## Shell Knob woman killed by truck rolling down driveway

A Shell Knob woman was killed on Thursday when a truck rolled backward down a driveway and hit her. According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, Bobbie J. Harris, 68, was killed, and another woman on foot was also hit and suffered minor injuries.

On Thursday, June 16, a 2001 Dodge Dakota Sport 4x4 was at a residence on Villa Vinee Circle in Shell Knob when it began to roll down the driveway. Harris and Judtih A. Betts, 77, Shell Knob, were

both pedestrians. The Dakota first hit Betts before continuing to roll onto Villa Vinee Circle and hitting Harris.

Harris was pronounced dead at the scene by Barry County deputy coroner Becky Davison.

Betts was transported via ambulance to Mercy Hospital in Springfield for minor inju-

Harris' next of kin was notified. This is the Missouri State Highway Patrol Troop D's 2nd fatal accident for the month of June and the 51st for the 2016 vear.

### Libraries forced to cut hours, board and staff reevaluate failed tax levy increase

After the proposed property tax levy increase by the Barry-Lawrence Regional Library was defeated in the April 2016, the library board and staff are reevaluating how to approach voters next April to try to get the measure passed.

Director Gina Milburn said that the library has already had to start making cuts because of the levy proposal's defeat. She said, 'We've already cut hours at our five bigger locations to close on Saturdays and the smaller branches will only be open three days a week." The proposed levy would have added a 7-cent increase on personal property tax levies from 15 cents to 22 cents.

As of August 1, Cassville, Monett, Aurora, Mt. Vernon and Marionville are now only open Monday through Friday, from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Smaller branches at Purdy, Eagle Rock, Shell Knob, Miller and Pierce City are open Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

Milburn said, "No one has lost their job, the board was very careful to make sure that no one had to be let go, but if someone quits, it'll be reevaluated as to whether they will be replaced or not. Some people's hours were reduced. but not by too much."

On top of the hour changes, the library has also had to cut their serials and magazine budget, said they won't get any new databases and cut some existing databases like Ancestry.com.

When asked if the library system is in trouble, Milburn said, "I would say we've managed our money very well and our budget reflects that. We're on the edge, but we're not in the red, and we don't want to end up there. Good budgeting means we're not waiting until we're needing a signature loan to make payroll."

Now, the local branches are reaching out to their communities and patrons to ask about why the levy didn't pass and how they can help educate the community on the need. Each branch is talking to people individually and asking

## Barry County Courts send 9 to prison in the month of May

• Carl E. Barnes, of Aurora, pled guilty to forgery and is to serve 120 days of shock time of a seven year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections. Barnes was already on probation for pleading guilty to forgery in January 2015, and his probation has now been revoked. His shock time for that offense is to run concurrently with the recent charge.

Barnes' charges came from a report made by Friendly Tire in Monett that a check had been forged and passed at the business in November 2014. The check was drawn on an account that did not exist and was written in the amount of \$324.44. The checks were part of an ongoing investigation into Barnes and two others. Another check was stolen form a victim in Pierce City, and checks were passed at Walmart in Republic and Price Cutter in Webb City in June 2015. Barnes was identified by security video in those cases. Barnes also wrote forged checks to other locations, as well.

• John Jason Bartholomew, of Goodman, pled guilty to endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree and possession of a controlled substance. Bartholomew was sentenced to seven years incarceration for the charges of which he will serve 120 days of shock

On April 14, 2014, Bartholomew was arrested following an investigation of drug activity in his home in Wheaton. Statements made by the three children in his home alerted the authorities to possible drug activity and described a green camo box where Bartholomew kept his syringes.

When officers investigated, Bartholomew admitted to having marijuana, but no other illegal substances. When officers found the box that contained syringes, spoons and a melted green pill, as well as marijuana pipes with burnt residue, Bartholomew said it belonged to another person. However, there was a letter inside the box that was addressed to him.

All of the illegal drug para-

phernalia was within reach of the children in the home. Officers also said the home was unsanitary for children.

• Stephen M. Brody, of Everton, pled guilty to two counts of statutory sodomy in the second degree. Brody was granted a suspended execution of a seven year incarceration sentence and five years supervised probation.

