Seligman water study recommends overhaul water main repairs

PROPOSED PLAN TO COST \$2.5M IF ACTION IS TAKEN

The city of Seligman received the results of a water study done by Olsson and Associates at their May council meeting. Seligman City Clerk Brian Nichols said, "Based on the study, Olsson recommended, and DNR (Department of Natural Resources) agrees, we need to start replacing the back bone of our system starting at City Hall to Farm Road 1070."

The water study was paid for with a 100 percent grant by DNR.

The proposed plan would cost \$2.5 million, and the city would have to make plans regarding how that would be paid for. One option would be to ask for voter approval of a bond issue to pay for it. Of the \$2.5 million, \$500,000 in grant funding is available.

Another option would be to systematically raise water rates over the course of several years to generate enough funds to pay for the project. Currently, Seligman has one of the lowest water rates of a municipality in Barry County with their base charges \$28.50 for 2,000 gallons of water and sewer service. Each additional 1,000 gallons is \$2.25 for water only.

Nichols said water bills would systematically be raised approximately \$10-15 per month each year to be eligible for the project.

Nichols said, "The proposal includes adding a water stand pipe or tower that would hold an additional 200,000 gallons on the north side near the car wash, as well."

He added, "Council hasn't taken action on it yet, but the sewer pipes are the original galvanized pipes from the 50's, so eventually something will need to be done, but we're looking at all of our options, and the first step of that is getting the water study."

There is no proposed date for when Seligman City Council will make a decision on the recommendation made by Olsson.

Thanks to a keen eye by a cemetery's caretakers, the Rotary Club of Cassville's stolen Bull Blast sign has been returned to its rightful owners. Herb Primrose, Rotary Club member, said, "We're just tickled to have it back. It saves us the expense of having to use the new one." Primrose picked the sign up on Tuesday, and it has since been placed in storage with the club's other signs. He said the club will reuse the signs for next year's bull riding event if they have one.

Local schools' bathroom policies currently in line with federal guidelines

After a historic decision handed down by the Department of Education and Department of Justice, schools across the country are reevaluating their bathroom policies regarding transgender students to ensure they retain their federal funding. According to all five of Barry County's superintendents, they believe their schools are currently in compliance and not at obvious risk for losing any federal funding to keep their districts going.

The directive letter released on Thursday last week instructed schools on how to tackle questions regarding transgender students and bathroom use in public schools. In the directive, schools were instructed to allow transgender students to use bathrooms, changing rooms and locker rooms that match their sex and that those students cannot be forced to use an individual or private bathroom if other students are not required to do so. The move was made as an insurance of equal rights.

John B. King, Jr., secretary for the Department of Education, released a statement following the letter, saying, "No student should ever have to go through the experience of feeling unwelcome at school or on a college campus. We must ensure that our young people know that whoever they are or wherever they come from, they have the opportunity to get a great education in an environment free from discrimination, harassment and violence."

Local school district superintendents feel that their schools' anti-discrimination policies already put them in compliance with the recent directive, but they have heard from the community about concerns over the policy. The only schools drawing heat from the recent decision are those with policies forcing transgender students to use bathrooms that do not match their gender or a private bathroom.

While all of the area schools have at least one gender-neutral bathroom in their facilities, usually in the nurses' stations, none have policies making certain students use them. However, they are available if it makes them more comfortable.

Cassville superintendent Dr. Richard Asbill said that he has already received phone calls from district patrons regarding the joint letter issues by the Department of Education and the Department of Justice. He said most of the correspondence thus far was pertaining to a parent or grandparents' concern about their own child's privacy in the school. Dr. Asbill stated, "We are talking about what kinds of steps we already have in place to afford all of our students a safe environment to learn in."

Asbill continued, "We still believe all of our students are guaranteed a free and appropriate education in a safe environment regardless of their personal beliefs, race or ethnic group.

Both State Senator David Sater and State Representative Scott Fitzpatrick made statements opposing the decision, saying that it is federal government overstepping its boundaries. Sater released a statement saying, "This overstep by the president is just another in a series of executive actions and bureaucratic decrees that attack state sovereignty and attempt to centralize more power in Washington, D.C. instead of back home, where it belongs."

