

Barry County E9-1-1 accredited for medical dispatch

There are a lot of public services that people don't think about until they need them. For more people, they don't regularly think about what happens when there is an emergency, and they need help.

Barry County's E9-1-1 Center was opened in 2008, and since, the center strives to provide the best service they can to the community. Part of that mission means working toward a variety of accreditation in the field of telecommunications that means their dispatchers are solidly trained and both residents and tourists needing their services are safe.

As of May 20, the Barry County E9-1-1 Center has

attained the highest accreditation that an emergency communication service can receive. Barry County E91-1-1 is the 215th Emergency Medical Dispatch Accredited Center in the world. The accreditation is earned through the International Academies of Emergency Dispatch.

Mike Phillips, Barry County E91-1-1 director, said the medical dispatch accreditation is the first of three that they are pursuing. He said, "Now that we are accredited in EMD, we are working on the fire dispatching and will start the police dispatch soon."

Emergency services can pursue accreditation in four services: medical

(EMD), fire (EFD), police (EPD) and emergency communication nurse system dispatching. The training provided for each of those areas is designed and developed by experts in the field across a variety of medical, fire and police departments internationally.

The reason the center opted to train their telecommunicators and become accredited is to provide a uniform standard of operations for each call that comes into the center. Whether the training is in medical, police or fire, the telecommunicators have a script to follow to ask questions and provide responses that will help callers with their individual emergen-

Marines honor local son in Memorial Day ceremony

For the men and women who have served their country through their military service, there is a silence amongst them from those memories. The inner demons of tragedy and horror rage, no matter what war, and sometimes healing is hard to come by.

However, for a group of Marines from the Second Battalion, Fourth Marine Regiment (2-4), a ceremonial rite every year gives them the chance to remember their fallen comrades and talk to the only people who really understand, the ones they served with.

Each year, the 2-4, known for years by their nickname, the Magnificent Bastards, spends Memorial Day weekend visiting the graves of fallen members from their ranks. This year, they gathered at Cassville's Russell Cemetery to remember and say goodbye to Zackery Phillips, a member of the 2-4 who died in 2014.

The first time the 2-4 collected to honor one of their own was in 2008. Since then, the men and their families travel to all corners of the

U.S. to pay their last respects and visit the families of the men who paid the ultimate price.

Zack's mother, Joy Phillips, said, "They put their lives on the line, and then come home and deal with the VA, emotional problems and the upsets. This is good for them."

Phillips said the Marines are visiting each one of the members of the 2-4, always choosing one who died recently if possible. Her son died of heart condition complications in November 2014,

but before that, he was one of the Marines visiting gravesides and saying goodbye as well.

Phillips said, "My son went to all of them. It was very therapeutic for him. Those guys went through hell, and they're the only ones who understand what that was like. It's great that they do it."

Each Memorial Day, the 2-4 Marines and their families travel to a different city of a fallen soldier, camp out, talk and then hold a ceremony to honor their brother.

An Aurora woman had to be airlifted last week when she fell off an inner tube on Table Rock Lake near Big M Marina on Saturday. According to the boating incident report by the Missouri State Highway Patrol, Debra R. Roberts, 42, fell off of an inner tube she was being towed on behind a boat around 1:18 p.m. on Saturday, June 4.

According to the report, Christopher S. Drost, 17, of Purdy, was driving a 1996 Chappal 23' Runabout around Big M Marina with Roberts being towed on an inner tube. While Roberts only suffered minor injuries, she had to be airlifted and transported to Mercy Hospital in Springfield for her injuries.

Both Roberts and Drost were wearing life jackets at the time of the incident.

Two-year old found walking road at night, father arrested

FATHER ALLEGEDLY PASSED OUT

Kenny Dale Shepard, 38, of Purdy, was arrested last week when his two-year old was found walking down a Farm Road around 10 p.m. According to affidavits of probable cause, Shepard was extremely intoxicated in his home.

On Tuesday, May 31, the Barry County Sheriff's Department responded to a small child walking down Farm Road 1065 in Purdy. Shepard allegedly passed out due to extreme intoxication, and the child was unattended on the road.

When officers went to Shepard's home, it took

them around 10 minutes to get him to wake up. Shepard was also in possession of two marijuana pipes with residue and Zig-Zag rolling papers.

Shepard was taken into police custody and booked into the Barry County Jail at 10:38 p.m. where he is still being held.

