#### **Roaring River meeting highlights plans** Saturday's Rotary Rodeo brings new fun

The annual Roaring River and Big Sugar Creek State Parks annual meeting was held last night, June 12, and featured the activities at the park over the last year, as well as plans to do some renovations at both the hatchery and the other areas in the park. Director of Missouri State Parks Ben Ellis was also at the meeting to answer the public's questions about the park system as a whole and provide updates about projects state-wide.

Assistant park superintendent Brian Hunter, who is currently acting in the capacity of superintendent, opened the meeting to provide an update about the park's projects over the last year and upcoming projects. Hunter's highlights included information about kids' fishing days as well as the turn out for the Earth Day event, which drew in around 250 people.

Hunter mentioned various rehab projects around the park, controlled burns already completed, such as the one in the Devil's Kitchen area, as well as upcoming controlled burns. Director Ellis later said the maintenance aspect of projects is a goal statewide, noting that multiple areas in the parks system had been neglected due to a focus on new parks in the past few years.

Hunter also mentioned an upcoming project regarding the schoolhouse on site. Hunter said, "We're cleaning out the school house at the park. We've had multiple people say they knew people who went there and want to see the inside of it. It's been used for storage until now." There is no projected completion date on the school house project.

Other presenters included park ranger Steve Jabben and concession manager David Waugh with informative portions about the ranger program and Waugh's duties within the Roaring River Park system.

A representative from the Roaring River Hatchery also fielded questions about the empty raceways at the hatchery and plans to rehab various areas, including the gates that control water flow in the park. MK Spurrier said staff is emptying raceways and releasing the trout in the lunker pond in order to make improvements and repairs. The work will be in full swing in the fall, and no changes to stocking will take place. Roaring River is

working with other trout hatcheries statewide to keep the river stocked.

The hatchery project will be completed by

To close out the project, relatively new director Ellis addressed the crowd to answer questions about the park system as a whole and field questions and comments. Ellis had been working in Alaska prior to coming back to Missouri. He said, "There's more diversity, more opportunity, more dynamic outdoor recreation in Missouri than Alaska will ever have. The rivers, the caves, the campgrounds, the hiking trails...Alaska doesn't hold a candle to that."

Ellis continued, "There is a focus on maintenance and repair. There was a focus on expanding park land and in many cases, expanding park land at the detriment of maintenance and repair of other facilities. We're happy to put the focus back on repairing what we need to be repairing on our big projects and on our small projects. Focusing on maintenance and repair in the past has been haphazard. There's never been what in management circles is called asset-based management. Look at the campgrounds. Look at the swing set. Look at the playgrounds. Look at the camper cabins. Look at the lodges and put repair on the cycle so we get out of the deferred maintenance.

"We have about \$188 million in deferred maintenance. We're looking at making a commitment not for one, two or three or four years, but looking at putting our resources over a five year time period at \$20 million a year. We're doing it on a systematic basis.

"You'll see a lot of improvements to campgrounds and CCC structures. When you improve campgrounds, the use goes through the ceiling which helps the community."

Questions from the audience included questions about getting reliable wi-fi in the park and 50 amp campsites for larger campers. Ellis said both of those projects are in the works, and Missouri State Parks will be engaging in a pilot program with wi-fi options in a park next year before moving forward system-wide. He said updates to higher amp campsites is also on the list of projects for coming years.

#### Edgewood Dairy: A true family operation

June is dairy month, and one of the state's leading dairies is located here in Barry County. If you'd told the Fletcher family 20 years ago that today, their products would be sold in stores and used in restaurants all over, they'd never have believed it. However, Charles and Melissa Fletcher have grown their humble Washburn family dairy back in 1997 into a bit of a family dairy empire, with their products known in multiple states.

Charles shared, "I grew up on a dairy farm. In 1993, we formed a family partnership, and we had poultry and dairy all together south of Washburn."

By 1997, they'd switched their dairy to a grazing method. Grazing is desirable for dairy cows and is considered healthier in many circles. Charles said, "In 2001, we wanted to grow our dairy, so we moved to Purdy. We didn't have enough land in Washburn."

Since then, the Fletchers' farm has continued to grow. In 2015, they opened a creamery on site that allows the public to purchase both fresh and aged cheeses as well as milk and other prod-

When they started, they had 75 cows, now they have 300. Fletcher said, "I never would have guessed it

would have grown as much.

