

JD Fletcher honored: A fishing legacy remembered



For many fishermen who have visited Barry County over the past five decades, the person who introduced them to the prime fishing spots was the same man. For over 50 years, JD Fletcher, a lifelong Barry County resident, took locals and visitors alike fishing to show them the good spots and share in memories for multiple generations.

In recognition of the years JD dedicated to his passion, a Kings River Access was named for him and his huge collection of antique fishing gear is displayed in a Springfield fishing museum.

JD served as a guide to area fishing for decades until his death in 2014. His son, Jeff, said, "A lot of people

Community mourns 8-year-old who drowned in Flat Creek

The community is mourning the loss of an 8-year old Cassville boy who drowned in Flat Creek on Friday. Haiden Conner Harrison, 8, was unable to be resuscitated after going underwater while swimming with friends. Conner's grandmother, Iris Slater, said, "He was full of life, and he wanted everyone to enjoy life and Jesus. That was him." Slater had guardianship of Conner.

According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol drowning incident report, Harrison was swimming in Flat Creek about three miles north of Cassville. Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly said he was swimming with some friends in a popular swimming hole in Flat Creek near the low-water bridge at Farm Road 2140 and Y Highway. The water is estimated to be between six and eight feet deep at the bridge.

Epperly said, "His friends looked for him for about ten minutes, and then they ran to a house to call 911."

The Barry County Sheriff's Department, Cassville first responders, Cassville Fire Department, the Missouri State Highway Patrol and Mercy Emergency Services all helped in the search and recovery of Conner.

While Epperly, Barry County detective Doug Henry and Sergeant Dave Ruark were searching one side of the bank when

someone spotted Conner from the other side. Epperly said, "We waded through waist-deep water to get to him and start CPR, but he was face down in the creek." Epperly, Henry and Ruark put the boy on a backboard and continued to administer CPR as they raced across a field to a waiting pickup truck driven by Gary Fields to get Conner to the hospital.

Once at Mercy Hospital, Dr. Cox worked on the boy for the better part of an hour, but he was unable to be resuscitated. Dr. Cox finally called the boy's death at 2:26 p.m.

Slater expressed her gratitude for all that the officers and doctors did to try to save Conner's life. "They stayed up there at the hospital past what they would have done for most people. They kept trying, and I'm so thankful for that."

Slater added, "I really want to thank Barry County officers and the hospital, because they did everything they could to save him. They were there for me after he was gone, that meant a lot to me. I'd especially like to thank Mick Epperly and his officers."

Epperly was somber when discussing the incident and stated, "It was really rough when it's a kid like that. It was hard for all of us." Epperly and his officers had been hailed as no less than heroes by many in the community for working so hard to save Conner's

life.

Slater said, "Conner wanted to grow up to be a police officer. Every time one of the officers seen him up at Jump Stop, they were always giving him money. He really liked Mick."

The mother of one of Conner's close friends, Amy Driskill, described the boy as loving to play video games, ride his bike and wrestling. She said, "He was a typical little boy full of energy and love for people. I don't think he ever met a

stranger."

Driskill added, "He was busy exploring and getting into mischief. He loved with all his heart and always had a smile for everyone he met." She also said that many in the community took the boy in and loved him as their own.

Slater said, "He wasn't afraid of anything. I know people are blaming themselves, but Conner wouldn't be blaming them."

Epperly said that he believes Conner drowned

near the deeper part of the creek, but people should always be cautious. He said, "Even though you're around shallow water, people can still drown. It's always great to have adult supervision, but you never know if that will prevent anything. With the whole summer coming up, we want people to be safe."

This was the Missouri State Highway Patrol Troop D's third drowning for 2016 in an 18-county area. There will be services for Conner at First Baptist Church in Cassville under the direction of Pastor James Weaver on Thursday, June 2, at 10 a.m.

Car crashes into house, injures passenger

A Cassville teen was injured on Sunday when the car she was riding in hit a house. According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, a 17 year-old Cassville girl was the passenger in a car and was headed southbound on Farm Road 1110 two miles south of Cassville when the crash occurred.

Brandon S. Stevens, 24, of Monett, was driving a 2004 Pontiac Solstice when he travelled off the roadway and struck a house around 2:48 p.m. Stevens had no reported

injuries at the time of the crash. The 17 year-old girl had moderate injuries and was transported via ambulance to Mercy Hospital in Cassville. Neither were wearing seatbelts at the time of the crash.

