Cassville's 7th Street bridge closed until reconstruction complete

DAMAGE SUSTAINED DURING HEAVY RAINS ACCELERATES PROJECT

Due to heavy rains over the weekend, the demolition phase of the 7th Street bridge in Cassville was bumped up to this week. City of Cassville employees began the process this week, according to city administrator Steve Walen-

The bridge was first damaged during the severe flooding in 2015 that led to a state of emergency in Barry County. Repairs were made to the bridge in the meantime while the city applied for FEMA assistance to fund a remediation effort to reconstruct the bridge in a way that

would prevent future Flat Creek flooding from damaging the bridge and taking it out of commission.

Walensky said, "The initial damage in 2015 came, and then we went through the process with FEMA. We finally got approved for our funding and have been working on redesign efforts, but that rain came and damaged it again, and that accelerated our demolition time table." He added that the city will not know when the bridge will be reopened until a construction bid is accepted at the May 8 City Council meeting.

The city's bid packets are

due tomorrow, Thursday, April 27. The bid request included a full reconstruction of the bridge, and 7th Street will be closed at that junction with Flat Creek until that work is complete.

Walensky said, "We are anticipating over \$30,000 to rebuild. That was the preliminary estimate." He added that the bid will determine how much of the bridge is paid for by FEMA.

All demolition efforts were completed by city employees. Walensky said that no additional damage in other areas has been reported from recent storms.

Arkansas man injured in Monett crash

A Gravette, Ark., man was injured in a three vehicle crash last week near Monett. According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol, Terry D. Willis, 54, of Gravette, Ark., was moderately injured when he was hit by two different vehicles.

The crash report states that 1998 Chevrolet Silverado driven by Willis was attempting to make a left turn at US 60 and Farm Road 1100, about a half a mile east of Monett. While trying to turn from westbound, a 2000 Pontiac Grand Am headed westbound, driven by Chance T. Nelson, 21, of Marionville, failed to yield and struck Willis. Then, a 2004 Toyota Tundra, driven by Charles P. Horner, 50, of Purdy, hit Willis from behind.

Willis was transported to Mercy Hospital in Joplin via ambulance for moderate injuries. The other two drivers had no reported injuries at the time of the crash. All three drivers were wearing seat belts at the time of the crash.

All three vehicles suffered extensive damage and were towed from the scene by Thomas Towing, of Monett.

Southwest High School writers near 1 million word goal

At the beginning of the school year, English and college composition classes under the instruction of Southwest teacher Steve Voyak began a journaling project. Each class period, they began class with a journal and spent eight minutes or so writing. They set out with a goal: to write a million words between all 80 students by the end of the year. As the school year rapidly approaches the end, they are getting closer and closer to that goal, racking up 844,365 words as of the time of press.

Voyak said, "We started with one journal per day, and eventually we started building volume. We've done journaling in the past, but it's always been sporadic. This year, we've been really committed to it."

He added that the school's block scheduling makes this project much easier. Their class periods are 94 minutes. As the year has progressed, they've upped their journals to two per class period and they spend approximately 15 minutes writing before the rest of their lessons.

To add incentive, Voyak made a spreadsheet on the white board in his classroom with students listed by class, their current totals and averages. He also keeps the total for all classes up.

"One million words was the pipe dream at the beginning, but we didn't think it would happen. The kids have really dedicated themselves to it."

In addition to meeting the goal, Voyak said he has seen improvements in the students' work because of the extra writing. "It's helped a little with their writing in that they aren't scared of the volume of

"It really helps with confidence, and to an extent, it's cathartic. Writing really helps you deal with what you're going through.

"I think it's been beneficial to them. Just the act of writing about things if you are having a tough time; you work through those tough things in the journals."

Voyak gives the students the prompts to write



Barry County's annual 4-H banquet was a big success this year and ensures the group will have scholarships for the upcoming year. Marissa Tucker, 4-H youth program assistant, said the annual event raised around \$2,000 for the program.

Barry County has three 4-H programs currently, with another couple in the works in the Cassville area. Right now, there are the Exeter Trailblazers, the Purdy Screeching Eagles and the Wheaton Wranglers. Funds raised at the annual banquet go to reimburse members up to half the cost of trips throughout the year. Tucker said, "The operating cost sort of varies depending on what trips the members go on, but if we go by last year's reimbursements, we'll definitely have enough to reimburse our members." There are approximately 40 members in Barry County.

The banquet this year was held at the Family Life Center in Cassville and featured both a silent and live auction as well as a meal and special guest speaker Scott Fitzpatrick. Route 76 delays expected during repaving effort

Drivers can expect one-lane traffic and occasional traffic delays when a project to resurface and widen Missouri Route 76 in Barry County begins the week of April 24, the Missouri Department of Transportation said.