"But cows lasted longer than we thought, and we had to grow or sell cows. So we grew."

While a lot of dairy operations in Barry County have transitioned over to beef cattle or poultry farming, Edgewood has thrived. Fletcher said he attributes their success to controlling costs and working together as a family.

Charles and Melissa are joined by their son, Tyler, and his wife, Aubrey, as well as their daughter, Mikala, when she isn't in college. They are also joined by Melissa's family: Randy, Wanda and Leon Brown.

Fletcher said, "Being able to work together and control costs of grazing as much as we can is how we are still here."

There have been multiple changes in the way Edgewood operates over the years. Fletcher said, "We're in a lot more retail stores and wholesale. Grocery stores in Springfield and Branson and northwest Arkansas and restaurants,

"Most of our growth now is in the wholesale market."

Products are available in restaurants and grocery stores in Missouri, Arkansas and Oklahoma, according to Edgewood's website.

#### Driver arrested in fatal wreck that kills two

An Exeter woman and her fiance were killed in a motor-cycle crash last week, resulting in the arrest of the other driver. Robin M. Henson, 49, of Exeter, and Kelly B. Utter, 43, of Monett, were both pronounced deceased at the scene of a Newton County crash last week. The driver of the other vehicle, Victor Arias Alanis, 19, of Nixa, was arrested at the scene and taken to the Newton County Jail.

According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, Utter was driving a 2004 Honda motorcycle eastbound on US 60 about four miles east of Granby with Henson as his passenger on Saturday, June 9. Arias Alanis was driving a 2017 Nissan Altima and made a left turn on Route M without yielding to the motorcycle, causing the motorcycle to hit the side of the car, ejecting both Utter and Henson around 6:15 p.m.

Utter and Henson were both pronounced deceased at the scene by Newton County Coroner Owen at 7:25 p.m. They were both wearing helmets at the time of the crash.

Arias Alanis had no reported injuries at the time of the crash and was taken into police custody at 7:40 p.m. to be transported to the Newton County Jail on a 24 hour hold for felony DWI (drugs) resulting in the death of two or more, failure to yield to a vehicle coming from the opposite direction when turning left, driving while suspended, no insurance, possession of less than 10 grams of marijuana and possession of drug paraphernalia.

The motorcycle was totaled, and the Altima sustained extensive damage. Both were towed from the scene by Riediger Wrecker.

As of time of press, Arias Alanis has not been charged and does not appear to be in custody of the Newton County Sheriff's Department. Arias Alanis has another pending DWI charge from February 2017. He was charged with misdemeanor DWI, exceeding the posted speed limit (16 to 19 miles per hour) and failure

to drive within a single lane on the roadway having three or more lanes in Nixa. After multiple failures to appear, Arias Alanis was released on his own recognizance on those charges on April 3, 2018.

Utter and Henson were Troop D's sixth and seventh fatalities for June and 53rd and 54th for 2018.

#### Teens charged with man killed in burglary of business in Golden

Two 19 year olds have been arrested and charged with breaking into Battery Outfitters in Golden late in May.

According to affidavits of probable cause, used in filing charges against them, Hunter Seay Williams, 19, of Golden, was driven to Battery Outfitters in the early morning hours of May 27. The driver was allegedly Kevin Newman, 19, of Exeter. Williams allegedly broke the window of the business with a rock and entered the building. Inside, he allegedly stole the deposits for the previous two days and the cash box. Williams then reportedly got into the car with Newman and the two drove away.

Deputies with the Barry County Sheriff's Office were dispatched for an alarm going off. When the deputies arrived on scene, the owner of the business was also present. The victim reported that the deposits were stolen, along with the cash box. The deposits reportedly contained over \$1,400 in cash and over \$1,000 in checks, plus \$673 cash in the cash box.

During an interview with the suspects, Williams allegedly admitted to breaking the window and taking the money. Williams and Newman reportedly burned the checks and credit card receipts, along with the clothing Williams wore during the alleged incident. Newman allegedly corroborated these details and admitted to driving the vehicle.