The charges against Brody originated in Lawrence County at a residence in Everton, and the case was transferred to Barry County on a change of venue. In March 2015, two girls, ages 15 and 16, made reports that Brody had touched them inappropriately while they were living in the home in Everton. The forensic interview revealed that Brody put his hands in their shirts, entered their rooms at inappropriate times while they were not dressed, and touched them inappropriately.

Brody is to serve probation until May 16, 2021.

• Michael D. Carr, of Shell Knob, made an Alford plea to theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in value. Carr was granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

Carr is to serve probation until May 16, 2021.

• Jason Matthew Clark, of Wheaton, pled guilty to manufacturing a controlled substance within 2,000 feet of a school, possession of a controlled substance and three counts of endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree. Clark received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

Clark was arrested following an investigation into possible drug activity at his apartment on Hill Street in Wheaton in October 2014. When officers arrived, they found two jars of liquid that tested positive for methamphetamine, as well as multiple precursors to meth and paraphernalia. The shake and bake methamphetamine operation was done inside the apartment, which is within 2,000 feet of the Wheaton school and is public housing. There were also additional charges because there were three minor children in the home, as well.

Clark is to serve probation until May 17, 2021.

• Eddie Mack Cook, Jr., of Purdy, pled guilty to tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree. Cook received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On December 30, 2015, Cook was involved in a motor vehicle crash on Route H. Cook wrecked a 1999 Ford F-150 pickup in the ditch and then fled the scene. During the investigation, officers discovered that Cook had engaged in a fight with the mother of his child earlier and assaulted another person in her home. When her father attempted to find Cook, he found the wrecked truck and reported it. Authorities believe Cook failed to negotiate a curve and crashed as he left the woman's

The pickup truck that Cook was driving was stolen from a man whom he had been working for and living in a house on his farm for the previous 10 days. The value of the truck was around \$8,500 and \$9,000 of equipment and tools. The owner of the pickup confronted

Cook verbally at Terry's Café in Shell Knob in front of Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly the next day, and Cook admitted to stealing the truck.

Cook is to serve probation until May 16, 2021.

• Lane Aaron Curran, of Exeter, pled guilty to DWI-Alcohol as a persistent offender. Curran received a suspended execution of a four year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections and five years supervised pro-

Curran was arrested following a Cassville Police officer observing him make a left turn from a right-turn only lane in June 2015. Curran failed field sobriety tests and had previous DWI convictions.

Curran is to serve probation until May 18, 2021.

• Daphne C. Doty, of Monett, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Doty received a suspended imposition of sentencing and four years supervised probation.

Doty was arrested after a narcotics investigation at a residence she was staying at in December 2014. In the bedroom where Doty and another woman were staying, officers found three ounces of methamphetamine, digital scales, drug paraphernalia and a fourth of a pound of marijuana.

Doty is to serve probation until May 16, 2020.

• Rochelle Denise Duncan, of Mt. Vernon, made an Alford plea to passing a bad check of \$500 or more with insufficient funds. Duncan received a suspended imposition of sentencing, three years supervised probation, and she must pay restitution.

Duncan wrote checks to Monett dentist Dr. Stephan Stidham's office in the amount of \$2,900 in May 2015, knowing that they would not be paid.

Duncan is to serve probation until May 17, 2019.

• James Lee Flanigan, of Hillsboro, pled guilty to theft/ stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in value. Flanigan received a sus-





pended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

On June 3, 2015, Flanigan took \$882.23 through the self-checkout at Walmart in Cassville and when all three debit cards were declined, he left the store with the merchandise without paying for it.

After the Barry County Sheriff's Department posted about the crime on Facebook, an anonymous tipster messaged saying that someone at George's who had recently moved from St. Louis had been bragging about stealing tools from Walmart. Flanigan was identified as the person on the security footage.

Flanigan is to serve probation until May 16, 2019.

• Braxton K. Franklin, of Cassville, pled guilty to theft/ stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in value. Franklin was granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

Franklin stole tires and rims from Ball and Prier Tire over a period of two and a half years, selling the sets for around \$1,000. Franklin admitted to stealing them when confronted in 2015, and he had eight tires in the back of his SUV, worth approximately \$500.

Franklin is to serve probation until May 17, 2021.

