

Facebook school shooting post leads to terroristic charge

POST ALLEGEDLY SAID 350 LIKES/REACTIONS AND MAN WOULD SHOOT UP SCHOOL

A Crane man was arrested and charged with terroristic threats after a Facebook post stated he was going to commit a school shooting.

Damien Dale Hilton, 20, who lives just west of Crane in Barry County, is charged with making terroristic threats in the second degree, a Class E felony.

According to the affidavit of probable cause, Hilton wrote the threat on his Facebook on Monday, May 22, at 11:13 p.m. The post allegedly read, “350 like/reactions and ima shoot up a school.”

The probable cause by Barry County Sheriff’s Deputy Kyle Rhea stated Hilton also said, “If somebody show up here ian kno ima blow they f-----n brains out.”

Hilton was booked into the Barry County Jail at 12:12 a.m. on Wednesday, May 24. He is currently being held in the jail in lieu of a \$50,000 cash-only bond. An

initial arraignment hearing was held on Thursday, May 25, and a disposition hearing is scheduled for June 6 at 8:30 a.m. with the honorable Judge Robert Foulke.

When reached for comment, Crane Superintendent Dr. Chris Johnson said that the school was not locked down, but precautions have been taken. “The school did not go into lock down because it happened when we were not in session,” Johnson said.

“We did take precautions,” Johnson said. “With it being that close to school, even though Crane was not specified, I made sure that summer school administrators and teachers know about [Hilton] and that he is not to be buzzed in and that the police should be called, if he is seen on campus.”

“The safety of our kiddos is always our top priority,” Johnson concluded.

Wheaton purchases two new buses utilizing Clean Diesel grant

Wheaton Schools has purchased two new buses with the aid of a grant that promotes environmental improvement. The district purchased two new 2018 Bluebird buses to replace two older buses on their fleet, and they were delivered on Friday, May 26.

Through the National

Clean Diesel Rebate Program, the school was able to get grant funding to help subsidize the cost of the buses. Wheaton’s Superintendent Dr. Lance Massey said, “Wheaton School Transportation Director Gary Bertalotto completed the application that was due November 1, 2016. We were informed in early December

that we were a recipient of the grant.”

Each bus received a rebate of \$20,000, meaning the school received a total of \$40,000.

The Wheaton School Board opened and reviewed bus bids at their February 21 meeting and selected the buses from Central States Bus Sales for \$85,589 per

bus.

The funding for the buses was provided by Security Bank of Southwest Missouri. Bank president Jon Horner was also present on Friday when the buses were delivered to the school. LJ Hart and Company was the company that secured financing for the district, and Security was selected to secure the

investment.

Currently, Wheaton Schools has a fleet of eight buses. The two new buses are replacing 1998 and 2001 buses. The fleet will remain at eight buses. Dr. Massey said the two older buses will be scrapped.

Dr. Massey said the school will receive the rebates on the two older

buses as soon as they are scrapped. He said it should be within six months.

Wheaton was one of four Missouri school districts selected for the rebate program. Nationwide, only 88 applicants were awarded rebates. The total for all of the school districts who received funding across the country was \$7.7 million.

Three teens injured in UTV crash near Shell Knob

Three teenagers* were injured when their UTV flipped south of Shell Knob. According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, two 14 year old children and a 15 year old were injured when the UTV was not maintaining a single lane of travel and ran off the road and overturned.
The report stated the crash involved a Polaris Ranger UTV on Friday, May 26, around 6:02 p.m. One 14 year old, of Olathe, Kan., was driving westbound on Farm Road 1216 two miles south of Shell Knob, with the other two teens as passengers. She was unable to maintain a single lane of travel, travelled off the roadway and overturned.