The Solstice was totaled as a result of the crash and was towed by US Auto of Cassville.

Two men arrested for assault on teenagers

Two local men were arrested last week after allegedly attacked two teenagers walking down a residential street in Cassville. Joshua Eldon Jacobs, 23, of Cassville, and David Joseph Corral, 26, of Wheaton, were arrested by the Barry County Sheriff's Department after the hoodie of one of the teenagers who had been assaulted was found in their car.

According to affidavits of probable cause, Corral was driving down a Cassville street with Jacobs as a passenger when they saw the two teenage victims, 16 years old and 15 years old,

walking on Friday, May 27.

Corral and Jacobs got out of the car and began assaulting the 15 year old by punching him in the face and torso. The two then turned their focus on the 16 year old and kneed him in the face as well as punched him. To escape, the victim slipped out of the Mizzou hoodie he was wearing.

When officers pulled them over, the hoodie was still in the vehicle with the two men who assaulted the walking teenagers.

Corral and Jacobs are each being held in the Barry County Jail on \$15,000 cash-only bonds.

Fairview girl breaks leg after jumping off Table Rock bluff

A 19 year old woman had to be airlifted on Sunday, May 29, after being injured falling from a bluff on Table Rock Lake.

Jorden Gunter, of Fairview, was swimming with friends in a rural area near Shell Knob on Sunday. They were jumping off of cliffs into the water in an area popular for bluff jumping. Gunter went to jump into the water but did not jump far enough. She landed 30 to 40 feet below on the rocky shore, breaking her leg.

Stone County 911 took the call, and Central Crossing Fire Protection crews were dispatched to the scene. Missouri State Highway Patrol boats also responded.

After assessing the situation, the Central Crossing

crew was able to reach Gunter by land and began working on her. They determined at that point that taking her to waiting EMS crews by land would be too risky for her.

The Central Crossing Fire boat was able to pull up to the shore alongside Gunter. After checking her over, the crew placed her in the boat and took her to the main marina.

While an ambulance was on the scene, the decision was made to airlift Gunter to Mercy Hospital in Springfield. A helicopter was waiting on the shore when the boat arrived.

In all, about 12 people were involved in the rescue, including six from Central Crossing Fire Protection, members of the Missouri State Highway Patrol, and both a ground and

air crew from Mercy.

According to Facebook posts, Gunter is doing well in the hospital. She suffered from a compound fracture in one of her legs and has undergone surgery to repair the break.

Rusty Rickard, Central Crossing Fire chief, emphasized that people should use extreme caution when jumping into the water, especially from that height.

Gunter was lucky to have stayed on the shore after the fall. Severe injuries become all

the more life threatening when water is involved.

Gunter and her family have expressed thanks for all of those involved in this rescue.

For a number of years, Seligman's City Park was on the north part of town. Due to acts of vandalism and other issues, the city opened a separate park outside City Hall which has a skate park, playground equipment and a splash pad for children during the summer. This summer, the splash pad is already open, with hours from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. seven days a week until the weather turns too cool to keep it on, usually in October. The north side park is closed, but new additions will make it ready for the public again soon.

Next, city clerk Brian Nichols said that park lighting will be installed and a security camera system ordered to ensure the park doesn't succumb to more vandalism in the future. They will also be installing new bathroom fixtures where the previous ones were vandalized.

outdoor exercise equipment installed at the north side park for a place for Seligman residents to be able to exercise while their children can play on the playground equipment.





As part of the Generation Google scholarship, Brown will be attending a special internship this summer called the Computer Science Summer Institute (CSSI). The CSSI is in Cambridge, Mass., from July 10 through 30, and is an opportunity for her and other high school graduating seniors to work with Google engineers. Google is taking care of the expenses to fly her to and from the camp. While at the camp, she will get to learning programing essentials as well as see some of Google's emerging technologies, including designing and developing an app with other participants.

The program is open to qualifying students who plan to major in computer science. The initiative is

Southwest Class of 1966 creates a legacy

The Southwest High School Class of 1966 has made history. It all started when Freddy Napier noticed two ladies crying while looking at the class photos during last year's All Class Reunion. Naturally curious, he investigated their distress and learned the school had burned in 1974 and their pictures would never hang in the Southwest halls with the other classes.

