CCC renovation project stalled by funding



The CCC Lodge at Roaring River State Park was anticipated to be fully renovated by Opening Day in 2016, but funding issues may stall the project.

The renovation project to convert the CCC Lodge at Roaring River State Park into guest rooms is currently on hold because of funding issues.

The decision to renovate the lodge came at the annual informational meeting at Roaring River in September of last year. Missouri State Parks director Bill Bryan revealed the plan and said, “Our first project goal is to have the construction contract signed by the end of June 2015. While I hope it is sooner than that, that is our goal.” Now, it appears that the project could be on hold for some time.

The funding for the

project was coming from a \$20 million budget item approved by the Missouri General Assembly for the Department of Natural Resources to state park and historic site maintenance, repair, renovation and construction projects from General Revenue. Renovations put off for years at the Capitol were also planned in that budget item.

Linda Luebbering, the budget director for Missouri, said that about \$5 million of the \$20 million has already been spent, and part of that was used for the planning stages of the CCC Lodge project. However, not all of the funds were spent and were not reap-

propriated by the legislature in the newest budget. Governor Nixon requested for the \$15 million reappropriation along with \$50 million in the state’s bonding capacity for state park projects.

The State Parks are operated on a 1/10-cent tax for parks, soils and water. Use fees also help provide funds necessary for regular operation, but the money from General Revenue was going to allow for bigger renovations that would improve the quality of the parks with historic sites.

In total, the legislators approved \$300 million to-

Kid’s Fishing Day draws Outdoor Network

Roaring River State Park will host the 35th anniversary of Kids’ Fishing Day on May 16 and a major television show will be taping during the day. STIHL Reel in the Outdoors with Joe Thomas, on the Outdoor Network, will be filming at the park after they were unable to film during Opening Day due to the weather.

Kathleen Hopkins, a spokesperson for the Outdoor Network, confirmed that the show would be filming at the park on Saturday but an air-date on the Outdoor Network was not certain yet.

Thomas will be at the event from 8 a.m. to noon with the Outdoor Channel Truck and boat on display. Thomas said “During this time I will be signing autographs and interacting with the attendees.

Portions of this event will be filmed for a segment of “STIHL’s Reel in the Outdoors” to air in Q4, 2015 on Outdoor Channel.”

Steph Deidrick, information officer for Missouri State Parks, said, “STIHL is involved with the National Association of State Park Directors and asked if anyone was interested in having the show film there. Our director Bill Bryan approached them and said that Roaring River would be a great place to film.”

The show was originally supposed to film at the park on Opening Day, but the weather ended up making travel plans too dangerous for the crew. Deidrick said, “When it didn’t work out with Opening Day, we immediately suggested Kids’ Fishing Day because we want to highlight our mission of kids enjoying the outdoors.

We think it’ll be perfect for the show.”

Thomas and his crew will arrive on Friday afternoon and shoot some B-roll film before filming at the park on Saturday morning. Saturday afternoon Thomas will fish at Table Rock State Park. Deidrick confirmed that Thomas is staying at Roaring River during his stay in the area.

Thomas said, “We are excited to attend the event on behalf of STIHL, who works hand in hand with the State Parks across the US

Seligman PD investigating burglaries, stolen car

The Seligman Police Department is investigating a string of burglaries and a car theft that occurred sometime Tuesday or Wednesday last week.

Seligman Police Chief Terry Burgess confirmed that there have been three reports of burglaries in residential areas and one car theft this week. Burgess said, "We think that the burglaries are all connected, but not the stolen car."

Two of the burglaries took place on Roller Ridge Road, one on Stapleton and the other on Main Street in Seligman sometime between Tuesday evening and Wednesday morning, May 5 and 6. In all cases, the culprit targeted garages. Burgess said, "They gained access through forced entry and unlocked doors to

get inside, so I want to take this opportunity to remind people to keep your garages and houses locked to prevent the opportunity."

Stolen items included power tools, chain saws and air compressors. Burgess estimated the value of the stolen items at between \$7,000 and \$8,000. He said, "We want these people to get their stuff back, so we're asking for tips that lead to the arrest of the suspect and recovery of the stolen items."