Route 76 will receive a new driving surface and the roadway will be widened to include two-foot wide shoulders with edgeline rumble strips.

The work will take place along a 21-mile stretch of Route 76 between County Road 2182 and a point north of Fifth Street in Cassville and between Missouri Route 112 to Flat Creek Road and the Barry/

Stone county line.

Drivers can expect flaggers on the road and pilot cars directing them through the work zone. Drivers should wait for the pilot vehicle before proceeding through the work zone or before entering the work zone from a side road.

Signs and message boards will alert drivers to the work zone.

All lanes of traffic will be open during nighttime

Weather and/or construction delays will alter the work schedule.





about during each class period, but he tries to vary it. Sometimes it's related to something they are reading, like Homer's The Odyssey. Other times it's about current events, such as the election in November. But often, the students can use it as a personal outlet to talk about things that are bothering them.

Voyak said he doesn't read every journal they write, instead he skims them to see that they are completing the projects and not just copying and pasting things. "It is a bit private, so I don't read every single word, but I check to see that they are doing the assignment."

He said that the goal has helped keep them motivated. In early April, they participated in a special writing day, and that really added to their count.

Voyak said, "We also

participated in National Journal Writing Day, which was April 5 and 6, depending on what class they were in. They had to produce the prompts and write the entire class period on those days. They then had to write from the prompts the students created and choose four to eight of them. Different classes had different goals, like seniors were 1,250-1,500 words in a journal, but freshman were 1,000 words."

He added, "The kids were looking forward to it and really enjoyed it."

Some students were willing to share some of the things they wrote in journals this year as examples. Hannah Brown, a senior, wrote about beauty standards in society: "Beauty is a skewed idea in our society. We all fight to be what we perceive as beautiful out-

wardly, but our standards are constantly changing. The problem in our society, perhaps is not so much to what lengths we will go for beauty, but why we set such unrealistic standards of beauty."

Another senior, Skylor Rausa, wrote, "Can a teenager love? How do we define love, is it a heart? If I were to tear open my chest, would I find it there, if you were to bash in my skull would my heart lie inside?"

This year is nearing the end, and while the students may not hit the one million goal, they've put the effort into it. Voyak said, "We have the goal, and then when I really added up the word counts, we realized that we may pull this off. I don't know if we'll get there, but they are trying."







Seligman Police Department's youth alcohol enforcement campaign joins national crackdown to reduce drunk driving fatalities

'DRIVE SOBER OR GET PULLED OVER' CAMPAIGN WILL TARGET SUBSTANCE-IMPAIRED DRIVERS

Local and state law enforcement will be out in full force as part of the annual nationwide May/Youth Alcohol Enforcement Crackdown "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over" substance – impaired driving crackdown. The crackdown, which will include high-visibility enforcement throughout Seligman, will run from May 4 through 15, 2017.

Seligman Police Department officers will be aggressively looking out for substance-impaired drivers during the crackdown and will arrest anyone caught driving impaired. Although it is illegal in all 50 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico to drive impaired (having a blood alcohol concentration of .08 or higher), far too many people across the nation get behind the wheel after consuming alcohol or other illegal drugs. The latest statistics from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration underscore the serious nature of the nation's continuing drunk driving epidemic.

"Every year, about one third of all motor vehicle traffic deaths involve one or more substance-impaired drivers or motorcycle operators," said

Call: 417-858-0334 417-342-0947 Chief Terry Burgess. "In 2016, 196 people were killed and 652 seriously injured on Missouri's roadways in crashes that involved at least one substance-impaired driver." That works out to approximately one substance-impaired driver involved fatality every two days.

Chief Burgess added the Cinco de Mayo holiday is particularly dangerous. During the Youth Alcohol Enforcement Campaign May 5 through 16, 2016, 10 people were seriously injured involving at least one substance-impaired driver that was under 21 years of age.

Research has shown that high-visibility enforcement like the 'Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over' campaign reduces substance-impaired driving fatalities by as much as 20 percent. By joining this nationwide effort, we will make Seligman's roadways safer for everyone throughout the holiday," said Chief Burgess.

"We want to remind everyone that getting behind the
wheel impaired is a terrible
idea. Unfortunately, not only
does being under the influence
impair your ability to operate
a vehicle safely, it also impairs
your judgment and good sense
about whether you can, or
should, drive. If you have any
doubt about your sobriety, do
not get behind the wheel. If you

Chief Burgess noted that being arrested for driving under the influence of any substance brings a wide range of negative consequences into one's life. Substance-impaired drivers face jail time, loss of their driver licenses, and steep financial consequences such as higher insurance rates, attorney fees, court costs, lost time at work, and the potential loss of their job. When family, friends and co-workers find out, viola-

tors also often face tremendous personal embarrassment.