Kevin Newman is charged with burglary in the second degree, stealing of \$750 or more and second degree property damage. He is being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of \$15,000 cash or surety bond. Hunter Williams faces the same charges, but his bond is set at \$30,000 cash or

#### Southwest Spanish teacher brings back real-life experience through Bolivia trip

Southwest School's Spanish teacher was offered a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to travel to Bolivia through the Partners of the Americas program, and she is passing along the knowledge she gained to her stu-

Southwest's Spanish teacher Dianna Galyen has taught at the school for seven years after working at private schools and as teachers' aide before. This school year, an opportunity presented itself that Galyen said she couldn't pass up: a trip to Bolivia to instruct other teachers how to teach English. Galyen said, "I learned about the program when Roarsio Keel visited the school looking for stu-

ambassadors program. It takes students for a month to a foreign country, and they go in groups of ten students and a mentor. It's a fantastic program for them to be able to learn about the world farther away.

"I worked really closely with [Southwest student] Blanche Kirk trying to help her get everything together for that program which she was selected for. When Partners of America was looking for a teacher exchange, Rosario contacted me and asked if I would be interested, and I said I sure would."

From there, Galyen prepared to travel to Tarija, Bolivia, for the bulk of her stay, finishing up in La Paz, Bolivia, before coming dents to participate in youth home. She left on February 16 and stayed just under four weeks total overseas.

Galyen said, "I learned so much. I learned a whole lot about the culture. I learned about foods and traditions, customs and holidays. I learned about the people in their everyday lives, like how they are so hospitable and generous and accommodating. I learned the different ways they learn to work around difficulties and how they make things work for them in terms of travel and education."

Most importantly, Galyen said what she learned she can give back to her students. She said, "It was an opportunity of a lifetime for me. It was the only way I'd ever get to do this. It's amazing the things I can bring back to my students. I can't wait to plan lessons for next year. I know so much more than I did, and I can show them pictures and give them a feel for that experi-

"Students have always asked me if I'd been to a country and learned Spanish there, and Green Forrest, Ark., where I learned my Spanish, is a let down for that answer. It's not that it wasn't a real experience, but it's a tiny speck compared to being surrounded by Spanish culture and language for a whole month."

Galyen was a part of the Teachers in Residence program sponsored by Partners of the Americas. Local vice president of the Missouri Chapter, Rosario Keele, helped prepare Galyen and introduce her to the program. Keele said, "Our Chapter and myself worked in collaborations and directly with the US Embassy in Bolivia coordinating the education trip for Dianna. As an advocate for education, I recognize our region of Southwest Missouri, we have an amazing group of excellent active and retired teachers that qualify and could have the opportunity Dianna had to volunteer and teach Anglicize at our Binational Centers overseas. They can teach to other teachers and students for a duration of up to six weeks in foreign counties, while themselves learn of other cultures' customers, practice their Spanish or Portuguese language

and travel to countries like Bolivia, Peru, Brazil or oth-

Galyen said, "Programs like this are very important. The purpose of the program is to build strong bonds between the two Americas so we can work in partnership and help each other accomplish our goals. I think that's important especially in a world where division and the norms are sometimes not getting along and being divided. I think its important to bring people together for common goals and have people realize we have a lot in common. And we have common problems and we all have unique and different ways of finding solutions. Friendship will make our world a better place.

"They are also looking to bring someone from Bolivia here in the coming months as well."

Galyen said part of what she gained from the experience was confidence in her abilities, which will translate into her teaching. "One of the most exciting things is I learned what I can do. I learned, of course, I'm fluent and everyone understands you and you understand everyone else, and it

"It's not perfect but, yes, I can survive a month where people speak this language, and that was exciting."

Learning she could thrive in a Spanish-speaking country, but for Galyen, that wasn't the only challenge. Her assignment was to instruct teachers, not students. She said she didn't have much public speaking experience prior to going to Bolivia. She said, "When I found out my assignment was teaching teachers, I was a little scared. I learned big public speaking there. My



main purpose was to teach foreign language teachers methods to teach foreign languages. Sometimes my classes were 12 and my largest was 44 people.

"I considered it a really strenuous schedule for me. Every minute I wasn't speaking, it felt like I was pulling it together as fast as I could do the next presentation. I was grateful for good classes at College of the Ozarks where I learned pedagogy. I had a lot of notes that I could look back on. I was also thankful for professional development offered at Southwest. It wasn't the luxury of speaking to different people and repeating my lessons. For the most part, it was delivering workshops and then see the same people a couple times a week.

