

City of Seligman makes sewer, water improvements

NEW EQUIPMENT PURCHASED FOR RELIABILITY

The City of Seligman making strides in infrastructure improvements in their water and sewer departments. Two major purchases will improve the function of both the water and sewer systems in the city.

The sewer system improvement is a new rain rail at the city's sewer lagoon. City Clerk Brian Nichols said the equipment is replacing the city's old system, which was in disrepair. Nichols said, "We had a much larger one capable of putting out the same amount of water, but it was a model from 1982, and we were constantly replacing parts. It was just pretty much worn out."

The new system is the Amadas 2450 rain rail, a 1,050 roll of 4 1/2 inch hose that allows the city to get

rid of lagoon water. The equipment cost the city \$54,928.80. The purchase was made from Perkins Sales, of Bernie, Missouri, and was one of five bids the city received.

The new hose has a flow rate of 770 gallons per minute. Nichols said, "It allows the city to get rid of two weeks of wastewater in one full day of running it."

Public works employees use a tractor to pull the hose out and then an engine reels it back in once they are finished. The equipment is an immediate solution to a problem the city initially wanted to solve with stationary sprinkler guns at the lagoon. However, due to issue with the Department of Natural Resources, they were unable to install the sprinkler guns at this time.

Nichols said, "We wanted to put in the sta-

tionary guns, but DNR was requiring we put in enough guns to get rid of 54 million gallons a year [of wastewater], and in a good year, we get rid of 18 million gallons. It just wasn't reasonable."

The discrepancy between the city's needs and DNR's requirements come down to an issue with the city's permit. Nichols said the DNR error overestimates the capacity needs for the city. Nichols said, "We abandoned the guns for now and just purchased another rain rail. But we'll be moving forward with a sewer system study and see what we can get resolved with DNR."

The Seligman City Council approved Nichols to complete a community development block grant application that would provide 80 percent of the funding for a sewer system

study that will cost around \$50,000. The city already did the water system equivalent study in 2016.

Nichols said he hopes the sewer system study will tell DNR exactly what is wrong in their permit and allow them to fix it with accurate information. The grant application has been filled out and they expect to hear back in about a month.

The city also purchased a new generator for Well #4. The generator cost \$37,267 and was the bid selected from Clifford Power, of Oklahoma. The city received six bids on the Generac propane generator. Its purpose will be to keep the well running in the event of a power outage. Nichols said, "It's good to have a power source stand by since #4 is our primary well."

Seligman man arrested on child molestation charges

A Seligman man was arrested and charged with child molestation for an alleged incident in 2014. Charles Stephen Love, 31, of Seligman, is charged with child molestation in the first degree and tampering with a victim in a felony prosecution. According to the affidavit of probable cause by the Barry County Sheriff's Department, the crime was reported to have happened at a residence on State Highway 90 in Washburn between August and November 2014. The state-ment claims that the victim said Love touched her private areas over her clothes several times when she was 10. The victim said the family was staying in the living room at that time because bedrooms were unavailable due to remodeling. The affidavit, completed by Officer Angela Cole, said after the victim told her mother, Love then texted the victim telling her to "fix what has happened at home." Love is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$50,000 cash-only bond.



Tracing geneology Southwest senior wins scholarship

Tracing one's genealogy is much more manageable thanks to the bevy of family tree and family lineage websites. Such sites work by gathering some key information, including the names and birthdays of certain relatives. The sites then use this data to create a more complete picture of family relations. On the popular genealogy site Ancestry.com, for example, suggestions pop up with a potential relative's name or further information about a loved one, which can then populate the family tree even further.

Tracing genealogy also can present a bigger picture of relatives' occupations and military history. Family tree sites can be enhanced by uploading images, census data, immigration records, and even more documents that would be otherwise buried in photo albums or memory keepsakes.

