## Two will face off for vacant House seat

Both the Barry County Republican and Democrat legislative committees put up candidates to run for the District #158 House of Representatives seat left vacant when Scott Fitzpatrick was appointed State Treasurer. The special election on November 5 will determine the replacement who will serve to represent citizens from Barry, Stone and Lawrence Counties at the state level.

The 158th District Republican Legislative Committee nominated Scott Cupps, 33, of Shell Knob, to run on its ticket. The Barry County Democrats nominated Lisa Gayle Kalp, 55, of Cassville, for as their candidate.

Cupps was selected out of three officially nominated for the seat during the Republicans' meeting on Tuesday, May 7. Other nominees included Landon Fletcher and Jerry Varner.

The Democratic Central Committee selected Kalp after their monthly meeting on Monday, May 6, invited nominations. The committee did a telephone vote on Monday, May 13, to decide between Kalp and one other candidate, Ron Monnig, of Eagle Rock.

Cupps said he is excited to run in the election, and it was a decision he made after considering it for years. He said, "This is something that has been in discussion for three or four years. I'm very passionate about some

of the issues facing rural Missouri more so than some of the people in urban settings are."

He added that having discussions with State Treasurer Fitzpatrick helped him understand the ins and outs of state politics and led him to pursue it.

Kalp said she is running because she thinks she can help the future of Barry County. She said, "I think some things need to be done. I've always told people that if things need to be done, do it yourself, so I took my own advice."

"There is a separation in this area of people. We have Hispanics, the farmers, and the city people. We don't have everybody being the 'Barry County people'. We all have the same issues."

When asked what issues he is passionate about on the state-level, Cupps said he is passionate about agriculture, education, civil liberties and property owners' rights. He said, "I've been quoted numerous times saying it's the government's job to work for the people and not the people to be slaves to the government. If we don't work to keep it that way, it can get there fairly quickly."

Kalp's perspective is that she wants people locally to feel like their vote counts and matters and they have a voice in local government. She is passionate about voters' rights, women's issues, affordable healthcare and

education and training for all Missourians.

She said, "People are worrying that their voting doesn't count because they are just going to change it anyway. That needs to change."

Both candidates plan to pursue campaign strategies of talking to residents to get their feedback and hold meet and greets to get to know voters' issues across the county.

Cupps lives in Shell Knob with his wife, Kim, a third grade teacher at Cassville Schools. He runs a diversified farming operation with his father and twin brother. He has a bachelors degree in agricultural education from Missouri State University and pursued a masters in agricultural business before taking an agricultural logistics sector position with a company based out of Boise, Idaho.

## Kids' Fishing Day this Saturday

This Saturday marks a family favorite in the area. Kids' Fishing Day at Roaring River State Park will offer free fishing, classes, activities and food to youngsters wanting to cast a line in the water or at least learn a little more about the outdoors through educational opportunities.

The spring Kids' Fishing Day event will be held on Saturday, May 18, with fishing starting at 6:30 a.m. and running until 8:15 p.m. Throughout the day, there will be classes, food, fishing, music and more to keep the whole family entertained.

Kids' Fishing Day is a free opportunity for kids ages 15 and under. Tags will be available in the main tent near the hatchery. Most of the park's waters will be dedicated to youth-only fishing with volunteers on site to help teach kids the ins and outs of catching trout. Classes this year will include a petting zoo, Mexican cuisine cooking, a cave hike, reptile classes, crafts, fly tying and more.

The big prize drawing will be held for children who attend classes during the day, as well. The main stage will feature prize giveaways beginning at 5 p.m. Children must be present to win.

Gates named as Purdy superintendent

Purdy R-2 Board of Education President Todd Schallert introduced Mrs. Mindi Gates as the District's 2019-2020 Superintendent at a staff breakfast reception on May 13. Gates, whose introduction was met with vigorous applause, is no stranger to the Purdy Schools staff. She began her career with the District in 2013 as the District's first official Instructional Coach, a position which she held for two years. In 2015 the Board of Education announced her promotion to Associate Superintendent.

In her remarks to the staff Gates noted that she attended kindergarten screening at Purdy as a five year-old, but her family's path took them a bit further south. Gates grew up in Cassville, where she attended school from kindergarten through her 1999 high school graduation. She continued her education at Drury University, where she earned her Bachelor's in Elementary Education. She received her Masters in Education Administration from Southwest Baptist University in 2012 and completed her Education Administration (Superintendent) Specialist Degree at Missouri State University in 2017. Mindi and her husband, Justin, make their home in Cassville. They have two children: Simon, age 12 and Ava, age 7.