"Driving while impaired is simply not worth the risk. So don't take the chance. Remember, we will be out in force and we will be watching, so 'Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over," said Chief Burgess.

REMEMBERING FORMER SEN. EMORY MELTON

Last week, my colleagues and I paused to take time out from the normal course of business in the Missouri Senate to honor former senators who have passed away over the last few years. This was an opportunity to celebrate their lives, legacies and records of public service with their families and loved ones. Among those honored was one of my predecessors in the Missouri Senate from the 29th District, Sen. Emory

Senator Melton was born in McDowell, in 1923, and was a life-long resident of Barry County. His love of Barry County and southwest Missouri as a whole was evident to anyone who met him. He was a student and writer of history, chronicling the history of his hometown, Cassville, in his book, "The First 150 Years in Cassville, Missouri," and was commonly known as the authority on all things related

to Barry County history. Senator Melton was no stranger to hard work and perseverance. After graduating from Verona High School, he hitchhiked his way to Columbia, where he enrolled in the Law School at the University of Missouri. While there, he swept floors, worked in the hospital's kitchen and slept in boiler rooms to make ends meet. Returning to Barry County, he began a career practicing law that would last over six decades until his passing in December 2015. He and his wife, Jean, were owners of Litho Printers and the Barry County Advertiser, both of which are still in operation today. They also owned the Crane Chronicle/Stone County Republican newspaper and were partners in the Barry County Abstract Company and former owners of the Cassville Republican

Perhaps what Sen. Melton

is most remembered for is his time serving in the Missouri State Senate. First elected in 1972, his career in the Senate lasted 24 years, until he termed out of office in 1996. Emory was among the Senate's most revered and beloved members, making friends on both sides of the aisle and gaining both respect for his intellect and fear of his knowledge and ability to debate. Nearly every time Sen. Melton is mentioned in the Capitol, the first thing I hear is "Emory read every one of the bills and knew most of them better than the sponsoring senator did." I heard stories about his use of humor and story-telling on the Senate floor to make a point or disarm a political opponent. I heard stories about his tireless campaigning across the district (which was a lot bigger back in his day), that he would stay overnight anywhere he could find so he could get up bright and early the next morning and knock on someone's door and tell them how hard he would work for them in the State Capitol. One of my favorite stories about Emory is one where he was so adamant in talking to every potential voter he could that he once removed his shoes and socks, hiked up his pant legs and waded across a creek to reach a farmer working on the other side. I heard a lot of stories about Emory this past week. Some of them I had heard and some I hadn't, but all of them had one thing in common: tremendous respect for Emory and his service to this

When I first considered running for public office, Emory was one of the first people I went to for advice. His counsel was invaluable and I got the feeling that neither I nor those that came before or that will come after me in the 29th District Senate seat could fully fill his shoes. Even in his twilight years, he would call my office every few weeks to request a copy of a Senate or House bill or to see if a new set of statutes was available or to offer advice about an issue or bill before the Legislature.

During this memorial service, all those senators honored had their names called on the Senate floor one more time. It was my pleasure and great honor to answer for Sen. Melton when his name was called. I am confident this won't be the last time Emory Melton's name is mentioned in the halls of the Capitol or in the Barry County Courthouse or on the streets of Cassville or any other town in the 29th District. His legacy lives on and those of who had the privilege of knowing him and learning from him don't know who lucky we are.





It wasn't a shutout this time, but Purdy's 21-4 domination of Southwest on the tiny field at Washburn gave the Lady Eagles a 3-0 regular season sweep of their Ozark 7 rival with district play just a week away.

Purdy improved to a stellar 19-1 with the victory, leaving one to wonder how in the world they lost that one game to Strafford. Twelve of the 19 wins were shutouts, several achieved in brutal fashion. Scores of 14-0, 15-0, 20-0, and 28-0 litter the Purdy scorebook. It has been an impressive season so far.

The Purdy domination of this conference rivalry has been tough to swallow for a proud group of Southwest girls. The Lady Trojans are a solid team, but haven't been able to play at the same level as the Lady Eagles.

Tuesday night, both teams came out swinging. Literally. It's always a good strategy to be aggressive at the plate when playing at Washburn, where the outfield fence invites home runs from 190 feet away. The short porch on the left field foul line is even closer.

Purdy struck for three runs in the top of the first inning. Rion Boyd stroked an RBI double to open the scoring, and Sami House knocked in two more runs as Purdy claimed a 3-0 lead with the two-out rally.