Burgess said that the department is not sure as to whether one person acted alone or if there was more than one person involved. The quantity and size of some of the stolen property would indicate that the burglar either had to make multiple trips or had help moving items.

During the day on Tuesday, May 6, there was also a car stolen from inside the Seligman city limits. A black Dodge Neon was stolen from a mechanic shop on Highway 37 near the car wash.

Burgess said, "Don't forget to lock your doors and keep your possessions secure in your house, garage and cars. We also encourage people to write down serial numbers and store them separate from the items because it aids in the recovery of property in the event that it is stolen."

Charges filed against alleged burglar

The man arrested in connection with multiple Barry County burglaries now has official charges against him.

Tommy Eugene Thornton, 43, of Exeter, was arrested on Tuesday, May 5, in the morning, and charges were filed against him on Wednesday, May 6. Thornton faces two counts of burglary in the second degree, two counts of property damage in the second degree and one county of theft/stealing. More charges may be filed

once fingerprint and DNA evidence comes back from the crime lab, according to Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly.

Currently, Thornton is charged with a burglary at the Sunrise Cafe in Monett and MO-ARK Livestock Auction in Exeter. According to affidavits of probable cause, Thornton broke the glass out of two windows in the front of Sunrise Cafe on State Highway 37 and stole between \$250 and \$500 in cash on April 3.

Then, on April 21, Thornton gained entry to MO-ARK's livestock barn and broke a glass door between the cafe and the auction ring. Security footage at both Sunrise and MO-ARK showed the burglar.

The Barry County Sheriff's Department posted a still image captured from MO-ARK's security camera on Facebook on April 29 and 30. According to the probable cause, the Sheriff's Department received several messages stating that it

was Thornton in the photos.

Then, on Tuesday, May 5, Exeter Police Chief Morgan Struble pulled Thornton over for a routine traffic stop when he recognized him as the suspect from the burglaries. Stuble placed him on a 24-hour hold until investigators with the Sheriff's Department could question him and press charges. When Thornton was arrested, he also appeared to be wearing the same shoes as in the security camera footage.

According to Epperly, more charges could be filed against Thornton once evidence from other burglaries is processed by the crime lab. Other unsolved burglaries in the last month

Cassville man arrested for alleged assault

A Cassville man was arrested on Tuesday for an alleged assault that took place on Old Exeter Road in Cassville.

Codie Allen Fullum, 26, of Cassville, got into an altercation with two women, one of whom was his girlfriend around 2:02 a.m., according to an affidavit of probable cause written by Officer Michael Smith with the Cassville Police Department.

In the report, Smith says that Fullum prevented one victim's vehicle from leaving his driveway, and then he went inside to retrieve his shotgun and loaded one round. Fullum then allegedly pointed the gun at the woman when his girlfriend then put herself between them so he would not shoot her.

According to Officer Smith, Fullum admitted to pointing the gun at the women while it was loaded and that he fired it into the ground. He also allegedly hit the woman in the chest with the gun, knocking her

down the house steps.

Fullum is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$30,000 cash-only bond. He is charged with assault in the first degree, unlawful use of a weapon, and domestic assault in the second degree as a first offense.

The Hotel Barry building, part III

Continued from last week's issue.

The Barry Hotel building was a modern structure consisting of a 60 by 80 foot main structure with a 14 by 22 foot kitchen attached to the west side of the building. The hotel had 16 guest rooms, all of which had an exterior window with above the door windows which allowed cross-ventilation. The rooms could be accessed by the central exterior stair on the front of the building or interior stairs either from the lobby or dining room. During Bayless' ownership the hotel was managed by W. L. Marbut and later by Mr. and Mrs. Harry Dillard.