Gates will accept the mantle of leadership from current Purdy Schools Superintendent Steven Chan-

cellor on July 1. Chancellor has served the District for the past seven years, during which time the District has enjoyed unprecedented educational advancement. He organized and led a committee of community and school staff members that produced the school's first Strategic Plan, which called for upgrades in technology and facilities. Chancellor met and exceeded these demands by paving the way for placing iPads in the hands of each student in grades three through twelve, upgrading the north high school entrance, adding a commons and concessions area and most recently spearheading the successful passage of a \$1.3 million bond issue which provided a new Performing Arts Center, FEMA shelter and preschool. Of her predecessor Gates noted, "I have very big shoes to fill."

Purdy Community Teachers Association President and fifth grade teacher Abbi Coy summed up the staff's response to the changing of leadership. "Dr. Chancellor will be greatly missed, but I can't wait to see how our district flourishes under Mindi. She is an amazing leader and person."

Chancellor declared full confidence in Gates when he stated, "The Board of Ed-

ucation has selected both a great leader and a phenomenal person as the District's next superintendent. She has worked hard to earn the trust and confidence of the staff and this will undoubtedly carry over into our community as she assumes her new role. There is no one more excited about her selection and the future of the school district than me."

Gates observed of her new position, "I am humbled beyond words at the trust our Board of Education has placed in me, and I consider myself incredibly blessed by this opportunity. I look forward to continuing to serve our students, parents and community alongside our incredible team of teachers and staff. I am proud to be a Purdy Eagle."

Purdy man arrested for molestation, providing alcohol to a minor

A 26-year-old Purdy man is in jail after allegedly molesting a child under the age of 17 and providing her alcohol. Lloyd Brandon Anderson is charged with one felony count child molestation in the fourth degree with a child less than 17 years old and an age difference of more than four years and two misdemeanor counts of supplying alcohol to a minor.

According to affidavits of probable cause, the victim reported that Anderson subjected her to sexual contact by touching her private area, butt and breast area as well as buying her alcohol on two different occasions. The victim was caught at school with alcohol in early April.

On April 8, Anderson was interviewed by detective Angela Cole, with the Barry County Sheriff's Department. Cole reported Anderson admitted to providing the victim with alcohol and touched her inappropriately.

Anderson is currently being held in the Barry County Jail on a \$45,000 cash-only bond.

**HUMMINGBIRDS**  
Every summer, we feed the “HUMMERS.”  
The hummingbirds have been back for a few days. Each year, it is the same. They start out timid. Any time they see someone, they fly away. As the summer progresses, they get bolder and bolder. By summer’s end, they hover a few feet away, impatiently waiting for you to hang up the refilled feeder. The more exposure they have to you, the less attention they give you.

That reminds me of how most people respond to Jesus Christ and his teachings. For some reason, the more they are exposed, the less they respond. Perhaps the old saying “Familiarity breeds contempt” applies. The more commonplace an event, the less noteworthy the event is to the participants.

Jesus said in Matthew 7:13: “Enter ye in at the strait gate: for wide is the gate, and broad is the way, that leadeth to destruction, and many there be go in thereat. (14) Because strait is the gate, and narrow is the way, which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it.”

My guess is that many on the broad path cross over from the narrow because the repetition of our faith causes it to become routine and/or boring. Because of this, they sought another path, more to their liking. 2 Timothy 4:3: “For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears; (4) and they shall turn their ears from the truth, and shall be turned unto fables.”

A path more comfortable or convenient: Gal. 1:6: “I marvel that ye are so soon removed from him that called you into the grace of Christ unto another gospel.”

Let’s be sure we feed upon God’s word and not become complacent in the familiar “routine” of our faith.

# Scannell's hurdle victory highlight of track sectionals

The Wheaton boys 4x800 meter relay team of Zane Johnson, Kelton Park, Ricky Miller, and Marek Smith finished fourth in 9:13.23.

The MSHSAA Class 1 and 2 Track and Field Championships will be contested Friday and Saturday at Jefferson City High School.

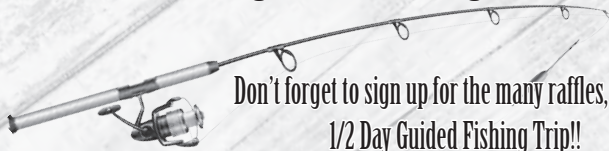
