Volunteers step up to help locate lost hunter over weekend

Multiple law enforcement agencies and first responders' located a local man lost while hunting on Friday. According to a press release by Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly, William Adams, 73, got lost while bow hunting on Friday and was not located until Saturday around 11 a.m.

According to a press release from Epperly, Adams was bow hunting on State Highway M when he got lost. His truck was found in a field near the intersection of State Highway M and Rock Creek Road. K-9 units from both Carroll County, Ark., and Joplin were on scene to help search for Adams. One K-9 unit followed his trail from the truck, but lost the trail.

Searchers from the Barry County Sheriff's Department, Central Crossing Fire Department, Eagle Rock-Golden-Fire Department, the Missouri Conservation Department and other volunteers banded together to find Adams.

The search began on Friday, October 14, around 5 p.m. and continued until around 3 a.m. on Saturday morning

when the search was called off for fear of search and rescue getting lost. Barry County E9-1-1 attempted to PING Adam's location through his cell phone before the battery died, as well as asking him where he was and attempting to locate him that way. However, their efforts were unsuccessful the first day of the

The search resumed on Saturday morning around 5 a.m. where ATVs, K-9 units, horseback riders and many on foot continued to search for Adams. He was eventually found around 11 a.m. on Saturday morning, October 15, close to Turkey Mountain One in Shell Knob on Mossy Oak's property on Farm Road 1230 by Eagle Rock-Golden-Mano Fire Department personnel.

Epperly reported that Adams was in good condition considering the circumstances. Adams was transported by ambulance, but reportedly was only dehydrated.

Epperly said, "I am glad to live in a great community where everyone comes out in times like this to help other

Barry County Museum opens new exhibit preserving Sen. Melton's office

Walking into a new exhibit in the Barry County Museum is like walking right into longterm Barry County attorney Senator Emory Melton's office with the completion of their newest exhibit. The display features his desk, many possessions, awards and personal belongings that made Melton's office memorable for so many who visited what he called "the people's office" over his 72 years as a Barry County attorney.

Melton was an asset to Barry County, a legend who will live on in the memories of many who were touched by his wisdom and dedication over his life and career. Melton's son, Stan, and Stan's wife, Cindy, opted to give the desk and many of his personal possessions, framed awards and acknowledgements to the museum on long-term loan to preserve his legacy.

Barry County Museum director Kathy White said, "We asked Stan if it would be possible after his father passed away if the museum

could have some things from his office so we could memorialize him, because he was such an important member of the community. And Stan and Cindy were very gracious and said we could have as much as we would like."

Stan said, "The contributions to Cassville and Barry County history made by my father were incredible and the museum approached us about doing an exhibit of his office and we were just overjoyed about the opportunity to preserve dad's office in a form that people could enjoy and get to see what he had done."

Melton's office had a lasting impact on people when they visited. His office faced 9th Street in Cassville, and appointments were not usually necessary since he was there seven days a week. Being a prominent republican in the Missouri Senate for 24 years, people visiting often gifted him with a GOP mascot, the elephant. Hundreds of elephants lined the tables and

shelves in Melton's office.

White stated, "I've always felt that office was very sacred. I know how I felt when I was in the office talking to him. He was such an overpowering individual, and I wanted that to be represented in the museum."

The large desk, while always cluttered with notes, had newspaper clippings, pictures and political cartoons under the glass, adding a personal touch.

Even Stan said the similarities between the display and his father's office were striking. "It's incredible. Getting the red piece of carpet down in there really made a big difference. They even have the cartoons he had up in his office."

Down to the section of car pet carefully cut and removed from Emory's office, the details are there, making you feel like you're back waiting to visit with him.

White said, "We wanted it to be that when people walked in, they were in a different place. We wanted it to be like they could feel his presence. Because there have been many, many people in this community that have walked through that office.

"I cannot tell you how many people, when they come in to visit, ask if Emory's display is ready. A lot of positive has come from it and when we tell them it is almost complete and take them back to it, they are overwhelmed. It was very well received."

Stan said, "We were thrilled to see the interest the museum expressed and to have that preserved for everyone to enjoy dad's contributions at the museum."

White noted that there is still work to be done on the exhibit, and they'll continue adding to it and tweaking it. "We're not done yet. We're still putting things together and putting as much up as we can because there is so much. But we want as much as we can in the room itself, but there will be panels outside the room as

City of Cassville clean-up days scheduled

The City of Cassville's annual fall clean-up will be held November 7 through November 11. Republic Services will accept additional household waste and large items on regular collection days.

