Two back in custody after Barry County Jail escape

Two inmates are back in custody after escaping the Barry County Jail early Tuesday, June 4, morning around 2:30 a.m. According to Barry County Sheriff Department Major Leonard Collins, chief deputy, the two men escaped custody after damaging jail property and were back in custody around two hours after.

The two inmates, Charles Love and Matthew Whittenburg, were housed in jail for unrelated offenses. According to Collins, the two knocked a hole in the wall behind the toilet in the cell and crawled through the hollow part of the wall before climbing into the ceiling. Collins continued, "After getting into the ceiling, they made their way over to the awning and kicked out the metal on the awning and let themselves out."

This was between 2 a.m. and 2:30 a.m. Tuesday morning. Then, two different tips led officers to Love and Whittenburg's location in a residence on Mill Street in Cassville. Collins said, "They only got about eight blocks from the jail and were hiding."

Initially, officers were directed to a residence on Mill Street before another tip sent them to a residence on Main Street. The two were located at the residence on Main Street.

Collins said, "They were taken in without incident." They were captured around 4:15 a.m. on Tuesday morning.

"We will be requesting a felony property damage to the jail and escape from custody," Collins said.

No charges had been filed as of time of press.

Collins said he does not anticipate any changes in jail security in the future to prevent similar situations. He said, "The hole will be fixed, but there isn't really a way to prevent that other than keeping a closer watch."

Love had been in the Barry County Jail since April 24, 2019, on no bond and was being held for one count of child molestation in the first degree in 2017, one count of tampering with a victim in a felony prosecution from 2017, one count of possession of a controlled substance in 2018, and one count of unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia in 2018.

Whittenburg had been held in the Barry County Jail since June 24, 2018, on a \$35,000 bond for one two counts of endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree with no sexual contact, one count of domestic assault in the second degree, probation violation of stealing \$750 or more from 2017, probation violation of possession of a controlled substance, one count of damage to jail property and failure to appear on theft by receiving.

The Barry County Sheriff's Department was aided by the Cassville Police Department.

Crowder receives \$150K donation toward building project

Cassville's Crowder College campus recently received a large donation to aid the school in a \$2.1 million building expansion project. A representative of the Sunderland Foundation presented a check to the Crowder College Foundation on Tuesday, June 4, in the amount of \$150,000 to help supplement the project.

Kent Sunderland, president of the Sunderland Foundation, said the foundation provides grants within a geographic area served by the Ash Grove Cement Company.

The Cassville Crowder expansion project overall will build a new approximately 5,000 square foot addition to the administrative building and will also connect the second building so that there will be one centralized entrance to administration and classrooms. The additional space will allow for the expansion of the campus bookstore, new classroom space and an im-

proved facade that will give the campus a facelift.

In total, the project will cost over \$2.1 million with construction and engineering costs.

Of the total \$2.1 million price tag on the project, \$1.33 million is coming from the State of Missouri and Crowder College has also dedicated some of its reserves to the project. The actual construction will cost around \$1.87 million and the remainder is engineering costs and similar expenses.

Wintech plans to open Cassville plant in June

Factory work has always been a large part of the economy in Barry County. From George's on the outskirts of Butterfield, to Regal in Cassville's industrial district, a large portion of Barry County's working class has always had options on the factory floor. Now, thanks to the efforts of Wintech, Inc., of Monett, and the industrial development arm of Cassville City Hall, the options for factory work within the county are

Wintech recently made the decision to move one of their manufacturing lines to a facility in Cassville's industrial district.

The facility, located next to the Cassville Aquatic Center, was previously used for storage by Wintech. According to Wintech president Jack Williams, expanding production demand led the company to set up additional work space in Cassville.

"With the growth we've seen in the last couple of years in both product lines and volume, what we needed was more floor space," said Williams, "We're very tight up here in Monett. We had that facility in Cassville and saw it as a great opportunity to expand our footprint."

According to Williams, the facility will begin with one production line and a production staff of roughly 20 people, but the company hopes to expand their production further in the coming years.

"Provided nothing drastic happens with the economy, we would expect to see that grow to 50 to 80 people within the next two to three years," said Williams.

This move was made possible due to assistance provided by both Barry Electric Cooperative and Cassville's economic director Isaac Petersen

Hearing held on fire damaged house in Purdy

During a special session of the Purdy City Council on Wednesday, May 22, the council held a hearing regarding the possible condemnation of a property located at 301 W. State Highway C in Purdy.