The first floor of the hotel building had commercial spaces with the hotel lobby and a restaurant in the south half of the building. The restaurant and dining room would seat eighty-five diners. The store front which occupied the north half of the first floor was initially occupied by R.G. Mitchell, who operated a furniture store, according to the advertisements of the day, the Mitchell Furniture store sold a variety of stock including kitchen and dining room tables, safes, commodes, bureaus, sewing machines, baby rockers, baby carriages, coffins and caskets. Mitchell's Furniture also had a custom workshop which made picture frames and coffins which were advertised as "fitted up at any time."

The hotel was located across the street from the Barry County Courthouse which because of risk of collapse was demolished in 1911 and in 1913 the "new" courthouse was built and occupied as the seat of both the administered offices and court system for the county. In 2003, the courts were moved to the new judicial center, but the 1913 building still houses the county's administrative offices.

In November, 1930, Eli Meador, the owner of the Cassville Republican newspaper and the son-in-law of then owner of the Barry Hotel, Hiram P. Sons, moved his newspaper offices to the area

on the first floor which had been occupied by the Mitchell Furniture Store. The Cassville Republican continued to occupy that part of the building until it moved in 1976.

The second floor of the Barry Hotel also had commercial space on the front of the building which initially included an office occupied by Justice of the Peace, E. C. Frost and another office occupied by George and Landis, attorneys. Later these offices were occupied by Dr. E. E. McDaniel, a physician and as the law office for John O. Sanders. The access to the upstairs commercial spaces was gained from the stairwell in the middle of the front of the building.

In addition to the other commercial spaces, the hotel had a sample room which could be rented by a wholesale "drummer" to display his merchandise during his stay in Cassville. The proprietors of country stores across the county would come to Cassville and after inspection of the good would place orders for the drummer's wares which would be shipped to their respective stores at a later time.

The two commercial spaces fronting West Street were occupied at various times by the City of Cassville as the Collector's Office and as an office for the Mayor and other city offices.

Bayless sold all of his business and interest in Cassville about 1905-1906 and moved to Oklahoma

where he died in 1907. He sold the Barry Hotel to Hiram P. Sons on January 29, 1906 and he owned it until his death in 1939. The hotel was inherited by his two daughters Lena Meador and Nora Mae Houston. October 6, 1950, Mrs. Meador and Mrs. Houston they sold the building to Royle and Reva Ellis. It continued as a hotel until 1959. By 1959, the hotel rooms and facilities were antiquated and the Ellis remodeled the building removing the exterior street-front stairs and staircase leading to the upstairs offices and hotel rooms, thus vacating their use for anything but storage. Eliis who at the time owned Barry County Abstract and Title added a twenty by sixteen foot vault for his abstract records in what had been the hotel lobby and dining room. He added offices, a library and a reception area for his law office as well as a space for the operation of the abstract office. In 1959, Royle Ellis moved his abstract office, Barry County Abstract and Title and his law office from the Barry County courthouse to the newly remodeled space in the south half of the building. The north half or the building continued to be occupied by the Cassville Republican until 1976.

From 1959 until 1976, the first floor of the building

housed the Cassville Republican, Barry County Abstract and Title and Ellis law office. Emory Melton maintained his law office in the Cassville Republican Office from 1949 to 1964. In 1964, Melton relocated his office two blocks north.

In 1976, Royle and Joe Ellis sold Barry County Abstract and moved in to the north half of the building in the space that had previously been occupied by the Cassville Republica. From 1976 until 2007, the south half of the building continued to be occupied by the Barry County Abstract and Title and north half was occupied by the law offices of Eliis and Ellis, Later Ellis, Cups and Cole.

The Property was Conveyed by Royle Ellis to his son Joe Ellis August 2, 1976 in the building was completely tucked pointed by Joe and JoAnne Ellis and following Joe Ellis' death in 2005, his widow Jo Anne Ellis sold the building to Donald and Mary Cupps and David and Amy Cole on August 1, 2006.

In 2007, the Barry County Abstract and Title moved its operations to the south side of the square and the Cupps and Coles remodeled the entire first floor to provide office space for their law firm.

The work was done by James Herndon Construction Company, with Jim Herndon and James Appleton doing the restorative to the structure originally built in 1894.