The following items will be accepted at the curb: barbecue grills; patio furniture; outdoor furniture; sofas; dressers; loveseats; recliners; desks; televisions; bundled guttering; beds, including hide-a-beds, mattresses and box springs; wood pallets; waste from small remodeling or wood projects, materials must be cut into four-foot sections and stacked; sinks; toilets; cabinets; vanities; carpet that is cut into four-foot lengths and bundled; fencing that is cut into four-foot lengths; and bicycles.

Republic Services will not accept tires, yard waste, large quantities of ash, dead animals, raw sewage, waste oil, hazardous materials, wet paint containers, chemicals, flammable substances, lead or acid batteries or waste from large remodeling or construction projects.

They are again offering options this year for Cassville residents who want to dispose of large appliances and metal.

One option will be to take only metal or large appliances to a dumpster located at 503 Mill Street. This is across the street from the Barry County Sheriff's Office. This option is free.

The other option will be to have Cassville residents set at their curb side large appliances for Republic Services to collect. There is a \$15 fee. Residents must pay the fee to Republic Services in order to schedule the pickup of the appliance. The following large appliances will be accepted after the \$15 fee has been paid: dishwashers; washing machines; dryers; hot water heaters; and stoves. Republic Services will also accept refrigerators, freezers and air conditioners that display a tag from a licensed technician proving that all freon has been removed from the item.

Yard waste will be accepted as normal at the Yard Waste facility behind the Cassville Aquatic Park.

make the display the best we can do. They were so good to us to do that. We really appreciate that."


The display at the museum

Speer's early days of repair included mowers, tractors, even some combines. By the time he was ten, he had graduated to working outside of his family's farm. Under the direction of Kenny Bishop of Bishop Sales and Service, in Exeter, Speer spent summers learning mower, trimmer and chain saw repair.

Speer said Bishop's influence had a lasting effect on his skills, which led him to open his own shop. "Kenny took me to another place with knowledge. He really helped me grow. I was better able to diagnose just by listening to the unit."

He added, "He was such a good mentor. He taught me so much."

With the knowledge and the work ethic already there, Speer said it was the encouragement of his wife, Samantha, that was the final push to open his own place.

He said, "There really is a need here for it, and I've been busy, to say the least."

Now, Speer's shop is insured and he will pick up and deliver equipment within a 10-mile radius. Everything from mowers, trimmers, chain saws and ATV's to anything with a small engine like a golf cart, dirt bike or generator, Speer will take it and fix it with as quick a turn-around as he

Speer added, "It might take me a day to get a part, but I try

to get things back to people as soon as I possibly can."

He said, "We stand behind our work and guarantee quality service."

Barry County courts send 8 to prison in the month of September

• Richard H. Bastura, of Shell Knob, pled guilty to child molestation in the first degree. Bastura was sentenced to five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

Bastura's charges originated from an arrest in 2015. Over a period of six and a half years, Bastura molested a child who was 8 years old when the abuse started. The victim was 14 years old when the charges were filed. Bastura touched her and made her touch him inappropriately. Bastura was in his 50s when the abuse started.

- Tiffany Brooke Davis, of Vandalia, made an Alford plea to possession of a controlled substance earlier this year. Davis' probation has since been revoked and she is to serve five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.
- Bobby G. Elliot, of Carterville, pled guilty to theft/ stealing of \$500 to \$25,000. Elliot received a suspended imposition of sentencing and two years unsupervised proba-

Elliot was arrested after stealing headphones and multiple tvs from the Monett Walmart in May 2013.

Elliot is to serve probation until September 19, 2018.

• Kevin Van Granger pled guilty to three counts of forgery, two counts of tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree and knowingly burning or exploding a vehicle. Granger was sentenced to seven years incarceration with the execution of that sentenced suspended and five years supervised probation.

Granger's charges originated from three separate incidents. On January 7, 2016, Granger used stolen checks at Race Brothers. Granger forged the name on the check in the amount of \$306.28. Then, on January 27, 2016, charges were filed regarding four vehicles that Granger set fire to and destroyed as well as stealing wrestling equipment, a pocket knife, video camera, clothing, tool set and more. On March 17, 2016, Granger wrote another stolen check to Casey's, which was on camera.