According to Purdy Mayor Bo Prock, the main housing structure on the property was se-

verely damaged by a fire on or around July 4, 2015.

Prock explained that the council has been pursuing corrective actions to be made on the property since six months after the fire. According to Prock, city officials had difficulty getting in contact with the property's owners, Brad and Melissa Bunnell.

Prock stated that he was advised by private legal counsel against the idea of taking immediate action and condemning the property as liens against the property could lead to unintended costs and liability for the city.

The city also filed a warrant against one of the owners of the property for failing to respond to a citation regarding the owner's failure to maintain maintenance on the lawn, a violation of Purdy city ordinance.

During the hearing, city attorney Darlene Parrigon submitted an amended finding of facts that had been agreed to previously by the property owner's legal council and Parrigon.

In the amended findings of fact, the owners stipulated that they were in fact the rightful owners of the property and had been informed numerous times of the city's ordinances regarding damaged structures though the exact dates of those notifications were removed due to debate on their accuracy

The owners agreed they were informed by the city that

they had 10 days from the initial notification to either begin repairs or demolition on the structure and had not yet begun either. The owners also stipulated that there were to be hearings with the State of Missouri at some point in July regarding liens against the property.

Finally, the owners agreed to have the property either cleaned and repaired or demolished by August 22. If the goal is not met, the city will have the right to move forward with condemning the property. There was also discussion of the possibility of extending that date to accommodate a scheduled demolition that would fall after that date at the board of aldermen's discretion.

Should the property become condemned by the city, they will have to right to act with imminent domain, effectively absorbing the property as a piece of public land owned by the city. Before this can happen, an appraisal would be done on the land and another hearing would be scheduled and compensation would be offered to the land owners. The

owners would have the right to appeal this process.

Parrigon commented during the hearing, "In my opinion, this resolves all the issues between the city and the property owners and is a more expedient and least expensive way for the city to handle this."

During open questioning on the matter, the property owner stated they plan to have the house itself demolished but keep the property in the family.

Parrigon also commented that the owners have agreed to come to Purdy Municipal Court on June 3. At this time, Parrigon expects that if the owners fully comply with the council's orders regarding the demolition of the property, the city will drop the warrant for failing to respond to the earlier citation after the August 22 goal is met.

The Purdy City Council voted unanimously to approve these new findings of fact, effectively agreeing to the new terms agreed upon by Parrigon and the owner's legal representation.

ATV driver lifeflighted after forest crash

A crash outside Eagle Rock left the driver of an ATV seriously injured. The driver, Kurtis A. Miner, 72, of Cassville, had to be lifeflighted for care after the crash on Friday, May 31.

According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, Miner was driving a 2009 Yamaha Grizzly south-bound in the national forest about five miles northeast of Eagle Rock. The ATV overturned as Miner attempted to ascent an embankment and overturned around 4:04 p.m.

Miner was seriously injured and lifeflighted from the scene and taken to Mercy Hospital in Springfield.

He was not wearing a helmet at the time of the crash.

The ATV was extensively damaged and removed from the scene by a private party.

Ground breaking for the project was held in March, and it is expected to be completed in 2020. Crowder College's vital role in educating and training students for today's workforce."

He continued, "The fact that a foundation outside southwest Missouri is so committed to this project, I hope, serves as an inspiration and motivation to others in Cassville and Barry County to also invest in this expansion. We have several opportunities for donors to secure naming rights for classrooms, the bookstore and other areas."



sor Ron Reed, who was hired by the city in a consulting capacity, had initially contacted the company about their plans with the storage facility.

"When they first started the economic development group in Cassville, [Ron Reed] asked myself and Jason Hunt, our vice president, out to lunch," said Williams. "We started discussing some of the opportunities that they had, knowing that we already had the building in Cassville, and he wanted to get an idea for what our plans were with the building and how they could help."

According to Petersen, after he took on the role in January, he began to network and facilitate relationships with Wintech, the City of Cassville, and several other private entities in order to foster a relationship with the business.

In those conversations, it was eventually determined that, if Wintech were to move production into the storage space, several improvements would need to be made in the interest of safety.

"It's a really fantastic facility. It needed a little work, and that's where the loan came in," said Williams.

In order to bring in new lighting and several other minor changes to the facility, Petersen determined that the best option for all involved would be what's called a REDLG (Rural Economic Development Loan and Grant).

operative. Once an application is submitted and approved, the associated cooperative gives a zero-interest loan to the business in question, who then agrees to pay the loan back in to be complete by June 24. installments over time.

