medical Clinic closing its doors

Heritage Medical Clinic, the walk-in practice serving Cassville for the past 12 years, is shutting its doors at the end of May. The clinic's owner and physician Dr. Mark Matthews, D.O., attributed declining numbers and rising expense to the decision to close.

Dr. Matthews said, "I want to thank my patients for their support through the years and through their friendship. I'm not leaving because of them, it's just that the environment of medicine is changing, and the paperwork to even keep a clinic running is becoming too expensive."

Dr. Matthews said he is not retiring, but he is moving into a career in occupational medicine, so he won't be able to continue to see his patients. His patients new physical or healthcare provider can request medical records be sent for their care to be transferred.

Dr. Matthews said that he's enjoyed his time at his Cassville practice, and he'll miss the people he sees. He shared, "We initially opened 12 years ago, and it was a different environment in medicine. We opened because we saw a need for the ability for patients to walk in to a clinic to be seen and not have to wait so long. It's really worked. I think the patients still to this day appreciate being able to come in and be seen that day.

"But now, it's become such an expensive endeavor even to get paid through insurance; it's just not working. The numbers of people we've seen are down 20 percent from last year. I hate to make it about money, but it really is."

He also said he plans to spend more time with his family with the clinic closing

Dr. Matthews concluded, "I'll miss the Cassville community terribly."

Dr. Matthews' clinic doors will be open until May 31. Heritage Medical Clinic is located at 101 Main Street, Suite 1. They can be reached at (417) 846-2277.

Dr. Matthews will continue to reside in Cassville.

Eureka Springs man allegedly flees stop, found with meth

A man from Eureka Springs, Ark., was arrested after blowing out three tires after Seligman Police put out stop sticks last week. According to affidavits of probable cause, a Seligman Police officer initiated a traffic stop and the driver, Jad Hector Perkins, 39, of Eureka Springs, Ark.,

refused to stop.

When officers attempted to pull Perkins over in Pea Ridge, Ark., he refused to stop. When Seligman officers initiated lights and sirens on April 11 on Highway 90, Perkins still refused to stop. Eventually, officers put down stop sticks, causing three tires to blow out on Perkins' vehicle.

According to officer reports, Perkins pulled into the oncoming traffic's lane, causing several vehicles to pull off the roadway.

When officers searched Perkins' vehicle, they allegedly found syringes filled with methamphetamine.

Perkins has been charged with resisting arrest by fleeing

causing serious risk of injury or death to any other person, possession of a controlled substance, unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia, and failure to stop at a stop line. He is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$15,000 cash-only bond.

Dr. Asbill said those findings are now going into summer planning for the upcoming school year. He said some of the suggestions will be seen in the upcoming 2018-2019 school year whereas others are more long-term goals.

"It's important to engage parents in conversations of where we are and where we are headed and where we need to be," Asbill stated.

"We've made some of the shift already just with our school calendar. We are embedding student data time within the school calendar. We are changing the way we are doing parent teacher conferences.

"We expect that we will approach many things differently. Some will be systematic differences and some won't be. We will still transport students and feed breakfast and lunch: those that are core to going to school, but there are some operation and instructional things that will have to change next year just from the feedback we got."







mind is gone."

Mulkey said she keeps going to the group even though her husband passed away because she feels that she can give to other people going through the process. She said, "I think it's helpful to the group to hear my experiences, and I found, when I first started going, that sharing with and hearing from the other caregivers is helpful. Mulkey also shares stories from a diary she kept while caring for her husband. "I have taken the diary to the support group and read a

few of the more pleasant or funny things that happened to show how the brain can be so off during all of it. It's interesting to see some of the things that my husband said or did."

Judy Capps, of Shell Knob, is another member of the support group. Capps' husband Les was diagnosed in 2013, and she has been attending the group for around a year.

She said she began attending the group after a friend suggested it. "I'm so glad that I started going. I've learned a lot about the disease.

"Everybody in the group

talks about their loved one for what they are going through. It's so comfortable there. It's like we've known each other a long, long time. Everyone is so supportive," Capps shared.

Capps continued, "The memories of the way it used to be is so sad. It's hard for me to look him in his eyes and not want to cry because I know he's not all there. That's the hardest part. I'm so glad I have the group to go to who understand."

House said the group isn't about her, but rather the people who benefit from it. It's clear that she cares

deeply about the people she is helping by keeping the group going. That sentiment is echoed by the people who attend the meetings.

Mulkey said, "Sheila is so passionate about the Alzheimer's patients and the caregivers. She was always telling me to take care of myself. When greeting me, she would ask how I was holding up instead of 'how are you'. She knew that I was under a lot of stress. I was sad and tired and worried."

Capps agreed. "Sheila is a god-send. What a super lady to host these down here. I have no family, but I have

lots of friends. So when Les was first diagnosed, it was kind of scary because I didn't know much about it. She has a lot of speakers and that helps," she said.

House's goal was to give people a support network so that they didn't feel so alone, and in the long-term, she wants people to start talking more openly about the disease. She said, "We've got to scream about Alzheimer's from the mountaintops. The spending on Alzheimer's will outspend the defense budget in the future. It's a crisis situation. We've got to talk about it and about the people going through it. It's hell. I've seen

She continued, never had to deal with it with a family member, but I've watched a number of people go through it with someone they love. It's devastating. I have a passion for the people going through this and for the people caring for them.