Granger is to serve proban until September 21, 2021.

• James Robert Harper, of Monett, made an Alford plea to property damage in the first degree in 2011. Harper's probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On June 18, 2009, Harper spray painted "Wash Me" on a vehicle in blue spray paint. Harper admitted to spray painting the car.

• James E. Hooper, of Wheaton, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and burglary in the second degree. Hooper received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On March 31, 2016, the Barry County Sheriff's Department served a search warrant on Hooper's residence where they found drug paraphernalia, loaded syringes, Sudafed, scales, and more, which appeared to be for distribution.

On March 5, 2016, Hooper agreed to be the lookout for a burglary at Cassville Bowl. Hooper was given coins stolen from machines and money bags in the office.

Hooper is to serve probation until September 19, 2021.

• Heth A. Johnson, of Seligman, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance in December 2013. Since then, Johnson's probation has been revoked. Johnson is to serve 120 days of shock incarceration of a seven year sentence.

In August 2012, Johnson was found to have methamphetamine, drug paraphernalia, marijuana and marijuana paraphernalia.

• Darryl Eugene Lands, of Monett, pled guilty to endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree, burglary in the second degree and theft/ stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in 2015. Lands' probation has since been revoked, and he is to serve 120 days shock incarceration of the five year incarceration sentence.

On April 16, 2013, Lands grabbed a 12-year-old child by the neck and threw him into a wall head first and then drug him outside by the neck and placed him in a choke hold.

On March 5, 2015, Lands forced entry into a home in Aurora. Then Lands stole a laptop, XBox, DVDs, clothing, a television and cable box and a tablet. Purdy Police Chief Jackie Lowe found the items being carried by the burglars after the crime.

On April 12, 2016, Lopez was confronted by the Monett Police Department for wandering in the roadway, trying to hit cars with a stick. He had self-inflicted wounds on his arms. Officers detained him to prevent him from engaging in anymore self-harm. Police and fire fighters were injured during his refusal to be detained.

Olbertz is to serve proba-

Golden to host annual chili supper to preserve historic building

Golden has a rich history and is still a vibrant community today. Many people work together each year to maintain their historic community building, erected in 1939. Their upcoming chili and soup supper is just one of many fundraisers that keeps the building preserved.

Missouri became a state in 1821 and, as early as

1828, people moved into the Golden area, which is where the town's story begins. Jacob Hickum was one of the first settlers, building a home between the White and Kings

The area became known as Hickum Prairie. In May 1841, White River Township was established starting at the Missouri/Arkansas line east of John Roller's farm and running north to Henry Pendergraft's farm to the J.L. Davis Mill and on to the Taney County line. Jacob Hickum and Mira Jackson were elected Justices of the Peace on June 1, 1841, in the first recorded election in what is now Golden.

John Leland migrated to the area after the Civil War ended and settled on the Golden Ford on White River establishing the first trading post and post office. Leland named it Golden. In 1862, the government issued a land grant to John Wesley Roberts where Golden is now located. Here, the community school building was erected. The first grist mill was built and operated by Mr. Slusher at a spring on Owl Creek. Later, another grist mill was built west of Golden on Owl Creek by Wat Carney. The first ferry boat on White River was built and operated by Mr. Pilkerton and was called Golden Ferry. In 1906, the First Baptist Church and the Christian Church were organized.

Unfortunately, a tornado destroyed Golden, which consisted of three large general stores, a drug store, post

office, barber shop, blacksmith shop, two churches, a school and several residences on April 29, 1929. However, the community banded together and rebuilt their

The first government highway was built in January 1936 with electricity coming to the community in 1940 through REA. The first school of any record was a log school built about two miles north of Golden called Hickum Prairie School around 1879 with the present four room school built in 1939 by WPA, which consisted of five classrooms and an auditorium which is now the community build-

The Golden Community Club was organized in 1957 to promote the area because the Table Rock Dam was being built, which would cover many of the old homesteads and Indian burial grounds.

Golden Circle Shores developed with new community sites and private coves for boat docks. Golden has grown and evolved with the times moving from a pioneer farming community to a thriving lake area for families and tourists. The strength and

stamina cannot by forgotten, and today, the Golden Circle Shores Association strives to maintain their heritage. They work diligently to keep the old community building in good repair.

