The ayes have it for the library tax

"I'm so happy; I'm so happy," were the first words Barry-Lawrence Regional Library Director, Gina Milburn, came out with in reaction to the news that the 7-cent library tax levy increase had passed in Tuesday's municipal election.

"I was glued to the news watching election results as they came in," she said. "I had this secret fear that, at the last minute, the levy might fail, so I was bracing myself for the worst. To wake up Wednesday morning and realize it really did pass is a huge relief. Now, we can move forward with next year's budget without worrying about what

plans we'll have to scrap and levy was 15-cents per \$1,000 what repairs will have to wait. I am so grateful to the library patrons who are responsible for getting out and voting in favor of the levy. They are the real heroes for understanding the importance of local libraries, and ensuring we have the funds to keep them operational."

The 7-cent tax levy increase will give libraries additional operating funds to offset shortages caused by the Hancock Amendment, which mandated that libraries had to roll back their property tax levy to numbers last approved by voters, which happened in 1973. At that time, the cap on the assessed valuation, which represented a loss from their then-current 2008 levy of 17-cents. Because the library gets 85 percent of their funding from property taxes, the seemingly small 2-cent decrease might not seem like much. To the library, however, it represented a loss of about \$250,000 of operating revenue between the two counties.

With the 7-cent increase, the new cap for the library's property tax levy will be 22-cents, an amount which will be collected during the

7th Street Bridge plans put on hold

Removal of old pavement on the west side of the former 7th Street bridge in Cassville took place last week.

"Without enough funds to move forward with the construction of a new bridge, we're at a standstill," Public Works Director, David Brock, said.

According to Brock, after the 2017 flood which damaged the bridge beyond repair, a FEMA grant of \$39,000 fell far short of the

bids received for reconstruction cost, so with FEMA's approval, the funds were spent on other street repair proj-

Applications available for CARES funds

Background

On March 27th, 2020, Congress passed, and President Trump signed into law, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act ("CARES Act"). The CARES Act established the Coronavirus Relief Fund and appropriated \$150 billion to the Coronavirus Relief Fund. Under the CARES Act, the funds are to be used to make payments for specified uses, based on the requirements of

the CARES Act requirements and United States Department of Treasury guidance.

Generally, the CARES Act provides that payments may only be used to cover costs that:

(1) are necessary expenditures incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to COVID-19; (2) were not accounted for in the budget most recently approved as of March 27, 2020, for the government; and

(3) were incurred during the period that begins on March 1, 2020, and ends on December 30, 2020.

Expenditures must be used for actions taken to respond to the public health emergency. Funds may not be used to fill shortfalls in government revenue to cover expenditures that would not otherwise qualify under the CARES Act. Expenditures

Cassville couple accused of neglecting special needs victim

Based on probable cause statements signed by Detective Danny Boyd, of the Cassville Police Department, on May 18, 2020, warrants were issued for the arrest of 27-year-old Tiffany Morango and her fiancé, 38-year-old Lee Robert Schroeder, III, both of Cassville. The pair

were booked into the Barry County Jail on May 28 where they are currently held with bond set at \$50,000 each.

According to the sheriff's department, they are each charged with Abuse or Neglect of a Child, and Endangering the Welfare of a Child Creating Substantial Risk.

According to the probable

cause statement, Detective Boyd assisted Barry County Children's Division with a child neglect case on January 29, 2020, in which the victim was in a Pediatric Intensive Care Unit in Springfield allegedly being treated for malnourishment. The special

Assessor issues warning

Barry County announces Phase 1 Extension

The Barry County Commission and the Barry County Health Department in alignment with Governor Parson's Show-Me Strong Recovery plan are announcing the extension of the Phase 1 rules until June 15, 2020.

At the Direction of the Governor, Phase 1 reopening orders and rules are in effect through June 15, 2020. The rules allow businesses to remain open, while mitigating the potential spread of CO-

VID-19 in Barry County. The rules include requirements for physical distancing, maximum occupancy limits, and source control masking requirements for some service providers.

In an effort to reopen additional businesses and reduce restrictions in Barry County, effective June 1, occupancy limits apply only to retail establishments. Those maximum occupancies have been raised, and additional physical distancing requirements for gymnasiums and athletic events have been removed.

The State mandated physical distancing requirements of 6' of separation remain in


On April 28, 2020, Barry County received information and guidance from the office of the Missouri State Treasurer regarding the distribution of CARES Act funds from the State of Missouri to Barry County. After approving and returning a certification for payment to the State of Missouri on May 7, Barry County received \$4,198,764.00.

Process

Over the course of the past three weeks, Barry County has reviewed the requirements of the CARES Act and the guidance issued by the Department of Treasury and has been working to identify community priorities and develop an application process to allow applicants to request CARES Act funds and make award decisions for the use of funds.

Application

The County is making an application available to request CARES Act funds. Initially, for the first round of funding, Local Government/Public Entity/Political Subdivision and non-profits will be eligible to submit an application. Applications for the first round of funding must be based on requests for reimbursement of eligible

expenses or costs already incurred during the period March 1, 2020, through May 31, 2020, and must satisfy the requirements of the CARES Act and Treasury guidance. Applicants will be required to submit sufficient supporting documentation such as invoices, receipts, and proof

of payment. Applications for the first round of funding are due on or before Friday, June 26, 2020. The County will then review and evaluate the applications for completeness (including supporting documentation), compliance with the CARES Act requirements and Treasury guidance.

