

Golden Museum open for eye-catching tours

Nestled in Barry County is an unforgettable hidden treasure. The Golden Pioneer Museum was founded in 1993 when the Trail of Tears Museum in Huntsville, Ark., arranged to have their collection combined with Winfred and Lee Ona Prier's Carnival glass and American pioneer artifacts. The Priers opened the museum, free of charge, for patrons to see a huge collection of artifacts that ranges from Vietnam trench art, to massive mineral samples to thousands of Native American arrowheads.

Winfred said he was always a collector in one way or another. The museum allows him a display to let others enjoy his findings, too.

The museum itself is expansive, stretching to multiple rooms with a main floor, upstairs and downstairs. They've added on to the building to contain the ever-growing collection.

Over the years, Prier said he has collected items through auctions, donations and purchasing collections. Sometimes, it means someone gives up a prized possession to foot the bill for their child's college education, like the preserved dinosaur egg nest with over 20 eggs, one of only four known nests of its size in the world.

Other times, people just want others to be able to enjoy their lifetime collections.

Walking through the museum with Prier is always a treat. He has a story for nearly

every piece contained within the museum. I asked him which his favorites were in the museum. It isn't an easy feat; the museum contains over 100,000 pieces, I'm sure. He thought about it and said, "I'd say it's probably the Klondike glass, it's really rare. Or the butter dishes."

The butter dish collection contains over 1,300 individual pieces. Prier keeps adding to them after acquiring the initial collection in 2015.

Prier went on, "But I also sit and just look at the toothpick holders."

The toothpick holder case contains hundreds of pieces. Seeing it, you understand how he could sit and stare at them. Prier tested me and asked me to pick out the expensive ones behind the glass, a glint in his eye. I chose three and failed miserably. I told him I must have cheap taste, and he laughed.

Prier's memory of the age of the pieces in the museum, where he got them, the people he got them from is impressive. He said, "I used to study and read a lot about the things I bought. So when I'd see something rare, I'd know it."

There are some pieces that experts have only seen in books until visiting the museum. There are thousands of pieces of glassware, from Davis glass, where the artist hid his name in the pieces, to vaseline glass, that glows under black lights, to cut glass and special colors. Prier takes pride in knowing the ones that

Exeter finishes third academic tourney season strong

For the second year in a row, Exeter High School's Academic Team has competed at national competition. The team's coach, teacher Michael Pisanti, said he thinks the team will continue to improve as time goes on.

Exeter's team is made up of 16 members: three seniors, three freshmen, three sophomores and the rest juniors. He said, "The same core that qualified us this year should be here next year." Meaning the team will be composed mostly of students who have been on the team at least a year.

This year, Exeter placed 61 out of 96 schools who went to Nationals. Last year, they placed 70 out of 96 schools. Pisanti said, "We were the top small school that played." They also had two individuals place in the top 100 students who competed out of a total of over 500.

Team members Andrew Blake finished 71 and Jarrett Brattin finished 82 out of 527 total competitors.

Pisanti said that while there is room to improve, the students are learning a lot as they gain more experience. He said, "We've had a team for a couple years, but this is the first real year

of success. They are still trying to get used to the work that goes into facing those bigger schools."

In the local conference, Exeter competes against six other schools. This year, they went five and one, only losing to Thomas Jefferson Independent Day School, in Joplin. Pisanti said that losing to Thomas Jefferson isn't something to be ashamed of. He laughed, "They beat everyone."

This year, Exeter qualified for Nationals in Chicago at the Clever tournament. He said, "You have to finish at the top of a tournament that uses NAQT (National Academic Quiz Tournament) questions."

Exeter competes monthly and usually plays six conferences during the year.

Pisanti said the team members really have to work together to be successful during the tournaments. He said, "It's more the core of kids we have instead of

anything I've done that has made them successful. They work really hard."

Pisanti volunteered to coach the team when the need was there because of his personal interests. He just finished his third year teaching science at the school. He said, "They had a team, and I really like trivia and Jeopardy and that type of thing. I thought it would be up my alley to help."

To prepare for competition, the team engages in a lot of team work and group-think to prepare. Pisanti said, "This year, we had a practice where we would actually sit down, and I would read them all NAQT packets. They tend to ask a lot of questions about certain things, like Picasso or the Great Gatsby. So, by hearing the questions and the clues in the questions, it gives them the information and helps them answer earlier in the competitions because they recognize it."

He continued, "They

Cassville man charged with assaulting deputies

A Cassville man was arrested and charged with assaulting two law enforcement officers in a disputed vehicle repossession. According to affidavits of probable cause, William David Ross, 43, of Cassville, fought deputies during a court-ordered repossession of his truck at a building on State Highway 76 in Cassville.

The report states Sergeant Thomas Bennett and Deputy Matt Phillips, both with the Barry County Sheriff's Department, informed Ross his truck, a 2003 Dodge, was being repossessed by court order. Ross allegedly told officers they were not going to take his vehicle.

Bennett and Phillips grabbed Ross' arm, informed him he was disobeying a court order, and pulled him from the vehicle. Ross then fought officers, punched Phillips in the face and elbowed Bennett in the chest, according to affidavits.

Ross was booked into the Barry County Jail on Thursday, May 24, and is charged with two counts of assault in the third degree - special victim, one count of resisting arrest for a felony and one count of interference in the legal process. He was initially issued a \$20,000 cash-only bond, which was reduced to being released on his own recognizance the same day.