This old WPA building needs lot of TLC, which costs money. This group meets monthly and has various activities to fund the maintenance of this historical landmark. The group has quilt raffles, fish fries, and of course, the annual Fiddlers' Contest, which actually started in

On October 28, they will continue the tradition of hosting their annual chili and soup supper from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. Meals cost \$7 and pie is \$2. Through fundraisers like these, the landmark can be preserved for yeas to come.

tion until September 12, 2021.

• Austin Tanner Rettman, of Cassville, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance in 2014. Rettman was granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and probation at that time. Since, Rettman's probation has been revoked, and he was sentenced to four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections with the execution of that sentence suspended and five years supervised probation.

On March 2, 2013, Rettman was arrested following an incident reported by the Missouri State Highway Patrol. The person driving the car was pulled over for a driving infraction, and Rettman was in possession of marijuana and a pill.

Rettman is to serve probation until September 21, 2021.

• Salmon Mata Rincon, of Hollister, pled guilty to leaving the scene of an accident in 2014. Rincon was initially granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and probation. Rincon's probation has since been revoked, and he was sentenced to four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections with the execution of that sentence suspended. Rincon is also sentenced to five years supervised probation.

Rincon's charges originated in June 2012, when the Monett Police Department was responding to the scene of a vehicle crash. Rincon left the scene of the accident and was found in the Walmart parking lot. Upon arrest, Rincon admitted to have been drinking earlier. His blood alcohol level was 0.234 percent.

Rincon is to serve probation until September 19, 2021.

• Ronald V. Roetto, of Monett, pled guilty to tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree and assault in the second degree. Roetto was granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

Roetto's charges originated in August 2014. Roetto was driving a truck when someone was following him too closely. Roetto flipped the other driver off, and the driver behind him returned the gesture. Then, Roetto got out of the truck and went up to the driver with a wood splitting maul in his hand. Roetto is to serve probation until September 19, 2021.

Since, Sooter's probation has since been revoked and she is to serve 120 days shock incarceration as part of a four year incarceration sentence.

Hospital staff claimed the parent's description of the injury was suspicious and called the Child Abuse Hotline. Wilson, the girl's mother, claimed she did not know what happened to the girl's leg. Wilson is to serve probation until September 19, 2021.



Cassville blocks Mt. Vernon upset bid, 30-29

September 1, 2007, I was sitting in the east bleachers at Razorback Stadium, enjoying the Hogs' seasonopening win over Troy. Suddenly, the crowd erupted and the stadium shook. Fans pointed at the scoreboard and screamed. Appalachian State had just beaten Michigan, 34-32, in the greatest upset in the history of college

Back home, I watched replays of the game and especially of the miraculous, game-saving field goal block by A-State's Corey Lynch on the game's final play, and I thought, "I will never see another game like this. Ever."

I was wrong.

On Friday night, the Cassville Wildcats pulled off an improbable comeback victory at Wildcat Stadium, turning back a strong Mt. Vernon team, 30-29. With just four seconds left in the game, Mt. Vernon's chip-shot field goal for the win died when a high snap and a low kick became a part of Cassville football lore. Jayden Buttram's desperate attempt was swallowed by the defensive surge led by Devin Phelps, and the jubilant Wildcats raced to midfield in celebration as the clock expired.

It was a fitting end to a crazy game.

The Wildcats took the opening kickoff and drove to the Mt. Vernon 13-yard line, thanks to a 42-yard slant from Shannon Haney to DJ White. But Haney dropped the ball in the backfield, and Buttram scooped it up at the 20-yard line and raced untouched for the game's first score. The PAT gave Mt. Vernon a 7-0 lead with 7:56 left in the first quarter.

Tne Wildcats were flagged on the ensuing kickoff, then Haney was sacked before throwing back-to-back incompletions. River Phelps lined up to punt on 4th and 13 at his own 13-yard line.

Lance Parnell lacks the riverboat gambler reputation, but his fake punt call with the Wildcats pinned deep in their own territory was simply brilliant. Phelps hesitated in the backfield, then headed up the sideline behind a convoy of blockers for a first down.

That play sparked the Wildcats to a 17-play, 84-yard scoring drive. Gilbert Medina powered in from 10 yards out, and Phelps added the PAT for a 7-7 tie with 1:13 left in the quarter.

After a Mt. Vernon threeand-out possession, Cassville fashioned a 10-play, 85-yard drive for the go-ahead score. Phelps burst through the line for a 14-yard touchdown, and his second PAT gave the 'Cats a 14-7 lead midway through the second quarter.