Some interesting characteristics of the building include; the front doors are the original front doors of the hotel lobby; the counter in the office was originally installed in the Farmer's and Merchants Bank of Seligman, Missouri. When the Farmers and Merchants Bank failed in the 1930's Isaac Epperly purchased the counter and it was used as a post office counter in Shell Knob until 1959 and then it was used in the Epperly and Cupps store in Shell Knob until 1983; legend holds the table in the conference room was used by the Confederate government of Missouri during it's brief stay in Cassville in 1861.

tal in bonding capacity for renovations and repairs to state-owned buildings but did not approve the \$15 million of the initial \$20 million allocated for DNR for projects.

Of the money from \$300 million bond, \$10 million will be used for state parks. Since the full \$15 million was not granted to state parks, multiple projects were put on hold until the department can reevaluate their plans, including the CCC renovation which was estimated at around \$1.25 million.

The renovation was slated to include 10 guest rooms that featured kitchenettes, bedrooms and bathrooms. Some rooms were also going to utilize the existing fireplaces on

either side of the lodge.

The CCC lodge was originally built in 1933 after the Roaring River was deeded to the state of Missouri in 1928. Prior to that, the first mill at the river was constructed around 1840.

Seligman PD to drop two part-time positions for full-time officer

In a decision at Monday night's city council meeting, the Seligman alderman approved a decision to drop two of the part-time officers positions with the police department in favor of one full-time officer.

Seligman Police Chief Terry Burgess said, "We've had trouble finding an officer to fill all of our part-time hours, so we feel like this will enable us to have better coverage in the city and maintain an officer for long-term."

Currently, the city has three part-time officer positions, and the position of

chief is also part-time. The three part-time officers currently employed by the city are Joseph Arnold, Aaron Kyser and Fernando Ortega. Officer Arnold resigned in February, but agreed to stay on the force until a suitable replacement was found. Not enough interest was generated by the position up to this point to hire his replacement.

The way scheduling was set up previously, two of the officers are approved for 32 hours a week and the other officer is approved for 30 hours a week. Burgess works 10 hours per week, giving the total coverage for Seligman at 104 hours. However, Burgess said that they haven't been maintaining that much coverage because of the high turn-over with part-time employees.

He said, "The reality is that, while we've got 104 hours approved, we are not getting 104 hours of coverage."

The council approved to make the switch to one part-time officer who will have 30 hours per week and a full-time officer who will cover 45 hours each week. Burgess will also continue working 10 hours. While the coverage will drop 19 hours, Burgess assures that it'll provide a more reliable police force.

He said, "My goal with this is to find one officer to fill that full-time position so that we have someone who will stay with the city."

Financially, the city will save around \$226.48 each month. The city spends \$1,145.08 weekly for the three part-time officers and Burgess, but with the restructuring, the city will spend \$1,088.46 each week, which includes the benefits for the full-time officer.

The full-time position was offered to a current employee on the force, but an announcement has not been made about whether he is accepting it. Burgess said,

Butler Hollow project meeting in Seligman draws heat from residents

In an informal meeting held at the Seligman City Hall on Monday night, many citizens showed up to voice their concerns with the proposed Butler Hollow restoration project in the Mark Twain National Forest.

The meeting, organized by concerned citizen JoNell Corn, drew between 40 and 50 citizens from the Seligman and surrounding communities. Corn also invited Joseph Koloski, the district ranger at the Ava/Cassville/Willow Springs Ranger District office. Koloski and Steve Best, Mark Twain National Forest deputy forest supervisor, spoke to the group and tried to answer questions about the confusion generated by the project and tried to set the record straight on the Forestry Department's plans for Butler Hollow.

Corn's motivation for holding the meeting was fueled by a variety of concerns she and others have regarding the project, including the cut/leave method of timber thinning and prescribed burns.

Koloski opened his portion of the discussion in an attempt to clarify how much land would be affected by the proposed project. Figures released by some claimed that over 70 percent of the forest was going to be cut down, however that was inaccurate. Of the acreage in the Butler Hollow, currently 97 percent of it is forest and 3 percent is glade lands. Under the proposed project, 83 percent would remain forest while 17 percent would be turned into glade, according to Koloski. Glade acreage would be dispersed throughout the area.

