Shoplifting incident leads to high-speed pursuit, suspect suicide

A law enforcement pursuit ended in suicide last night after an alleged shoplifting incident at the Cassville Walmart.

The chase, which began with an officer with the Cassville Police Department ended with the Barry County Sheriff's Department and a dead-end road, after which the suspect in

question shot himself, according to law enforcement.

The suspect in the case, who has not been named, was the subject of an alert put out by the Monett Police Department earlier that day, stating he was involved in an alleged domestic disturbance and he had fled from officers. The alert also notified fellow law

enforcement that he was armed and dangerous and had active warrants for his arrest. He was said to be driving a White Ford Taurus.

Cassville Police Chief Dana Kammerlohr said, "The officer was at Walmart for a separate stealing case when he was made aware of a shoplifting in progress. He followed the suspect as he got on Business 37 heading north."

Kammerlohr confirmed the officer pursued the suspect, and when he turned onto Farm Road 2172, he activated his lights and sirens as the suspect accelerated down the road. After a high speed chase ensued, the Cassville officer terminated the pursuit and returned to Walmart to gather information related to the alleged theft.

According to Barry County E-911, Cassville Police initiated the pursuit at 9:36 p.m. when a citizen alerted him of a shoplifting incident. The vehicle matched the description of the vehicle in Monett Police Department's alert.

The Barry County Sheriff's

Department initiated their pursuit of the suspect after hearing that Cassville was involved in a pursuit. Deputies on patrol headed toward the chase in the event that Cassville needed assistance.

Once Barry County officers were in the area of the chase, they saw the vehicle in question and engaged in a short pursuit which culminated at a deadend on Private Road 1086.

Barry County officers exited their patrol vehicle, approached the car, heard a single gun shot and alerted 911 that a shot had been fired. The driver was slumped over the steering wheel, and a female passenger was then handcuffed by officers and taken for questioning.

Barry County Sheriff Gary

Davis said that the woman's name was not released, and that as far as he knew, she did not have any pending charges against her.

Davis said, "Everyone involved did a professional job in the situation. It ended badly by [the suspect's] own hand, but none of the law enforcement personnel were injured."

He confirmed the suspect had died at 10:22 a.m. after being lifeflighted from the scene.

Multiple agencies were confirmed to be on the scene, including Exeter Police Department and Seligman Police Department.

As of time of press, neither the suspect or passenger's name had been released.

Three arrested for marijuana, meth in RV

Three different people were arrested last week when the Barry County Sheriff's Department was investigating an RV on Farm Road 1070. The RV's residents, Justina Carol Potts, 25, of Monett, and Bruce England, 59, of Monett, were arrested and charged, along with Justina's mother, Susan Marie Potts, 53, of Monett, who was visiting.

According to the affidavit of probable cause, Barry County Sheriff's Department Alvin Zabala went to the RV on May 6. Upon investigating the

residence of Justina and England, law enforcement found marijuana, a meth pipe, scales and small clear bags for packaging narcotics. Items were also thrown out of the RV's window when law enforcement arrived, according to the report. Outside, the Sheriff's Department found a container of methamphetamine.

All three were charged with possession of marijuana and delivery of a controlled substance. They are each being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of \$40,000 cash-only bonds.





Kansas man charged with Wheaton domestic assault

A Baxter Springs, Kan., man was arrested and charged last week with domestic assault and burglary after allegedly breaking into a home and attacking a woman he was in a previous romantic relationship with. Corey Robison, 42, is charged with burglary in the first degree, domestic assault in the third degree and property damage in the second degree.

According to the affidavit of probable cause by the Barry

County Sheriff's Department, Robison broke into the victim's residence on Hill Street in Wheaton on March 4 with the intent to physically assault her. Once inside, he allegedly inflicted pain by throwing her into kitchen cabinets and holding her up by the head at her ears and shaking her.

When he reportedly broke in through the garage, he damaged the door, as well.

Barry County Deputy Justin reported that Robison was no longer on the scene and had fled back to Kansas once he arrived on the scene.

Robison is being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$30,000 cash-only bond.

