City of Seligman makes sewer, water improvements

NEW EQUIPMENT PURCHASED FOR RELIABILITY

The City of Seligman making strides in infrastructure improvements in their water and sewer departments. Two major purchases will improve the function of both the water and sewer systems in the city.

The sewer system improvement is a new rain rail at the city's sewer lagoon. City Clerk Brian Nichols said the equipment is replacing the city's old system, which was in disrepair. Nichols said, "We had a much larger one capable of putting out the same amount of water, but it was a model from 1982, and we were constantly replacing parts. It was just pretty much worn out."

The new system is the Amadas 2450 rain rail, a 1,050 roll of 4 1/2 inch hose that allows the city to get wanted to put in the sta-

rid of lagoon water. The equipment cost the city \$54,928.80. The purchase was made from Perkins Sales, of Bernie, Missouri, and was one of five bids the city received.

The new hose has a flow rate of 770 gallons per minute. Nichols said, "It allows the city to get rid of two weeks of wastewater in one full day of running it."

Public works employees use a tractor to pull the hose out and then an engine reels it back in once they are finished. The equipment is an immediate solution to a problem the city initially wanted to solve with stationary sprinkler guns at the lagoon. However, due to issue with the Department of Natural Resources, they were unable to install the sprinkler guns at this time.

Nichols said,

tionary guns, but DNR was requiring we put in enough guns to get rid of 54 million gallons a year [of wastewater], and in a good year, we get rid of 18 million gallons. It just wasn't reasonable."

The discrepancy between the city's needs and DNR's requirements come down to an issue with the city's permit. Nichols said the DNR error overestimates the capacity needs for the city. Nichols said, "We abandoned the guns for now and just purchased another rain rail. But we'll be moving forward with a sewer system study and see what we can get resolved with DNR."

The Seligman City Council approved Nichols to complete a community development block grant application that would provide 80 percent of the funding for a sewer system

study that will cost around \$50,000. The city already did the water system equivalent study in 2016.

Nichols said he hopes the sewer system study will tell DNR exactly what is wrong in their permit and allow them to fix it with accurate information. The grant application has been filled out and they expect to hear back in about a month.

The city also purchased a new generator for Well #4. The generator cost \$37,267 and was the bid selected from Clifford Power, of Oklahoma. The city received six bids on the Generac propane generator. It's purpose will be to keep the well running in the event of a power outage. Nichols said, "It's good to have a power source stand by since #4 is our primary



Seligman man arrested on child molestation charges

A Seligman man was arrested and charged with child molestation for an alleged incident in 2014. Charles Stephen Love, 31, of Seligman, is charged with child molestation in the first degree and tampering with a victim in a felony prsecution.

According to the affidavit of probable cause by the Barry County Sheriff's Department, the crime was reported to have happened at a residence on State Highway 90 in Washburn between August and November 2014. The state-

ment claims that the victim said Love touched her private areas over her clothes several times when she was

to "fix what has happened at home."

Love is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$50,000

10. The victim said the family was staying in the living room at that time because bedrooms were unavailable due to remodeling.

Bud's parents and brother, Jerry Allen Rogers, preceded Home, Monett.







Cassville man arrested for allegedly assaulting witness

A Cassville man was arrested for allegedly attacking another man who was a witness in a drug investigation. Justin Micah Guilkey, 36, of Cassville, is charged with robbery in the first degree, assault in the second degree and tampering with a witness in a felony prosecution.

According to the affidavit of probable cause by Cassville officer Jonathan Cherney, Guilkey was in a room at the Cassville Budget Inn when he asked the victim to come over and write his name on a piece of paper to compare his signature to another paper. Guilkey was comparing the signature to that of a witness statement on a narcotics case in Barry County where the victim was a witness. The victim

claimed when he bent over to sign it, Guilkey started beating him in the head with a metal flashlight saying, "I don't like (obscenity) snitches."

The victim then claimed Guilkey stole \$450 cash from his wallet. The victim was transported to the hospital by his girlfriend for his injuries which required five staples in his scalp. The girlfriend then told officers that Guilkey called her later that morning and said he was sorry he "had to do that to [the victim]."

Another witness stated Guilkey repeated that his actions against the victim were because "he's a snitch."



Both Southwest Middle School and High School Trapshooting Teams came home last weekend from Linn Creek as Missouri State Runner-up Champions.

The State Championships were moved to May 6th after being postponed due to heavy rain and flooding issues around the State the previous weekend.

The windy conditions Saturday proved to be a plus for Southwest.

"Our practice facility is at the Monett Sportsman's Club," said trap coach Mike Vining.

"While most trap fields face the north, the facility in Monett is facing the south. So at 80 percent of our practices, our kids are constantly shooting into the wind, which makes it very tough. I honestly was a little nervous with this bunch at State for the obvious reason being we have two first year shooters on the squad. I knew that Ty, Samuel, and Garrett would be ok but didn't really know how the brother/sister combo Olivia and Caleb would handle the pressure having had absolutely no experience at this level of competition. These shooters have worked their tails off all winter and I was very glad they got to experi-



ence what rewards can be achieved with a little old fashioned hard work. Their confidence level just went up a ton at this shoot and if they keep up their great work ethic, it will take them to even higher levels."





