CoxHealth breaks ground on new \$42 M Monett hospital

On Wednesday, May 1, CoxHealth officially broke ground on their new \$42 million facility in Monett. This new facility will be located on Highway 60 east of Lowe's on the land previously occupied by the Bryce Oaks Golf Club.

The facility will replace the current CoxHealth campus located in the residential district of Monett. This facility has been in use since 1953 and since then, its functionality has outgrown its square footage.

"[We will be] bringing a state-of-the-art building to the already five star patient experience," said Darren Bass, president of CoxHealth Monett. "We are looking forward to a 'one

stop shop' for hospital, clinic, pharmacy and ancillary services. The new location will be a big advantage for growth."

According to Bass, the new facility will include several expanded services as well as facilities that weren't previously available to Monett patients.

"We are looking to expand our orthopedic surgeon presence in Monett to full-time allowing more procedures to be done locally," said Bass. "We will be expanding the size of the emergency department and integrating three primary care offices into one large medical office building. This new medical office building will be home to family practice and specialty services

Three tornados confirmed in Barry County last week

A third tornado was confirmed to have hit Barry County last week. The two previously confirmed tornados on Tuesday, April 30, hit in Pleasant Ridge, outside of Purdy, and Wheaton. The third hit in Cassville. Initially suspected to be just straight line winds, the EF-0 tornado in Cassville was responsible for the destruction of a few trees, knocking down limbs and home damage to at least one residence in mid-Cassville near the square.

Of the three tornados confirmed, Wheaton's was the most severe. Rated at an EF-1, the Wheaton tornado hit around 3:42 p.m. and had maximum estimated wind speeds of 110 miles per hour. The path was 880 yards wide at the maximum and travelled 12 miles, according to the National Weather Service.

While there were no reported injuries from

the tornado, it was reported to have destroyed several buildings and uprooted several trees. It was on the ground approximately 18 minutes.

The Pleasant Ridge tornado was rated at EF-0 and struck around 4:25 p.m. The National Weather Service estimated the peak wind speed at 85 miles per hour and travelled five miles. The maximum path was 200 yards wide. The Weather Service released that several outbuildings were destroyed as well as several trees were uprooted while it was on the ground for about

The newly released data on the tornado in Cassville showed it hit at 6:48 p.m. and travelled intermittently for 1.89 miles. The maximum path width of the tornado was 75 yards, and large trees were downed or damaged. One large tree fell and damaged a house, as well.

When tragedy strikes, Barry County citizens have a long history of stepping in and helping out. Since a devastating tornado hit Wheaton and the surrounding area last week, people came together to help out and make sure those affected have everything they need. Wheaton Police Chief Clint Danforth said the town finally shut down their command post Tuesday, May 7, now that most of the immediate issues have been resolved.

Danforth said people from all over helped out to get things under control. Danforth said, "We are a big family here and in the time of need we all step up and do what we need to do."

Multiple law enforcement and fire departments from across Barry County provided mutual aid in the initial clean up and getting roads reopened.

Danforth said people are still needed to aid in the clean up process, especially metal clean up. He said, "We're still in need of volunteers to help clean up metal. Homeowners are having trouble doing that themselves."

City of Cassville flooding causes minor damage

Last week on Tuesday, April 30, Barry County residents felt the effects of a major storm cell. During that time, there were 11 reported tornadic touchdowns across southern Missouri during the storms, three of those in Barry County, leaving several structures throughout the area damaged or destroyed.

The City of Cassville experienced a confirmed,

fairly small, EF-0 tornado, but due to the town's close proximity to Flat Creek, once again the city received flood damage.

According to David Brock, Cassville's public works director, the storms and the ensuing flooding left some streets and culverts with debris issues and damage to the Greenway

'We had a lot of debris that washed up on box cul-

verts," said Brock. "Most of the street cleaning and debris removal was done by the end of the following

Brock went on to explain that some of the most costly damage centered around Cassville's Greenway Trail. The Greenway runs from a northern point in town, beginning at Rocky Edmondson Park behind Cassville Middle School, to the Aquatic Center, located

in the town's industrial dis-

"The real damage that we suffered was on the gravel sections of the Greenway Trail," said Brock. "Sections were washed out down adjacent to Flat Creek and some more down at our city's south park by the aquatic center, and we're still doing repairs on those."