Cassville man accused of rifle theft, extortion

A Cassville man was accused of stealing a rifle and then attempting to sell it back to its owner. Robert Aaron Windes, aka Aaron Carr, 28, is charged with burglary in the second degree and stealing a

According to the affidavit of probable cause by Barry County Detective Rob Evenson, Windes unlawfully entered a home on Farm Road 2190 in Cassville without permission and stole a DPMS, G11 Recon AR10, .308 caliber semi automatic rifle, valued at \$2,500 on April 5, 2016. The next day, Windes allegedly went into Family First Pawn in Republic, showed them the rifle and asked about fitting a supressor to the weapon. At the time, the serial numbers were present on the weapon, according to the

Then, a few days later, the victim stated that Windes contacted him, saying he heard he was missing a rifle and he thought he might have seen it. Then, according to the report, Windes offered to get it back for the victim on April 11, but it would cost him \$100, which the victim agreed to.

Evenson reported that Windes and the victim spoke several times by telephone and FaceTime through the night. During the conversation, the victim told Evenson that he saw a dog food bag in the back of Windes' truck. Windes then reportedly delivered the rifle to the victim's roommate, but only the upper part. Windes told the victim he would need another \$200 to get the rest of the rifle, according to the affidavit.

It was at this point that Windes allegedly told the victim that the people who had the rifle did not give it to him, but he knew where it was, which was in a ditch outside of Exeter. The roommate located the rest of the rifle in the same dog food sack the victim said he had seen in the back of Windes' truck while FaceTiming him. The serial numbers were obliterated on the rifle when it was recov-

On April 14, the victim, the roommate and Windes met in person, and the victim turned a recording of the conversation over to law enforcement. In the conversation, Windes said he was given the rifle by another man who owed him a drug debt. Windes then said he gave the rifle back to the man when he learned it was the victim's. Windes then admitted to having the rifle for two or three days, but not knowing how it was damaged or defaced, according to the report. He also told them he made up the part

Evenson reported that Windes had agreed to provide his phone records to show the numbers of the person(s) he had spoken to regarding the gun, however, he then called the victim, upset that he had contacted law enforcement and that he was concerned about getting in trouble and providing his phone records to law enforcement.

Evenson also stated that Windes changed his appearance by getting a short haircut and shaving his beard after speaking with him and Detective Doug Henry the first time. Evenson concluded the report with, "It is my belief and there is evidence to support the allegation that Windes is the only person involved in the burglary and theft of [the victim's] rifle." He also added that Windes admitted to taking the rifle to

the pawn shop but that he did case is scheduled for May 25. not try to sell it.

A warrant with a \$30,000 cash-only bond was issued by Judge Robert Foulke on April 28. That bond was later recalled the same day, and an arraignment hearing was held on May 1. A disposition hearing on the

Ole Miss volleyball senior Aubrey Edie continues to rake in honors months after tallying her last assist for the Rebels. The Fayetteville, Arkansas native has received a prestigious NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship to continue her studies.

Edie becomes the 20th NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship recipient at Ole Miss and the first since Lee Ellis-Moore of Track and Field in 2011. She is also the first volleyball player to earn the scholarship.

An elementary education major with an impressive 3.98 grade point average, Edie is one of 58 studentathletes (29 male, 29 female) from all NCAA divisions to earn the \$7,500 scholarship for the fall season.

"We want our studentathletes to have a great experience while at Ole Miss," said executive associate athletics director and senior woman administrator Lynnette Johnson. "Our student-athlete development staff provides support for their educational endeavors and prepares them for 'life after athletics.' Aubrey's postgraduate scholarship is a great testimony to her commitment to excellence in preparing for her career after volleyball."

Directing the offensive attack for the Rebels in 2016, Edie became the career record holder at Ole Miss with 4,834 assists, which ranked fourth in the NCAA in active career assists. She

ranked fifth in the SEC in assists per set and paved the way for the Rebels to have two hitters among the top 10 in the SEC and two players in the top 10 in kills and points per set. Edie earned AVCA All-South Region honors.

Off the court, Edie became the first two-time CoSIDA Academic All-America honoree in program history in 2016 and the first player to be named to the first team. Edie is a three-time CoSIDA Academic All-District First Teamer as well as a threetime member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll. She has made the Chancellor's Honor Roll every semester and has been named to the SEC Community Service Team twice.

In addition, Edie was also chosen to represent the University of Mississippi in the 2016-17 class of Who's Who among Students in American Universities and Colleges.