Napier knew this heartbreak had to be repaired. First, he contacted his fellow classmates and told them the story. Then, the Class of '66 spent the next year gathering annuals from 1945-1974. This task was made more difficult because Seligman and Washburn were separate schools until the 1950's. Napier found success quite by accident. He dialed a wrong number and ended up talking to a lady in Cassville who just so happened to have eight annuals. Then a lady in Washburn brought in the Class of 1974 and Napier had a great start.

Ironically, the Class of 66's motto was, "Life is a picture, paint it well." Have they ever fulfilled this motto. For the first time, the Seligman graduation pictures are in Washburn and the finished product now hangs proudly in the Southwest R-5 High School lobby.

Napier wants to recognize the six families of the Class of '66 who helped make this

historic project a reality along with Norma Rainey, who went through 17,552 pictures from annuals to obtain the necessary pictures, and Cherise Rogers and her business class at Southwest, who built the pictures into pages that were then framed.

The Class of 1966 went to high school during the Vietnam War era and many of them served our country during this time. These war heroes were not welcomed home as soldiers have been in other wars so Napier and his classmates decided to create a permanent plaque to hang in the Southwest High School commons area that would honor all veterans from all branches of the military.

First, they obtained permission from Tosha Watson, Southwest's high school principal, Bob Walker, Southwest's superintendent, and finally the Southwest R-5 school board. Then, Randy Dunlap, an architect and fellow classmate of '66, designed the plaque and then contacted several people and gained their help in constructing, painting and applying military emblems to this phenomenal piece of artwork. The plaque was revealed and dedicated to all veterans and their families at the All School Reunion at Southwest R-5 High School on Saturday, May 28.

Napier noted, "Our class is the one who stood up and gave to others." This is truly

Local officer educates parents on summer Internet safety

With summer rapidly approaching, children in the community have far more free time than they do during the school year, and with that time comes additional threats. Captain James Smith, of the Cassville Police Department, has been working to educate parents and the community on the dangers of online crimes against children.

Capt. Smith is an officer with the Cassville Police Department, but he also investigates the exploitation of children online. He said that parents need to be aware of all of the apps installed on the devices their children use to ensure that their children are safe this summer and all the time.

Smith said, "Kids aren't mature enough to know the consequences of their actions. A lot of people are on these apps looking for kids."

He added, "Parents need

to actually be parents."

The first step is knowing what apps are installed on any phones, tablets or computers that minor children are using, even if it is a parent's own device. Smith said, "Any app on a phone or tablet can have people on it like that. There are always new apps that parents need to be aware of."

Former apps popular for predators included Kik and SnapChat, but the popularity of apps changes rapidly, and it can be hard for parents to keep up with those changes.

Smith shared a story of a nine year old girl who was playing on a Disney app when she was contacted by a man from Ohio and asked her to move to the Kik app. Smith said, "It can happen even on apps that parents wouldn't expect. It's important for them to talk to their kids and just be aware."

Some devices are more dangerous than others.

Smith noted, "They need to pay attention. On Android devices, you can actually hide apps so that parents can't even see them."

He added, "Parents need to know how to check phones and pay attention to any activity on it."

Directly communicating with children about what is safe and what isn't online is also important. Smith said, "They need to make sure to talk to them about what information they can share and what they shouldn't."

He continued, "In Granby, there was a girl who was playing online and within a couple of minutes, a predator

knew where she went to school and what time she got home and how long she was alone."

Smith said that he is always available if parents want additional information about how to keep their children safe this summer or any time. For more information, contact Capt. Smith at (417) 846-3205.

who fished with my dad the first time they came here and moved to the area, like in Eagle Rock, Golden and Shell Knob." JD became somewhat of an icon for the fishing community in Barry County, and that is a big reason why he is remembered by so many. Now, his memory will be preserved through the museum contributions as well as the dedication of the J.D. Fletcher Kings River Access.

J.D. Fletcher lived in Barry County all of his life. While he grew up near Washburn, he moved to Eagle Rock in the late 1950's at the urging of a man he trapped minnows for who owned a bait shop on Bull Shoals Lake, according to Jeff. Jeff said, "Everybody thought he was crazy because the lake wasn't even there yet. This was before Table Rock was dammed up. He bought the property and started a guide service."

