Recent flooding exceeds 2015 levels

LOCAL AUTHORITIES STRESS THAT COOPERATION LED TO SMOOTH MANAGEMENT

Multiple agencies came together over the weekend to preventively stage and ensure the safety of Barry County residents during a flood-inducing rain. Efforts included the City of Cassville, area fire departments, the Barry County Sheriff's Department, the Missouri State Highway Patrol and local police departments. While there were 11 water rescues that took place, there were no reported injuries in Barry County related to the flooding.

This flooding episode did, in fact, surpass the December 2015 event, with historic crests at Roaring River and Flat Creek. Roaring River crested at 9.82 feet this weekend, with the previous record of 9.6 feet in 2011. For comparison, the crest was 9.4 feet in the July 2015 flood.

Flat Creek at Jenkins crested at 25.74 feet versus 25.30 in December 2015.

David Compton, Barry County Emergency Management, confirmed the data. He also said rain was comparable to 2015 quantities

Barry County Sheriff Gary Davis attributed the smooth management of the flooding to cooperation amongst agencies, but also to citizens. He said, "I can't thank the citizens of Barry County enough. They didn't get out. They stayed home, which prevented a lot of problems."

Cassville city administrator Steve Walensky said the coordination efforts prior to the rain included staging different vehicles and departments in varying areas that are typically hard to reach when Flat Creek floods. He said, "I really appreciate the cooperation with the businesses and the citizens, and there was outstanding coordination with our fire, police, Sheriff, Highway Patrol, conservation agents and water rescue folks, and also with Dave Compton with emergency management. There was a very well organized communication plan, well organized asset management plan and strategically placed equipment on various sides of the creek so that we would have access at points we would normally get cut off.

"To sit back as a city administrator and be a part of that and see how well the communication worked and move forward was great."

Sheriff Davis said, "We mostly did traffic direction and responding to the very few calls that 911 did take, but I think the coordination made light years difference

toward making it smooth from this side of things. I did pre-stage some deputies in places you can't get to once it floods."

Walensky said that he has had citizens reach out to him to thank the city for the work the city has done on Flat Creek. While there were historic crests, the investment the city has made did impact the severity of the flooding. Walensky said, "When you go up and down Main Street and you see how Regal didn't have any water in their facility. No building on Main Street flooded as far as we have been told. Nothing has been reported, and I personally didn't observe any water entering into buildings. Restoring our carrying capacity and restoring some of the channeling work absolutely helped."

The city invested \$50,000 on removing gravel in Flat Creek in 2016, and \$27,783.75 to date in 2017. Walensky said the city will continue with the money budgeted to increase carrying capacity, but it has helped to prevent damage.

He added that the only damage the city took was in the parks and Greenway Trail, and if disaster money becomes available, they will look to apply for that to help clean up and restore the ball

fields.

He said, "The city's perspective it was just exclusive to the park area. The park is the Greenway Trail and at 13th Street, there was erosion on the road itself on the part that rolls over to Rocky Edmonson Park."

Walensky added that they will be inspecting the walking bridge on the Greenway near the aquatic center to check for structural damage.

He said, "Obviously we are in a flooding environment, but if we can mitigate it and make it better, that is where we will go.

"The only negative thing I have to say is that we seem to be getting very good at this."

A Washburn woman was killed last week when her car was hit by a train on a Private Drive off of Farm Road 1065. According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, Sylvia M. Hayworth, 73, of Washburn, was attempting to cross the tracks when she was hit.

Hayworth was driving a 2015 Nissan Versa when she failed to yield to an Arkansas and Missouri Railroad electromotive diesel train. Hayworth was hit around 11:08 a.m. on Wednesday, April 26, at 24047 Private Drive.

Hayworth's Nissan was hit and totaled, and she as pronounced deceased by Dr. Joe Himes at Mercy Hospital in Cassville at 11:49 a.m. Hayworth was wearing a seat belt at the time of the crash. The Nissan was towed from the scene by Wilson's Towing, of Washburn.

The train had no reported damage, and was driven by David N. Garvin, 49, of Springdale, Ark.

This was Missouri State Highway Patrol Troop D's 31st fatality of 2017.

Exeter man arrested for alleged counterfeiting

An Exeter man was arrested last week when officers found counterfeit bills and counterfeiting equipment in his home. Carl Wayne Lincoln, 30, of Exeter, is charged with forgery and possession of a forging instrument.