"The only time I'd spoken publicly, it wasn't even public. I spoke to teachers for about 30 minutes. I didn't think I could do that."

When Galyen wasn't teaching, she was learning about the culture and different aspects of Bolivian life.

She said, "It was so interesting to function within the society which I've studied.

"I teach Spanish architecture as part of our curriculum in Spanish class, and I felt I understood it very well until I'm looking around and surrounded by this very architecture: the balconies and roof tiles and the interior patios. It's entirely different to be surrounded by it and a part of it.

"I was impressed so

much by the hospitality and good manners. They will speak to everyone in a cab, not just one person. At a restaurant, they greet everyone at the table. As you leave a restaurant, you say goodbye to all of those people.

"I can't explain how incredible it was. It's the only time I've been able to travel to a Spanish-speaking country for any length of time. It was incredible to me to be able to see the fruits

and vegetation. The flowers were amazing. To be able to go pick oranges off the tree and squeeze it into juice that day was incredible."

While Galyen was good at putting into words her experience, she said it doesn't do how she feels justice. She said, "There aren't any words to describe what I lived and there aren't any pictures to tell the story either. I care about the lives that are a world away from





Tingling and numbness in the extremities while swimming in the water has been a common statement made by individuals who survived incidents involving electrical

current near docks. Swimming away from any dock suspected to be charged with electricity is the safest course of action. Exiting the water at the shoreline, a safe distance from the electrically charged dock, or swimming to a nearby dock, would be the alternative. It should be noted, if there are metal dock cables securing the electrically charged dock to the shoreline, the metal cables may be charged with electricity and should be avoided also.

"Warm weather has arrived in Missouri and many people will begin enjoying time on our state's lakes and rivers," said Colonel Karsten. "While it is convenient to have electricity available on a boat dock, it is important to be responsible. Make sure you have taken the necessary



#### Free smoke detectors offered to Exeter area residents

Through a partnership with the Red Cross, the Exeter Fire Department is offering free smoke detectors with installation to residents within the district. According to Jim Matthew, Exeter Fire chief, this is the first time the department has offered the program through Red Cross.

Matthews said, "Basically, they can call our city hall if they need smoke detectors. If they have some that don't work or don't have any at all and live in our district, my guys will put them up for them at no charge."

Matthew said Exeter Fire has handed out free smoke detectors before, but this is the first time with the Red Cross. Previously, the department purchased them through donated

He added, "They are ten-year smoke detectors, so people won't have to worry about a battery for ten years."

Julie Stolting, with American Red Cross, said the initiative is part of an organizational goal to decrease fatalities in single-family home fires by 25 percent. The program, called Sound the Alarm, started three years ago.

Stolting said, "The initiative is the smoke detector program, but it also teaches about fire safety and escape plans.

"We've installed over 50 smoke alarms in Barry County so far, and the initiative requires they are installed, not just given out."

She added that Butterfield and Monett Fire Departments are already using the program for their residents, and that Purdy Fire Department will be added soon.

Matthew said that volunteers from Exeter Fire will install the smoke alarms in homes within their district. He said, "There is a little bit of paperwork required. They have to fill out their name and address, and then my guys will help them fill out an escape plan that they can put on their fridge with a magnet with two ways out of their house in case of an emergency."

There is also an informational aspect about how to act in the event of severe weather.

Matthew said the firefighters will actually work with each family to establish a safe plan on how to get out of their home in case of a fire. "They'll actually go through the house to help them figure out two escape plans in case of a fire."

To sign up for the program and receive a free smoke detector, fire district residents should contact Exeter City Hall to fill out the form. The fire department will then contact them to set up a time to install them.

Exeter City Hall is located at 116 Front Street and is open Monday through Friday 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. If you have questions about whether or not you are in Exeter Fire district, stop by city hall and fill out a form.

Exeter Fire Department has 18 to 20 volunteers. They respond to around 125 calls a year.







### Pint Size Resale offers new, used bargains for families

Kids clothing shops and boutiques in rural areas tend to be few and far between. That is the main reason why a mother-daughter duo opened a resale and new children's and maternity clothing shop in Aurora, and since then, business has been booming.

Brandy Coulter and her mom, Lori Clardy, opened Pint Size Resale in Aurora less than six months ago, but business has been good, and locals are benefitting from the deals offered at the shop. Coulter said she opened the shop because, as a mom of ten kids, she knew there weren't a lot of options in the area. Coulter shared, "There isn't anywhere around here to shop for kids' clothes besides Walmart."