J.D. had multiple ventures in the area aside from his bait and tackle shop. He owned Fletcher's Devil Dive Resort from 1967 until 2000 and Fletcher's Lakeside Motel, where the Methodist church now sits, but it was fishing that had his heart and soul.

Over the years, J.D. took countless people out on the White River, Table Rock and the Kings River. Some of the people he guided were celebrities, some locals and many visitors, and in those moments, J.D. took the time to teach, guide and add to his collection of stories and antique fishing lures and equipment.

Jeff said, "When he would take people out, he'd trade out their old lures for new ones, and he would add them to his collection."

After J.D. passed away in 2014, Jeff said he had over 80 tackle boxes full of antique lures, 150 old rods and reels and a number of old motors, trolling motors and a couple of flat bottom boats. When a friend of Jeff's mentioned purchasing the collection for a fishing museum opening up in Springfield, he decided to do it. J.D.'s huge collection is now housed in the Lew's Ozarks Fishing Museum, which

opened on May 19. Jeff said, "He knew that I would sell it and use that toward my boys' education, but it also fulfilled dad's wish. It would have made him so happy because he loved people and he loved the business. I know that he would have wanted all of his stuff together so that everyone could see it and enjoy it." He added, "He'd been collecting those baits since he was a kid." The museum also has pictures of J.D. out on the

water where he was happiest. In just a couple weeks, J.D. was honored twice, once with the museum opening, but also with an access point to the Kings River opened in his name. Jeff said, "Dad started running trips to the White River before the lake was dammed up, but then he started the Kings River, and that was where his home was, that river." Jeff said that years ago, his dad had worked with the Arkansas Fish and Wildlife

commissioner at the time, Kirk Dutts, about getting an access point on the Kings River back in a place that he used to put in before a bridge was constructed about 15 years ago, which he accomplished. However, over time, there was an accident at the access, and there were people camping illegally and the access point was going to have to be closed because of the people congregating constantly under the bridge. When it became apparent that the access point needed to change, they decided to open it up on the other side of the river where people wouldn't be able to get under the bridge and named it in J.D.'s honor. Jeff and his family went to the grand opening of the J.D. Fletcher Kings River Access on May 26.

Jeff said, "They thought it needed to be named after him because they wouldn't have been able to do it without him." The J.D. Kings River Access is located on Highway 62 between Berryville, Ark., and Eureka Springs, Ark. The Lew's Ozarks Fishing Museum is located at 3031 N. Martin Ave. in Springfield. Jeff Fletcher lives in Eagle Rock with his wife, Kara, and their sons, Riley, 17, and Carter, 15.

Emergency funds available through OACAC

The Ozark Area Community Action Corporation (OACAC) has been awarded federal funds made available through the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) under the Emergency Food and Shelter National Board Program.

Barry County has been chosen to receive \$13,892 to supplement emergency food and shelter programs in the county. The selection was made by a National Board that is chaired by the U.S. DHS’s FEMA and consists of representatives from American Red Cross; Catholic Charities, USA; National Council of Churches of Christ in the USA; The Jewish Federations of North America; The Salvation Army; and United Way Worldwide. The local board was charged with distribution of funds appropriated by Congress to help expand the capacity of food and shelter programs in high-need areas around the country.

A local board will determine how the funds awarded to OACAC are to be distributed among the emergency food and shelter programs run by local agencies in the area.

The local board is responsible for recommending agencies to receive these funds and any additional funds made available under this phase of the program.

Under the terms of the grant from the National Board, local agencies chosen to receive funds must: be private voluntary non-profits or units of government; be eligible to receive Federal funds; have an accounting system; practice nondiscrimination; have demonstrated the capability to deliver emergency food and/or shelter programs; and if they are a private voluntary organization, have a voluntary board. Qualifying agencies are urged to apply.

OACAC has distributed Emergency Food and Shelter funds previously with Cassville United Methodist Church, Central Community Methodist Church and Helping Hands Food Pantry participating.

Public or private voluntary agencies interested in applying for Emergency Food and Shelter Program funds must contact Gail Reed, 700 E. Hwy. 248, Cassville, MO, 65625 for an application. The deadline for applications to be received is June 9, 2016.