On April 20, 2017, Detective Danny Boyd with the Cassville Police Department executed a search warrant at 6208 Farm Road 2200 in Exeter. During the search, Det. Boyd confiscated a suitcase inside a chicken house that had 33 counterfeit \$20 bills inside, as well as two folders with papers in them that were used as templates for the counterfeit bills.

While searching another outbuilding, Boyd found Lincoln hiding along with a printer used for making the bills and a bowl with food coloring and water used to dye the paper. There was also a laptop and a note explaining how to make counterfeit money, according to the report.

During an interview, Lincoln allegedly admitted to making the counterfeit bills.



A late night taco run resulted in criminal charges for a Monett man. According to an affidavit of probable cause, Kevin Oved Sanchez, 19, of Monett, pulled up to the Taco Bell drive through window in Monett, wanting to place an order, and when he was told they were closed, he stole \$100 from the cash register.

The report by the Monett Police Department stated the shift manager told a hispanic male in a white Ford F150 that they were closed, and then walked away on April 22. He then reported that he and co-workers heard the alarm for the drive through window, and

Two arrested for allegedly duct taping child HOME REPORTED TO BE UNSANITARY WITH 12-15 CATS INSIDE

Two Exeter residents were taken into police custody and charged for alleged child abuse and neglect. The children's mother, Carissa K. Spicer, of Exeter, 24, allegedly allowed Dennis Wood, 25, of Exeter, to duct tape her five year old's hands behind his back. The reporting officer, Deputy Chris Hutson, also stated the house was unsanitary for children.

According to the affida-

vit of probable cause, Hutson went to the home for alleged abuse that took place between January and May, 2017. There were four minor children in the home, a one year old, three year old, five year old and seven year old.

Hutson reported that Wood duct taped the five year old's hands behind his back for more than 20 minutes at a time on more than one occasion, and that Spicer knew this had happened and did not stop it. When Hutson questioned Wood, he stated, "You don't know how [the child] treats me."

The report also stated that Spicer and Wood allowed 12 to 15 cats to be inside the home with the children, and that three litter boxes were in the kitchen near the food preparation area, full of urine and feces. Neither Spicer or Wood had a problem with the sanitary condition of the house, according to the affidavit. Hutson also stated that the one year old had a serious medical condition that made him prone to infection while living in that kind of environment.

Spicer and Wood were both charged with four counts of child abuse/neglect each. Spicer is being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$25,000 cash-only bond. Wood's bond was set at \$75,000 cash-only.

The children were taken into Child Protective Custody and turned over to the Department of Family Services, according to the Barry County Sheriff's Department.

Emily Snyder were warriors tonight," said Southwest's Tony Eagleburger. "Both my pitcher and catcher were banged up but they hung in


there and got it done." Southwest earned a semifinal spot opposite second-seeded Clever.

Cassville City-Wide Clean Up May 8-12

The City of Cassville's annual spring clean-up will be held May 8 through May 12. Republic Services will accept additional household waste and large items on regular collection days.

The following items will be accepted at the curb: barbecue grills; patio furniture; outdoor furniture; sofas; dressers; loveseats; recliners; desks; televisions; bundled guttering; and beds, including hide-a-beds, mattresses and box springs.

They will also collect: wood pallets; waste from small remodeling or wood projects, materials must be cut into four-foot sections and stacked; sinks; toilets; cabinets; vanities; carpet that is cut into four-foot lengths and bundled; fencing that is cut into four-foot lengths; and bicycles.

Republic Services will not accept tires, yard waste, large quantities of ash, dead animals, raw sewage, waste oil, hazardous materials, wet paint containers, chemicals, flammable substances, lead or acid batteries or waste from large remodeling or construction projects.

They are also offering an avenue to dispose of large appliances for Cassville residents.

One option will be to take only metal or large appliances to a dumpster located at 503 Mill Street. This is across the street from the Barry County Sheriff's Office. This option is free.

The other option will be to have Cassville residents set at their curb side large appliances for Republic Services to collect. There is a \$15 fee. Residents must pay the fee at the Cassville City Hall by May 3 in order to schedule a pick-up for a large appliance. The follow-

ing large appliances will be accepted after the \$15 fee has been paid: dishwashers, washing machines, dryers, hot water heaters and stoves. Republic Services will also accept refrigerators, freezers and air conditioners that display a tag from a licensed technician proving that all freon has been removed from the item.

Yard waste will be accepted as normal at the Yard Waste facility behind the Cassville Aquatic Park.