"In order to use it, it's required that a co-op be involved," said Petersen. "Barry Electric Co-op was willing to do that for the community."

Petersen went on to explain how these loans are specifically engineered to bring work to towns like Cassville.

"They're targeted at rural communities with a population of under 50,000, specifically in manufacturing and agriculture to strengthen those communities," said Petersen.

Wintech began the process of changing the building to suit its needs with the new crop of employees expected to begin on June 20. The first windows at the new facility are expected

Williams expressed his hopes for the facility, explaining that he sees the move as both a positive one for the company as well as the town.

"We're really excited about Cassville," said Williams. "We understand that there's a pretty strong labor pool that is currently driving out of Cassville. Hopefully, we can capture some of that and give them a place to work in the town.",

Roark Family Health expanding to accommodate medical marijuana patients

For Missouri citizens following medical marijuana changes locally, yesterday marked an important day regarding Amendment 2 implementation. As of June 4, 2019, licensed physicians across the state are able to see patients to qualify them to apply for their medical marijuana cards. However, with such a new change to Missouri law and policy, a lot of doctors are either choosing not to see cannabis-seeking patients or work for healthcare systems that do not allow them to discuss marijuana as a treatment option for patients. For the few doctors willing to discuss the

treatment option, including Cassville-based M.D. Dr. Lisa Roark, business is booming.

Dr. Roark said her clinic's phones were ringing off the hook this week, dozens of voicemails were left and her staff are running ragged to keep up with the demand. In anticipation of this phenomenon, Dr. Roark even added an additional assistant physician to her staff to keep up and is making plans to add on to her existing clinic.

She said, "I think medical marijuana in Missouri has a lot to do with [the increase]. There are very few physicians who are doing the physician certifications so I'm finding I'm getting a lot of new patient requests and realized that I cannot see all of those new patients and also manage the DOT physicals and the urgent care and all of the other services we try to offer."

Even though patients will not be able to apply for medical marijuana cards until July 4 through the Department of Health and Senior Services website, physicians have to see patients within 30 days of their applying online. So, patients are lining up to get that part taken care of before they can apply meaning Roark Family Health is very busy.

In July 2018, Dr. Roark added the first assistant physician to her clinic. Dr. Paul Hannam joined Roark Family Health from Carmel, Indiana.

Dr. Mohit Sharma, MD, joined the Roark Family team on May 9 of this year.

While Dr. Hannam and Dr. Sharma cannot do the medical marijuana certification appointments, they are taking other types of appointments.

Dr. Roark explained, "Dr.

Sharma is taking over all of the acute care visits and regular DOT physicals and foster care physicals and all of the nonmember tech services we offer.

"The Department Health says a physician can have no restrictions on their license at all, and unfortunately, Dr. Hannam and Dr. Sharma are considered assistant physicians because they have not finished residency. Just like a nurse practitioner and a physician's assistant cannot do theses certifications either, a physician with any restriction cannot do them. So, that just leaves me."

Once patients' applications are approved by DHSS, both Dr. Sharma and Dr. Hannam will be able to consult with patients about medical marijuana treatments. However, that is still a little way out on the horizon.

Dr. Sharma said, "I'm very excited to join the community. Now, Missouri is my new home, and I look forward to this new chapter in my life. I hope to establish roots in this

great state.'

Dr. Sharma is originally from India, grew up in Michigan and attended medical school at the American University of Antigua School of Medicine. Prior to joining Roark Family Health, he worked for Webb City Community Clinic - Ozark Community Hospital. Dr. Sharma is still waiting to match into a family medicine or internal medicine residency program.

He continued, "An opportunity to have continual involvement in the medical field as an Assistant Physician in the state of Missouri is a blessing. Furthermore, serving the underserved who are often neglected due to lack-of or type-of insurance is an honor to itself."

The current timeline for medical marijuana hopefuls with qualifying conditions allows online applications to be submitted as early as July 4 with the appropriate paperwork. Then, DHSS has 30 days

to approve or deny the applica-

The only hiccup is facilities that will grow, process, test and sell marijuana will not have that product for patients until January or February 2020, according to information released by DHSS. Any new major changes to law takes time to implement, but patients are still enthusiastic about getting the first steps completed to allow them legal treatment options with cannabis.

Dr. Roark said a lot of her preparation has been education to help counsel patients on what options they have. When interviewing potential physicians to join her, medical marijuana was a topic discussed. She said she wanted other doctors who were at least open to medical marijuana.