Then the Mountaineers opened up their passing game, and Garrett Hadlock completed 6 of 8 throws on the next drive. Hadlock found Jarrett Massie open for a 12-yard touchdown pass, and then Sammy Robinson ran in for a 2-point conversion to give Mt. Vernon a 15-14 lead with 3:14 left in

Going for two that early in the game served notice that Mt. Vernon would leave no stone unturned in their quest for a victory.

Starting at their own 25-yard line after the kickoff, the Wildcats drove down the field, desperately racing the clock. With no timeouts remaining, Haney flipped a screen pass to Phelps for a 16-yard gain to the Mt. Vernon 20-yard line, then spiked the ball to kill the clock with 5 seconds remaining.

Mt. Vernon's Tom Cox burned his timeouts trying to ice the Cassville field goal unit, but Phelps split the sticks with a 37-yard kick, and the Wildcats took a 17-15 halftime lead.

The half-ending drive was another great example of clock management by the Wildcats and their coaching

But Mt. Vernon would not go away. Robinson's kickoff return to midfield set up a 4-play scoring drive, as Hadlock hooked up with Andrew Mountemayor for a 31-yard touchdown strike. 2-point try failed though, and Mt. Vernon led, 21-17.

Cassville stormed back with its ground game, and Haney ran in from two yards out to cap a 13-play, 63-yard drive. The PAT failed, but the Wildcats reclaimed the lead at 23-21 with 3:33 left in the third quarter.

Mt. Vernon went three and out. Then, Cassville went three and out as the quarter

On the second play of the final quarter, Hadlock hit Mountemayor down the right sideline for an 83-yard score that silenced the Cassville crowd. Hadlock kept off right tackle for a successful 2-point conversion, and Mt. Vernon held a 29-23 lead with 11:42 to play.

Another special teams penalty saw the ball marked at the Cassville 8-yard line. But there was plenty of time left and no panic on the Cassville sideline. Haney directed the Wildcats to a 92-yard scoring drive in 10 plays, never throwing on the drive. Instead, the Cassville offensive line took over the game, opening huge holes for Phelps, Haney, and Steven Hunter. Haney scored out of the wishbone on third-andgoal from the Mt. Vernon one-yard line, and Phelps stroked the PAT to give Cassville a 30-29 lead with 7:21 left.

Mt. Vernon suffered through another three-andout and punted. The Wildcats bled another three and a half minutes off the clock, but had to punt. The Mountaineers took over at their own 26-yard line with 2:54 remaining.

2:54 remaining

Hadlock threw incomplete twice and faced a fourth down at his own 29-yard line. Massie came up with a clutch catch to move the chains. Hadlock found Mountemayor for another 13 yards, then tossed to him again for a short gain to the Cassville 42-yard line.

1:09 remaining

On third down, Haddock rifled a pass to Massie for 11 yards. Then Robinson gained 4 yards on a draw play to the Cassville 31-yard line.

Mountemayor came up with another grab at the Cassville 16-yard line, and then Hadlock spiked the ball to kill the clock.

28 seconds remaining

Hadlock gunned a quick 5-yarder to Mountemayor, and Mt. Vernon called timeout. A third down throw was too tall for Massie in the back of the end zone, and the Mountaineers sent in the field goal unit.

16 seconds remaining

The anxious Cassville defense jumped offsides, and suddenly, Buttram's 28-yard field goal distance shrank to 23. Mt. Vernon gambled, and ran a draw with Robinson, but he was stopped for no gain at the Cassville 6-yard line. The Mountaineers called for time with less than 5 seconds remaining.

4.7 seconds remaining

The field goal unit returned, and Lance Parnell spent all his timeouts to ice the Mt. Vernon kicking team. But then the Cassville defense jumped offsides again, and the ball was spotted at the standard PAT line, for a 20-yard chip shot.

A bad snap, a panicked hold, and a desperate field goal attempt later, the Wildcats dodged a bullet when Phelps and company swatted the kick away and secured a miraculous victory.

Cassville improved to 7-2 with the emotionally-draining win, while Mt. Vernon fell to 5-4.

The Wildcats will host East Newton on Friday night in the first round of the Class 3 District 4 playoffs. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m.





will not make a return trip for any of those items. If the items are not sitting at the curb when the truck goes through, they will not be picked up.




Pet Breeders Assoc. donates to libraries