Shepard was charged with endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree by Barry County Prosecuting Attorney Amy Boxx. He is being held in lieu of a \$10,000 cash-only bond ordered by Judge Robert Foulke.

Mathew Miller, the younger brother charged with kidnapping a Washburn woman in January 2014, received his first sentencing yesterday, June 7. Miller, 22, was sentenced on his three most serious charges, all originating in McDonald County where the kidnapping took place. Miller was sentenced to 18 years, 15 years, and seven years on the three charges of kidnapping, burglary in the second degree and tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree, and those sentences will run concur-

In January 2014, Matthew, his older brother, Michael Miller, and Michael's girlfriend, Amanda Rhodes, of Pittsburgh, Penn., were also charged in the kidnapping of a woman from her home. The brothers and Rhodes kidnapped a Washburn woman, put her in the trunk of her car, used her debit card to withdraw \$1,125 from her bank account, and then punched her in the face and threw her down a hill before abandoning her car in the Roaring River arm of Table Rock Lake. The victim had to walk barefoot for a

The training in each EMD, EFD and EPD, is just the first step toward accreditation. Once trained, then the center has to prove their excellence in a variety of areas. The accreditation comes once they've proven their skills in that particular area of dispatch. The training portion was included in the 2015-2016 and cost approximately \$185,000.

For the EMD portion, the center had to meet 20 points of excellence to qualify for accreditation. The points encompass international practice standards of excellence for EMD. According to the IAED, they are evaluated on their system oversight, quality improvement programs and the individual certification of all emergency call takers.

The Barry County E9-1-1 telecommunicators were honored for their dedication to attaining their EMD accreditation on Thursday, June 2, with a dinner and presentation of EMD lapel pins by Phillips. Barry County E91-1-1 Board director Jon Horner was also present to thank and congratulate the employees for all of their hard work.

Horner also shared that he had a family member from out of town visiting that had to call 9-1-1 for an emergency. He said, "I had no doubt that my family would be taken care of when they called, and that is because of you all."

Phillips said, "I am very proud of our staff's hard work, dedication and commitment to excellence. I have always said that Barry County Emergency Services E9-1-1 has some of the best professionals in the industry. This award confirms that."

Aside from their most recent accreditation, the Barry County E91-1-1 Center also does all of the Global Information System mapping for the county, and Phillips earned the Emergency Professional certification by the National Emergency Number Association (NENA) earlier this year.

Roaring River Healthcare greenhouse addition grows peace for residents

Roaring River Health and Rehabilitation is always providing residents opportunities to stay active and be involved in meaningful activities. A new addition is under construction, a greenhouse. So far, the greenhouse is enclosed with raised beds, cedar ceilings, and plants and now the waterfall and pond are on the way. The greenhouse is still under partial construction, but will eventually be open 8 a.m. until 8 p.m. for residents to use as an activity or community room to enjoy the garden, or visit with friends or just enjoy the peace and

tranquility of this relaxing room. Russ Newby, Roaring River Health and Rehabilitation Administrator, said, "It gives the residents purpose and satisfaction."
The greenhouse will also be used as a therapy room, including physical, occupational, speech, and even have stationary bikes. Heather Gusta, the activities director, is anxious for the greenhouse to be finished so she can bring residents who don't get out of their rooms to the greenhouse a couple of times a week for one-on-one time to read, enjoy relaxation lotions or just to visit. This will be a great way to help them get more involved and active without having to join group activities. Gusta said, "This will be a place of tranquility to spend time with family and friends."
Shawn Erke, a resident, comes to the greenhouse every day to take care of her plants. She is so proud because she is able to watch her bulb grow to a healthy plant. She is excited to have something to do and can take satisfaction actually seeing her accomplishment grow.
The greenhouse is the latest innovation for the residents, but Roaring River Health and Rehabilitation provides much more, and there will be future stories about other aspects and activities.

Phillips recanted what the ceremony looked like at Russell Cemetery. “Marine Post 993 out of Springfield came down to do a gun salute and played Taps. Then, the 2-4 got in formation and took single roses to his grave and laid them down one by one and said their goodbyes.”

In all, 38 Marines came to Cassville to honor Zack and join each other in camaraderie and understanding with the only others who really comprehend their struggle. They camped on Phillips’ land, ate and spent time together. She added, “The local companies really helped out. I didn’t want them to have to worry about their food or any of those needs while they were here. A lot of them aren’t in a financial position to even do this. But they were taken care of while they were here, and I’m thankful for that.”