Monett man charged with \$12K cash, firearm theft

A burglary that included \$12,000 in cash, medications and a handgun leads to the arrest and charges against Evan Mareth, 18, of Monett, the victims' son. According to the affidavits of probable cause, Mareth stole some of the items from a safe at the residence located on Farm Road 1090.
Barry County Sheriff's Department Detective Doug Henry investigated the incident and reported that Sergeant Bill Watkins investigated the theft of \$12,000 cash, a Smith and

Wesson Shield handgun and prescription medications on May 12. The medications reported missing were Adderal, Percocet and a few bottles of Tylenol 3.
On May 18, Det. Henry executed a search warrant at the residence on Farm Road 1090 and reported to have found empty envelopes from the money under Mareth's mattress. There was also a marijuana pipe in Mareth's room and a box on his dresser with a clear vial that field tested posi-

tive for cocaine. Det. Henry also found the medication stolen in Mareth's pickup, along with a small baggie with a white substance inside.
Mareth is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$20,000 cash-only bond ordered by Judge Robert Foulke. Mareth has been charged with three founts of possession of a controlled substance, theft of a firearm and stealing \$750 or more.



Eagle Rock man allegedly fires handgun, grazes victim

An Eagle Rock man racked up charges after allegedly shooting a handgun and grazing the victim’s leg. Thomas E. Crone, 56, of Eagle Rock is charged with domestic assault in the first degree, armed criminal action and endangering the welfare of a child.

According to the affidavit of probable cause by Barry County Deputy Taylor Lombard, the incident took place on Monday, May 22, on Farm Road 1218 in Eagle Rock. Crone allegedly fired a semiautomatic handgun at the victim, grazing his right leg. Lombard reported he was attempting to kill or cause serious injury to the victim.

Crone’s child endangerment charge stemmed from a minor who was present at the time of the shooting. The report states the child was in close proximity to the altercation.

Crone is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$40,000 cash-only bond. Crone had an arraignment on Thursday, May 25, and has a disposition hearing set for June 6 in front of Judge Robert Foulke.

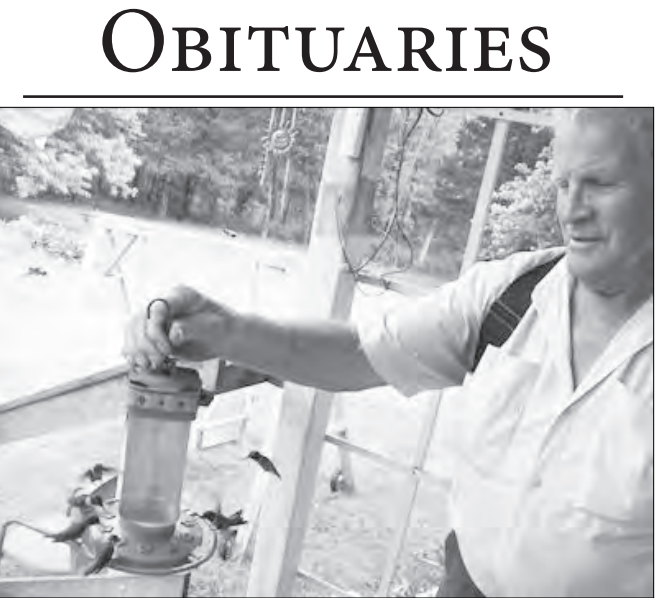

Lafayette’s Hindman dominates State track meet

Austin Hindman was the big story at the MSHSAA large schools State track meet in Jefferson City over the weekend. Hindman won four gold medals in sweeping the distance events, leaving overall and class records in his wake.

The Lafayette senior dominated the Class 5 competition. On Friday, he won the 1600 in a class record 4:09.67, the fastest high school metric mile in Missouri since Adam Perkins set the Class 4 record in 2002 with his 4:08.14. Hindman then won the 800 meter event in 1:55 flat.

Saturday saw the meet interrupted by storms. The afternoon respite aided Hindman's attempt to break the hallowed overall state record in the 3200, the 8:57.23 set by Olympian Matt Tegenkamp back in 2000. After Lafayette won the 4x800 meter relay, Hindman enjoyed a long afternoon rest while the stadium was cleared.

