# Kids' Fishing Day this Saturday

Spring is here and hopefully the fish will be biting on Saturday for Roaring River's Kids' Fishing Day. The spring Kids' Fishing Day is this Saturday, May 19, and the hatchery is stocking the waters with 2,000 trout for kids to catch for

According to Paul Spurgeon, Roaring River's hatchery manager, this year will be similar to years past. He said, "We'll be stocking the waters the night before and all day during the event, and we'll have 50 lunkers."

Kids Fishing Day happens twice a year at Missouri State Parks' trout parks. Kids age 15 and under can fish all day on Saturday for free until they catch their limit. There are also special classes for all different interests. At the end of the day, there will be prizes given away to kids and parents thanks to sponsors' donations.

He added that this year will

have bluegrass music on the stage for most of the day again. He said, "They'll be on the stage from 10 a.m. to around 3 p.m. If anyone wants to just come sit and listen, they can do that, too."

Spurgeon said they are still looking for volunteers to come help. Whether experienced anglers or not, Spurgeon said they can always use extra hands during the event. He said, "We'll need more volunteers. They can call the hatchery or just show up at the tent and say they want to help. We always need volunteers for these events."

For kids who catch their limit or who don't feel like fishing, the day will also be filled with multiple classes and activities. From archery to fly casting to snake identification to flint knapping, there will be something for everyone in attendance.

Kids can pick up their free fishing tags at the hatchery office all day on May 18 or the day of the event in the big tent. Fishing will be from 6:30 a.m. to 8:15 p.m. on Saturday, May

Prize drawings will be held 5 p.m. Kids can win fishing equipment, sports equipment, bicycles and more as long as they attended three of the classes during the day. Parent appreciation prizes will also be given away at that time. This year's parent appreciation prizes will be a stay at the Roaring River Inn and Big Cedar Lodge.

Spurgeon added, "We've got really good prizes this year. The sponsors have come through again for us."

# One killed, one air lifted in US 60 wreck near Monett

A Monett woman was killed in a crash outside of Monett last week. According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, one of the vehicles failed to stop at a stop sign, causing it to be hit in the side, killing the driver.

On Friday, May 11, Jimmie P. Davidson, 79, of Cassville, was driving a 2006 Chevrolet HHR southbound on a side road about two miles west of Monett. At 9:43 a.m., Davidson failed to stop at a stop sign and was struck in the side by a second vehicle headed westbound, a 1989 Chevrolet pickup, driven by Perry C. Cantrell, 80, of Springfield.

Davidson was pronounced deceased at the scene at 10:00 a.m. by Lawrence County Coroner Scott Lakin.

Cantrell was air lifted to Cox South Hospital in Springfield for moderate injuries.

Both drivers were wearing seat belts at the time of the crash. Both vehicles were totalled. The HHR was towed by West 60 Auto, of Monett, and the pickup was towed by US Auto, of Monett.

This is the 35th fatality for Missouri State Highway Patrol Troop D in 2018. The next of kin were notified.

from the Barry County Sheriff's Department, the crime took place on May 8 on Farm Road 1157 in Aurora. Foster allegedly shot a 20 gauge shotgun at the victim, who was in a vehicle on the farm road. The victim was hit by one of the pellets from the shot gun, leaving a red mark on his stomach, according to officers.

The victim's vehicle also sustained exterior and interior damage.

When officers questioned Foster, they stated he made a spontaneous utterance admitting to shooting the victim because he was on "his property." Officers claimed Foster was intoxicated and smelled of alcohol.

Foster is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$100,000 cash-only bond.

# OACAC hosts open house for National Community Action Month

In honor of May being National Community Action Month, the Ozarks Area Community Action Corporation (OACAC) Neighborhood Center in Cassville is hosting an open house and inviting the community to learn more about what they do. The open house will be on Wednesday, May 23, from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Gail Reed, supervisor for the Neighborhood Center, said they are hoping to make the community more aware of everything they do for families in Barry County. She said, "I think people would be really surprised to know how many people, working families, we serve every day."

OACAC offers a number of programs in Barry County, including housing assistance, emergency shelter assistance, utility assistance, a school readiness fair, Head Start preschool, and life skills classes that teach a variety of topics. They also work with area schools to put on programs like REALL and VOICE, which exposes school-aged children to different careers and how different choices can impact their lives long-term.

Reed said, "We want families to be more self-sufficient and that is what we try to do with our programs. We serve a lot of families where both parents are working and, if they work for minimum wage now, they can't make it sometimes. Whether they need help

with utilities, or we do clothing giveaways or school supplies for their kids, it can mean the difference between making their rent or not."

Reed said that is a common misconception people have about programs through OACAC. She said most of the families who utilize services are working families, and that they also have a lot of senior citizens who are helped, as well.

She shared, "We serve a lot of elderly and disabled families. I think people have a misconception that we don't serve as many elderly people and disabled that come here for services for different things we have. We have quite a few who come to the life skills classes to learn about different topics like on nutrition and budget-

Reed said all of the programs are geared toward providing aid to people in the community in need, whether that is long term or short term.

On average, Reed said they have around 20 families utilizing services, however, special programs can draw a lot more than that. One of the more well-known large scale events is the annual school readiness

Each fall, families who qualify can take their kids to the fair to get their school supplies, as well as participate in fun and games and get a free meal. Reed said they offer the program to over 400 kids each

She said, "When we started the school fair so long ago, I literally went to three or four business people in town and got \$200 and bought basic supplies, no backpacks, and nothing else. In my heart, I knew what a difference it would make even for those 15 or 20 kids who could walk into the school with new crayons and paper."