• Kevin Van Granger, of Joplin, pled guilty to three counts of forgery, two counts of tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree, and knowingly exploding or burning a motor vehicle. Granger was sentenced to between four and seven years for each offense of which he will serve 120 days of shock incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

In January 2016, Granger stole checks from a vehicle and

then wrote a check to Race Brothers totalling \$306.28. Granger was identified through tips on social media with the still photos from the security

Then, Granger was also charged and pled guilty to stealing, destroying or burning four vehicles also in January 2016. Granger also stole a car stereo, black duffle bag, video camera and other property.

• Joshua Lee Green pled guilty to two counts of non-support with the total arrears in excess of 12 months. Green received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years of supervised probation.

Green was charged with child support in arrears totalling \$35,464.04 as of January 2015. He was to pay \$447 per month for two children.

Green is to serve probation until May 10, 2021.

• Jeffrey Robert Healey, of Seligman, pled guilty to DWI-Alcohol as a persistent offender, driving while revoked or suspended as a second or subsequent offense and failure to wear a seat belt. Healey received a thee year and 60 day sentence of which the execution has been suspended, a \$10 fine and a year of supervised probation.

Healey was arrested when he was pulled over by the Missouri State Highway Patrol when he was driving a truck without headlamps on August 23, 2015, on Missouri 37 north of Purdy. Once detained, Healey failed field sobriety tests after officers noticed he smelled heavily of intoxicants. He did not have a drivers license and had multiple DWI convictions.

Healey is to serve probation until May 16, 2017.

• Travis Lee Hobbs, of Lebanon, made an Alford plea to assault in the third degree and property damage in the second degree. Hobbs was given a suspended imposition of sentencing, was fined \$300 and is to serve a year of unsupervised probation and must pay restitution.

On May 5, 2015, Hobbs was arrested after unlawfully entering a residence on State Highway 76 in Cassville and shoving the victim several times.

Hobbs also broke into a residence on Farm Road 2200 in Cassville and did around \$750 worth of property damage in November 2013.

Hobbs is to serve probation until May 16, 2017.

• Samantha May Hostetter, of Aurora, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Hostetter received a suspended execution of a five year incarceration sentence and five years supervised probation.

In May 2014, Hostetter was the passenger in a car that was pulled over by the Missouri State Highway Patrol. When Hostetter's purse was searched, the trooper found methamphetamine.

Hostetter is to serve probation until May 17, 2021.

• Joseph M. Hunepohl, of Monett, pled guilty to harassment of a person under the age of 17 by a person over 21 years old. Hunepohl was sentenced to two years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

Hunepohl was arrested after having inappropriate text message conversations with a 13 year old girl in Monett. The text messages between the two in early 2014 involved Hunepohl advising the girl to get genital piercings and that he and his girlfriend had similar piercings.

• David Preston Jackson, of Seligman, made an Alford plea to domestic assault in the third degree. Jackson received a suspended imposition of sentencing and two years supervised probation.

In December 2014, Jackson tried to pull his girlfriend out of her vehicle by her arm. He had prior convictions for assault in Barry County.

Jackson is to serve probation until May 17, 2018.

• Terry Dean Klein, of Green Forest, Ark., pled guilty to

burglary in the second degree and theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in value. Klein was sentenced to five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On January 4, 2016, Klein and another man broke into the Roaring River Nature Center in Cassville and stole multiple items as well as caused over \$750 in damage. Some of the property, including a trailer that the pair stole, was on Klein's property.

• Kenneth Shane Lakey pled guilty to non-support with the total arrears of more than 12 months. Lakey received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years unsupervised probation.

Lakey was charged for being in arrears of child support for three children. Lakey was to be paying support at the rate of \$446 per mount and was \$13,135.23 in arrears as of April 6, 2015.

Lakey is to serve probation until May 16, 2021.

• Michael Douglas Martin, of Monett, pled guilty to unlawful possession of an illegal weapon. Martin received a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years unsu-

pervised probation.

Martin was charged after the Monett Police Department investigated a shot being fired on Palmer Drive. Martin was in possession of a shotgun that was used in the incident on March 15, 2015.

Martin is to serve probation until May 16, 2019.

• Taylor Mayes, of Springfield, pled guilty to unlawful use of a weapon. Mayes was sentenced to two years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

Mayes was arrested when the Cassville police Department found him to have an illegal knife concealed on his person. Mayes threatened three people with the knife on February 11, 2012.

• Kyla Breanne Mestas, of Exeter, pled guilty to two counts of possession of a controlled substance. Mestas received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

Mestas was a passenger in a vehicle pulled over by the Barry County Sheriff's Department on June 4, 2015. She was in possession of a hollowed out ink pen that had methamphetamine in it.