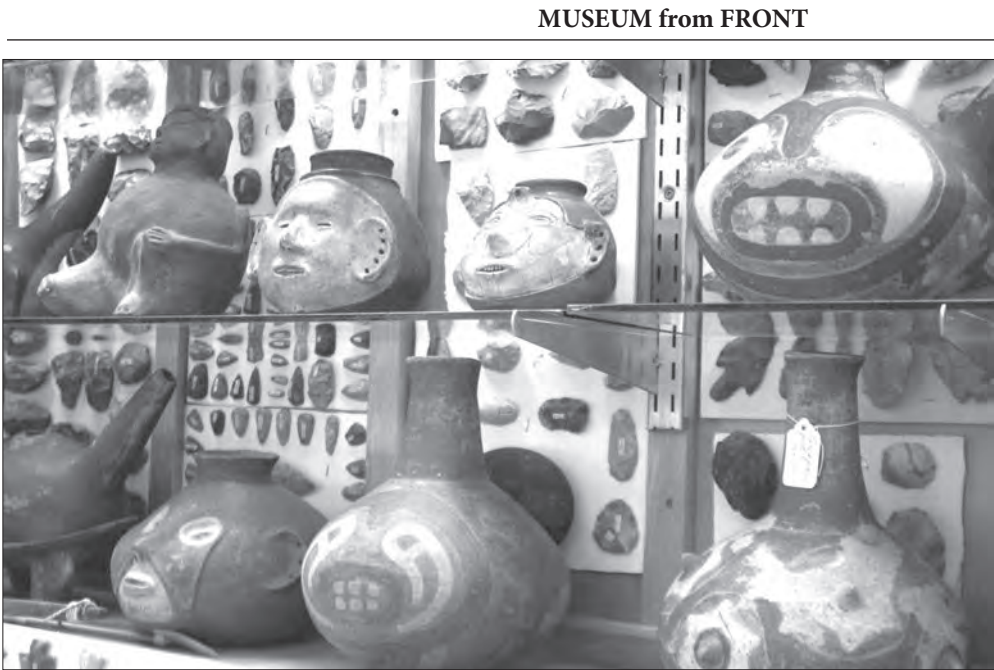

are rare and unusual. I learned pretty quick that if I thought something wasn't the most aesthetically pleasing, it was probably rare and worth a lot. Prier explained to me, "The pieces people didn't like didn't sell well, and they didn't make as money."

Walking through the rooms, there are world record sized mineral samples, wooden Civil War matches, a massive lunchbox collection, Native American artifacts and

prehistoric fossils, including a preserved cave bear skull. If you don't see it, you won't believe the variety.

Over the years, carrying so many rare artifacts, Prier has inevitably been asked to sell pieces in his collection, but the answer is a resounding no. He did admit he sold a piece one time. He said, "Only one time, a woman wanted to buy a pot. She was a teacher and really wanted it to show her students and couldn't find it

anywhere else. So I sold that to her. I knew her folks really well. That's the only time."

Prier doesn't want to sell

pieces because he wants people to learn from them. He wants people to walk around and see pieces of history.

Prier has no plans to stop traveling to pick up new pieces for the collection, so no matter how many times you visit, you'll always find something new.

The Golden Museum is open from April 12 through October 31 each year, Tuesday through Saturday from 10:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Special tours can contact the museum for after hours visits.

Wilson, Postlewait, Wolf earn state track medals

After seeing State track meets ravaged by storms on consecutive weekends in Jefferson City, MSHSAA might consider moving the track and field championships to St. Louis where the “Dome at America’s Center” - formerly the Edward Jones Dome - sits empty, unused and dry.

OK, so you can’t reasonably hold an outdoor championship in an indoor facility - unless it’s football - but it sure would prevent the headaches and Plan B execution required when those thunderstorms predictably roll across the state Capitol in mid May.

Like all the other State qualifiers, Cassville’s thin-clads patiently waited out the weather delay and took their best shot when the opportunity finally arrived.

The whole state was watching when Brandon Miller of John Burroughs High School broke a 31-year old Missouri record, run-

ning away with the Class 3 boys 800 meter race. Miller’s 1:49.55 bested the overall state record of 1:49.89 set by Parkview’s Bill Rainey back in 1987.

Cassville’s senior speedster Austin Wilson nabbed a spot in the finals of the 400 meter dash, running the fourth fastest qualifying time of 50.37.

The goal in the events with preliminaries is always just to advance to the Saturday final. Barring illness, injury or disqualification, that assures an athlete of claiming one of the eight All State medals for that event. Outside the accolades awarded to the individual champion, it really doesn’t matter if you are second or eighth “All State” is a special distinction.

In Saturday’s final, Wilson cranked it up a notch. Running out of lane 6, he took second with a scorching personal best of 50.17. He trailed only Cardinal Ritter’s Jame-son Williams, who posted a

winning time of 48.68.

Postlewait, Wolf shine in shot

Largely unnoticed in the week leading up to State, Cassville freshman Kyren Postlewait nailed fifth place in the girls shot, throwing 40-02.75 to claim a state medal. After barely breaking 38 on one throw and 37 on another, Postlewait exploded

through the release on her best throw to break the forty-foot barrier.

Skyler Wolf fouled four times in the boys shot competition and only managed two legal throws. But his 47-02 was good enough for the eighth place medal.

Not all would qualify or medal in the tough Class 3 competition.

Arther Reed placed tenth in the javelin with a throw of 136-08.

Wilson failed to qualify for the finals in the 200 meter dash, running 23.18 for 14th in the prelims.

Freshman Jordyn Stafford finished 14th in the girls 1600, struggling home in 5:53.35 after posting a 5:34 PR at sectionals. For young distance runners forced to max out in qualifying meets, it can be tough to duplicate

performances in back-to-back weeks.

Kennedy Parnell, competing in the 100 meter hurdles, also placed 14th, running the barriers in 17.21.

Cassville’s quartet finished 15th in the prelims of the 4x200 meter relay team. Hannah Hackler, Parker Marple, Kyren Postlewait and Chloe Parsons circled the track in 1:51.51.