Koloski said, "My goal is a healthy forest." The main concerns driving the restoration project include trees maturing at the same rate and dying, disease and invasive species like Cedar trees taking over areas. The plan to manage that is to thin existing forest to about half the density, remove invasive species and institute prescribed burns. Both commercial logging and cut-and-leave are part of the plan for the forest.

The tension in the crowd was apparent before the question-and-answer period. Koloski addressed the audience and stated, "I realize this project has stirred a lot of interest and emotions. I do listen. I do read the comments, and I care about what you have to say."

He continued, "I'm taking my time in making a decision. I'm not in a rush. I realize that I have a responsibility to the community and the forest that I've been asked to provide management for."

Concerns from citizens from the area included is-

sues with the number of trees being removed, the smoke from the prescribed burns, the beauty of the forest, and a call to let nature take its course.

Best addressed the audience, stating, "Nature is hard. When an area gets overpopulated, nature wipes it out."

Koloski also said there are safety concerns with just letting the forest be without management strategies. He said, "This is a fire-adapted ecosystem. It will burn one way or another. With prescribed burns, there's at least some control with where that fire and smoke goes, unlike with a

wildfire."

Corn stated, "There are great concerns that the cut/drop and prescribed burns are destroying and damaging future timber sales. Cut and drop management method destroys trees that would be marketable in the future." Senator Roy Blunt brought up the same concern regarding Mark Twain National Forest in the past.

For some of the audience, the information provided by Koloski seemed to alleviate some of the fears about the project. Other citizens were heated in their questions, taking the opportunity to voice their anger at Forestry Depart-

ment representatives for what they consider to be proposing to destroy the forest.

Corn said, "In trying to find answers for some of my own questions regarding the Butler Hollow project, I obtained information I felt was important to share with our community. I think everyone understands the environmental impact this project may produce, however there is also an economic impact to our community." Corn was referring again to the timber damage from prescribed burns that would affect the financial prospects for commercial harvesting.

Koloski said the main reason for the cut-and-burn method instead of harvesting that viable timber commercially is due to the lay of the land. Using heavy equipment on steeper grades can cause issues with erosion.

However, some comments Koloski made generated an uproar of applause Monday evening. He assured the crowd, "I want to add an alternative to this project to meet the needs

of the forest and the community both. For example, the public was not comfortable with the herbicides in the proposal. I'm more than comfortable with exploring the alternatives to using those herbicides."

Koloski stressed that he wanted to find a viable solution that both the community and the Forest Department was comfortable with. He said, "What I'm interested in is some of the areas where we agree. We want a healthy forest just like you do."

Best assured everyone, "Deforestation is not the same as restoration."

At the end of the meeting, Corn read a letter from State Representative Scott Fitzpatrick regarding the proposal. Corn also showed a video where Senator Blunt raised concerns over the timber harvesting in Mark Twain National Forest.

Corn said, "It does not cost anything to allow these trees to remain and grow, however, it costs for us to

pay for these trees to be slashed/cut/drop and for prescribed burns to be conducted."

Koloski said, "The majority of this project is thinning the vegetation for maintaining the sustainability and health of the forest."

While the public comment period ended on the Butler Hollow Project, there will be a 45-day period for people who submitted comments in the public comment period to file an objection once the environmental assessment and plan is revealed.

Koloski said that it may not be until August or later before he makes a decision with the additional input received in mind. Anyone who made a comment during the public comment period will receive a notice when the plan is finalized and be given the opportunity to file an objection at that point.

Sales tax revenue takes a sharp downturn

The sales tax received for April's sales throughout the county showed a sharp decline comparatively to the beginning months of 2015.

Barry County's sales tax took a 33.74 percent decline for the month when compared to the same month from 2014. The hit took the year's total sales tax revenue down to only 1.89 percent above last year's figures. Months prior to May's sales showed large gains in January and March with small declines in February and April. The tax revenue received for the county in early May was \$118,500.18 for the ½-cent tax.