Brock also said that the main lasting damage done to the trail is the large amount of gravel that the storm and subsequent flood washed away.

"The trail is still passable," said Brock. "We've reclaimed as much gravel as we could, but there's been some areas where we're needing to bring new gravel in. We need to wait for the ground to be less soggy so that our trucks can get through to there. As soon as that ground firms up and we can get those dump trucks in, then we'll finish that off."

The public works department will locally source the gravel, according to Brock. This will be funded through the city's public works budget and should cost no more than \$2,000.

However, the public works department may be reimbursed, as the recent storm activity has the potential to be declared a disaster by the State Emergency Management Agency (SEMA). According to Brock, SEMA representatives have contacted Cassville City Hall as well as several other local government advising representatives, them on the matter.

"SEMA has advised all of the local communities to document their flood response and damages, because now they've said there's been 11 tornado touchdowns in southern Missouri during the storm event. There's some potential that there will be a disaster declaration and reimbursement."

Resurfacing on the Greenway Trail is expected to begin at the city's earliest possible convenience. For more information on this or other public works projects, contact Cassville City Hall at (417) 847-4441.

City Washburn online ticket payment issues to be resolved at next meeting

At a city council meeting on Tuesday, April 16, Washburn City Clerk Emily Arnett made the alderpersons aware of an issue regarding the payment of traffic tickets needing to be resolved immediately.

According to Arnett, after several calls from confused citizens regarding their ability to pay their traffic fines online, she was prompted to conduct further investigation into the complaints. She discovered the Washburn Police Department hands out business cards with traffic tickets with instructions on how to pay fines online. Washburn, however, does not currently have an online payment system in place.

After conducting further research, Arnett concluded that an online payment system was put in place under the previous city clerk, but due to a lack of communication, payments to the system were cancelled without realizing their importance.

Arnett then contacted Washburn City Attorney Darlene Parrigon about the matter. According to Arnett, Par-

rigon said the city has to have a system in place for online payments to be in compliance with state law.


Arnett told the council members she would work throughout the month on finding a suitable service to process the ticket payments.

After some pricing comparisons and a few weeks of digging, Arnett settled on a service called Jetpay. The service will transfer money from online traffic and court payments meant for the Washburn court to the appropriate

It will not cost the city anything to utilize, instead exacting a small convenience fee from the defendant to process payments online. People still have the option to pay the city directly for no additional fee. The onlinepayments will be processed through the Jetpay website. The City of Washburn does not have a dedicated web-

Arnett plans to present her findings to the council at their next meeting on Tuesday, May 21. Should the council move to accept this service, the cards handed out to citizens during traffic stops will be amended to reflect the correct information regarding online payment options.

Bass also stated that, in addition to expanded services, having a facility designed to suit their needs will also aid staff in the care of patients.

ology and laboratory."

"This new facility will bring a high level of efficiency that we currently do not have with the design and flow of the current hospital,"

Regarding the old building, CoxHealth is currently in conversations with several organizations that have an interest in purchasing the facility.

"We are in conversations with several interested parties that have a common vision of enhancing this community with a purposeful plan for the current hospital," said Bass. "We do not have a solidified plan yet, but are looking forward to being able to announce the plans once the final determination and agreements have been made."

According to Bass, Cox-Health has been working closely with the community

to ensure that the new hospital better serves the community's needs more adequately than its predecessor.

"We are actively recruiting for a full-time orthopedic surgeon and currently assessing community needs," said Bass. "We have a community advisory board that works with us to understand what the community needs and wants are."

The new facility will be 75,000 square feet and will also feature an attached medical office building that will be an additional 27,000 square feet. This will make the total square footage of the new facility over a hundred thousand.

Bass stated that the construction of the facility has been a long time coming with hospital administration facing many challenges along the way.

"CoxHealth purchased the land on E. Hwy. 60 in 2005," said Bass. "We started ramping up conversations about a new hospital again starting in 2017, and we were thrilled to make the announcement this past De-

"Becker's Review reported more than 60 rural hospitals have closed since 2010, 68 percent of which were Critical Access Hospitals like Cox Monett. Facilities in states where Medicaid expansion did not pass, like Missouri, have proven to be at a higher risk. We understand the importance of health care in rural communities. It's a vital service."

According to Bass, construction is expected to be completed in November or December 2020 with a tentative move-in date of early

Bass stated that, despite the larger facility, Cox-Health will not be planning any major staffing changes to accommodate the move.