She said both Dr. Hannam and Dr. Sharma are favorable to the treatment option for patients, and they will be able to


Kelley's motorcycle struck a rough patch on the roadway, skidded and left the right side of the roadway before striking a ditch, overturning and ejecting the driver.

Cassville High cheer squad honored by UCA at cheer camp





discuss that option with their patients once they have their cards. Dr. Roark explained, "They can discuss it with patients, they just need the education and the training. That goes for all physicians, none of us have received that education as part of our medical school training."

Dr. Shrama shared, "I do believe that marijuana is a good therapeutic option for certain medical conditions which I believe Dr. Roark will evaluate and diagnose and treat accordingly. It's a great treatment for people who have tried everything else and it hasn't worked."

With a lack of education in the medical field about cannabis as a treatment option and restrictions preventing doctors affiliated with major healthcare systems from discussing it with patients, that cuts the number of physicians able or willing to do certifying appointments, leading to Dr. Roark's influx of patients.

In this area, very few doctors are offering appointments. She said, "I know of two doctors in Springfield but not one in Joplin. I'm actually holding a clinic in Webb City because there is no one there."

Through a partnership with a nurse, Dr. Roark will do a day clinic to assist patients in the Joplin area hoping to receive their certifications. With a lot of the qualifying conditions for patients having debilitating effects, sometimes a lengthy car ride is an unreasonable request for a patient, and Dr. Roark is hoping to make that process easier for them.

Certification appointments, if a patient is not a member of Roark Family Health, is \$100 and includes everything needed to apply for the card, assuming the patient has a qualifying condition.

Dr. Roark will fill out the physician certification form from DHSS, then patients will need to submit their own electronic application once that opens July 4. She said the application process could create some problems for certain patients, which she is trying to preempt.

She said, "I think it will create some problems. One thing we're offering is that any patients we do certifications on, we will also help them with the online application. We can help scan in their photo ID. You know, a lot of people don't have scanners or know how to take a picture of their ID and download it onto a website. So we're going to assist patients with that process."

The next big step for Roark Family Health? A building expansion.

Dr. Roark shared, "My husband [Griff Roark] actually met with the city today to file a permit to build onto the clinic."

She added the expansion

could also include more services to patients in the area. "We've spoken with a few physical therapy companies about utilizing our space to do physical therapy. We're making the addition big enough to where there are lots of options."

Roark Family Health already offers direct primary care services including physicals, labs, xrays and more; urgent care services; prescription medications for members; massage therapy; cosmetic services; and CBD products. Trout tag prices could increase in 2020

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) is proposing an increase in cost that will affect local anglers fishing the waters at Roaring River. According to a MDC press release, an initial proposal to increase trout permits and daily tags was approved and is set to begin in 2020. MDC is accepting public comments on the proposal from July 2 through July 31, and an informational meeting at Roaring River State Park is slated for June 19.

The proposal, if implemented, will go into effect on February 29, 2020. The cost will go from \$7 to \$10 for annual trout permits for anglers aged 16 and up and from \$2.50 to \$5 for anglers 15 and under. Trout permits do not apply to trout parks within Missouri State Parks. Daily tags at Roaring River, Meramec Spring Park, Bennett Spring State Park and Montauk State Park are proposed to go from \$3 to \$4 for a daily tag for adults and from \$2 to \$3 for children 15 years and younger.

MDC stated the increase in price is to better cover the costs of operating the five trout hatcheries across the state. Each year, Missouri's trout hatcheries in Roaring River, Bennett Spring, Meramac, Shepherd of the Hills and Montauk raise approximately \$1.7 million trout to release to the public for fishing.

MDC director Sara Parker Pauley said, "The

Conservation Department has not increased theses permit prices in nearly two decades. We are adjusting these permit prices - which were set in 1999 - to make them more in line with today's real costs of the work we do. The price increases will help MDC meet the pressures of increased management costs at our hatcheries and help meet the increased demand of trout fishing around the state."

MDC released information that the cost to raise a trout has doubled in price since 2003. In 2003, it cost approximately \$1 per trout for food and labor. In 2017, the cost was evaluated at approximately twice the amount in 2003.

Currently, to fish in a state park, a daily tag and standard fishing license is required unless the angler qualifies for an exemption. Annual permits apply to waters outside of those dedicated trout parks.

Roaring River's hatchery raises between 150,000 to 400,000 fry each year and releases 265,000 fish into the park. The information meeting at Roaring River State Park will be held at the Emory Melton Inn and Conference Center on June 19 at 6 p.m. MDC will hold a brief explanation of the proposed changes and will then move into a public comment period.