## City of Cassville's Jennifer Evans earns CPFO designation

Jennifer Evans is an intelligent and driven woman who has accomplished what only 12 other people in Missouri have achieved. She has graduated from the Government Finance Officers Association

(GFOA) as a CPFO (certified public finance officer). The self study program is an extensive and difficult course covering five different exams in public finance. This is such an intense course students are given seven years to take the five exams which cover Governmental Accounting, Auditing, and Financial Reporting, Cash Management and Investments, Debt Management, Operating and Capital Budgeting, and Pension and Benefits, Risk Management and Procurement.

Before she could begin this arduous task, she had to have a Bachelors degree and three years in government accounting. The tests are given in the spring, summer and fall and provide no study guides or curriculum, only recommended readings. Jennifer started the program in the fall of 2014 and her first test of 175 questions covered the book, Governmental Accounting Auditing and Financial Reporting, which was over 1000 pages long. She

studied for six months before taking the test. She was told it was very difficult and not to get discouraged if she failed. Jennifer proudly passed the test the first time and went on take a test a semester, passing each one the first time. This is a major accomplishment requiring weeks of study before each test, and she was able to graduate in the spring of 2016. Now, Jennifer, the mayor, council and city can have confidence the finances of Cassville will be handled correctly and efficiently and the audit will be completed with no problems.

What started Jennifer on this path to success? She graduated from Southwest Baptist University in Bolivar with a Bachelors degree in Mathematics. She taught

school for a few years then took time off to raise her children. She then worked part time for 13 years in the banking business before taking the job of city clerk in April 2013. In 2014, she was promoted to the position of City Clerk/ Finance Officer. At this time, she had no accounting background and knew she needed this knowledge to successfully perform her duties as a finance officer. Government accounting is completely different from the private sector, which led her to the GFOA. Now upon graduating, she only has to participate in 30 hours of continuing professional education each year to maintain her designation.

She is very grateful to the mayor and council who encouraged and supported



Then, a little over a week later on June 15, 2015, the Wheaton Police Department found her to have a rock of methamphetamine in her possession.

Mestas is to serve probation until May 17, 2021.

• Sharon D. Miller, of Joplin, pled guilty to tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree, possession of a controlled substance and five counts of forgery in 2013. Her probation has since been revoked and she is to serve five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On December 31, 2013, Miller jumped into the seat of someone else's vehicle and drove it to Rebel Recycling. Then, in January 2013, Miller stole checks that she was using at various locations like Pack N Go, Casey's and Mazzio's in Monett.

Miller also was arrested after taking items from victim's washer at the laundromat in Monett. She claimed she stole them for "the rush" on June 25, 2013. Miller was found to have methamphetamine and a crack pipe at the time.

In June 2013, Miller also forged checks to Pizza Hut and Bruner Pharmacy in Monett.

• Casey Lynn Myers, of Monett, pled guilty to hindering the prosecution of a felony. She received a suspended execution of a three year incarceration sentence and four years supervised probation.

On September 17, 2015, a man reported that two vintage automobile doors as well as a Jeep tailgate, a small electric winch and a Craftsman lawn edger were stolen from his property on Farm Road 2030 in Monett.

When the doors were found on a vehicle, Casey claimed she bought them at a swap meet, but the swap meet records did not match. The stolen items were found at her friend's father's trailer.

Myers is to serve probation until May 17, 2020.

• John Christopher Plopper, of Purdy, pled guilty to burglary in the second degree, tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree and resisting arrest for a felony. Plopper was sentenced to three years incarceration with the Department of Corrections

On April 4, 2016, Plopper burglarized a residence on Farm Road 2020 in Monett. He stole keys to the victim's truck and then was found in the truck later. He caused around \$550 worth of damage to the residence to steal the keys. Then, he broke into another residence when trying to evade officers attempting to arrest him.

• Jennifer Kay Steele, of Washburn, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Steele received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

Steele was arrested after being pulled over by the Missouri State Highway Patrol on June 15, 2014. Officers found her to be in possession of methamphetamine, and she was driving the vehicle heavily intoxicated by drugs.

Steele is to serve probation until May 17, 2021.