"We do not anticipate adding staff initially, but will utilize the metrics already in place to determine staffing levels based on volumes and other statistics," said Bass.

Plans for transferring staff between the two facility have not been made official at this time, but are currently being deliberated, according to Bass.

"We are working with consultants to plan for the move," said Bass. "All decisions have not been made as of this point, but we will utilize all the tools and strategies to ensure a successful transition for our patients and our staff."

Citizens looking to donate further to the hospital's construction fund can still do so. "To position Cox Monett and all it serves for a bright future, a community investment is needed," said Bass. Missouri travelers should use caution, heed closure signs, during flooding

Moving barricades or driving over flooded roads could be deadly. With flooding impacting roads and bridges across the state, the Missouri Department of Transportation wants to remind travelers to pay attention to all posted signs.

"The phrase 'Turn Around, Don't Drown' is the best advice we can give drivers," said Becky Allmeroth, MoDOT's chief safety officer and maintenance engineer. "With major rivers rising and flash flooding covering routes throughout the state, motorists need to check the Traveler Information Map before heading out."

Travelers should heed barricades barring travel across flooded roads. Several water rescues have already occurred across the state. Almost all of them could have been avoided if the driver had not attempted to cross a flooded route.

"I'm always flabbergasted to learn someone has driven around -- or even moved -- a barricade to get across a flooded route," Allmeroth said. "They are literally putting their lives, and the lives of their passengers, in jeopardy. It's not only dangerous, it's illegal."

During flooding road may have collapsed under the water. Water may be deeper than it appears and can hide hazards such as sharp objects, washed out road surfaces, electrical wires and chemicals.

According to the National Weather Service, it takes just 12 inches of rushing water to carry away a small car, while 2 feet of rushing water can carry away almost any vehicle. It is NEVER safe to drive or walk into flood waters. Downed power lines, hidden debris or one false step can lead to injury or even death.

With more rain forecast across the state for the next few days, MoDOT advises all travelers check the Traveler Information Map before heading out, even if your current location appears not

to be affected by flooding. You can also call 1-888-275-6636 (Ask MoDOT) to talk to a MoDOT customer service representative 24-hours





Barry County Health Department releases April 2019 Food Service Report

Core items, although important to the overall hygiene of the establishment, do not necessarily present an immediate threat to food contamination or illness and/or injury.

A report for each establishment that is inspected shows the number of priority items, along with a short statement as to the nature of the violations. The report also shows the number of core items but doesn't list the nature of those violations.

On Sunday, May 12, Roaring River State Park will host its annual Mother's Day Wild Tea. The event will start at 11 a.m. and is scheduled to end at 12:30 p.m. at the CCC picnic shelter, located near Highway F. This event is free to the public.

According to Kelly Koch, interpretive resource specialist for Roaring River State Park, in previous years, the event met in a tent near the Chinquapin Nature Center on the park grounds. This year, the location was changed to the CCC shelter in order to give it a more naturalistic, outdoorsy atmosphere.

"It's a new location this year," said Koch. "I think the atmosphere will be better than the tent we usually have at the nature center."

During the event, park employees will be making and handing out warm herbal teas, cool beverages and finger foods, all made from wild plants and flowers that grow in Missouri. Park employees will also educate attendees on the process by which the food was made, as well as how to identify these edible plants in the wild.

Attendees will first make their own tea bags out of local herbs. Herbs available



are said to include mint, echinacea and dandelion to name a few.

During this time, attendees will be educated on the wild roots and herbs that grow in Missouri and how previous generations used them for survival. According to Koch, the education portion of the event is the most important component. "I think it's important to teach people about these wild edibles, because it's some of the knowledge that our grandparents and greatgrandparents had and utilized out of necessity.

"With the world that we have now, we're losing some of that knowledge, so it's kind of fun to look back on what people used historically so that people can know what's out there."

Cold drinks will also be served at the event. The main attraction of this portion of the morning will be root beer, made from Koch's own recipe using locally grown sassafras roots.

Finger foods made from local wild plants will also be served throughout the event. Details on some of the foods are to be announced since their ingredients will be picked from the wild in the days before the event, but Koch stated that there will be a type of spinach puff made from wild nettle leaves.

"Most of the foods will already be prepared," said Koch. "It's an opportunity to sit and enjoy the wild food that grows around here."