Tegenkamp's record was also set during unusual con-

ditions. A weather delay allowed him to run under the stadium lights instead of under a blazing afternoon sun. The 3200 event is normally contested in the middle of the afternoon, often under scorching temps and high humidity. Coaches and medical advisors have complained for years about the dangers of running a distance race in those extreme conditions and have pushed, unsuccessfully, for moving some of the distance events to a morning or evening schedule.

With Saturday's weather delay, the 3200 event didn't start until 8:30 p.m., and Hindman, who earlier in the season ran an 8:43 at Arcadia, Cali, cranked out an 8:54.92 to overtake Teg at the top of the Missouri record book.

Carlie Queen of SCA won the Class 3 high jump, setting class and overall records when she cleared the bar at 5-11.

Brandon Miller, a freshman from John Burroughs, won the Class boys 800 with the fastest time of the day,

1:50.84.

The top area performances belonged to East Newton's Kinsey Sorrell and Springfield Catholic's Stephen Kielhofner. She won the Class 3 girls 800 in 2:20.02, while he won the Class 3 boys 1600 in 4:19.67.

It was a tough day for Cassville's Austin Wilson and

Brianna Hemphill in Class 3. Wilson failed to make the finals of the 400 meter dash, and his 53.48 was 15th best in the preliminary heats. Hemphill finished 16th in the triple jump with her 31-08.5.

Motorcyclist ejected from bike after hitting SUV

A motorcyclist was injured in a crash near Cape Fair after losing control of his bike and hitting an SUV over the weekend. According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, Andrew C. Gaston, 27, of Aurora, was travelling westbound and crossed the center line of EE about five miles east of Cape Fair.

On Saturday, May 17, around 2 p.m., Gaston was headed westbound when he lost control of his 2003

Harley Davidson 20C and crossed the center line, hitting a 2012 GMC Acadia headed westbound, driven by Shannon N. Brewer, 44, also of Aurora. Gaston was ejected from his motorcycle, leading to serious injuries.

Gaston was taken to Cox South Hospital of Springfield by ambulance for serious injuries. No other injuries were reported at the time of the crash. Brewer was wearing a seat belt. Gaston was not wearing a helmet.

The Acadia suffered extensive damage and the motorcycle was totalled. Both were towed from the scene by Double Eagle Towing, of Marionville.

trailer for them, a six foot by ten foot 2017 Patriot trailer. The boys went with their scoutmaster and assistant scoutmaster to pick it up in Springfield.

Sims said the boys were really shocked by how the community responded. He stated, "They were amazed when they walked in for our meeting and saw all of the stuff set up that people had donated. They couldn't believe that."

"They said 'They didn't have to do that,' but I tell them that all of that community service stuff you boys do for people, they see that and they want to help you."

"It was truly amazing. They were surprised by all the outpouring of support they are getting."

While the original trailer was recovered by the Newton County Sheriff's Department, the camping equipment was not, and the trailer itself was in no condition to be used until extensive work can be put back into it. Sims said, "Whoever it was used it to haul a bunch of greasy stuff in it, and I'll have to sand the floor and repaint just for it to be usable."

He also said they vandalized the trailer, as well. "They gutted the trailer completely. There's nothing left in it. Even the things they recovered inside weren't ours. They knocked all of the running lights out of it, took all of the bulbs. They really did a number on it."

He added, "We even lost our Troop flag and U.S. flag. I was hoping they would be in the trailer when they found it, but they even took out the tubing we kept them in." Sims said one person replaced the U.S., but they were still in need of the Troop flag.

Officer Danny Boyd

with the Cassville Police Department said the trailer was recovered by Newton County Sheriff's Department, but that there were no current leads on who might have stolen the trailer. It was stolen from the Troop's building on Mill Street in Cassville last Sunday morning.

The trailer and equipment inside are used by the boys four or five times a year for camp. With donations coming in from people across the Ozarks, Sims said they are close to what they had before.

"We're pretty close to replacing everything. I still have to pick up a couple things before we leave for camp, but we're set to where we can go. Between two or three leaders, we'll pull together and make it happen."