Just two weeks ago, the Purdy Eagles squeezed a 6-5 home victory over McAuley Catholic to clinch the Ozark 7 Conference title. On Tuesday, McAuley evened the slate with a 4-2 win over Purdy in the Class 2 District 12 championship game.

The game was played in the heart of old Joplin at venerable Joe Becker Stadium, originally built in 1913. The stadium has burned down twice in its long and storied history, but is an impressive facility following extensive recent renovations.

The park is big enough to host minor league games, with center field a full 400 feet from home plate, and measuring 320 feet down the baselines. Right field is both an adventure and a nightmare for the defense, with a hill slanting up from the warning track to the short fence. Right fielders peer directly into the setting sun above the third base bleachers.

But baseball is baseball, whether it is played in the shadow of the St. Louis arch or in a cow pasture. Players play, fans cheer.

Early on, the Purdy fans had the most reasons to cheer. After McAuley failed to score in the top of the first inning, Carl Hughlett ripped the very first offering from McAuley's Brendyn Taylor into deep center for a leadoff triple. Taylor retired James Hughlett but plunked Adam Humphrey to give Purdy a pair of baserunners. Then Andrew Martinez ripped an RBI single over first base to give the Eagles a 1-0 lead.

But Taylor survived the inning with no more damage. Humphrey was caught off third base and then thrown out at the plate, and Jose Sanchez hit into a 5-3 ground-

Still, the Eagles held that early 1-0 lead.

The Warriors went in order in the second inning. But the Eagles stranded two more runners in their half of the second. Still 1-0, Purdy.

In the third inning, McAuley Catholic prayers answered. The first three batters reached base via a walk, an error, and a single to load the sacks. Nathan



Serious play: Local wins favor with unique costumes

Playing pretend isn't just for kids. The world is filled with adults who get lost in it. If nothing else proves that, events all across the globe like

Comic-Con do. For some, festivals and conventions give them a chance to break out of the routine and experience fantasy life as they meet celebrities, show off costumes and meet



their comrades who share in that appreciation. And for others, like Bruce Holt, it's a chance to show off his craft: an undeniable talent for costume making.

For Holt, the costuming bug hit him early. He reminisced, "I remember I was 12 or 15 years old, making my own costumes." What started out as a Halloween endeavor spread. He said eventually he started replacing his costumes in school plays with his own creations. Childhood summers spent with his father in California fueled the creative side of him. The spark began there and eventually turned into wildfire.

Halloween became Holt's personal Superbowl. He made elaborate costumes out of leather, plastic, fabric, anything he could find, trying to replicate his favorite characters and top his creation from the year before. He even dreamed of moving out to California and making costumes, but then he met his wife, Joyce, and they settled in Cassville. As they say in the movies, the rest is history, and Holt wouldn't change where he is.

For a number of years, Holt made costumes for fun and for the challenge. Then, in the late 80's, Holt started competing. He said, "It was around then that I realized there were prizes to be won; money to be won. I got a little more inventive with my craft then." One of his early costumes he made from the ground up, a Klingon from Star Trek. Even the facial prosthetics looked movie quality.

What began as a simple hobby transformed into

something much bigger. Now, he researches costume contests around Halloween and plans where he will compete. He attends anywhere from three to five conventions a year, sometimes Comic-Con and other times more specific venues like Star Trek conventions. Most recently, he competed in Kansas City at Planet Comicon where he brought with him an impressive trophy for his character adaptation of Morphysses from World of Warcraft that opens up more doors for him: Master Class Craftsmanship. The same costume, without the additional mask he added for Kansas City, brought him Best of Show at Visioncon in Branson. Even so, Holt says winning isn't why he does it.

"I'm never unhappy if I don't win. I learn something everywhere I go. If you never lose, you never learn."

"I'm not after a trophy. It's more like this is my resume, these costumes," he said.

That resume now means he is not only making his own costumes, but people are hiring him to make theirs as well. The base level costumes without shoes start at around \$500, and that is without airbrushing work done. Thanks to his new medium, he's able to make costumes for other people that are lightweight, functional and cost efficient.

Initially, Holt used whatever he could find to make his creations, but now things are different, and he's moved on to using a special kind of foam to build everything from his shoes to his costume to his weaponry when he competes. All of his techniques are self taught.

His process starts with

an idea for a character, always something more intricate than what he has done before. Then he designs the costume on made out of EVA was for a torso mold of himself. Eventually he transfers his designs digitally in his computer, prints them and cuts them out of foam before the process of construction. From there, it's a matter of creating the right designs, patterns, and eventually moving on to air brushing, which he hires out, although he is learning that aspect of the process,

The EVA foam work he learned through trial and error and watching people work with it on YouTube. "Some people knew what they were doing and some people didn't," Holt mused. "I don't feel there's anything I can't do out of it, though. It's much more lightweight and works really well."

The first costume he the Joplin-based 4-State Fusion football team, which was their mascot, Nuke Fusion. Since then, he's tried to make each costume "bigger and badder" than its predecessor.

Holt has gained such an appreciation for the material that it's all he uses. "With the EVA, you can do some much more, move better and it's lighter."

Years of learning techniques means he's gotten exceptionally adept at his craft, which he attributes to not being afraid to make mistakes. He also added, "I have a passion for it, and you've got to if you're going to do this." And he doesn't plan to stop anytime soon.

Holt lives in Cassville with his wife, Joyce.