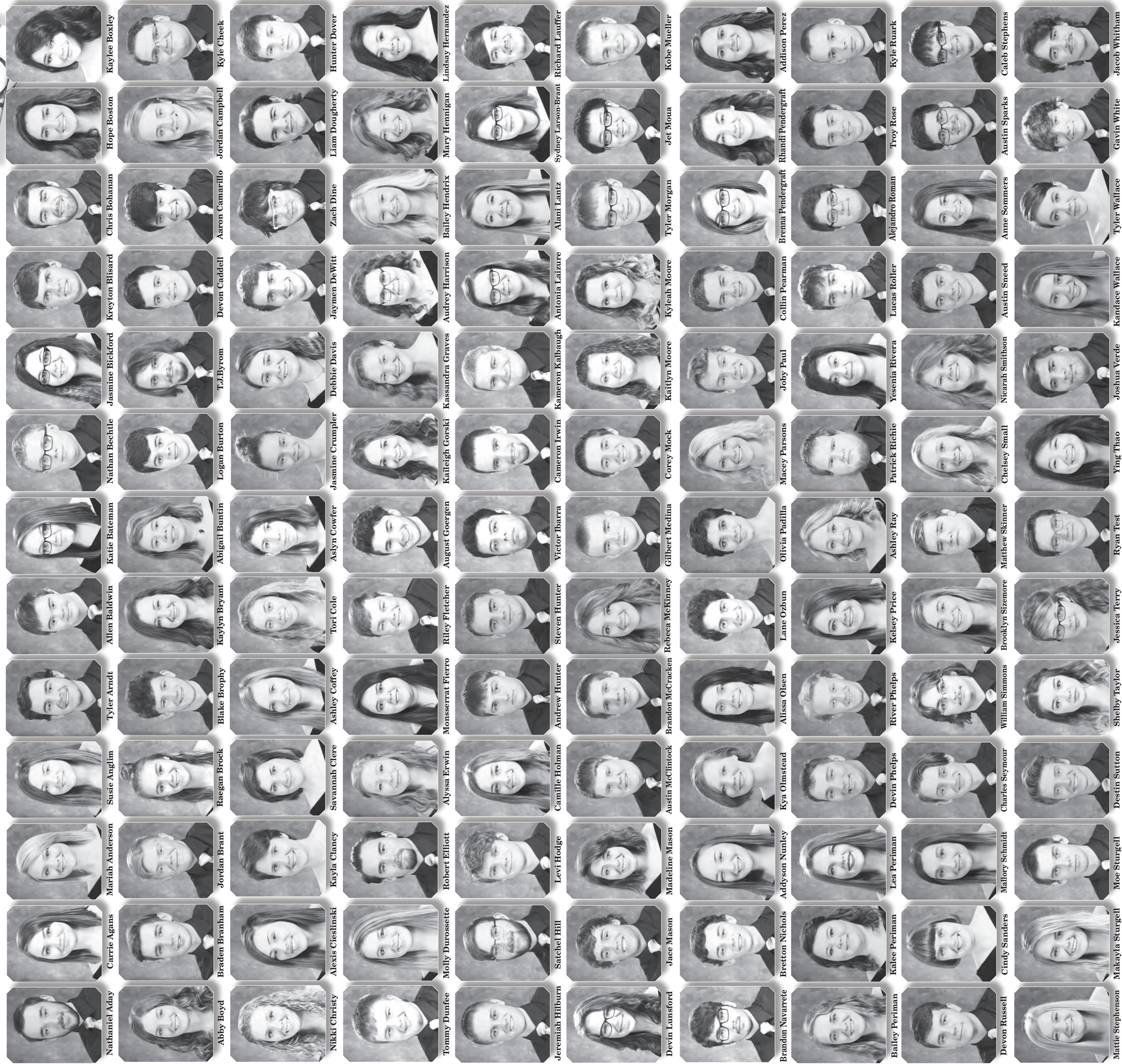
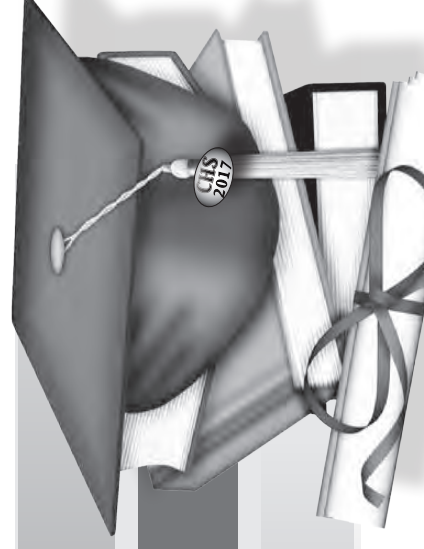

Cassville man arrested for allegedly assaulting witness

A Cassville man was arrested for allegedly attacking another man who was a witness in a drug investigation. Justin Micah Guilkey, 36, of Cassville, is charged with robbery in the first degree, assault in the second degree and tampering with a witness in a felony prosecution.