Southwest went in order



in the bottom of the inning, but Maggie Robbins held the Lady Eagles to a rare scoreless frame in the top of the second. Likewise, Hallie Henderson mowed down the Lady Trojans in the home half of the inning.

Purdy again went scoreless in the third, and then Southwest pushed a run across for their first score this season against the Lady Eagles. That run came courtesy of three walks and a hit batsman by Henderson, but it counted. After three innings, the Lady Trojans were within hailing distance at 3-1.

But Robbins returned the favor in the next frame, walking the bases full of Eagles. Then Zoe Brown laced an RBI single to up the lead to 4-1.

Heather Windes led off the Southwest half of the fourth with a shot over the center field fence. Her windaided solo blast cut the lead to 4-2. The home crowd came to life, sensing a monumental upset.

It was not to be.

Robbins, who left the mound against Sarcoxie on Monday night after taking a line drive off the shin, struggled to find the strike zone. Determined but disciplined, the Purdy batters took pitch after pitch and were rewarded with three free baserunners with no outs. Freshman outfielder Kylie Wood stepped to the plate and ripped a 2-2 pitch over the fence in right center for a grand slam.

Although Southwest would score twice more via home runs by Taylor Swindle and Windes - her second of the game - the Lady Trojans could not keep pace with the Purdy scoring machine.

Purdy led 13-3 after adding 5 runs in the sixth. Only Windes' second dinger kept the game from being shortened. The Lady Eagles then batted around in the top of the seventh and scored 8 more after Windes came on to pitch in relief of Robbins.

Purdy will open district play at Clever on Monday at 4:30 PM when they square off against winless Verona. Next, Exeter will play Wheaton at 6 PM. Southwest plays Marionville at 6 PM on Tuesday.

The District 10 semifinals will be contested on Wednesday, with the championship game at 6 PM on Thursday.





There is an old saying: "You can tell what kind of a stock man a person is by looking at the behavior of his cattle." Although many factors can impact cattle behavior, the handling facilities is the easiest and quickest way to make working cattle much easier and safer.

"Effective beef livestock working facilities are unique to each producer," said Zulovich. "One must

consider a host of things before determining the best facility such as: the objective, times of year being used, number of head being worked and topography of the site."

The facility should make working cattle both easier on you and more profitable. For those who utilize artificial insemination, they will likely experience improved conception rates with low stress handling around insemination. For market animals, a large loin bruise generates a significant economic loss to that animal. Improved handling facilities may help prevent







Hummingbirds begin to come back to Missouri

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) encourages people to discover nature this spring by learning about the ruby-throated hummingbird. Missourians will begin seeing these hummingbirds in April as the tiny long-distance fliers return to the state as part of their spring migration from Mexico and Central Ameri-

"Hummingbirds be arriving soon and a few have already been spotted in southern Missouri," said MDC State Ornithologist Sarah Kendrick. "It's time to put out feeders! Their numbers will increase throughout the month of April."

Kendrick noted hummingbirds.net is a fun and useful website to see when and where hummingbirds are migrating. The rubyhummingbird throated migration map shows locations where the birds have already been spotted this year as they migrate northward into the US and Canada. The website allows visitors to help out by submitting dates and exact locations of hummingbird sightings.

Just like most birds, hummingbirds typically migrate south in early fall and migrate back north in the spring.

"Hummingbirds arrive in Missouri in April and May to nest and raise their young. They then make their fall southward migration in mid-August with most leaving by early October," Kendrick said. "A few birds overwinter in extreme southern coastal states, but most overwinter from southern Mexico to Costa Rica. During migration, these tiny birds fly nonstop for 600 miles from the Gulf Coast of the U.S. to the Yucatan Peninsula over the Gulf of Mexico and then back on their return trips. They often lose half their body weight during this 24-hour flight."

Early spring arrivals rely on sap oozing from sapsucker-drilled holes and insects for food. With warmer weather, they soon switch to eating nectar from many different kinds of flowers later in spring. This gives them energy needed to catch insects all day long to feed their young.

Hummingbirds are more than just a delight to watch zipping around at your feeder, they also play a very important part in our ecosystem.

"Hummingbirds important pollinators for many plants that require a long-billed pollinator," Kendrick said. "And because of their small size, hummingbirds can end up as food for predators such as large insects, spiders, other birds, and frogs."

Hummingbirds are found across Missouri throughout the summer and can be seen around nectar feeders outside homes and in parks and gardens. Hummingbirds nest in wooded areas on small tree branches 10-20 feet up, and are frequently observed near forests and streams.