The county anticipates making award decisions Thursday, July 30, 2020. Award recipients will be required to enter into a written agreement with the County prior to disbursement of awarded funds.

The application is available at the County Clerk's office beginning on Monday, June 1, by requesting an emailed copy at jhlecompte@barrycountyclerk.com.

Questions regarding the application process may be directed to Jill LeCompte, Barry County Clerk (847-2561); Gary Youngblood, Presiding Commissioner (847-5965); Wayne Hendrix, Southern Commissioner (847-7788) and Gary Schad, Northern Commissioner (737-2897).

Depending upon the number of applications received and amount of funds awarded in the first round of funding, the County anticipates potential additional rounds of funding.

According to a probable cause statement signed by Deputy Thaddaeus Harris of the Barry County Sheriff's Department, a warrant was issued for the arrest of 53-year-old Thomas Eugene Campbell, of rural Purdy. He was booked into the Barry County Jail at 11:26 p.m., May 29, 2020.

According to the statement, Campbell is charged with the 1st Degree sexual abuse of a female less than 14 years of age. The sheriff's department also lists a charge of 1st Degree endangering the welfare of a child.

first year, then be subject to the state's decision in years ahead, based on the economy.

Milburn would like to assure voters that the passage of the increased tax levy doesn't mean that the library will begin spending money willynilly.

"We'll move forward with plans already in place," Milburn indicated, "in particular, the expansion of our databases."

According to Milburn, streaming data programs, including Hoopla and Missouri Libraries to Go, are extremely popular with readers, especially in audio and e-book formats.

"The programs allow readers to check out digital materials to read on their own

devices," she said. "There's a charge to the library for us to use the databases, but no charge to our patrons."

Traditional print books, Milburn says, are still the library's most popular checkout items, though.

"Print books cost much less for libraries to purchase, too," she said.

This summer, the Barry-Lawrence Regional Libraries have been awarded a Reading Challenge Software Grant of \$544 to be used, initially, for the children's summer reading program – scheduled to begin June 8. The grant is funded by the Library Service and Technology Act through the U.S. Institute of Museum and Library Services.

may become available in the future," Brock continued, "but, for the time being, we're just cleaning up the approaches on both sides of the creek and will sow some grass seed."

According to Brock, future plans for a bridge are uncertain.

"After a hydrological analysis of the area, it's been recommended that we construct something that will allow the water below the bridge to flow more freely, so we don't run into issues with backups of debris which have caused damage to previous structures," he added. "In order

to do that, we would have to build the roadbed up considerably."

In the past, the city had kicked around the idea of constructing a pedestrian bridge across the creek, but even that, Brock says, would require quite a bit of elevation in order for it to withstand flooding.

"It's not a realistic possibility in the near-term," he said. "And, even if it were, there would be better places to construct a pedestrian bridge than on 7th Street. So, for now, we're just trying to improve appearances."

needs (child), who requires extensive care, had been taken to the hospital the previous night after experiencing a seizure, the statement indicated.

According to the statement, while in the hospital, medical personnel noted that the victim was alleged to be very weak, had lacerations, sores and bruising throughout his body, was dehydrated and malnourished, and appeared to be improperly fed and bathed.

Prior to going to the hospital for treatment, the statement continued, the victim had been in the direct care of his mother, Tiffany Morango, and her fiancé, Lee Robert Schroeder, III.

According to Cassville Police Chief, Dana Kammerlohr, the (child) was taken into protective services at that time, then placed in foster care.

According to Boyd's statement, in the past, Morango allegedly fled from Oregon while being investigated by Oregon DHS, and Schroeder has relatives in California where he mentioned going.


Harvard Medical School says that diet, exercise, age, and psychological stress may affect immune system response. Certain lifestyle choices can promote a strong immune system.

- Increase your intake of fruits and vegetables. Fruits and vegetables supply the powerhouse antioxidants that are essential for protecting a body against free radicals. Free radicals may play a role in heart disease, cancer and other diseases. Serve fruits and/or vegetables with every meal to ensure you're getting enough antioxidant-rich foods.
- Consume fiber and fermented foods. Fiber can help feed the gut microbiome, which is linked to a robust immune system. The microbiome also may prevent harmful pathogens from entering the body through the digestive tract. Data also suggests that eating more fermented foods can further strengthen and populate healthy bacteria in the gut.
- Exercise regularly. Aim for 30 minutes of moderate exercise per day, advises the American Heart Association. Thirty minutes of exercise each day can go a long way toward keeping the body healthy. The U.S. National Library of Medicine says physical activity may help flush bacteria out of the lungs and airways. Exercise causes changes in antibodies and white blood cells. These antibodies and white blood cells circulate rapidly, so they may detect illnesses earlier than they would

if you do not exercise. Body temperature also rises during exercise, which could naturally prevent bacteria from growing.



A healthy immune system is vital to fending off or recovering from illness.








"I've been sewing all my life; it's what I love to do," Woods said.

Glenda Cassity, owner of 4th Street Cleaners, found instructions online for fabric masks. Woods began to make them, then Cassity posted them on her Facebook page. Woods has seen a steady flow of orders ever since.

"I've probably got around 30 bins of fabric scraps in my shop that we have used

She also uses thin flannel from the bins to line the masks. Wood's masks are machine washable.