He also said, "This discussion goes beyond just who should and should not use a certain bathroom in our schools. How should schools manage the issue of gender-specific sports teams? Should we open up male or female locker rooms to the opposite gender based on how that individual "feels"?"

Fitzpatrick was concerned with what would happen if a student chose to abuse the policy. He said, "The way the letter from the administration reads, basically if the student declares they are now identifying as the opposite sex as they are biologically, and they announce that and there are

no other requirements to be met, there may be a prob-

"They said there doesn't need to be a letter or a doctor, it's literally just a declaration by the student. If they are not comfortable using a bathroom that does not match their genitalia, they need to find a private bathroom or use a bathroom that does not have other students in it."

Dr. Bob Walker, superintendent of Southwest Schools, said, "What its guidance is suggesting, some have even called it a veiled threat with federal funding, is something we'll have to discuss. We don't have transgender accommodations in place currently other than our students are expected to use the restrooms and locker rooms and showers that consistent with the gender reflected on their birth certificate."

He added, "Whatever guidance we receive, we'll be analyzing that and making decisions in the future. Local boards need to be making local decisions. I do think this is an overreach."

Purdy superintendent Dr. Steven Chancellor said, "We do not have a specific policy. We do have unlabeled restrooms. They are not designated male or female that are single stall restrooms with a door lock. So that's all we have. I feel like I could argue a point that irregardless of this ruling, we could be considered in compliance. We feel like no action was warranted because we are covered."

He went on to add, "If we don't create an issue, then there isn't going to be one. Several people are upset. We need to wait and be more patient. Let's wait for more guidance by DESE. Let's not overact.

"First and foremost, we will protect our kids from anything up to and including people trying to abuse or interpret this in a way





Barry County Courts' monthly felony sentences for April

• Shannon Lee Barlow, of Monett, pled guilty to burglary in the second degree and theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in value. Barlow was granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

Shannon Barlow was arrested following an incident in October 2006 at a residence near Cassville. According to a witness statement, Barlow and another person stole items from Barlow's father's home. She was in possession of a .38 Taurus Special pistol.

Barlow is to serve probation until April 19, 2021.

• Jessie J. Cruise, of Cassville, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Cruise was granted a suspended imposition and is to serve five years supervised probation and 100 hours of community service within a year.

Cruise was arrested following an arrest at a Missouri State Highway Patrol sobriety checkpoint on MO 37 on August 31, 2013. Cruise was a passenger in a vehicle with another person and voluntarily gave the trooper a bag of marijuana that he said he had paid \$300 for. Cruise also blew a 0.061 percent on a voluntary breath test. Cruise had 112 grams of marijuana in his possession.

Cruise is to serve probation until April 19, 2021.

• Melissa Gayle Darter, of Aurora, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Darter granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and is to serve supervised probation for five years.

Darter (also known as Melissa Gayle Sutherland) was arrested by the Cassville Police Department on December 25, 2015. Officers pulled over Sutherland because she was listed as a missing person. While she was pulled over, officers saw a clear plastic bag with white residue in it. The bag tested positive for methamphetamine, and a search produced a glass methamphetamine pipe, as well.

Darter is to serve probation until April 18, 2021.

• Tiffany Brooke Davis, of Vandalia, made an Alford plea to possession of a controlled substance and unlawful use of drug paraphernalia. Davis was granted a suspended execution of a five year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and must serve five years supervised probation and 200 hours of community service within a

Davis was loitering with another person outside of the Casey's in Aurora when officers questioned her. Since Davis had an active warrant out of Lawrence County, officers searched her and found two loaded

syringes in her purse. The liquid tested positive for methamphetamine, Davis admitted that they were hers.

Davis is to serve probation until April 28, 2021.

• Robert Dean Harper, of Monett, pled guilty to unlawful use of drug paraphernalia. Harper granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and must serve two years unsupervised probation.

Officers executed a search warrant on Frisco Avenue in Monett on June 30, 2015. During the search, officers found 924 small zip lock baggies, two digital scales and five utensils used for filling bags. Harper admitted that some of the bags and scales were his and that he had used them to package and sell methamphetamine the month before.

Harper is to serve probation until April 19, 2018.