The Marines participate each year of their own volition, with no subsidies or payments for their presence. It’s merely an act of service to the fallen, their families and one another to ease the burden of war.

Phillips said, “It’s important for them to get together and talk to each other and have their wives talk to each other. It helps them deal with it.”

The history of the 2-4 is a long one, dating back to World War I. The formation of the 2-4 was activated in 1914. Since, the Magnificent Bastards have been involved in WWII, the Korean War, Vietnam, the Gulf War and Operation Iraqi Freedom.

Zackery joined the Marines just after graduating high school in 2003. By February 2014, at only 19 years old, he was serving in Ramadi, Iraq, which would become a devastating place for the Marines.

The battalion was charged with providing support and stability operations, but on April 6, the area erupted with intense fighting after insurgents attacked. Phillips said April 3 through 6 is considered one of the most intense times because of the casualties suffered. Between April 6 and 7, 14 men died in the ambush in Ramadi. Since the War on Terror began, over 30 men from the 2-4 have died.

Zackery served during the most disastrous time for the Magnificent Bastards, but he survived to come home. He moved back to Cassville when he was completed his service in 2007. When he died in 2014, he left behind a three-year old daughter, Ada.

When the 2-4 paid their respects to Zackery, Ada was there, remembering her dad in a somber Memorial Day ceremony. But for the Magnificent Bastards and their families, Ada is one of their own, as is Joy and all who Zackery left behind. That is a fact that will remain as long as there is a single member of the 2-4 left.

Golf cart wreck ends in arrest for Florida man

A Titusville, Fla., man was arrested over Memorial Day weekend when the golf cart he was driving overturned, ejecting him and three minor children. Thomas Firestone, 39, was charged with driving while intoxicated, failure to drive on the right half of the roadway, three counts of endangering the welfare of a child, and three counts of assault in the second degree.

On Memorial Day, Monday, May 30, Firestone was driving a golf cart with three passengers, all minor children between the ages of 10 and 13, according to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report. While driving about a mile east of Arrowpoint, Firestone drove down a gravel driveway and accidentally applied the emergency brake instead of the regular brake, causing the golf cart to skid off the side of

the driveway and overturn, according to the affidavits of probable cause by the Missouri State Highway Patrol.

When the golf cart overturned in the ditch, Firestone and the three children were thrown, causing minor to moderate injuries like road rash and minor cuts on two of the children and a broken left arm for the other child.

When Trooper Coffey spoke with Firestone, he noticed a strong smell of intoxicants. After failing a sobriety test, Firestone consented to a breath test, which showed his blood alcohol level to be 0.199 percent, over twice the legal limit of 0.08 percent. Firestone was arrested at the scene and transported to the Barry County Jail.

Firestone's warrant was issued May 31, and he posted the \$10,000 bond on June 1.

Cassville's Wilson tops women's field at Lockwood 5K

Brylee Wilson is a pretty typical teenager. Just out of seventh grade at Cassville, she is a solid student, and is involved in a myriad of activities: band, jazz band, winter guard and a blur of sports.

"Track, cross country, soccer, basketball and volleyball," she smiled, rattling off the five sports without hesitation.

She likes horses, she reads, she draws, she likes to hike with her family.

But she has a genetic predisposition for one activity in particular: distance running.

As anyone who has attended a Cassville Middle School track or cross country meet knows, Brylee is a talented runner. Even with being stretched between so many athletic activities, she has excelled as a distance runner without specializing. With only one hiccup in her 1600 meter races this Spring, Brylee has her sights set on some lofty goals.

"I want to be a State champion for track and cross country, and I hopefully can go to the Olympics," she says matter-of-factly.

Her times were 2:32 in the 800, and 5:26 in the 1600 and put her in the elite level for her age. She finished the track season as the #4 seventh-grade miler in Missouri. She has already run a sub-13 minute 3200 meters, a mark that would place in most area high school meets.

The question is, how high is her ceiling and how hard will she work to attain those goals?

Increasing her mileage and learning how to train effectively are key elements in this summer of running for Brylee. She blew through the 13-minute barrier for two miles on just her second time trial at that distance and has since turned a 12:32 personal best.

In her first road race of the year on Saturday at Lockwood, Brylee was the overall women's champion and fourth overall with a time of 21:21 over the 5K course.

I was the top-finisher of all the men's master's runners in that same race, and finished 34 seconds behind Cassville's blonde wonder.

The next test will be the Red, White, and Boom Run 5K on a hilly course at Carthage on July 4.