Out of that need, Pint Size Resale was born.

Walking into Pint Size, the variety is almost over-whelming. The shop carries new and used baby and kids' clothes up to size 14, as well as toys, books, hair bows and maternity clothes of all sizes. Brands vary tremendously.

Coulter said, "We carry anywhere from Walmart brands like Garanimals up to Matilda Jane. We just carry all of it for everyone. We try to accommodate something toys to help those looking to buy and those looking to sell. Coulter said she wishes they could take more, but space is limited at their current location. She said, "Right now, we are just doing consignment. We had to put a pause on buying because we were over full. Our racks were overflowing."

Normally, Pint Size will buy clothes in exchange for store credit toward other merchandise.

She continued, "We had to tear apart the store and add three more shelves just to be able to put things out on the floor. We have tons and nowhere to go with it."

Coulter attributes that success to friends telling friends about the shop. She said, "For the most part, it's been word of mouth and people saying, 'it's awesome' and it ends up with them coming in."

Coulter is no newbie to the resale world. She worked for a small children's resale shop for 10 years before moving. That sparked her interest in opening her own shop in Aurora.



### Teach kids about mowing the lawn safely

Lawn mowing is often one of the first jobs young people

It is also one of the most dangerous spring activities, says University of Missouri Extension health and safety specialist Karen Funkenbusch.

U.S. hospital emergency departments treat about 80,000 people each year for lawn mower injuries, according to the Consumer Product Safety Commission. The American Academy of Pediatrics reports that more than 17,000 children and teens receive treatment for such injuries each year.

Funkenbusch urges parents to reduce risk by knowing which tasks are appropriate for the age of the child. Proper training, supervision and safety protection are basics of safe lawn mowing.

Ask yourself if you feel your child is mature enough to recognize a hazard, problem-solve and respond appropriately, says Funkenbusch. Children under 13 require constant supervision. Children ages 14-15 need intermittent supervision. Children 16 and older require less supervision.

Train children while operating mowers at low speed on level ground when there is good light, says Funkenbusch. Remind them not to let anyone else ride with them or be in the yard when they mow. Also remind them to pick up yard debris before using a mower or trimmer.

Make sure your child wears closed-toe, nonskid shoes, and hearing and eye protectors, and avoids wearing loose-fitting clothing that the mower can grab on to. Talk to your child about sun protection and regular hydration while mowing.

Funkenbusch mends that parents ask themselves these questions before letting a child mow the lawn:

Does your child have the physical strength to push, turn and control a push mower safely?

Is the child tall enough to operate controls?

Is your child coordinated enough to use his hands and feet simultaneously?

Are the mower and attachments like baggers in good working condition?

If you have a riding mower, does it have a seatbelt and a rollover protection device?

Does your child know to stop the mower, shut it off and call for help if the mower strikes an object?

#### Watch out for MoDOT mowing crews

Missouri Department of Transportation crews will soon begin mowing roadsides across the state.

"Our mowing focuses on visibility and safety," said MoDOT State Maintenance Engineer Becky Allmeroth. "Motorists will see tractor mowers near the shoulder of interstates and other busy roadways. Please watch out for our crews, slow down and don't drive distracted."

Major and minor routes are mowed in three cycles usually starting in mid-May, mid-July and mid-September. Along with mowing, crews selectively use herbicides to stunt vegetation growth, control brush and stop the spread of noxious weeds. Wildflowers

careful herbicide usage add additional benefits in that they reduce the amount of time spent mowing fence-to-

MoDOT mows about 400,000 acres of grass each year, which is equivalent to 300,000 football fields.

On rural two-lane roads, crews may use a protective "follow" truck to alert motorists they are approaching slow-moving mowers. Drivers are advised to use the following tips to safely pass

- Be alert for trucks and tractors with lights flashing and moving slowly, 2 to 5
- Slow down and focus on the road ahead of you. Avoid talking and texting on a cell

phone or other distractions.

- Be prepared to stop or drive very slowly behind a "follow" truck, especially approaching a hill or curve on a two-lane road.
- Obey the no passing zone stripes and only pass when you can see far enough past the "follow" truck to avoid meeting oncoming