For the year, Barry County is up by \$13,677.72 for 2015 thus far for the ½-cent General Revenue tax. The sales tax is still up by \$12,987.74 for the additional 1/8-cent General Revenue sales tax collected since October 2013.

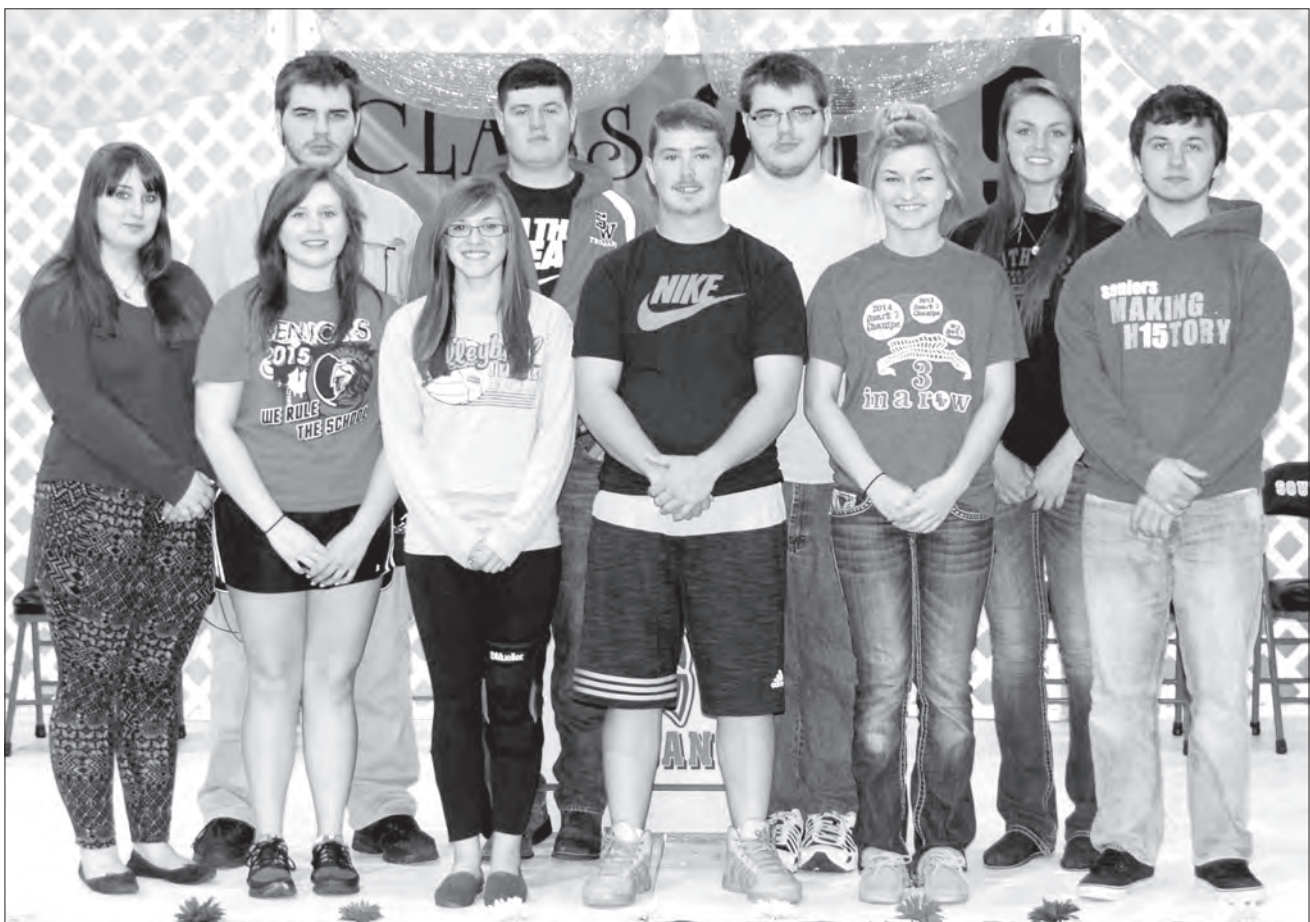
To some extent, the measure of comparing the

year to 2014 may be immeasurable since 2014 was a banner year for sales tax revenue for at least the five years prior. The significant increase in revenue for 2014 was exceptional when compared to data as far back as 2009.