Sims added that his troop isn't the only one that this has happened to.

"I didn't expect anybody to step up like they did. It's happened to other troops, but they never went public with it. If we end up with extras, we'll be passing along any extra equipment we have to other troops that have lost things. We'll take care of our own."

Sims said with their original trailer back in their possession and the new trailer, they will be keeping them on private property for now. The trailer used to be stored in a lean-to at the Barry County Sheriff's Office, but storm damage took that area out of commission. Sims added they might move one of the trailers back under it if the area is restored.

Southwest participates in special Health Education classes, upcoming camp offered

The Southwest Missouri Area Health Education Center (AHEC) serves to offer medical or health care career experiences to middle and high school students. AHEC started a pilot program in the 2015-2016 school year to provide workshops to rural schools and has continued in the 2016-2017 school year.

“Our AHEC realized that we were unable to reach all of our rural students with our previous programming so we decided to create a list of “transportable,” medically-based workshops that we could take on the road to our schools more than an hour from our Springfield hub site to expose students to health career options. We are happy to announce that our pilot has been very successful,” says Health Programs Coordinator Heather Phillips. “Two of our most active schools have been Southwest High School in Washburn and Osceola High School in Osceola, both schools are about an hour and a half from Springfield. Through our program on the road, students have had the opportunity to practice medical skills such as drawing blood on a mannequin (phlebotomy), dissecting assorted body systems on animal specimens, infection prevention measures such as gowning and gloving, CPR and First Aid skills and certification, emergency preparedness/triage, and oral health and nutrition topics have also been covered,” she says.

“On March 22, we provided a new opportunity through our partnership with the First Hand Foundation called “Healthe Foundations.” Through the Healthe Foundations Program, students at Southwest High School were able to learn about a virtual patient who was 17 years old and experienced a traumatic brain injury, due to a car accident while texting and driving. Students felt they could relate to this patient and were able

to learn a lot from her medical case. The students each played a role on the healthcare “team” and prepared a care plan for their virtual patient. They reviewed her physical exam and all her labs, radiology tests, pharmacology, and decided what education and care she would need to fully recover. At the end of the school day, they were able to put a presentation together outlining their care plan for their patient and present it.”

The students commented on the experience: “I learned what a TBI (Traumatic Brain Injury) is and not to text and drive.” “I learned what normal pulse rate is,” “I learned the long term and short term effects of a TBI,” “I learned how to be a nurse and about medications,” and “I learned new things about trauma and medications.” The additional comments are always good too! They included: “FUN,” “liked and loved it,” “enjoyed the instructor.”

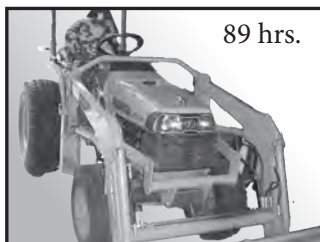

Monett Bus. 60 to close for bridge replacement, public meeting planned

People who live and work in the Monett area and use Business 60 east of Monett are encouraged to attend a public meeting Tuesday, June 6, to learn more about plans to close the road to replace an aging railroad bridge, the Missouri Department of Transportation said.

The come-and-go style meeting is planned from 4:30 to 6 p.m. on Tuesday, June 6, at the Monett Chamber of Commerce at 200 E.

Broadway Street. No formal presentation is planned.

Those unable to attend the in-person meeting can visit an online public meeting at www.modot.gov/southwest. The same exhibits displayed at the in-person meeting will be available online.

MoDOT representatives will be on hand at the in-person meeting to visit with area residents about the plan to rebuild the bridge with a higher and wider structure. The project is scheduled to begin the week of June 19 and that's when Business 60 will close for the duration of the project.

Contractor crews have until Dec. 29, 2017, to complete the bridge and open the road to traffic. However, barring any construction delays or weather delays, crews expect to complete the work and reopen Business 60 by the fall.

While Business 60 is closed, a detour will be set up using U.S. Route 60. Drivers can also use Lawrence County Route W to get around the project.