According to the affidavit of probable cause by Cassville officer Jonathan Cherney, Guilkey was in a room at the Cassville Budget Inn when he asked the victim to come over and write his name on a piece of paper to compare his signature to another paper. Guilkey was comparing the signature to that of a witness statement on a narcotics case in Barry County where the victim was a witness. The victim

claimed when he bent over to sign it, Guilkey started beating him in the head with a metal flashlight saying, “I don’t like (obscurity) snitches.”

The victim then claimed Guilkey stole \$450 cash from his wallet. The victim was transported to the hospital by his girlfriend for his injuries which required five staples in his scalp. The girlfriend then told officers that Guilkey called her later that morning and said he was sorry he “had to do that to [the victim].”

Another witness stated Guilkey repeated that his actions against the victim were because “he’s a snitch.”

Guilkey is currently held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$30,000 cash only bond.



Larry is an accomplished trap shooter, and his help in fine tuning and their mental approach has been extremely valuable.”

“I can’t tell you how happy I am to see our two seniors, Levi and Elizabeth, go out in

the manner they did. These two have shown great leadership skills all season and have very bright futures ahead of them.”

The Jr. High team of Ty Howard, Samuel Jennings, Garrett Stanley, Olivia Ayer, and Caleb Ayer finished just 1 target behind the Champions from Rogersville and outdistancing 3rd place Silex by 26 targets. Ty led the Jr. High team shooting a 93/100.

“The sky is the limit with our Jr. High bunch. I can’t wait to see what they’re capable of when they reach High School. I honestly was a little nervous with this bunch at State for the obvious reason being we have two first year shooters on the squad. I knew that Ty, Samuel, and Garrett would be ok but didn’t really know how the brother/sister combo Olivia and Caleb would handle the pressure having had absolutely no experience at this level of competition. These shooters have worked their tails off all winter and I was very glad they got to experi-



ence what rewards can be achieved with a little old fashioned hard work. Their confidence level just went up a ton at this shoot and if they keep up their great work ethic, it will take them to even higher levels.”

“After the shoot ended, a lot of us stopped at Dowd’s Catfish House in Lebenon on the way home and let me tell you, the catfish tasted just a little better Saturday night.”

For four innings, this was a staring contest. Neither team could muster any offense. Purdy hitters were held to just two hits in those first four frames. Pierce City collected four. The green-clad Eagles wasted a golden opportunity in the fourth, collecting three hits but failing to score.

Libbey Strickler led off the home half of that inning with a cunning bunt single, but was cut down trying to steal second. A pair of two-out singles produced no runs, as Kristen Jones' at bat became a 4-3 groundout.

Both Purdy's Hallie Henderson and Pierce City's Ragan Blinzler were money on the mound, taking full advantage of a generous strike zone.

In the top of the fifth, Pierce City blinked.

Sami House smoked a leadoff double high off the

center field fence, then scored on an RBI single by Mikey Schad. Kylie Wood laid down a sac bunt to put Schad in scoring position. Then McKenzie Renkoski, the fastest player on the field, beat out a bunt single when the hurried throw pulled Jones off first base.

Senior Devyn Callahan rapped an RBI single to chase Schad home, and Purdy held a 2-0 lead.

Henderson burned through the Pierce City batters to finish the fifth, retiring Lexi Eck, Christine Stellwagen, and Kate Zebert with just five pitches.

Purdy picked up another pair of runs in the sixth inning with a two-out rally. House doubled into the left field corner and scored when Schad's Texas leaguer found the gap in left center. Wood ripped a worm killer through the box for an RBI single to plate Schad as the lead grew to 4-0.

Pierce City finally scratched a run home in the bottom of the sixth. Blinzler led off with a double, then scored on a wild play.

Strickler struck out, was safe at first on a dropped ball, and Blinzler reached home to put Pierce City on the scoreboard. Perhaps the most significant part of the play was

Casey Ellison's spot on throw to second base, where Zoe Brown slap-tagged Strickler. That was a base runner Pierce City couldn't afford to waste.