"I feel like that, through the group, people I've known have been able to receive some help, support and love, and have the opportunity to give that as well to others who are going through it."

Mulkey said, "I hope they continue with the support group for a long time because we have a nice group. Some have lost their loved ones and still continue to go. Each stage of Alzheimer's is different and we share those difference. Each person is different, but the Alzheimer's patients share the same symptoms.

"It was hard, but things could always be worse. It was good to have the support group."

House doesn't plan to slow down any time soon. She said, "I'm of the opinion that if people need this monthly, then I'm going to be there. If it's just two of us and they got benefit from it, it's worth it to me to do it."



and what we are doing.

"We have to be authentic enough to say that's a great idea, now this is how we are going to put that into place."

At the summary meeting, Asbill mentioned multiple times the move to ask questions about the school in a different way, and not cater to the average, but rather grow and change as society progresses. He said, "It'll look different, but we want them to be part of that because that's the next model of success for kids"

As far as specific examples for changes parents to see, the biggest immediate change will be a shift in parent-teacher conferences. "We do really well at involving parents in that they can come to music events, open houses, speech and debate and that thing.

"We don't do as well engaging parents in decision making and this is how we are going to start the year, continue the year and end the year with your child."

One proposed solution is a beginning of the year conference to set expectations of the school year and give parents a better understanding of what their child will be learning, then do other conferences to provide updates.

Dr. Asbill said, "We have to be progressive enough to stay in tune with developing our students to be college and career ready, but that also means to engage our parents in different conversations of what is different from when they were in school.

"That's going to be a shift for some educators: moving from what we are comfortable with to something that could be better and may require additional effort and work, which is important."

Asbill concluded, "We just want to apply the effort and expanding things and being a part of that." More meetings will continue to take place in the new school year as the school implements changes to the five areas discussed in committees.

MDC reports 33 CWD positives out of samples CMS names April Students of the Month

NONE OF THOSE CASES FOUND IN BARRY COUNTY

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) reports 33 new cases of chronic wasting disease (CWD) have been found following the testing of 24,486 free-ranging Missouri deer through its 2017-2018 sampling and testing efforts. None of the cases were found in Barry County samples.

The new cases were from the following counties: Adair (3), Cedar (1), Franklin (4), Jefferson (1), Linn (7), Macon (3), Perry (1), Polk (3), St. Clair (4), and Ste. Genevieve (6).

Of the 33 new cases, 16 were from hunter-harvested deer, one was from a road-killed deer, and 16 were from MDC's post-season targeted culling efforts in the immediate areas around where previous cases have been found.

This year's findings bring the total number of freeranging deer in Missouri confirmed to have CWD to 75. For more information, visit mdc.mo.gov/cwd under "CWD in Missouri."

"For a third year in a row, we found no CWD-positive deer in central Missouri, where a single case was confirmed in early 2015," said MDC Wildlife Disease Coordinator Jasmine Batten. "Additionally, we found no cases of CWD on the Missouri-Arkansas border, despite the high level of CWD in northwest Arkan-

Batten added that where CWD has been found in Missouri, the numbers of positives remain relatively low

"It is encouraging that cases of CWD are still pretty low overall, and MDC remains committed to monitoring the disease and taking actions to limit its spread," she said. "We encourage hunters and landowners to continue participating in our CWD monitoring and management efforts."

Batten added that these efforts are vital in limiting the spread of the disease.

"If we do nothing, areas affected by CWD will increase in size and many more deer will become infected by the disease," she explained. "Over time, this would lead to significant long-term population declines."

MDC will continue CWD sampling this fall and

MDC will again require mandatory sampling of deer harvested during the opening weekend of the fall firearms deer season, Nov. 10 and 11, in and around counties where the disease has been recently found. MDC will again also offer voluntary CWD sampling during the entire fall and winter hunting season of deer harvested in and around counties where the disease has been recently found.



More on targeted culling After the close of deer season, MDC staff work with landowners on a voluntary basis to cull additional

deer within an area of 1 to 5

miles of where recent cases of CWD have been found. Collecting additional samples helps MDC scientists better understand how many deer in the area may be infected and where they are in the area. Targeted culling also helps limit the spread of CWD by removing potentially infected deer from an

"Targeted culling has proven to be very useful in finding cases of CWD and in reducing the spread of the disease by removing additional CWD-infected animals," explained Batten. "We found about half of the new

CWD cases this year through targeted culling. Without targeted culling, those 16 infected deer would have continued to spread the dis-

She added that targeted culling is the only tested method of slowing the growth of CWD in a local deer population.

"The state of Illinois has been successful in stabilizing levels of CWD through the use of a sustained targeted culling program over many years," Batten said. "In contrast, states such as Wisconsin that have not used targeted culling, or that have

only implemented targeted culling for a short period of time, have seen levels of CWD climb steadily."

Of the more than 101,000 deer MDC has tested for CWD since 2001, about 4,500 have been harvested through targeted culling, including 1,485 from the past season.

"This accounts for about 4% of all CWD samples collected so far, but has resulted in finding about 49 percent of CWD cases in Missouri," Batten explained.