The existing Business 60 bridge was built in 1935 and carries 3,480 vehicles a day. Over the past several years, the bridge has been in need of frequent repairs.

The new bridge will be 30 feet wide and will no longer have a height restriction because the overhead truss system will be removed.

Hartman & Company, Inc. of Springfield is the prime contractor on the project.

The total estimated project cost is \$3.7 million.

Governor requests federal disaster assistance

On May 24, Gov. Eric Greitens requested that President Donald Trump approve a major disaster declaration for Missouri that would provide federal assistance to a total of 51 counties in response to historic and devastating flooding that began April 28.

“As soon as safely possible, damage assessment teams began operating all over Missouri. Their reports confirm just how devastating this historic flood was for many communities in Missouri,” Gov. Eric Greitens said. “Today, I am requesting that President Trump approve federal assistance for flood survivors and businesses. This assistance will help our people begin to rebuild, and help local communities with costly emergency response and infrastructure repair costs. The people of Missouri are strong. Communities are coming together to rebuild. Support from the administration is essential to that effort.”

The flooding brought as much as 10-12 inches of rain to some areas, pushed at least a dozen rivers and major creeks to records crests, led to hundreds of flood rescues and evacuations, and resulted

in major damage and the destruction of hundreds of homes and businesses.

Based on joint Preliminary Damage Assessments conducted by the State Emergency Management Agency, Federal Emergency Management Agency and local officials, Gov. Greitens is requesting Individual Assistance for 37 Missouri counties, which would allow eligible residents to seek federal assistance with temporary housing, housing repairs, replacement of damaged belongings, vehicles and other qualifying expenses as a result of the flooding. The Governor is also requesting that the U.S. Small Business Administration assist businesses, homeowners, and renters in the 37 counties with low-interest loans.

The 37 counties for which Individual Assistance is being requested are: Bollinger, Butler, Carter, Christian, Crawford, Dent, Douglas, Dunklin, Franklin, Gasconade, Greene, Howell, Iron, Jasper, Jefferson, Laclede, Madison, Maries, McDonald, Morgan, Newton, Oregon, Osage, Ozark, Pemiscot, Phelps, Pulaski, Reynolds, Ripley, Ste. Gen-

evieve, St. Louis, Shannon, Stone, Taney, Texas, Wayne, and Wright.

Based on joint Preliminary Damage Assessments conducted by SEMA, FEMA and local officials, Gov. Greitens has also requested Public Assistance for 45 Missouri counties, in order to allow local governments and qualifying nonprofit agencies to seek federal assistance for reimbursement of emergency response and recovery costs, including repair and replacement costs for damaged roads, bridges, and other public infrastructure.

The 45 counties for which Public Assistance is being requested are: Barry, Barton, Bollinger, Butler, Camden, Carter, Cedar, Christian, Cole, Crawford, Dade, Dallas, Dent, Douglas, Dunklin, Franklin, Gasconade, Howell, Iron, Jefferson, Lawrence, Madison, Maries, Miller, McDonald, Morgan, Newton, Oregon, Osage, Ozark, Perry, Phelps, Pike, Pulaski, Ralls, Reynolds, Ripley, Shannon, Stone, Taney, Texas, Washington, Wayne, Webster, and Wright.

Those affected by the flooding are encouraged to continue documenting losses

by photographing damage and retaining all receipts. As additional information about damage becomes available, the Governor may add other counties to his request.

On April 28, Gov. Greitens declared a state of emergency in preparation for the heavy rain and flash flooding that National Weather Service forecasts indicated would impact much of the state. The emergency declaration activated the Missouri State Emergency Operations Plan, allowing state agencies to coordinate quickly with local jurisdictions to provide emergency services as needs arose. On April 30, the Governor signed an executive order that activated hundreds of Missouri National Guardsmen in addition to those who were initially participating in helicopter search and rescue missions. Since the start of this emergency, every department in our State government has contributed to the relief and recovery effort.