Then with two outs, catcher Ali Raley jumped all over a Henderson pitch and smoked a line drive to left center. But Wood sprinted across the outfield turf to the gap and Raley's double died in her outstretched glove for the third out.

Blinzler retired Purdy in order to start the seventh inning, and then Pierce City had one more chance to rattle the bats.

On the first pitch, Henderson thumped Jessica Prescott to give the green Eagles a free base runner.

Jones worked her plate appearance to a 3-2 count, then hit a towering fly ball to the right field corner. Renkoski, with her flame-red locks reflecting the stadium lights, turned completely around but regained her bearings to snag the first out of the inning.

Henderson then struck Eck out looking with a 1-2 pitch over that wide outside corner.

The Purdy faithful rose to their feet to cheer the final out, but Stellwagen quieted the crowd with a single. A single that changed the complexion of the game.

Pierce City had runners at the corners, and Kate Zebert represented the tying run at bat. Henderson burned a pair of strikes past Zebert, then wasted a pitch to create a 1-2 count. Zebert dug in to protect the plate and stroked a grounder to the right side. Brown scooped, threw, and watched Schad cradle the ball for the final out.

4-1, Purdy. It wasn't the 15-0 blowout of Crane, but it was enough to send the black and gold Eagles to a state semifinal appearance. Purdy, now 26-1, will face undefeated Lincoln at 7 PM on Friday at the Killian Sports Complex in Springfield. Strafford, 23-1 and owners of the only blemish on Purdy's record, will play Kennett at 5 PM.

The championship game is scheduled for Saturday at 1 PM.

McAuley Warriors earn district diamond title over Purdy

Just two weeks ago, the Purdy Eagles squeezed a 6-5 home victory over McAuley Catholic to clinch the Ozark 7 Conference title. On Tuesday, McAuley evened the slate with a 4-2 win over Purdy in the Class 2 District 12 championship game.

The game was played in the heart of old Joplin at venerable Joe Becker Stadium, originally built in 1913. The stadium has burned down twice in its long and storied history, but is an impressive facility following extensive recent renovations.

The park is big enough to host minor league games, with center field a full 400 feet from home plate, and measuring 320 feet down the baselines. Right field is both an adventure and a nightmare for the defense, with a hill slanting up from the warning track to the short fence. Right fielders peer directly into the setting sun above the third base bleachers.

But baseball is baseball, whether it is played in the shadow of the St. Louis arch or in a cow pasture. Players play, fans cheer.

Early on, the Purdy fans had the most reasons to cheer. After McAuley failed to score in the top of the first inning, Carl Hughlett ripped the very first offering from McAuley's Brendyn Taylor into deep center for a leadoff triple. Taylor retired James Hughlett but plunked Adam Humphrey to give Purdy a pair of baserunners. Then Andrew Martinez ripped an RBI single over first base to give the Eagles a 1-0 lead.

But Taylor survived the inning with no more damage. Humphrey was caught off third base and then thrown out at the plate, and Jose Sanchez hit into a 5-3 groundout..

Still, the Eagles held that early 1-0 lead.

The Warriors went in order in the second inning. But the Eagles stranded two more runners in their half of the second. Still 1-0, Purdy.

In the third inning, McAuley Catholic saw prayers answered. The first three batters reached base via a walk, an error, and a single to load the sacks. Nathan Taylor flied out but not deep

enough for the runners to tag and go. Then Jake Doyle's RBI grounder tied the game. Aaron Moran scored, and McAuley had runners at the corners after Purdy secured the second out at second base.

Dylan Londo came to the plate and turned a Ricky Aldaba fastball into a 3RBI home run. Londo circled the bases while the ball ricocheted in the empty bleachers beyond the left field fence. McAuley took a divine 4-1 lead.

The Warriors would not score again. But Purdy struggled at the plate, wasting opportunities and stranding baserunners in both the fourth and sixth innings as the score remained the same.

The Purdy bats finally came to life in the bottom of the seventh and final inning. Facing elimination, the Eagles were more aggressive at the plate. But after Mason Schallert drew a leadoff walk from Taylor, Kyler Propps and Carl Hughlett both struck out, and Purdy was one out away from a long off season.