• Jessica Kay Thompson, of Monett, pled guilty to non-support with the total arrears over 12 months. Thompson was sentenced to two years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

Thompson's charges originate from being in arrears for child support for three children in the amount of \$7,200 as of September 4, 2012. She was to be paying \$500 per month.

• Brian Stan Uentillie, of Springfield, made an Alford plea to assault in the second degree - operating a motor vehicle while intoxicated resulting in an injury. Uentillie received a suspended execution of a four year incarceration sentence and three years supervised probation.

Uentillie was the driver in a single-vehicle crash on December 19, 2015. He and his passenger had to be airlifted from the wreck that occurred in Golden. While intoxicated,

Uentillie failed to negotiate a curve and struck several trees.

Uentillie is to serve probation until May 15, 2019.

• Shawn L. Vickrey, of Wyandotte, Okla., pled guilty to domestic assault in the first degree and felonious restraint. Vickrey was sentenced to five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

Vickrey was arrested in February 2016 when he assaulted his ex-wife in Wheaton. He punched her in the head and chest and then hit her in the back of the head with fencing pliers. She ran to a neighbor's apartment for help.

• Christopher Lee Youngblood, of Cassville, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and two counts of burglary in the second degree. Youngblood was granted a suspended imposition of sentencing, give five years supervised probation, pay restitution, and must complete the CRISP rehabilitation program.

Youngblood's charges stemmed from three different events. On October 17, 2015, Youngblood was found in someone's home. The home owner did not know Youngblood, and officers found him with methamphetamine.

Then, on November 8, 2015, Youngblood broke into a home on Farm Road 2175 in Exeter and stole \$20 from the victim's purse. Finally, on December 8, 2015, Youngblood broke into a residence at 1401 Oak Street in Cassville.

Youngblood is to serve probation until May 12, 2021.



questions about why they personally feel it didn't pass, what others have said about the proposal, and what they can do better in the future to help voters understand the need for the increase.

The library system is working with Every Library, which is an organization that helps libraries pass tax levies. Milburn said, "We didn't use them before because, honestly, we thought it would pass, but now we have guidelines to follow."

Every Library has Barry-Lawrence talking to people individually, encouraged them to form a strategic plan for their system, and is helping them to form a Political Action Committee to encourage people to vote yes. Milburn said, "We, as librarians, can't ask people to vote yes, but a PAC can do that. It has to be run by the community."

After listening to individuals in the community, the library hopes to begin campaigning in January 2017 for the April 2017 vote. As they get closer, they'll think about the wording of the ballot, but Milburn says they'll still be asking for the 7-cent increase.

The concentrated effort to ask the community about their opinions has yielded a lot of commentary. Milburn said, "It's been an interesting conglomerate. A lot of people are saying they don't want more taxes, but one thing that sticks out is that a lot of people don't understand how property tax levies are calculated, that it's not thousands of dollars they are paying the library on their home, it's just based off of a percentage of their home's value.

"We've tried to break that down in our literature, show that its not has bad as everyone thinks, but it's a challenge."

Milburn said that another hurdle is getting people out to vote. She said, "A lot of people said they didn't vote because they thought it would pass and that they didn't need to. So we need to encourage people to get out and vote."

Other issues that arose involved smaller communities worrying that all of the money was going to be used for the larger branches, which isn't the case. Because of the small amounts of funding at the smaller branches, without the larger branches, smaller

communities wouldn't be able to fund their libraries. Some don't even take in enough revenue to pay the salary of one person operating the branch, but Milburn assured that the funds are used for all of the branches based on what they need.

Milburn said, "We had a lot of people really think that Monett was going to get a new building with this money, which isn't what this levy is for. We've always had building maintenance, and we own eight out of 10 of our branches. All of those branches have been remodeled except for Monett, where we have even been

taping the carpet to keep it together, but the funds are going to many different things, not building a new Monett branch."

As time passes, the library hopes that with Every Library's guidance, they'll be able to educate the public on the need for more operating revenue. Milburn said, "We're in the same boat as most other libraries."

Right now, the library applies for grants for technology upgrades and their summer reading program to help supplement their funding and keep patrons able to use their facilities.

However, even grants are a 25 percent match which has to come from tax-funded revenue.

Milburn said, "We are one payment away from being in trouble if anything major happens to one of our branches. We have no way of paying for it if there were something major like a tornado. We would be stuck."

The fair will conclude with a Premium Dinner beginning at 6 p.m and the premium sale at 6:30 p.m.


