# Cassville man arrested for purse snatching, drugs

A Cassville man was arrested for a purse theft after answering the victim's stolen cell phone. Larry W. Delano, 55, of Cassville, is charged with two counts of possession of a controlled substance, escape from police custody while under arrest for a felony, unlawful use of drug paraphernalia with prior drug offenses and stealing of less than \$150.

According to the affidavit of probable cause by Cassville Police Officer Colt Beck, on Tuesday, June 6, a woman reported a man stole her purse out of her car. The man was described as being about 50 years old and wearing plaid shorts. Officers knew the man to be Delano based on the description. The purse contained a cell phone, \$64 in cash as well as personal belongings, identification and credit and debit cards.

When officers arrived at Delano's apartment on 9th Street, they called the stolen cell phone. When Delano answered and officers asked who it was, he responded, "Larry M----- F----- Delano," according to officers. At that point, officers told him they were law enforcement and to come to the door.

When officers approached, another resident in the apartment gave them consent to search the apartment and Delano was taken into custody. While searching the apartment, Delano was found to have drug paraphernalia, 10 Tramadol Hydrochloride pills, crystal methamphetamine, syringes, and a marijuana smoking pipe.

While law enforcement was searching the apartment, Delano had fled from the front of the building and was running, still hand cuffed, north bound. Delano was located at the bottom of a creek bed just north of the apartment building. When taken into custody and successfully transported to the Barry County Jail, Delano then allegedly threatened another officer, telling Barry County Officer Dave Ruark that he would put a contract out on his life. The jail incident was on video.

Delano also has two other cases with pending charges from this year. On February 7, Delano was arrested for drug offenses when officers were investigating a suspicious person complaint on Harold Street in Cassville. Delano allegedly had Oxycodone, Clonazepam, as well as a metal pipe for marijuana and another metal pipe. Officers reported that Delano tried to get rid of a pipe while talking to officers.

The other incident was on January 3. Officers investigated a drug offense on State Highway 112 and arrested multiple people, including Delano, for different drugs, including Alprazolam, Hydrocodone and methamphetamine.

Delano is being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$30,000 cash-only bond.

The earlier incidents not pertaining to purse theft have Delano facing two counts of possession of a controlled substance, endangering the welfare of a child, two counts of unlawful use of drug paraphernalia, and three counts of delivery of a controlled substance

# Seligman chief resigns, current officer takes his place

Seligman's Chief Police for the last three Terry years, Burgess, stepped down from his position at the city's June council meeting. Burgess also recommended Seligman's current Detective Sergeant Matt Phillips to take his place at the same time. The city accepted both the resignation and recommendation on Monday, June 12.

Burgess said that it was time for him to step down and turn the job over to someone else. He said, "After a combined 19 years between the military and law enforcement, it was time to focus solely on my business. I truly felt like I did my part and contribute.d" Burgess owns 37 Pawn and Gun in Seligman.

Phillips said he hopes to continue on with Burgess' goals for the city and thinks he has a firm grasp on the position after working in the city for the last two years. He said, "I'm hoping to see the city grow. Terry and I have some of the same views, and I hope to carry that on."

Phillips was hired by the Seligman Police Department as a reserve in August 2015. By November, he had been hired as the city's part-time officer. Then, in October 2016, Phillips was promoted to Detective Sergeant after completing Crime Scene Investigation classes, earning his certification in CSI.

Burgess said, "In my resignation letter, I also made

it a recommendation letter. Matt has been more than dedicated to this city for two years. Some of the things he brought to the table did nothing but improve the city, and it seemed fitting to me to have Matt pick up where I'm leaving off.

"Matt knows the city. Matt has come to know a lot of the people. He understands the department. His willingness to do the hard things and put in the legwork will make him a good chief."

Burgess said that he is proud of his time as chief and all that he and his officers accomplished over his three years with the city. He said, "Seligman was my first commission. After that, I went full time with the county, and eventually came back here.

"My goal coming in was just to provide a professional police department to

the community and update the police department. I honestly feel that we went from being one of the most underdeveloped departments to one of the most technologically advanced. We were the first to put computers in the cars, the first to do mobile ticketing. We really put a lot of technological advancement into the department."

He added that he is proud of Phillips and all of the officers that have passed through Seligman during his time in charge of the department.

"I'm really proud that every officer I've had leave the department and go to Barry County, Cassville and Newton County. They all moved up. Unfortunately, we'll always be a stepping stone department, but even this officer has succeeded me in becoming chief.

"All of the officers I've hired have gone on to bigger and better things. That's what I'm most proud of," Burgess said.

Both Phillips and Burgess agreed that the biggest changes in the department came with the equipment and technological advancements. Phillips said they've recently transitioned from laptops in their cars to Toughbooks, a military grade computer. He added

## Barry County buses get passing grades

After inspections by the Missouri State Highway Patrol, Barry County's school buses got passing grades and all will remain in commission.