From there, the school readiness fair eventually formed, getting kids all supplies on their list, new backpacks, shoes and more. She said, "We want the kids to start out on an even keel with everybody else, and that's one of the ways that happens.

"A lot of the time, people don't have that much money to get all the supplies, which are expensive."

For some families, a little bit of help can make a big difference during trying times. Reed explained, "I have literally seen families that come here and say that if they can't get help with their electric bill, they can't buy groceries or pay their rent. These are working people. But a little help with one bill means the difference between making rent or having to find a new place to live. We serve a lot of working families."

Of the family assistance program, OACAC also offers weatherization programs that help make homes more energy efficient, emergency help for shelter, clothing drives and housing assistance.

Reed said, "We do a clothing giveaway every quarter. I

appreciate being able to do that through a consignment shop here in town. That's exciting to do. They come and get clothes for their families."

There is also the Head Start preschool program for kids from low income and at risk families.

Reed said she hopes the community comes in during the open house to learn all about what they do and why they do it. She said, "For me personally, being able to make a difference in people's lives is why we are important. That sounds cliched, but it really is. I feel like we make a difference every day in people's lives. Whatever we do, whether it's one-on-one help through utilities or weatherization, or it's the REALL experience or VOICE where you give a kid something to think about for their future. We're just trying to promote self sufficiency and

help people out."





# Cassville motel incident leads to domestic assault charge

Jason M. McGinnis, 39, of Monett, was arrested and charged with an assault from May 1. According to the affidavits of probable cause by the Cassville Police Department, McGinnis attacked his girlfriend after she refused to have sexual relations.

The report states that the assault took place at America's Best Value Inn on Highway 37 in Cassville. McGinnis allegedly went into the bathroom where the victim was taking a shower in an attempt to have sexual relations. When the victim turned him

down, the police reported McGinnis began strangling the victim, causing stitches from a recent surgery to pop open.

The victim reported being unable to breathe and losing her balance, falling in the tub. The officer reported seeing red marks on the victim's upper arms as well as her neck.

McGinnis was charged with domestic assault in the second degree. He was booked into the Barry County Jail on May 14 and is currently being held in lieu of a \$25,000 cash only bond.

# Seligman man injured in Washburn crash

The motorcycle sustained moderate damage and was removed from the scene by



# Royal Family Kids Camp gives foster kids memories of a lifetime

Each year, a local camp offers a special opportunity to kids who've faced tough challenges in their lives. The Royal Family Kids Camp, a foster-kids-only Christian outreach, hosts kids for a week of fun and games in the outdoors each summer.

Emily and Max Akers are the directors of the local Royal Family Kids Camp and started the week-long camps 11 years ago. Emily shared that she felt God led her and her husband to reach out to foster kids. She said, "God really gave me a heart for kids. Then, he focused it on foster kids and we became foster parents and have adopted as well."

Now, the Akers run the camp each summer, usually in June, for kids from Barry, Stone and Lawrence Counties, and sometimes other outlying counties, as well.

Akers said, "We usually work with DFS (Department of Family Services) and through counselors involved with foster kids, but mainly it's through DFS."

Once kids are referred to them for the camp, Akers said that they typically take between 20 and 30 children. She said, "We are only limited by finances, volunteers

and the availability of kids."

Since the camp is run purely through donations, the Akers' rely on help from the community for it to become a reality each year. They also have to have an adequate number of volunteers to make sure the campers are entertained and safe.

Akers said, "We usually have 35 to 40 volunteers each year, and they have to have special training since they are foster kids."

The training ensures all volunteers are familiar with the appropriate way to deal with issues that may arise, special considerations for children who have experienced abuse or neglect, and are equipped to act as mentors for the kids at the camp, according to the official Royal Family Kids Camp website.

The Akers' themselves had to undergo training to be directors of the camp, as well. She said, "My husband and I started helping build a camp facility specifically for this ministry many years ago. In the process of that, we did training for Royal Family and then started directing."

She added, "We had other people we were building the facility with help, but this was mainly God calling my

husband and I into being directors."

The stipulations for directors, volunteers and the camp itself are fairly strict to be sure the campers have a fun, safe time at the camp, which runs for five days.

Akers said making sure the campers have a good time is the main mission. "I think it's important because foster kids struggle to know how much they are loved and that they are special, and that is what this camp sets out to do for them.

"This camp sets out to tell them they are special and important, regardless of what has happened in their lives already."

While the kids are there, they do typical camp activities like swimming, fishing, games, and arts and crafts. They also have Bible study time and work with horses.

However, one of the more unique activities at Royal Family Kids Camp is the group birthday party they hold every year. Akers explained, "Everyone has a birthday. There are actually kids every year that have not had birthday parties. So, we do a great big birthday party with a birthday cake, and they get to dress up. They each get around \$50 worth

of birthday presents. Some of them have just never had that before. Then, we have a carnival afterwards."

Aside from a large garage sale fundraiser in April or May each year, Royal Family Kids Camp relies on donations. They accept donations to run the camp as well as to buy birthday gifts for the kids who attend.



# Four arrested for drugs following traffic stop in Monett




It appeared that Purdy would extend that lead, but Pierce City's left fielder Gage Brown cut down runners at the plate on consecutive plays to end the inning.



#### **Driver airlifted after** Roaring River motorcycle wreck





### Cassville's Hannah Kelley selected for state academic honor