• John Heistand, of Clin-

ton, pled guilty to passing a bad check of less than \$500. Heistand was granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and two year unsupervised probation.

In May 2010, Heistand wrote a check to Race Brothers in Monett in the amount of \$1,156. Hesitant knew that the check was drawn on an account that he knew would not be paid.

Heistand is to serve probation until April 19, 2018.

• Melissa Ann Hovt-Ross, of Crane, pled guilty to two counts of tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree, one count of burglary in the first degree, two counts of property damage in the first degree, one count of possession of a controlled substance, and one count of distribution of a controlled substance. Hoyt-Ross was granted a suspended execution of a seven-year incarceration sentence and is to serve five years supervised probation.

Hoyt-Ross was charged following multiple different incidents. In October 2015, Hoyt was arrested for driving a vehicle that she did not have permission to drive. Then, Hoyt-Ross stole a lighter and a pair of gloves from a property on State Highway 248 near Aurora. Hoyt-Ross put the stolen property into a truck beside the garage and drove away. The property owner found Hoyt the next day driving the stolen truck. The owner caught up to Hoyt-Ross and stopped her until law enforcement came, but she tried to flee and hit the owner's other truck, damaging both in the process.

"Our focus and attention is the basics: teaching and learning, and we're not going to get derailed. When it's necessary and when they time is right, we'll address it in a way that mirrors the values of our community."

Wheaton superintendent Dr. Lance Massey said, "I'm a little concerned about federal funding, and Wheaton cannot operate as we are without federal dollars.

"Conversations are going to happen concerning this and for different folks in the community, it's a concern."

Dr. Asbill said that schools have regularly been a testing place for social policy change, and he doesn't feel that it is appropriate. He said, "I am disappointed that the government has decided schools are the litmus test for the transgender issues, but pub-

lic schools have been the ground for those social tests

historically."

He added, "We're not going to be able to come up with every single scenario that might happen because there are so many hypotheticals that we don't want that to snowball into something that overwhelms the purpose of a free and quality education for our students."

Exeter Schools superintendent Dr. Ernest Raney said that Exeter should be safe from the issue with the current anti-discrimination policy. He added, "I don't see any need to call out any specific minority to say that they are protected. That seems like discrimination to me. We don't discriminate

against any minorities at all.

"Education is our focus, and we want this to be a good school that kids feel comfortable and safe coming to, regardless of anything else. I just want our kids to feel safe, loved and supported, and issues like this cloud that. It creates hardship and division, but we've got educating children to take care of."



MoDOT warns drivers to look for mowing crews

Pushing the lawn mower yard is a springtime neces- some and a chore for others. back and forth across the sity. It can be a pleasure for At the Missouri Department

of Transportation, our crews are beginning the mowing season with a main purpose: safety.

During May and June, there is a good chance you will see MoDOT crews out mowing on tractor mowers so motorists have a clear, safe line of sight as they cruise along state highways.

"We ask motorists to pay attention and slow down when approaching mowing crews. Please take the time to pass carefully and safely especially on rural two lane roads," said MoDOT State Maintenance Engineer Becky Allmeroth."

Major and minor routes

will be mowed at least three times through the end of October. Along with the mowing, crews selectively use herbicides to stunt grass growth as well as to control brush and stop the spread of noxious weeds. Wildflowers are an added benefit of not mowing fence-to-fence and careful herbicide usage.

- On rural two-lane roads, crews may use a protective "follow" truck to alert motorists they are approaching slow-moving mowers. Drivers are advised to use the following tips to safely pass
- Be alert for trucks and tractors with lights flashing

and moving slowly, 2 to 5

- Slow down and focus on the road ahead of you. Avoid talking and texting on a cell phone or other distractions.
- Be prepared to stop or drive very slowly behind a "follow" truck, especially approaching a hill or curve on a two-lane road.
- Obey the no passing zone stripes and only pass when you can see far enough past the "follow" truck to avoid meeting oncoming

Between mowing cycles, report grass and weeds blocking visibility at intersections along state roads to MoDOT.Contact MoDOT's 24/7 Customer Service Center at 1-888-ASK-MODOT (1-888-275-6636) or fill out an online form at www. modot.org and click on Report A Road Concern.