Each year, the Missouri State Highway Patrol inspects school buses as part of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Division's school bus inspection program. Between February 2 and May 5, Highway Patrol personnel inspected Missouri Schools' buses. This year, the statewide average approval was 90.24 percent. Barry County's average was 83.48 percent.

According to a report released by the Missouri State Highway Patrol, there are three categories buses fall into: approved, defective and out of service. Despite the name, defective does not mean buses cannot be operated until repairs are made. Out of service buses had to be repaired, reinspected and placed back into service by the Missouri State Highway Patrol inspection personnel before transporting students again. Buses were allotted 10 days to be repaired and reinspected.

Inspection results were:

Cassville R-IV: 26 buses inspected, 26 buses approved, 100 percent approval rating

Exeter R-VI: 5 buses inspected, 4 buses approved, 1 bus considered defective, 80 percent approval rating.

Monett R-I: 26 buses inspected, 20 buses approved, 3 buses considered defective\*, 3 buses out of service\*, 76.9 percent approval

Shell Knob 78: 7 buses inspected, 6 buses approved, 1 bus considered defective, 85.7 percent approval rating.

Southwest R-V: 18 buses inspected, 15 buses approved, 1 bus considered defective, 2 buses out of commission, 83.3 percent approval rating.

Wheaton R-III: 8 buses, 6 approved, 2 buses defective\*, 75 percent approval rating.

\*Wheaton Schools has since replaced the two defective buses with new models utilizing a clean diesel grant. Monett's superintendent was unavailable to answer questions regarding any bus replacements.

Admission is \$10 for adults and \$5 for children ages 6-12. Advance tickets are \$2 off for adults.




within a run at 3-2.





# MDC releases spring turkey harvest totals

Preliminary data from the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) shows that turkey hunters checked 39,239 birds during Missouri's 2017 regular spring turkey season April 17 through May 7. Top harvest counties were Franklin with 932 birds checked, Texas with 843, and Callaway with 697. Young turkey hunters harvested 4,100 birds during the 2017 spring youth season, April 8-9, bringing the overall 2017 spring turkey harvest to 43,339.

Barry County's numbers were 167 turkeys total with 143 being adult gobblers, 21 being juvenille gobblers, and three being bearded hens.

The 2016 overall spring turkey harvest was 48,374 birds with 4,167 harvested during the youth weekend and 44,207 during the regular spring season.

"Given that we haven't had good hatches the past couple years, and the less-thanideal weather during a considerable portion of this year's season, the drop in harvest compared to last year was not unexpected," MDC Turkey Biologist Jason Isabelle said.

He added that the number of birds harvested this spring wasn't too far behind last year's harvest total going into the second weekend of spring turkey season, but the heavy rains that blanketed much of the state shortly thereafter caused the harvest to drop rapidly.

Isabelle noted favorable weather over this past weekend helped harvest numbers bounce back a bit.

The 2017 spring turkey season included two non-fatal hunting incidents. One involved a shooter who mistook another hunter for a turkey and the other was a selfinflicted shooting injury.

Missouri offers some of the best turkey hunting in the nation. MDC restoration efforts in past decades have taken this popular game bird from almost being wiped out in the state by the 1950s to an estimated sustainable population of more than 300,000 birds today. Missouri turkey hunters spend more than \$125 million each year on related travel, food, lodging, and hunting equipment, which helps local businesses and the economy.

## MoDOT reminds drivers to take caution during mowing season

Pushing the lawn mower back and forth across the yard is a springtime necessity. At the Missouri Department of Transportation, our crews are beginning the mowing season with a main purpose: safety.

During May and June, there is a good chance you will see MoDOT crews out mowing on tractor mowers so motorists have a clear, safe line of sight as they cruise along state highways.

"We ask motorists to pay attention and slow down when approaching mowing crews. Please take the time

to pass carefully and safely especially on rural two-lane roads," said MoDOT State Maintenance Engineer Becky Allmeroth.

Major and minor routes will be mowed in three cycles starting in mid-May, mid-July and mid-September. Along with the mowing, crews selectively use herbicides to stunt vegetation growth as well as to control brush and stop the spread of noxious weeds. Wildflowers are an added benefit of not mowing fence-to-fence and careful herbicide usage.

On rural two-lane roads,

crews may use a protective "follow" truck to alert motorists they are approaching slow-moving mowers. Drivers are advised to use the following tips to safely pass

- · Be alert for trucks and tractors with lights flashing and moving slowly, 2 to 5
- Slow down and focus on the road ahead of you. Avoid talking and texting on a cell phone or other distractions.
- Be prepared to stop or drive very slowly behind a "follow" truck, especially approaching a hill or curve

on a two-lane road.

• Obey the no passing zone stripes and only pass when you can see far enough past the "follow" truck to avoid meeting oncoming

#### Phone and Internet Discounts Available to CenturyLink Customers