Then, thanks to the MSHSAA pitch-count rule, McAuley changed pitchers. Tommy Doyle came on in relief of Taylor, who had just struck out consecutive batters. Doyle walked James Hughlett to give Purdy a pair of baserunners, and then surrendered an RBI double to Humphrey.

Suddenly, Purdy only trailed 4-2 and had the tying runs in scoring position. But Doyle coaxed a groundball from the bat of Martinez for a 4-3 groundout to end the game.

Purdy finished the season 14-8 while collecting the

second place district trophy. McAuley advances to play Galena in a Class 2 sectional game on Monday, May 22.

Serious play: Local wins favor with unique costumes

Comic-Con do. For some, festivals and conventions give them a chance to break out of the routine and experience fantasy life as they meet celebrities, show off costumes and meet

their comrades who share in that appreciation. And for others, like Bruce Holt, it's a chance to show off his craft: an undeniable talent for costume making.

For Holt, the costuming bug hit him early. He reminisced, "I remember I was 12 or 15 years old, making my own costumes." What started out as a Halloween endeavor spread. He said eventually he started replacing his costumes in school plays with his own creations. Childhood summers spent with his father in California fueled the creative side of him. The spark began there and eventually turned into wildfire.

Halloween became Holt's personal Super-bowl. He made elaborate costumes out of leather, plastic, fabric, anything he could find, trying to replicate his favorite characters and top his creation from the year before. He even dreamed of moving out to California and making costumes, but then he met his wife, Joyce, and they settled in Cassville. As they say in the movies, the rest is history, and Holt wouldn't change where he is.

For a number of years, Holt made costumes for fun and for the challenge. Then, in the late 80's, Holt started competing. He said, "It was around then that I realized there were prizes to be won; money to be won. I got a little more inventive with my craft then." One of his early costumes he made from the ground up, a Klingon from Star Trek. Even the facial prosthetics looked movie quality.

What began as a simple hobby transformed into

something much bigger. Now, he researches costume contests around Halloween and plans where he will compete. He attends anywhere from three to five conventions a year, sometimes Comic-Con and other times more specific venues like Star Trek conventions. Most recently, he competed in Kansas City at Planet Comicon where he brought with him an impressive trophy for his character adaptation of Morphysses from World of Warcraft that opens up more doors for him: Master Class Craftmanship. The same costume, without the additional mask he added for Kansas City, brought him Best of Show at Visioncon in Branson. Even so, Holt says winning isn't why he does it.

"I'm never unhappy if I don't win. I learn something everywhere I go. If you never lose, you never learn."

"I'm not after a trophy. It's more like this is my resume, these costumes," he said.

That resume now means he is not only making his own costumes, but people are hiring him to make theirs as well. The base level costumes without shoes start at around \$500, and that is without airbrushing work done. Thanks to his new medium, he's able to make costumes for other people that are lightweight, functional and cost efficient.

Initially, Holt used whatever he could find to make his creations, but now things are different, and he's moved on to using a special kind of foam to build everything from his shoes to his costume to his weaponry when he competes. All of his techniques are self taught.

His process starts with

an idea for a character, always something more intricate than what he has done before. Then he designs the costume on a torso mold of himself. Eventually he transfers his designs digitally in his computer, prints them and cuts them out of foam before the process of construction. From there, it's a matter of creating the right designs, patterns, and eventually moving on to air brushing, which he hires out, although he is learning that aspect of the process, too.

The EVA foam work he learned through trial and error and watching people work with it on YouTube. "Some people knew what they were doing and some people didn't," Holt mused. "I don't feel there's anything

I can't do out of it, though. It's much more lightweight and works really well."

The first costume he made out of EVA was for the Joplin-based 4-State Fusion football team, which was their mascot, Nuke Fusion. Since then, he's tried to make each costume "bigger and badder" than its predecessor.

Holt has gained such an appreciation for the material that it's all he uses. "With the EVA, you can do some much more, move better and it's lighter."

Years of learning techniques means he's gotten exceptionally adept at his craft, which he attributes to not being afraid to make mistakes. He also added, "I have a passion for it, and you've got to if you're going to do this." And he doesn't plan to stop anytime soon.

Holt lives in Cassville with his wife, Joyce.