For the city of Cassville, the decrease in revenue was also apparent but not to the same extreme as for the county. Cassville's revenue dipped 7.4 percent from 2014 for the month. Even with the decline, the city is still up 3.9 percent for the year when compared to last year.

Income generated by the 1-cent General Revenue sales tax for Cassville was \$66,469.82. The decrease from 2014's totals was \$5,731.56 for the month. However, the city is still up \$12,913.11 for the year thus far for their 1-cent tax. Revenue generated by the new 3/8-cent for the month \$24,801.41, not significantly different from each month since January.

Kids 15 and under can pick up their free trout tags at the hatchery office any time on Friday or all day on Saturday. A section of the park will be reserved for kids, and they are encouraged to bring their own fishing equipment.

Over 100 volunteers are expected to help assist kids taking part in the activities. Parents are welcome to help, but it is required that only one pole be used between the child and helper or parent. Adults will not be allowed to fish alone in the area reserved for the kids. From 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. free hotdogs, chips and soda will be available.

"We will be stocking around 3,000 fish and 100 lunkers in the kids-reserved area. We will also be stocking 1,000 in the adult portion of the stream. We will be stocking for this event Friday night and also throughout the day on Saturday," said hatchery manager Paul Spurgeon.

Activities will be provided throughout the day such as: fish cleaning, taxidermy, knot tying, fly tying, fly casting, watersheds, Dutch oven cooking,

how to fish Roaring River, and stream biology.

At 1 p.m., Ryan Persinger will give a hatchery tour, Tim Smith will teach fish cooking at 2:30 p.m., and at 3 p.m., Carmen Hallock and Tim Canchola will teach outdoor survival skills.

There will be a complete schedule available for all classes the day of the event. Kids that are present for three activities will be entered for prizes. The drawing will be held at 5 p.m. Kids must be present to claim their prize. Seminars are open to all, but only kids can enter the drawing.

A Missouri snake program will be given using live specimens, and critter headbands will also be available. The Roaring River crew has been working hard over the past couple days putting up tents, getting classes ready and picking up prizes.

Shell Knob Elementary School art teacher Valerie Ball brought over 150 entries to this year’s show, and the colorful artwork livened up the gallery. A team of students from Missouri University of Science and Technology will race its Formula One-style racecar at Formula SAE-Michigan, a national student design competition sponsored by SAE International.

The competition, held May 13 through 16 at the Michigan International Speedway, challenges students to design, build and operate small scale Formula One-style racecars. Missouri S&T’s team will compete against 125 other teams from around the world.

Barry County natives that are part of the team are:

- Skylar Knoll, a junior in mechanical engineering from Washburn.

At the event, students must present a budget report and the engineering principles behind the car’s design to a panel of industry experts. Teams will then compete in four dynamic events.

A skid-pad event tests the car’s turning and cornering on a figure-eight-shaped course. An acceleration test measures the car’s speed over a short distance. A one-lap autocross event proves the car’s maneuverability on a tight course and determines the starting order for the final event, an endurance race to prove durability. In the endurance race, the car must withstand the stress of long-term driving at elevated speeds over the two-mile-long course. Each race is timed to rank the teams; none of the events are head-to-head races.

Missouri S&T’s car features a modified Kawasaki engine that can produce up to 91 horsepower for the 450-pound vehicle. The car is estimated to travel from 0 to 60 miles per hour in 3.5 seconds. Its custom aerodynamics package produces a large amount of downward force and is designed to help the tires grip the track better. The car has undergone 10 hours of wind tunnel testing to help the team plan the aerodynamics package.

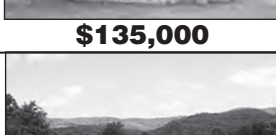