Edie was also awarded a Taylor Medal, which is the highest academic accolade at the University of Mississippi and is awarded to no greater than one percent of the student body.



cycle Safety Month. Favorable weather seems to be an invitation to motorcyclists to go for a ride. It's important for motorcyclists to take an active role in their safety. Please keep these suggestions in mind

• Be visible. Motorists often have a hard time seeing you. Keep your headlight on, day or night. Use reflective strips/decals on your clothing and on your motorcycle. Be aware of other vehicle's blind

when you're on the road:

- Dress for safety. Wear a helmet and eye protection. Wear bright clothing. Wear thick or leather clothing for protection. Section 302.020 RSMo. states, in part, "Every person operating or riding as a passenger on any motorcycle or motortricycle, as defined in Section 301.010 RSMo., upon any highway of this state shall wear protective headgear at all times the vehicle is in motion. The protective headgear shall meet reasonable standards and specifications established by the director."
- Think safety while riding. Give yourself space to react to other motorists' actions. Use lane positioning

to increase visibility. Watch for turning vehicles. Signal your next action in advance. Pretend you're invisible and drive defensively.

May is Motorcycle Safety Month

• Know your bike. Get formal training and take refresher courses. Practice riding your motorcycle before going into heavy traffic. Know how to handle your motorcycle in all types of road condi-

Car and truck drivers need to share the road with motorcyclists and keep the following in mind:

- · Drivers should actively watch for motorcyclists.
- · Motorcycles may look farther away than they are due to their smaller size. It is also difficult to judge the speed at which a motorcycle is traveling as it approaches.
- Motorcycles are hidden easily in a vehicle's blind spots, or masked by objects or backgrounds. Thoroughly check traffic before changing
- Motorcyclists may slow down by downshifting or easing off the throttle. So, you may not see a brake light. Allow extra distance between you and a motorcycle.
- A motorcycle's turn signal does not cancel after the

turn like a vehicle's signal does. So, pay attention, the motorcycle may not be turn-

- A motorcyclist will often adjust their position in the lane in order to be seen more easily and to avoid debris, wind, or passing vehicles. Allow the motorcyclist to share the lane; don't assume they are being reckless.
- Stopping distance for motorcycles is similar to that of cars. But, slippery pavement can make stopping quickly difficult. Please allow more distance behind a motorcycle in these types of road conditions.

Preliminary 2016 statistics indicate there were 2,138 crashes involving a motorcycle. In these crashes, 1,933 were people injured and 121 people were killed.

The only 100 percent survivable traffic crash is the one that never happens. Make sure everyone in the vehicle is properly restrained in a seat belt or child restraint. Every day as we travel on Missouri's roadways, we trust that every driver on the road is going to obey the speed limit, pay attention, and drive sober. "Don't Violate The Trust."

Small business disaster loans available

Director Tanya N. Garfield of the U.S. Small Business Administration's Disaster Field Operations Center - West today reminded small nonfarm businesses in 36 Arkansas counties and neighboring Missouri counties of the May 30, 2017, deadline to apply for an SBA federal disaster loan for economic injury. These low-interest loans are to offset economic losses because of reduced revenues caused by excessive rain, flooding, hail and high winds in the following primary counties that began April 1, 2016.

Primary Arkansas counties: Carroll, Clay, Craighead, Independence, Jackson, Lawrence, Lincoln, Madison, Prairie, Randolph, White and Woodruff;

Neighboring Arkansas counties: Arkansas, Benton, Boone, Cleburne, Cleveland, Crawford, Cross, Desha, Drew, Faulkner, Franklin, Greene, Izard, Jefferson, Johnson, Lonoke, Mississippi, Monroe, Newton, Poinsett, Saint Francis, Sharp, Stone and Washington;

Neighboring Missouri counties: Barry, Butler, Dunklin, Oregon, Ripley, Stone and Taney.

According to Garfield, small nonfarm businesses, small agricultural cooperatives, small businesses engaged in aquaculture and most private nonprofit organizations of any size may apply for Economic Injury Disaster Loans of up to \$2 million to help meet working capital needs caused by the disaster. "Economic Injury Disaster Loans may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable and other bills that cannot be paid because of the disaster's impact," said Garfield.

"SBA eligibility covers both the economic impacts on businesses dependent on farmers and ranchers that have suffered agricultural production losses caused by the disaster and businesses directly impacted by the disaster. Economic injury assistance is available regardless of whether the applicant suffered any property damage," Garfield added.

The interest rate is 4 percent for businesses and 2.625 percent for private nonprofit organizations with terms up to 30 years. Loan amounts and terms are set by SBA and are based on each applicant's financial condition.

By law, SBA makes Economic Injury Disaster Loans available when the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture designates an agricultural disaster. The Secretary declared this disaster on Sept. 28, 2016.

Businesses primarily engaged in farming or ranching are

not eligible for SBA disaster assistance. Agricultural enterprises should contact the Farm Services Agency about the U.S. Department of Agriculture assistance made available by the Secretary's declaration.


